ANOTHER WIN FOR AYANNA?

Ayanna (In Excess {Ire}), front-running winner of the Nov. 18 Mocassin S. at Hollywood Park and the Dec. 22 Christmas Futurity at Turf Paradise, looks to make it three in a row in today's GII Santa Ynez S. going seven furlongs at Santa Anita. Second behind the talented Habibtu in her second start, the Triple AAA Ranch homebred came back to break her maiden at Del Mar at the end of August. The Arizona-bred was eased after getting off to an awkward start and then rushing up to set the early pace in the one-mile GI Oak Leaf S. in September, but bounced back to start her stakes-winning streak after a short break. "She jumped some tracks or something on the backstretch that shook her up pretty good [in the Oak Leaf]," trainer Kory Owens explained. "It jarred her badly enough that she was sore for about 10 to 12 days afterward." The dark bay has yet to win beyond seven furlongs, but Owens may try her going two turns after the Santa Ynez. "Because speed comes so naturally to her, it's hard to slow her down," he admitted. "It just comes too easy for her. But we'll talk with [jockey Mike Smith] to see if we can get her to stretch out." Ayanna is likely to be joined on the front end by Lady George (Lake George), who zipped a half in :44 3/5 en route to her victory in the restricted California Breeders' Champion S. at Santa Anita Dec. 28; and by Rich Musique (Rizzi), who led every step to win an optional-claiming event over Candor (Crafty Prospector) and Respectful (Honour and Glory) Dec. 31.

THE RICH GET RICHER

She had to fight for it, but Affluent (Affirmed) got the job done once again, battling past Royally Chosen (In Excess {Ire}) to take yesterday's GII El Encino S. at Santa Anita by a nose. It was the fourth graded-stakes win in the last five starts for the versatile filly, who notched her first black-type score in the July 14 GII Hollywood Oaks going nine furlongs on the dirt. She added a victory in the Oct. 13 GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup at that distance on the turf at Keeneland two starts later and made it two in a row in the Dec. 29 GI La Brea S. going seven furlongs on the Santa Anita main track. Odds-on to make it three straight, the Janis Whitham colorbearer was four-wide around the first turn, tucked in along the rail while tracking the leaders down the backstretch, had to wait for running room as they raced past the quarter pole, but found a narrow seam along the inside in the stretch. "She was in trouble there for a while," trainer Ron McAnally said. "But like [jockey Eddie Delahoussaye] said, the hole opened up just enough for him to get through." Looking to sweep the La Canada series, the winner will make her next start in the GII La Canada S. Feb. 9.

BIETOLINI JAPAN BOUND

Top Italian jockey Mirco Demuro continues in his attempt to secure a first win at Santa Anita for trainer Richard Mandella but his Italian substitute Gabriele Bietolini, who is trainer Bruno Grizzetti's number two jockey, is set to travel to Japan in Demuro's place. Bietolini will replace Demuro, who is to remain in the United States, for a four week period at the Ritto training complex near Hokkaido for owner Tenryu Yoshida. It is believed that Demuro wishes to stay at Santa Anita for the time being in a bid to establish himself and intends to divide his year between Italy, Japan and the United States. In the meantime, Grizzetti has acted quickly to secure the services of Tuscany-based jockey Stefano Landi who enjoyed a double at Pisa yesterday with wins aboard Zamindan (GB) (Zamindar {USA}) and King Of Swamps (USA) (Peteski {USA}).

HORSES KILLED IN ACTION

An unfortunate incident happened at Rome's Capannelle racetrack last Saturday when three horses were fatally injured in the same race. The second race on the card, the Premio Poussin, a handicap steeplechase over 3,400 meters, saw Manaus (Ire) (Waa'ib {Ire}) break a leg at the 12th fence followed by Leonteo (Ire) (Brief Truce {USA}), who suffered a heart attack soon after. Tideo (Ity) (Nordance {USA}), who was challenging for a place at the time, also broke a leg at the 15th fence. The last time there were three fatalities in the same race in Italy was in 1959 when three horses all fell at the same fence in the Gran Steeple di Milano at the San Siro.

ENGLIS CLASSIC SALE BEGINS

The Inglis Classic Yearling Sale begins today at the Newmarket-based sales pavilion at Randwick in New South Wales where 463 lots are catalogued to pass through the ring of the two-day event. Inglis threw down the gauntlet to the rapidly-growing Magic Millions sale a couple of years ago when it introduced three attractive sale incentive races, including the \$1 million centerpiece, the Heroic Championship. Earlier editions of the January sale has produced two G1 Blue Diamond winners; True Jewels (Aus) (Brief Truce (USA)) and Road To Success (Aus) (Dolphin Street (Fr)), who cost A\$28,000 and A\$18,000 respectively, while this season's boom two-year-old and reigning Slipper favourite Bel Esprit (Aus) (Royal Academy (USA)) cost his owners a meager A\$9,000. Among the likely stars of this year's catalogue is Lot 306, a well-built Snippets (Aus)--Fairy Legend (Aus) (Fairy King (USA)) colt who is part of the consignment of Widden Stud and Lot 299, a popular Grand Lodge (USA)--Espouse (Aus) (Marscay (Aus)) colt who Corumbene Stud will offer on the sale's second day. Other potential scene stealers are Willow Park Stud's colt Gold Fever (USA)--Cailin Deas (Aus) (Century (Aus)) and Riverdene Stud's outstanding Strategic (Aus)--Winged Hope (Aus) (Personal Hope (USA)) colt, both expected to attract plenty of attention during the first day of action. "I think we are in for a good sale across the board, there's a sprinkling of nice horses, real racehorse types, which the market likes, and if we can hold or better last year's average, that would be very nice," said Inglis spokesman Vin Cox. "Snippets is having a good run right now with high profile two-year-olds like Snowland, but the Australian sires-- Zeditave, Marauding, Marscay and Rory's Jester--always get results on the board at the end of the season and that is reflected in their sale results," he said. "There is a real boom on Showhog. He is a very fast son of Danehill and the way

sons of Danehill are going is fantastic, and he is going to be the next big one." Both sessions are scheduled to begin at 10:30 a.m.

MONARCHOS ON TRACK FOR DONN Kentucky Derby winner Monarchos (Maria's Mon) exited his 8 3/4-length defeat in Saturday's Gulfstream allowance return in good order and is still on track for the Feb. 9 GI Donn H., trainer John Ward Jr. reports. The four-year-old, off at 1-2 in his first start since June, broke a step slowly, settled at the back of the pack through a soft half in :48 1/5, made a moderate middle move, but flattened out in the stretch to be third behind easy winner Mongoose (Broad Brush). "I got what I wanted out of the race," Ward said. "It fits nicely into our scheme for him and I like where we are with him at this time. He got tired and now we will get more serious about things. I haven't been working him hard in the mornings and he's gotten laid back. Now I'll give him two hard works and he'll be set up nicely for the Donn." Jockey Jorge Chavez, the colt's regular rider, added, "He got a little tired. I'm not disappointed--he tried hard. He'll be ready to go next time." Also scheduled to have two more serious workouts before his engagement in the Donn, Graeme Hall (Dehere) went five furlongs in 1:02 4/5 at Gulfstream yesterday morning. "It was a good work considering that this track is playing a little deep," trainer Todd Pletcher said. "He's doing very well."

Irish Prize, two-for-three over this course, stretches out after a rallying head victory in the Dec. 30 GII San Gabriel H. at a mile and an eighth. A four-time graded-stakes winner last season with consecutive wins in the May 13 GIII Fastness H., May 28 GI Shoemaker Breeders' Cup Mile and July 4 GII Firecracker Breeders' Cup H., the chestnut was also fourth in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile, but tries a mile and a quarter for the first time. Kerrygold has four wins from eight tries at 10 furlongs and was second behind Bienamado in this event last year. Winless since taking the restricted San Marino H. over course and distance nearly 11 months ago, the six-year-old looks to rebound after finishing eighth in the Dec. 1 GI Hollywood Turf Cup at a mile and a half and ninth in the Dec. 30 GII San Gabriel H. going a mile and an eighth. Lord Flasheart, a multiple Group winner in France, ended his European campaign with a second-place finish in the 2000 G1 French Derby. The bay returned after almost 18 months on the shelf to take a one-mile Santa Anita allowance Dec. 30.

Crash Course had shown a fondness for the Gulfstream turf in the past, winning two of his three prior starts on the surface, but had yet to win at this extended route. The consistent six-year-old had been knocking on the door, however. The winner of the 1 1/16-mile GIII Cliffhanger H. at the Meadowlands Sept. 22, he stretched out for the 10-furlong GII Knickerbocker S. at Belmont Oct. 26 and finished third, beaten only a half-length by Sumitas (Ger), then shortened up again to be second in the nine-furlong GIII Tropical Turf H. Dec. 8. Last time out, the bay weakened late to be fifth, beaten 2 3/4 lengths by Profit Option (Alleged), in the 12-furlong GII W. L. McKnight H. at Calder Dec. 29. Favored off that effort, he rated comfortably in the middle of the full field through a pedestrian six furlongs in 1:17 4/5, angled to the outside for the stretch run and kicked it into gear late to get up in the final strides. "My instructions were to come from way out of it, but I had a feeling that it was going to be a snail's pace," jockey Jerry Bailey said. "My intention was to set him somewhere in an easy middle and let him sneak up on them, and that's what he did." The GI Gulfstream Park Breeders' Cup H. on Feb. 16 is the next likely target for the winner.
