EXPECT SNOW IN HALLANDALE ON FRIDAY

Having had success with main-track stars Monarchos and Beautiful Pleasure over the last few years, trainer John T. Ward developed **Snow Dance** (Forest Wildcat) into a force in the three-year-old filly turf division last year. The gray filly will make her seasonal debut in the GIII De La Rose H. on Friday at Gulfstream Park. Switched to the turf last summer, the John Oxley colorbearer rattled off five wins from six starts on the turf, including victories in the GII Mrs. Revere S., the GIII Lake Placid S. and GIII Pucker Up S. Her lone defeat on the grass came when an excellent third to MGISW Affluent and GISW Golden Apples in the GI Queen Elizabeth II Cup at Keeneland in October. "She beat older horses a couple of times in allowance races last year," Ward explained. "This year she has to take on those tough older grass mares that have won stakes and it'll be interesting to see how she fares." The co-highweight in the field, **Batique** (Storm Cat) enters this event off a victory in the GIII Honey Fox H. over course and distance Jan. 4.

Saturday, Santa Anita

SANTA MONICA H.-GI, \$200,000, 4yo/up, f/m, 7f

A short, but talented field is projected for Saturday's race, one of just three Grade I events for older filly and mare sprinters. **Spain** (Thunder Gulch) will be cutting back in distance off her disappointing fifth-place finish in the GIII Falls City H. at Churchill Downs Nov. 22. The winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff in 2000, the bay mare won the GI La Brea S. over the seven-furlong distance of the Santa Monica. Owned by The Thoroughbred Corporation and trained by D. Wayne Lukas, she recorded just one win from nine starts in 2001, but was beaten just a neck when second in the Breeders' Cup Distaff two back. Spain worked four furlongs in :48 2/5 on Tuesday.

Lightly raced **Kalookan Queen** (Lost Code), second to Honest Lady in this event two years ago, will vie for favoritism with Spain. A Grade III winner last year, the Bruce Headley trainee comes into this test off a six-length score in the Corona H. at Hollywood Dec. 16, inspiring confidence in her trainer. "Tell King Lukas to buckle up," Headley said. "Kalookan Queen is ready to go." The six-year-old blew out three eighths of a mile in a solid :35 4/5 yesterday morning.

Sunday, Santa Anita

PALOS VERDES H.-GII, \$150,000, 4yo/up, 6f

Breeders' Cup Sprint hero **Squirtle Squirt** (Marquetry) rates the marquee in the first start of his four-year-old campaign, but trainer Ian Jory has high hopes for GIII El Conejo H. runner-up **Explicit** (Distant View). "I'm looking forward to taking on the big horse," the conditioner said. "The Dubai race is looming, so we need to see exactly where we're at," he said, referring to the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen at Nad al Sheba Mar. 23. As fast as any horse on his day, Explicit missed the break of the El Encino and chased eventual winner **Snow Ridge** (Tabasco Cat) in vain en route to his runner-up finish. The latter is also probable for Sunday's race.

BYRNE OFF Alan Byrne is to leave his post as editor of Britain's only daily racing newspaper, the *Racing Post*, after eight years in the job. Byrne, who had previously worked as news editor of the Dublin-based *Sunday Tribune*, has intimated that he intends to pursue other interests. He told *Racing Post* readers yesterday: "It has been a wonderful privilege editing the *Racing Post*. I have enjoyed it enormously. When I took over the main aim was to try to overhaul the *Sporting Life*, which had nearly two-thirds of the market. As a result of the efforts of a great many people we managed to overtake the *Life*. After the two papers merged in 1998 we were able to produce an even better paper, thanks to the influx of talent from the *Life*. The *Racing Post* is currently enjoying record sales, so I feel my job here is done and the time is right to move on. Whoever takes over from me will inherit a very talented team. I will always be indebted to my colleagues for the work they have done in making the *Racing Post* a successful and profitable paper and I wish them continuing success." Founding director Brough Scott added: "Alan has done an unbelievable job. He is a terrific editor, but I understand why he wants a new challenge. Now our challenge is to keep up the service for all of our readers." Chris Smith, currently working as deputy editor, will act as editor over the course of the next few weeks until a successor is appointed.

RED CARPET AIMING FOR SPRINTS

Cheveley Park Stud's **Red Carpet (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}), a head runner-up to King's Ironbridge (Ire) in last season's G3 Craven S. at Newmarket, has returned to training with Michael Bell and is pointing to the six furlong Listed NGK Spark Plugs Abernant S. at Newmarket Apr. 16 for his reappearance. The four-year-old chesnut's only other racecourse outing last year was a fifth-place finish to Golan (Ire) in the G1 Sagitta 2000 Guineas; his intended campaign was subsequently blighted by intermittent lameness. Bell told the *Racing Post*: "Red Carpet came back in just before Christmas and is fine. We will feel our way with him, but he is definitely going sprinting. We have no definite plans at this stage and we will have to discuss it with [stud manager] Chris Richardson but, all things being equal, we could start him off in the Abernant."

AUTHORITIES TO INVESTIGATE DEATHS

Italian authorities are to mount an investigation into the circumstances surrounding the deaths of three horses in the Premio Poussin steeplechase at The Capannelle in Rome last Saturday. **Manaus (Ire)** (Waajib {Ire}), **Leonteo (Ire)** (Brief Truce {USA}) and **Tideo (Ity)** (Nordance {USA}) all suffered fatal injuries and one of the three was euthanized without screens being erected. Jockey Giuliano Rota also suffered a broken collarbone during the race. The Capannelle track doesn't have a (British-style) horse ambulance and there has been criticism from some quarters regarding the lack of specialised veterinary services.

Bailey has reportedly given the call to trainer Bobby Frankel, if he decides to ship **Lido Palace (Chi)** (Rich Man's Gold) from California for the \$500,000 event.

Tampa Bay to Reduce Purses:
 Tampa Bay Downs in Oldsmar, Florida, has announced a reduction in purses effective Jan. 29. General Manager Peter Berube explained that the cuts are necessitated by a refusal by seven tracks outside of Florida to import the simulcast signal from Tampa. Berube said that he is disappointed in the leadership of the local Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association as well as the national leadership, which encouraged the seven tracks to take the action they did. "We have signed a contract with our HBPA and support for the contract by the majority of HBPA directors and members. But because the President of the local HBPA was not allocated stalls for his horses during the present racing season, he is promoting this boycott," Berube explained.

Five Grade I Stakes in Canada for 2002:
 The Canadian Graded Stakes Committee have compiled a graded-stakes list which includes five Grade I, 10 Grade II and 25 Grade III events for the 2002 racing season. The GI Grey S. and the GI Mazarine Breeders' Cup S. for two-year-olds were both downgraded to Grade II status for this term, and the GII Marine and Eclipse S. were demoted to Grade III events. The previously Grade III Speed to Spare S. lost its graded status, thus becoming a Listed stake. Among the upgrades for 2002 is the GI Niagara Breeders' Cup and the GII Nassau S, previously Grade II and III, respectively.

Tampa Bay to Reduce Purses:

Tampa Bay Downs in Oldsmar, Florida, has announced a reduction in purses effective Jan. 29. General Manager Peter Berube explained that the cuts are necessitated by a decision by seven tracks outside of Florida to import the simulcast signal from Tampa. Berube said that he is disappointed in the leadership of the local Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association as well as the national leadership, we encouraged the seven tracks to take the action they did. "We have signed a contract with our HBPA and support for the contract by the majority of HBPA directors and members. But because the President of the local HBPA was not allocated stalls for his horses during the present racing season, he is promoting this boycott," Berube explained.
