SOPHOMORES SET TO STAR IN HOLLYWOOD

Hollywood Park has made some changes in its stakes schedule for the upcoming Spring/Summer Meet, adding a new race for three-year-old fillies on the turf and deleting the GII Princess S. Debuting July 6 will be the American Oaks, a \$500,000 contest for turf fillies going 10 furlongs. "We decided we should be doing something that no one else is doing," Martin Panza, Hollywood's racing secretary, told *Daily Racing Form*. "No one else in America has done anything with this division." The American Oaks will be the richest race in California for three-year-old fillies. Another change on the stakes schedule is that the GII Hollywood Oaks, previously run at nine furlongs on the main track with a \$150,000 purse, has been renamed the Hollywood Breeders' Cup Oaks and has had its purse money boosted to \$250,000. It will now be contested at 1 1/16 miles June 15.

ZANZIBAR RETIRED Zanzibar (Ire) (In The Wings {GB}--Isle of Spice {USA}, by Diesis {GB}) has been retired to her owner Kevin Mercer's Usk Valley Stud near Abergavenny. An impressive seven-length winner of the G1 Oaks d'Italia in Milan last May, the Mike Bell trainee found the fast ground against her when finishing last in the G1 Epsom Oaks the following month. Fifth in the G1 Yorkshire Oaks at York in August and sixth in the G1 Prix Vermeille at Longchamp in September, she was fifth in the G1 Prix de l'Opera at Longchamp before finishing a disappointing ninth in the G2 Premio Lydia Tesio in Rome in October. She will be covered by first-season sire Fantastic Light (USA). "I would say she was certainly the best middle-distance filly I've trained," the conditioner said. "She won the Oaks d'Italia well and obviously that was her peak--she was never really the same again for one reason or another. To be fair to her she won a Group 1 and there aren't many fillies who can do that."

RECORD ENTRY FOR NATIONAL Aintree were yesterday celebrating a modern-day record entry of 144 for this year's £500,000 Martell Grand National Apr. 6, beating the previous best of 141 in 1984. Previous winners **Red Marauder (GB)** (Gunner B {GB}) and **Papillon (Ire)** (Lafontaine {USA}) are included, as are Tote Cheltenham Gold Cup hopes **Florida Pearl (Ire)** (Florida Son {GB}), who heads 26 Irish-trained entries, and **First Gold (Fr)** (Shafoun {Fr}), one of five from France. Trainers will have to wait to learn the weights of their contenders in London Feb. 5. Charles Barnett, Aintree's Managing Director, said yesterday: "This is another tremendous entry combining top quality with quantity--the perfect National formula. We have our biggest-ever overseas entry with yet again amazing support from Ireland. I'm also delighted with the number of French entries and in particular the prestige of J P McManus' First Gold from the Doumen yard. I would like to wish Senior Handicapper Phil Smith the best of luck although he is of course at liberty to apply the Aintree factor."

WEBSITE FLAP

Trainer John Hawkes has threatened to sack Sydney jockeys who supply pre- and post-race comments to the controversial new website www.racewebb.com.au. At the same time, Thoroughbred Racing Board stewards have issued a "please explain" to senior riders on the issue. The jockeys have been asked to show stewards their contracts and details of any financial gains expected from their involvement. Australian racing rules prevent jockeys from providing information about their mounts for monetary gain. The site is run by racehorse owner David Simpson and a charge of \$99 per year is levied on users. "We don't want to interfere with the promotion of racing but we must ensure that the arrangements don't compromise the rules," said chief steward Kim Kelly. "Our role is to protect the image of racing." Said Hawkes, "If jockeys are talking about my horses, they won't be riding them. I'm the one that does all the talking. They just do the riding."

MULTI-MILLION DOLLAR COLT WINS

The most expensive yearling ever sold in Australasia, **Don Eduardo (NZ)** (Zabeel {NZ}), won his first race from five starts when he took out a Bendigo maiden yesterday. The colt, out of Diamond Lover (Aus) fetched NZ\$3.6 million at the New Zealand Premier sale in 2000. Unplaced in his first four outings, the Lee Freedman-trained colt earned the princely sum of \$6,500 for today's win in the Country Vet Maiden Plate (1300m). Don Eduardo is owned by Filipino businessman Eduardo Conjuangco's Gooree Pastoral Stud.

NEW FUTURITIES AT DELAWARE The National Association of Two-Year-Old Consignors has announced the sponsorship of a pair of restricted stakes, one for fillies and one for colts and geldings, to be held at Delaware Park this year. The races are tentatively scheduled for Labor Day weekend, but the exact dates will be announced when the 2002 Delaware Park stakes schedule is finalized. All graduates of two-year-old in training sales which were consigned by a NATC member who is also a contributor to the organization's advertising fund will be eligible. The NATC Futurity's two divisions will be run at six furlongs and will have a purse of \$100,000 guaranteed. Nominations and two sustaining payments to maintain eligibility will be required for each prospective entrant.

Another Injured:

Graded-stakes winner **Another** (Seattle Slew--Choice Claim, by Mining) sustained a fractured knee will preparing for a title defense in the GIII First Lady H. at Gulfstream and will likely be retired, according to trainer T. V. Smith. "She suffered a fracture in a knee when I was getting ready to run her in the First Lady H.," Smith said. "I sent her to a clinic in Kentucky, where they confirmed the injury. I believe the owner [Robert Masterson] is going to breed her." A \$175,000 Keeneland September purchase, Another is from the immediate family of Grade I winners Cat's Cradle (Flying Paster) and Roamin Rachel (Mining). The five-year-old mare's record stands at 15-4-6-2 and earnings of \$271,583.

Frankel on the Fence:

Trainer Bobby Frankel has stated his intention of running MGISW **Lido Palace (Chi)** (Rich Man's Gold) in the GI Donn H. Feb. 9, but flight arrangements may preclude the chestnut's participation. "We still don't know for sure about a flight," Frankel said. "They are trying to get some other horses together to come on the plane with him. I don't want to come by myself--it would cost more than \$25,000. That just doesn't make much sense. The one thing I can tell you right now is that if he does come the flight will leave on February 7." Frankel's star three-year-old **Labamta Babe** (Skywalker) who surprised winter-book Derby favorite Siphonic in the GII Santa Catalina S. last Saturday, could make the journey East for the \$1 million GI Florida Derby Mar. 16. "That's a possibility," Frankel added. "We might just do that."

It actually was one small fracture running down the middle of the cannon bone and two other small ones branching out from it. Dr. [Larry] Bramlage said surgery couldn't be done and that the injury would heal with stimulation. He's sound enough, and in fact has already started jogging lightly." Iron Deputy will likely be off for three months.
