PREMIER SALE CONCLUDES

A strong third session, led by a NZ\$800,000 son of Danehill--Tristalove (NZ) (*Sir Tristram), concluded the Premier Sale portion of the 76th National Yearling Sales Series Wednesday at Karaka in Auckland, New Zealand. Cambridge Stud offered the Australian-bred bay, a son of champion Tristalove--a granddaughter of fabled broodmare Eight Carat. Walter and Cathy Alteri of the Victoria-based Newlands Thoroughbreds purchased the youngster, who is a full brother to G1SW Viking Ruler (Aus). The sale aggregate was down just over NZ\$10 million from last year, while the average for the three-day Premier Sale was also down from NZ\$123,366 to NZ\$102,935. "We knew this would be the toughest year we've faced since taking over the business five years ago," remarked Peter Vela, chairman of New Zealand Bloodstock. "No doubt the market is down on what we have experienced in the past, but it's a world-wide trend at present that we could not expect to be completely immune from forever. In light of this, we are very satisfied with the results and it was encouraging to see the market pick up so much [Wednesday]. There were some great individual sales and although not the most spectacular sale we've had, overall it was a very solid sale." Danehill led the way among sires, with six yearlings averaging NZ\$410,000, while Zabeel (NZ) ranked second as his 42 yearlings sold for an average of NZ\$222,524.

HUTCHESON S.-GII, \$150,000, 3yo, 7f

Unbeaten **Cashel Castle** (Silver Ghost) will miss the Hutcheson after coming out of a Tuesday breeze with some filling in his right ankle. "I'm sure that he strained some soft tissue above the ankle," said trainer Chris Block. "We took some X-rays and they didn't turn up anything, and I'm sure that he'd be fine if the race were three weeks from now." Cashel Castle had taken his three starts by a combined 19 1/2 lengths, culminating in an eight-length victory in the Hoosier Juvenile S. Nov. 24...**Maybry's Boy** (Broad Brush) took the Gill Spectacular Bid S. on opening day and seems a likely favorite for the Hutcheson, while **Axis** (Saint Ballado) captured a Gulfstream allowance Jan. 12 and will be making his stakes debut. The chestnut colt has progressed from a \$145,000 Keeneland November weanling to a \$275,000 Saratoga August yearling before being purchased for \$700,000 at Fasig-Tipton's two-year-old sale last February. "We were impressed with this horse when we bought him and he has done nothing to disappoint us," said trainer Elliott Walden.

1,181 ENTRIES FOR WORLD CUP CARD

After the second entry stage for the Mar. 23 Dubai World Cup meeting, a total of 1,181 entries were received for the seven races. The number of entries marked a 12-percent increase from the 2001 total. "It is very rewarding to see the amount of entries and from where they have come and our aim for the 2002 Dubai World Cup to be the best ever is a step closer to being achieved," said Les Benton, World Cup Committee Chairman. "The number of entries we have received is again up on last year which proves the increasing popularity of the Dubai World Cup within the international racing community." Among the new invitees are three horses from South Africa: **Ingleside (SAf)** (Dolpour), **Trademark (SAf)** (Goldmark {SAf}) and **Nhlavni (SAf)** (National Emblem), as well as **Sagittarius (GB)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}) from Norway.

SRI PEKAN TO TURKEY

Sri Pekan (USA) (Red Ransom {USA}--Lady Godolphin {USA}, by Son Ange {USA}) has been purchased by the Turkish Jockey Club in a deal brokered by the French Bloodstock Agency and Brian Grassick Bloodstock. The 10-year-old stallion will ship from Ireland's Castlehyde Stud to Izmit National Stud this weekend. On the race-track, Sri Pekan was a three-time group winner in England. He has sired Italian champion juvenile Blu Air Force (Ire), as well as group winners Dora Carrington (Ire), Hoh Dear (Ire) and Buffalo Berry (Ire).

BUTLER OUTLINES DUBAI PLAN

Trainer Gerard Butler Tuesday outlined plans for **Stratus (Fr)** (Septieme Ciel {USA}), entered in America's Triple Crown. Highclere Thoroughbred Racing's colt, third in his debut in a Lingfield all-weather maiden before scoring at the same track the following month, may head to Dubai this spring. Butler said: "He performed well on the dirt both times and is set to run back at Lingfield Feb. 9. If he runs well there, he will go to Dubai for the UAE 2000 Guineas and UAE Derby--it's a pretty tough call, though." Butler also confirmed that his other Triple Crown entry, **Goshin's Lad (USA)** (Nicholas {USA}), would go for the Whirlaway S. at Aqueduct Feb. 4. "He needs to go to America, and hopefully he can market himself a bit. He will run for us in the Whirlaway and then stay in America, probably going to [trainer] Mike Stidham."

★ BRITAIN ★

41ST LEVY SCHEME ANNOUNCED

British racing received a boost on Tuesday with the announcement by Tessa Jowell, Secretary of State for Culture, Media & Sport, that income from the 41st levy scheme is set to advance by approximately 50 percent, to over £90 million for 2002-2003. The decision was tempered by the BHB's disappointment that the levy is to be based on bookmakers' gross profits rather than on betting turnover. Jowell told *Racing Post*: "I understand that the racing industry may be disappointed that I have decided to introduce a gross profits levy but this is wholly consistent with the Government's introduction of a gross profits betting tax and is the fairest and most reliable indication of the bookmakers' capacity to pay. I would like to encourage the betting and racing industries to develop a modern relationship as business partners and move away from an adversarial approach."

HUGHES URGES COMPROMISE

Robert Hughes, chairman of the Levy Board, yesterday urged the racing and betting industries to work together to find a mutually advantageous replacement for the levy. Hughes warned that if an agreement wasn't reached by May 1--the date when the BHB's licensing deals for bookmakers to receive pre-race data and live pictures will start--there would likely be a steep decline in horserace betting. He made the following proposals, "Firstly, both sides should accept the Secretary of State's announced determination with good grace and without legal challenge. Secondly, they should recognise that there is a degree of equivalence to a payment for data rights. After all, the BHB's demands of 1.5 percent of turnover are very similar to the Levy rate of 1.52 percent under this year's Company Scheme. Thirdly, sort out the issue of picture rights, on a short-term basis if necessary."

TAX TO RETURN?

Bookmakers' representatives Tuesday warned that punters in Britain may be forced to accept the reintroduction of a betting tax only months after the withdrawal of General Betting Duty. Keith Brown, chairman of the Racecourse Association, addressing bookmakers at a meeting of the British Betting Offices' Association in London, said commercial pricing of data by the British Horseracing Board could lead bookmakers to re-introduce a tax on punters to meet the new charges, to be introduced from May 1.

SCENIC RETURNS TO COLLINGROVE

Collingrove Stud has announced that **Scenic (GB)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}--Idyllic {USA}, by Foolish Pleasure {USA}) has been promoted back to its Victorian roster for 2002 after spending three seasons in WA. Collingrove sold Scenic in 1999 to David Smith of Durham Lodge, but the stud jointly owned by the Hayes and Sangster families has arranged for a season lease and the sire of AJC Derby winner Universal Prince (Aus) will stand at A\$22,000. Scenic, who stood at A\$12,000 in 2001 at Durham, has figured highly on sire tables in recent years and last season was runner-up to Danehill (USA) with his progeny earning \$5,575,550 in prize money. He has 30 stakes winners and earnings of more than A\$25 million.

NORTHERLY MAY MAKE FUTURITY START

Australian Associated Press reported that **Northerly (Aus)** (Serheed {USA}) worked solidly between races at Pinjarra in Western Australia ahead of his bid to snare back-to-back G1 Australian Cup trophies at Flemington on Mar. 11. Northerly, working with a stablemate, was unofficially timed at :46.2 for his final 800m. Trainer Fred Kersley said earlier this week he was concerned the gelding may not be forward enough to resume in the Feb. 16 C F Orr S. at Caulfield and his return could be delayed until the Futurity S. just nine days before the Australian Cup.

NJ DATES DRAMA CONTINUES The New Jersey Racing Commission yesterday announced a 120-day thoroughbred racing schedule for 2002, with a 76-day meet at Monmouth Park and a 44-day meet at the Meadowlands, but the controversy surrounding this year's calendar is not yet over. Legislation passed last year calls for a mandatory 141-day thoroughbred racing season in the state, and owners and trainers, unhappy with the abbreviated schedule proposed by the Commission, intend to fight it in court. "We are very disappointed that the Commission opted not to comply with the letter of the law, which mandates that we have 141 days of thoroughbred racing in New Jersey," Bud Keegan, the president of the New Jersey Horsemen's Association, said. "We are not satisfied with 120 days, and we're going to take them to court. We believe they have to comply with the statute, and we're going to try and make them do it." The Commission also awarded the Meadowlands a fall harness meeting, which starts Nov. 22 and runs through Dec. 28, while Atlantic City Racecourse will hold a one-day meeting on Friday, May 10. "I actually think the dates they've come up with are reasonable and will work for both industries and for the state," Bruce Garland, the senior vice president of racing for the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority, which runs Monmouth and the Meadowlands, said. With 116 days of Thoroughbred racing in New Jersey last year, purses, boosted by an \$11.7 million supplement from the state, reached record levels. But, looking to reduce a 10-figure budget deficit, Gov. James McGreevey has frozen all discretionary spending, including the purse supplement, which had already been reduced to \$3.9 million. The fear is that, with the loss of the supplement, an expanded meet would necessitate much smaller purses. "Last year, we had tremendous racing at Monmouth Park and the Meadowlands, and we are going to work hard to do it again," Garland said. But Thoroughbred horsemen believe they can have their 141-day season and maintain the level of the purses and the quality of racing. "Their answer to losing the purse supplement was giving us less days, instead of trying to be creative and find the money somewhere else," Keegan said. "They could give us a better split of the simulcast revenue produced at the Meadowlands, for instance. There are no promises, no guarantees, but we believe we will get the supplement."

A graded-stakes winner at two, Harlan's Holiday endured a wide trip when second in his three-year-old bow, the GIII Holy Bull S. Jan. 19 at Gulfstream.

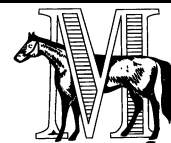

IRISH PRIZE, MUTAMAM TOP CANADIAN

RANKS Irish Prize (Irish River {Fr}), winner of the GI Shoemaker H. and GI Canadian International S. victor **Mutamam (GB)** (Darshaan {GB}), topped the Canadian Jockey Club's Free Handicap classifications at 126 pounds yesterday for the 2001 racing season. Both males were listed among the three-year-old and up, turf division over one mile and a quarter. Irish Prize's lone Canadian outing came in the GI Atto Mile Sept. 9, when the chestnut finished fourth, beaten three-quarters of a length. **Confessional** (Holy Bull), winner of the GI Frizette S. as a juvenile, led the sprinting fillies division with 124 pounds after scoring in her second consecutive GIII Royal North H. at Woodbine. Recently named Canadian champion three-year-old filly after an impressive season which featured a win in the Queen's Plate,

Dancethruthedawn (Mr. Prospector) led all sophomore fillies over nine furlongs at 123 pounds, giving further credit to her illustrious dam Canadian Horse of the Year Dance Smartly. Two fillies filled the top spot on the turf filly & mare division at 10 furlongs: Grade I-winning **Choc Ice (Ire)** (Kahyasi {Ire}), victorious in the GI E.P. Taylor S.; and **Spring Oak (GB)** (Mark of Esteem {Ire}), winner of the G3 Prix Cleopatre and third in both the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf and the GI E.P. Taylor S. in 2001. The committee weighed 300 horses in total for 2001, 139 fillies and mares and 161 colts or geldings.
