THE HEAT IS ON IN HUTCH

The road to the Triple Crown begins to heat up today at Gulfstream Park with the 49th running of the GII Hutcheson S. Among the champions who have graduated from the Hutcheson are Holy Bull, Swale and Spectacular Bid. Hoping to add his name to that list is **Maybry's Boy** (Broad Brush), who broke his maiden by six lengths at today's seven-furlong distance at Aqueduct in November. Second in allowance company in his next outing, the Shug McGaughey-trained colt closed well to take the Jan. 3 GIII Spectacular Bid S. at Gulfstream in his last start. "He's still a little green, but he's learning how to run and he's getting better at it with each race," McGaughey said. **Axis** (Saint Ballado), second in his debut at Keeneland last October, was a 6 1/4-length maiden winner at Turfway in November and added an allowance tally at Gulfstream Jan. 12. "This horse has progressed well through the fall and early winter and he does have the kind of pedigree that would indicate he's going to be able to get a distance of ground," trainer Elliott Walden said. "We were impressed with this horse when we bought him and he has done nothing to disappoint us." The chestnut was purchased for \$700,000 at the Fasig-Tipton two-year-old sale last February. Since running sixth in the GIII Iroquois S. last fall, **Showmeitall** (All Gone), a \$6,000 yearling purchase, captured a Calder allowance and ran second in the Dec. 15 Inaugural S. at Tampa before a runner-up finish behind Maybry's Boy in the Spectacular Bid. He gets a favorable six-pound weight shift here. **Monthir** (Gulch), second in the GIII Nashua S. in October before tiring to be fifth going two turns for the first time in the nine-furlong GII Remsen S. Nov. 24, made his 2002 bow in a 1 1/16-mile Gulfstream allowance test Jan. 9 and missed by a nose after setting the pace.

RIGHT AT HOME IN SAN VICENTE

Came Home (Gone West) suffered the first loss of his short career in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile, finishing seventh behind Johannesburg last October, but he looks to get back on the winning track in his three-year-old bow, today's GII San Vicente S. at Santa Anita. "He's doing very good," trainer Paco Gonzalez said of the colt, who has three bullet workouts on his tab. "He's coming to this race as good as you can get him." Came Home was virtually untouchable in the first three starts of his career, including a four-length victory in the GIII Hollywood Juvenile Championship and a two-length win in the GI Hopeful S., but he tired after pressing the pace in the Juvenile, his first route try, and has been off since. A \$650,000 KEESEP yearling, **Line Rider** (Danzig) was an expensive rabbit for Johannesburg last season in Europe, tiring to off-the-board finishes in the G1 Phoenix S., G1 Prix Morny and G1 Dewhurst S. The colt, making his first start for trainer Tim Pinfield, has not been out since running sixth in the Dewhurst at Newmarket last October. He will be making his first start on the dirt. The Thoroughbred Corporation's homebred **Popular** (Saint Ballado), second in last year's GIII Hollywood Prevue, is coming off a narrow victory in the Jan. 13 GIII San Miguel S. Undeclared **Werblin** (Unbridled's Song), an \$850,000 KEEJUL yearling and a full brother to the yearling colt which sold for \$1.1 million at the Keeneland January Sale, makes his stakes debut. The chestnut broke his maiden at Hollywood in July and came back to take a six-furlong Santa Anita allowance in his second start Dec. 26. He blew out for the San Vicente Jan. 30, going three furlongs in a bullet :34 1/5.

Western Pride won four straight, including victories in the Sept. 29 GII Ohio Derby and the Oct. 20 off-the-turf GIII Calder Derby, before ending his 2001 campaign with a fourth-place effort on the turf in the Nov. 25 GI Hollywood Derby. The dark bay returned to defeat **Oriente** and **Fancy As** in the Jan. 12 GII San Fernando Breeders' Cup last time out. He has won three of four starts at this distance. **Mizzen Mast** took the Nov. 7 Bien Bien S. over the Hollywood turf by 3 1/2 lengths before producing a strong late kick to take the Dec. 26 GI Malibu S. by 2 1/2 lengths in his main-track debut. He has worked a pair of bullets at Hollywood in preparation for his first start of 2002. **Giant Gentleman**, third after setting the pace in last year's GII Pegasus H. at the Meadowlands, dueled on the front end before finishing second in the Malibu in his last trip to the post.

DARLEY TO SPONSOR OAKS The G1 Irish Oaks, to be run July 14 at The Curragh, will be sponsored by Darley this year. For the past 14 years, the 1 1/2-mile event has been sponsored by Kildangan Stud, the County Kildare base for Darley's Irish stallions. "The Irish Oaks is a prestigious filly's Classic--just the right sort of race for Darley, which stands 40 stallions around the world, including five at Kildangan," Kildangan Stud Managing Director Joe Osborne said. The purse for the 2002 Irish Oaks will increase from Ir£225,000 to €400,000. "We are delighted to continue our association with Darley and Kildangan Stud," Curragh Manager Jason Morris said. "We had record attendance last year and the extra prize money can help ensure another top-class race."

ADENA SPRINGS TO SELL MAJORITY OF JUVENILES Frank Stronach's Adena Springs Farm will offer two-thirds of its current crop of two-year-olds at a special auction, to be conducted by the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company. The one-day sale will be held Mar. 21 at Adena Springs South in Ocala. Seventy-one two-year-olds, representing top Adena stallions such as Awesome Again, Touch Gold and Wild Rush, have been catalogued for the auction. Each juvenile will be offered with a pre-set published reserve. "I have a great deal of confidence in the Adena Springs program and our ability to breed, raise and train horses capable of competing at the highest level," Stronach said. "All of the horses catalogued for this sale have been brought through the same winning program that has resulted in four Eclipse Awards over the last three years. This auction reinforces our practice of ongoing support of our young stallion roster."

Azeff Still "Serious" at Memorial Hospital: Assistant trainer Yvonne Azeff, who was injured during morning training hours at Gulfstream Park last Saturday, remains in "serious" condition at Memorial Regional Hospital in Hollywood, Florida. Dr. Lawrence Lottenberg, director of trauma and critical care for the hospital's trauma center, said Azeff suffered a "traumatic brain injury" and, while she is recovering, is still in a semi-comatose state. "She is off the ventilator and she is being moved out of the intensive care unit [Friday]," Dr. Lottenberg said.

Sophomores Work: **Booklet** (Notebook), winner of the GIII Holy Bull S., worked five furlongs yesterday at Gulfstream in 1:00 3/5. The colt starts next in the Feb. 16 GI Fountain of Youth. "I was happy with the way he worked," said trainer John Ward. "He could have gone a little faster, but I didn't want him to. He's training and doing well. I'll give him one more serious work and then he'll be set up for the Fountain of Youth."

Also working yesterday, **Repent** (Louis Quatorze), second in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, went five furlongs in 1:03. Trainer Ken McPeck is keeping all his options open for the colt, who could make his three-year-old bow in an allowance contest, the Feb. 17 Risen Star S. at Fair Grounds or the Fountain of Youth.

Keats & Mongoose Remain Donn Possibles: Trainer Niall O'Callaghan is still deciding whether to send graded-stakes winner **Keats** (Hennessy) to Gulfstream's Feb. 9 GI Donn H. or to the Feb. 10 Whirlaway S. at Fair Grounds. "I'm not sure," said O'Callaghan. "I'm 50-50 between the two races right now. I'm going to work him at Payson next Monday or Tuesday and probably I'll decide after that." Also on the Donn fence is **Mongoose** (Broad Brush). The four-year-old defeated Kentucky Derby winner Monarchos while winning a Gulfstream allowance Jan. 19. His stable-mate **Ubiquity** (Colonial Affair), winner of the GII Clark H., may also make an appearance in the Donn. "They've both been pointed in that direction," said trainer H. James Bond. "They both may start in the Donn, or I may just start one of them."

Claimed for \$50,000 after a winning effort at Hollywood Park in June, Desiraes My Candy captured an entry-level allowance race at Del Mar in her second start under new management. She was given a chance in the Aug. 18 GI Del Mar Oaks off that performance and, after pressing the pace, weakened late to finish a decent fifth, then went to the sidelines. The bay returned in an optional claimer on the Santa Anita lawn Jan. 2 and came home a one-length winner. Let go at 8-1 this time, she stalked the leaders, angled to the outside for the stretch drive and dashed past pacesetter Tropical Lady before holding off Dispersed Reward for her first black-type victory. The 6-5 favorite The Seven Seas (El Gran Senor), making her first start since September, was at the back of the pack for the opening mile, came four-wide into the lane, but was caught in traffic and never threatened, finishing fourth.

Trace Levels of Clenbuterol Approved for California:

California's Office of Administrative Law Wednesday approved an amendment which will add the bronchodilator clenbuterol to the list of medications which can show up at trace levels in post-race urine samples in the state. The level of clenbuterol allowable in a post-race test cannot exceed five nanograms per milliliter. Approval for the amendment was granted after scientists at the University of California at Davis found that, at that level, the medication does not alter a horse's performance.

CBA chief executive Tom Kelly announced the setting up of a working party to "in response to comments by racecourse bookmaker Barry Dennis at the BBOA seminar earlier this week...concerning the weakness of racecourse markets and the potential for manipulation". He went on: "The committee will take into account the BHB's appointment of the Press Association as the sole compiler of betting shows and the sole distributor of starting prices. It will also discuss the recent proposal whereby the existing SP executive could be replaced by a new body comprising, among others, racing and media representatives. Given the number of people who are showing an interest in our SP system, it is, perhaps time for the betting industry to reciprocate that interest."
