MONARCHOS TO CLAIBORNE

It's official--Kentucky Derby winner **Monarchos** (Maria's Mon--Regal Band, by Dixieland Band) will begin his stud career at Claiborne Farm in Paris, Kentucky. The four-year-old will stand the 2002 season for a fee of \$25,000 live foal. "I have the highest regard for Seth Hancock and Claiborne," the colt's owner, John Oxley, said. "Claiborne and the many fine clients they are associated with will assure an exclusive book of mares for the important first four years and thereafter." The colt will be syndicated. "Monarchos has received his EVA vaccination," Oxley said. "Following the required 30-day period of observation, it is anticipated that a syndication will be completed, as there has been a very strong interest in participation expressed by major breeders. I will be retaining a substantial interest, allowing [wife] Debby and me to send our very nicest mares to Monarchos over the coming years."

FLUTE RETIRED

Flute (Seattle Slew--Rougeur, by Blushing Groom {Fr}), winner of the GI Kentucky Oaks and GI Alabama S. last season and a finalist for the Eclipse Award as champion three-year-old filly, has been retired because of a small chip in her ankle. "If it's a normal horse, you'd think nothing of it, take the chip out and bring her back," Juddmonte Manager Garrett O'Rourke told *The Blood-Horse*. "But we're at that time of the year when we have the opportunity to get her bred and get an early foal out of her next year. At the end of the day, it's better to be safe than sorry." Flute started just once at two, finishing second, then was first or second in her first six starts of 2001, adding runner-up finishes in the GI Santa Anita Oaks and GI Beldame S. to her Grade I victories. She was off the board for the only time in her career in her final start, finishing seventh as the even-money favorite in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff. She retires with four wins and three seconds from eight starts for earnings of \$1,101,504. The four-year-old is expected to arrive at owner/breeder Juddmonte Farms near Lexington this week, but breeding plans have not been finalized.

Gaily Flash, still looking for his first graded-stakes win at the ripe old age of nine, had been winless since taking the Chuto S. 13 months ago. The veteran runner stalked the pacesetters, gained the lead in midstretch and inched clear late. "I was nervous in the stretch when those other horses were getting close to us, but he never gave up," jockey Tetsuya Kobayashi said of the winner. Gaily Flash is expected to make his next start in the Mar. 24 G1 Takamatsunomiya Kinen. Trot Star (Jpn) (Damister), last year's champion sprinter, was favored, but came home only sixth.

Three Donn hopefuls had there final workouts at Gulfstream yesterday morning. **Graeme Hall** (Dehere), trained by Todd Pletcher, went five furlongs in 1:01 3/5. The five-year-old, making his first appearance since running second in the Nov. 24 GI Cigar Mile, will be the starting highweight at 118 pounds. "It was a very good work," Pletcher said. "I got him going out six furlongs in 1:13 and change. He's been training well and I hope he's fit enough for the Donn. It's hard to guess, with the track being deep, but we'll find out Saturday."

Traditionally (Mr. Prospector), winner of the GI Oaklawn H. last year, went a half-mile in :48 1/5. **Free Of Love** (Meadow Flight) matched that time in his four-furlong breeze. "So far, so good," trainer Rick Violette Jr. said. "We'll see how he's doing the next couple of days and, if he's all right, then we'll enter him."

PEDIGREE INSIGHTS

THE ROBERTO LINE

One of my most memorable visits to a racecourse dates back nearly 30 years, to York's 1972 August meeting when the extraordinary Brigadier Gerard was expected to extend his unbeaten record to 16 wins. Braulio Baeza, riding the Derby winner Roberto for the first time, had other ideas, though. Having helped force the early pace, Roberto made his bid for glory as he headed for the five-furlong long finishing stretch and maintained his gallop so well that even the heroic Brigadier couldn't catch him. In the process, Roberto sliced nearly two seconds off the track record and stunned the York crowd into virtual silence, with the exception of a few jubilant Irishmen.

Just recalling that moment makes me feel old, and reminds me too of the unwelcome fact that several of Roberto's best stallion sons are also well past the first flush of youth. Kris S. is now 25; Robellino, an underrated son based in England, is 24; Silver Hawk is 23; and Lear Fan is 21. Even Repriced, billed as "the youngest son of the great Roberto at stud," is now 14.

Although there should still be plenty of life left in Dynaformer, 17, and in Red Ransom, 15, we should perhaps be looking to see whether there are many grandsons of Roberto capable of maintaining his powerful influence in the U.S. It is slightly worrying that this year's *Blood-Horse* stallion register lists only 10 grandsons, and there are only five Grade I winners among them--Kris S.'s sons Arch, Kissin Kris, Prized and You and I, plus Lear Fan's son Labeeb.

At the moment, then, the task of extending the Roberto male line in North America seems to rest fairly firmly on the shoulders of Kris S. Unfortunately, Prized has probably made a greater impact with his 1997 New Zealand crop than with his American progeny, headed by the Grade II winners Prized Stamp and Pisces. However, You and I may yet recover from a slow start with his first crop, having sired eight stakes winners in his second and the Grade I-winning You in his third.

Kissin Kris is based in Florida at the Franks Farm of his breeder John Franks, who experienced some highs and lows during the horse's racing career. When Kissin Kris took the GI Haskell Invitational H. in 1993, he improved his record to 13-4-3-2, with the three seconds including one in the Belmont S. Remarkably, Kissin Kris made a further 22 appearances without managing to win another race. This epic losing streak is hard to believe in view of his second in the Travers S., his third behind Arcangues and Bertrando in the 1993 Breeders' Cup Classic and his second in the Suburban H. in 1995. Perhaps the losses had more to do with lack of determination than any lack of ability.

Jorge Chavez, who partnered Kissin Kris in the Suburban, reported, "I had so much horse and he was coming so strong, but he started cheating. He wouldn't give me everything."

Although Kissin Kris clearly had his foibles (as did Roberto), he was surely a welcome addition to the stallion strength in Florida, where Kris S. sired so many good horses during the first part of his career. He was popular in his first season in 1996 at a fee of \$5,000, attracting 88 mares for a crop of 62 named foals, but the next two years saw his book fall to 70 and then 51. Although his fortunes have continued to fluctuate, he attracted 112 mares in 2000, so his yearling crop this year is his largest to date.

It will be interesting to see how Kissin Kris progresses over the next few years, because there are signs that he has ability. His first crop contained the Canadian champion Kiss A Native and his comparatively small third crop has so far produced the stakes winners Blissful Kiss (My Dear Girl S.), Kiss An Angel and Cellars Shiraz, an unexpected winner of Sunday's GIII Herecomesthebride S.

It will also be interesting to see how Arch and Labeeb, two other grandsons of Roberto, fare with their first juveniles this year. Kris S.'s Super Derby winner Arch attracted the attention of John Ferguson, a man who has paid such prices as \$3,900,000, \$1,200,000 and \$1,000,000 for sons of Kris S. The Englishman collected two of Arch's highest-priced yearlings at \$140,000 and \$100,000.

Tiznow (Cee's Tizzy), who battled Arc winner Sakhee to the wire in his second consecutive GI Breeders' Cup Classic win, was voted champion California-bred older male for the 2001 season, reports the *Thoroughbred Times*. The five-year-old appears to be the leading candidate to secure his second Cal-bred Horse of the Year title at the awards luncheon, to be held at the Golden Gates Fields Turf Club Saturday. The Thoroughbred Corp.'s **Officer** (Bertrando) earned the champion juvenile title following a season which included five consecutive wins, including a victory in the GI Champagne S. Victress in the GI Apple Blossom H. and GI Vanity H., **Gourmet Girl** (Cee's Tizzy) emerged the leader in the older female division. Other honorees are:
