Forest Secrets To Face Miss Linda in Sabin:

A pair of Grade I winners from last year make their respective returns to the races in Friday's GIII Sabin H. at Gulfstream. Forest Secrets (Forest Wildcat), the 50-1 upsetter of the GI Acorn S. against fellow sophomore fillies in 2000, closed her season with a flourish, finishing third in the Raven Run S. at Keeneland and second in the GII Churchill Downs Distaff before recording a 1 1/4-length victory in the GIII Falls City H. in Louisville. Highweighted Miss Linda (Arg) (Southern Halo), a multiple Group 1 winner in her native Argentina, went on a three-race winning streak last summer, culminating with a wire-to-wire success in the GI Overbrook Spinster S. at Keeneland. Sixth in the Breeders' Cup Distaff in her penultimate start of 2001, she finished fourth in Forest Secret's Falls City H. win. Also in the field of 12 older fillies and mares is defending race champion De Bertie (De Niro).

McPeek Runners Work:

Harlan's Holiday (Harlan) worked five furlongs at Gulfstream Tuesday in a bullet 1:00. "It was an excellent trial," commented trainer Ken McPeek. "My plans are to run him next in the [Feb. 16 GI] Fountain of Youth S." The colt, winner of last year's GIII Iroquois S., was second in the Jan. 19 GIII Holy Bull S.

Stablemate Repent (Louis Quatorze), second in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile, blitzed five furlongs yesterday in :58 and galloped out six furlongs in 1:11 4/5. The move tied the time of GII Walmac Alcibiades winner Take Charge Lady (Dehere) as the fastest of the day. Repent is expected to make his three-year-old bow in the Feb. 17 GIII Risen Star S. at Fair Grounds.

Also on the Gulfstream worktab, trainer Nick Zito's High Star (Private Terms), third in the GIII Kentucky Jockey Club and an allowance winner at Gulfstream Jan. 26, worked five furlongs Tuesday in 1:04 3/5. He is being pointed towards the Mar. 16 GI Florida Derby, with a possible allowance start beforehand.

Apprentice jockey Lorenzo Lezcano rode five winners on yesterday's card at Aqueduct, extending his lead in the overall jockey's standings. He began the afternoon by sweeping the early Daily Double before adding victories in the fifth, sixth and the featured eighth race. "It is a very emotional thing to win five races," Lezcano said through a translator. "I try very hard to ride in the mornings and I try hard in the afternoons." Lezcano's final mount of the day finished off the board in the ninth race. He leads second-place Javier Castellano by a margin of 47 (from 277 mounts) victories to 39.

Summer Colony Invades for La Cañada:

Summer Colony (Summer Squall), the winner of five consecutive races by a combined 54 lengths, will ship to the West Coast to contest Saturday's GII La Cañada S. at Santa Anita. A remarkable 32 1/4-length maiden winner last summer at Saratoga, the dark bay took her next three allowance tests with ease and comes into the La Cañada off a neck victory in the GIII Ladies' H. at Aqueduct Dec. 22. Trainer Mark Hennig, a former regular on the Southern California circuit, has tabbed Gary Stevens to ride. The Edward Evans homebred will vie for favoritism with Affluent (Affirmed), looking to become just the third horse to sweep all three legs of Santa Anita's La Cañada series for four-year-old fillies.

Habibti Back in Las Virgenes:

The Thoroughbred Corporation's Habibti (Tabasco Cat) makes her seasonal debut in Sunday's GI Las Virgenes S. at Santa Anita. The chestnut, who suffered her only defeat to date in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, closed her freshman season with a narrow decision over You (You and I) in the GI Hollywood Starlet S. at Hollywood Park Dec. 16. Habibti will face that rival again on Sunday. "I hate to run that hard in a race like this, but we've got to run her somewhere," trainer Bob Baffert explained. "Our long-term goal is the [GI] Santa Anita Oaks [Mar. 9] so we're not really bearing down on her." Habibti completed preparations for Sunday's race with a five-furlong bullet in :58 4/5 Tuesday at Santa Anita.

BANS ALL ROUND

Germany's racing authority, the Direktorium für Vollblutzucht und Rennen, has meted a series of bans to riders for various infringements of riding regulations. Scottish-born jockey Ian Ferguson received the stiffest penalty of all and was banned until Jan. 8, 2003 after testing positive for amphetamines. It is the Hoppegarten-based jockey's second drug offence, having previously failed a test for cannabis two seasons ago. Apprentice Katharina Niebecker, who has ridden one winner from four rides in public, was handed a six-month riding offence ban for her part in an ongoing inquiry into a race at Neuss Jan. 12. Another inquiry is to be opened after jockey Alessandro Schikora was prevented from riding at Neuss last Sunday when he was found to be above the permitted limit for alcohol. Schikora, who claims to have had only two glasses of champagne, can expect to be banned for up to a month.

VON DER RECKE SIGNS O'CONNOR

Jockey Warren O'Connor, best known for his association with multiple Group 1-winning filly Kooyonga (Ire) (Persian Bold {Ire}), has been signed by leading German trainer Christian von der Recke. The 33-year-old Irishman, who missed much of last season due to injury, has been contracted by von der Recke until the end of the year. Von der Recke told *Racing Post*: "Warren will be coming over to ride for me from March 1 and has signed a contract until the end of the year. I've known him for some time, ever since I was in Ireland as assistant to Liam Browne. He has ridden for me before and he will do well."
