**FIRST FOALS FOR DUBAIMILLENNIUM**

**Dubai Millennium (GB)** (Seeking the Gold), who died after an attack of grass sickness last year, has his first foals on the ground. **Zelanda (Ire)** (Night Shift) produced a chestnut colt Jan. 13 at Winbledon Farm in Kentucky. The grey mare, winner of the Listed Flying Fillies' S. at Pontefract, descends from G1 1000 Guineas and Epsom Oaks winner Petite Etoile (GB). Over at Darby Dan Farm, G1SW **Tribulation** (Danzig) produced a filly for Darby Stud Management. England's Dalham Hall Stud, where Dubai Millennium spent his brief retirement, saw **Gold's Dance (Fr)** (Goldheyev) provide his second foal, a bay colt, on Tuesday. The newborn is a half brother to French champion two-year-old filly Goldamix (Ire) (Linamix {Fr}). A day later, European champion **Flagbird** (Nureyev) foaled a bay colt.

The story remained the same as Best of the Bests ran away to an easy repeat victory in this prep for the G1 Dubai World Cup March 23. An easy 12-length winner in the 2001 edition, the Irish-bred chestnut was the solidly backed favorite for his next start in the World Cup, but came up empty with an 11th-place finish. He did not start again until an appearance in Newmarket's G1 Champion S. in October, when he ran a well-beaten seventh behind Nayef. Pitted against a solid field which included recent Jebel Ali S. winner Resplendent Star (Northern Baby), he stumbled at the start, but recovered quickly to take command soon after and cruised home for a comfortable win. His best distance is probably 1600 or 1800 meters," said trainer Saeed bin Suroor about the horse's future. "Whether he runs in the Dubai World Cup or another race on the day is something we have to decide. We have some very nice horses that may be better suited to the Dubai World Cup distance, so we may switch him back to the Godolphin Mile

**DEPT. OF AGRICULTURE AMENDS KENTUCKY BREEDING REGULATIONS**

Hoping to help the Thoroughbred breeding industry rebound from the losses suffered during last year's Mare Reproductive Loss Syndrome crisis, the Kentucky Department of Agriculture has changed the regulations regarding the breeding of imported mares. Regulations were originally enacted to help protect the industry from contagious equine metritis (CEM), a venereal disease which caused significant problems in the state in the late 1970s. The last case of CEM was diagnosed in Kentucky in the '80s. Imported mares will be required to undergo an additional culture prior to being covered, but the covering stallion will not have to observe the previously mandated 12-hour waiting period before returning to the breeding shed. **WALDEN NAMED WINSTAR PRIVATE TRAINER** W. Elliott Walden has accepted the position of private trainer for WinStar Farm, the Versailles, Kentucky-based operation announced yesterday. The 38-year-old trainer has conditioned champion Victory Gallop as well as Grade I winners Brahm, Ecton Park, Menifee and Plenty of Light. "Elliott will be instrumental in helping WinStar reach the next level with our racing operations," said Doug Cauthen, vice president and racing manager of WinStar. "Our main goals are to develop graded and classic winners, while also developing stallions. Elliott is a proven winner in the classics, and he's a multidimensional trainer--he's been successful with sprinters, milers, distance horses, dirt and turf horses, fillies and colts. I expect this to be a long and mutually beneficial relationship."

**BENAMADO TO CALIFORNIA** Recently retired **Bienamado** (Bien Bien--Nakterjal {GB}, by Vidges) has arrived at Cardiff Stud Farm near Creston, California, according to *Thoroughbred Times*, and will enter stud for a fee of \$5,000. The blaze-faced chestnut was retired in early January due to a suspensory injury. A group winner in France, Bienamado captured a pair of Grade I events in the U.S. and earned \$1,262,486. The six-year-old will be syndicated for \$15,000 a share.

**WATERHOUSE BACK IN HOT WATER**

Just months after returning to the betting ring following a 17-year exile, prominent Sydney bookmaker Rob Waterhouse has come under fire once again after he inflated 3-1 favorites odds up to 500-1. In an inquiry launched by the NSW Thoroughbred Racing Board, headed by chief steward Ray Murrhy, Waterhouse told the panel which opened at Canterbury racetrack on Wednesday night, that he made the bets with former bookmaker Peter McCoy as a favor to help McCoy wipe out a debt he owed to Waterhouse. "It is a storm in a teacup. I have done nothing wrong," Waterhouse said outside his office yesterday. McCoy, interviewed on *ABC Radio*, said: "I do owe him money and we discussed this when I was in Australia recently. To my knowledge, no offence has been committed and there are no tax implications. It is a beat-up."

Murrhy asked Waterhouse for a contact number and address for McCoy, a former Canberra bookmaker who now manages the Grant Waterhouse betting shop in Fiji, but Waterhouse was unable to provide the information. McCoy was one of several people, including Waterhouse and his father Bill, warned off for having prior knowledge of the Fine Cotton ring-in scandal at Brisbane's Eagle Farm track in 1984. Then AJC Chief Steward John Shreck, now based in Hong Kong, said on *ABC Radio*: "When Fine Cotton occurred they all said that was a storm in a teacup too, but the whole episode did untold damage to racing. I just hope this does turn out to be a storm in a teacup for the sake of racing."

Stewards have asked Waterhouse, who returned to the ring on Aug. 11, to produce records of non-racing debts which appear in his settling ledger against McCoy's name. Waterhouse was grilled by stewards over a series of 12 bets he placed for McCoy at inflated odds, with McCoy believed to have won about \$40,000. Waterhouse's children, Kate and Tom, were also questioned by stewards, his bookmakers' bag was searched and documents were seized. Murrhy asked Waterhouse in the inquiry, "You set this person [McCoy] at odds of 500-1 on horses that started 3-1 and under...Are you serious?" Waterhouse claims he and McCoy had been involved in property purchases, mortgages and bans; and McCoy owed him "a six figure sum." Murrhy suggested to Waterhouse the wagers were "fictitious" and noted the tax situation in regards to losses. Murrhy discovered a debt figure relating to McCoy in Waterhouse's computerised printout and Waterhouse said the debt was accumulated by "transactions outside of racing." Murrhy asked: "What's it doing in the betting ledger?" Bets are going in your ledger for Peter McCoy on short priced favourites at 500-1. I suggest this is a charade." Water-

house refuted the suggestion.

TRB chief executive Merv Hill said at a press conference Thursday he was determined to ensure "that the betting operation in question is purely a betting operation...we want to know a lot more about the transaction and why it is in the better ledger." Veteran turf journalist Max Pressnell wryly observed on ABC radio that Waterhouse had "broken the Guinness book of records for the most generous overs."

**CAMARENA'S BREEDING PLANS SET**

**Camarena (NZ)** (Danehill {USA}), winner of the 1999 G1 Queensland Derby, is in foal to Darley Australia sire King's Best (USA) while her dam, **Canny Miss (Aus)** (Marscay {Aus}), has a date this year with none other than Danzig (USA). Darley Australia's Oliver Tait confirmed that Sheikh Hamdan Bin Rashid alMaktoum, who purchased Camarena last year for a reported A\$1.5 million, also purchased Canny Miss privately from Davilora Lodge. "Canny Miss is at Winbledon Farm in the US and she is going to visit Danzig," he said of the three-quarter sister to Group 1 winners Canny Lass (Aus) and Canny Lad (Aus), both by Bletchingly (Aus). Darley has retained Canny Miss' weanling filly by Danehill at its base at Collingrove in the NSW Hunter Valley. Meanwhile, trainer Bart Cummings confirmed the retirement of Camarena's lightly-raced full brother **Shrewdy (Aus)**, a \$280,000 Easter purchase. Shrewdy raced on six occasions for two wins and a third with earnings of \$33,135. "He showed tremendous promise and jockey John Marshall was certain he would easily have been a Group One horse," said stable foreman Anthony Cummings. "But unfortunately he suffered a bone fracture in his knee." Arrangements for four-year-old to stand at stud are currently being negotiated.
