IT'S "MON" IN THE DONN

It has taken a while for **Mongoose** (Broad Brush) to live up to the potential that he displayed as a stakes-winning two-year-old, but his star is certainly on the rise following his victory in yesterday's GI Donn H. at Gulfstream Park. The winner at two of the Cradle S., the bay was largely a disappointment early in his sophomore season, finishing a distant third in the GII Spiral S., ninth in the GII Arkansas Derby and fourth in the GIII Jersey Derby. Given a bit of a summer breather, the colt was runner-up in the Summing S. at The Meadows before closing the season with back-to-back allowance victories Oct. 26 and Nov. 16. Switched from the barn of Bill Mott, Mongoose made a successful debut for trainer H. James Bond with a 6 1/4-length victory over **Watch Your Pennies** (Absent Russian) and the subsequently retired **Monarchos** Jan. 19. Coupled in the wagering with GII Clark H. winner **Ubiquity** (Colonial Affair), the team went postward as the 6-1 fourth choice in the field of 13 betting interests. Favored **Red Bullet** (Unbridled) broke in the air at the start and spotted the rest of the field three lengths as **Keats** (Hennessy) set a contested pace from Ubiquity and **Duckhorn** (Not For Love). Mongoose, tucked neatly in fourth just behind the speed, was angled three wide into the far turn, while behind him, Red Bullet shifted out, interfering with Rize (Theatrical {Ire}) and causing that one to check off heels. Mongoose continued a steady advance to take over leaving the far turn, opened a two-length lead leaving the eighth pole and held off a resurgent Red Bullet for the win. The latter was subsequently disqualified and place fourth for the incident on the far turn. "Mongoose owes this win to Ubiquity [who collapsed after the race, but was revived 10 minutes later]," the winning trainer commented. "With Ubiquity setting the speed, this horse could come on and take the lead late. Poor Ubiquity took the worst of it." Of the incident at the gate, Jerry Bailey, jockey of Red Bullet, said, "The starter turned his head just a bit to try to get him straight but my horse reacted to that. I have to think my horse would have won if he got a clean start." Bond was noncommittal on a next start for the winner. (Chart p2)

HABIBTI, YOU LAS FAVORITAS IN VIRGENES

One began her career in the maiden-claiming ranks. The other has always been well meant, carrying high expectations ever since selling at last year's Barretts sale for \$450,000. This afternoon, **You** (You and I) and **Habibti** (Tabasco Cat) renew acquaintances as the favorites in GI Las Virgenes S., but did not manage to scare away the competition. Six other sophomore fillies were entered, including fellow Grade I winner **Tali'sluckybusride** (Delineator), Team Valor's GIII Santa Ysabel S. heroine **Bella Bella Bella** (Soft Gold {Brz}) and **Spring Meadow** (Meadowlake), who broke her maiden at first asking in a swift 1:08 4/5, earning a Beyer Speed Figure of 102. But clearly, the spotlight is on the two "big" fillies, who knocked heads in the GI Hollywood Starlet S. at Hollywood Dec. 16. That afternoon, You, who broke her maiden for a \$50,000 tag last summer before being privately purchased by Edmund Gann, set the pace as Habibti stalked from third. The Thoroughbred Corporation colorbearer swept to the front and looked an easy winner, but You fought back gamely and finished just a head behind the winner, with GI Oak Leaf S. winner Tali'sluckybusride another 8 1/2 lengths back in third.

Spinning Hill settled ninth of 15 early before jockey Steve Arnold set her loose close to the line to snatch the race by 1/2 length from Mistegic. Miss Pennymoney (Aus) (Brocco), making her first appearance since finishing last in the 2001 Newmarket 12 months ago, was a gallant fifth. Spinning Hill has not raced since finishing unplaced in the G1 Epsom H. last September at Randwick. She will target the G1 A\$750,000 Newmarket H. Mar. 9, but trainer Guy Walter is uncertain whether to add the G1 A\$350,000 Oakleigh Plate (1100 meters) to her campaign as well.

Winless in her first three career starts as a two-year-
 old, Summer Colony returned from an eight-month
 layoff to be second in a Belmont main-track maiden
 May 27 and runner-up again over that turf course be-
 fore a fourth over the Saratoga lawn July 27. She's not
 been defeated since. A 32 1/4-length maiden winner in
 an off-the-turf event at Saratoga Aug. 17, the
 homebred filly took three successive New York allow-
 ance tests by a combined 21 lengths and was coming
 into this off a neck success in the GIII Ladies' H. at
 Aqueduct Dec. 22. Settled in third position behind
 Royally Chosen (In Excess {Ire}) and Ask Me No Se-
 crets, Summer Colony rolled up three deep into the
 stretch, overtook a tiring Ask Me No Secrets with a
 furlong to run and edged clear. Azeri rallied nicely from

Decarchy has been nothing short of sensational since his U.S. unveiling last summer. A one-length winner on the Del Mar turf Aug. 29, the impeccably-bred bay added a pair of victories over the Santa Anita grass course before finishing an excellent second over testing ground in the GII Citation H. at Hollywood Park Nov. 24. Scratched out of the Turf Paradise Breeders' Cup last weekend in favor of this spot, he was the odds-on choice to earn his first stakes success. Eased out off the rail down the backstretch, jockey Russell Baze sent Decarchy up to split horses at the three-eighths pole, shifted back to the inside for the drive and won under urging.

KING CUGAT TO SHUTTLE TO AUSTRALIA

King Cugat (Kingmambo--Tricky Game, by Majestic Light), who recently joined his sire at William S. Farish's Lane's End Farm near Versailles, Kentucky, will shuttle to Widden Stud in Australia, where he will command a fee of A\$17,500. "King Cugat is suited to Australian conditions in many respects," said Widden Stud's Anthony Thompson. "He was a tough, genuine and consistent performer who recorded some very fast times during his career on turf. Just as Kingmambo has crossed brilliantly with mares by Danzig, Sadler's Wells, Seattle Slew and Storm Cat, we feel King Cugat will provide a fantastic outcross," Thompson added. Out of a half sister to Seeking the Gold, King Cugat was a four-time graded-stakes winner and five-time runner-up in Grade I company. He was retired after suffering strained ligaments in his left foreleg while preparing for last year's Breeders' Cup Turf.

FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH S.-GI, \$200,000, 3yo, 1 1/16m

Trainer Bill Mott confirmed that **Blue Burner** (French Deputy), an impressive allowance winner Jan. 3, will make his next start in the race. The Kinsman Farm homebred colt breezed five furlongs in 1:03 at Payson Park this past Wednesday.

Political Attack (Hawk Attack), hero of the GIII Tropical Park Derby Jan. 1, will also take his place in the starting gate on Saturday, trainer John Hennig said yesterday morning after the colt worked five eighths of a mile in 1:03 up at Payson Park. The conditioner was also considering the GIII Palm Beach S. on the turf for the sophomore.

Graded-stakes winners **Booklet** (Montbrook) and **Saarland** (Unbridled) each recorded five-furlong works yesterday morning at Gulfstream. Booklet, winner in his most recent start of the GIII Holy Bull S. Jan. 19, stopped the clock in 1:00 4/5 for trainer John Ward. Saarland, unraced since his victory in the GII Remsen S. at Aqueduct Nov. 24, breezed five panels from the gate in 1:02, much to the delight of trainer Shug McGaughey. "He went very well this morning," he commented. "I really liked his workout and he's ready to run." McGaughey indicated that either or both Saarland and/or GIII Spectacular Bid S. winner Maybry's Boy could start on Saturday. If Saarland goes, John Velazquez will ride.

Stephentown (Wild Again) recorded an easy five-furlong work beneath jockey Pat Day yesterday morning in 1:06 4/5. "It was a nice and slow workout and Pat [Day] had him relaxed," trainer Tony Reinstedtler explained. "I'm pleased with the way he's coming up to the race and I like what I see." The \$500,000 yearling purchase took an allowance test by five lengths in his local debut Jan. 9.

DESERT SUN REPRESENTED AT INGLIS PREMIER

Desert Sun (GB), sire of multiple champion Sunline (NZ), has five fillies and five colts catalogued for Inglis' Premier Yearling Sale, which kicks off at Oaklands Junction at 6 p.m. today. Eliza Park Stud proprietor Lee Fleming is convinced Desert Sun has the potential to emerge as Victoria's leading sire and not many would dispute the claim following an overpowering win by his six-year-old superstar daughter in the G1 Waikato Sprint yesterday. Fleming suggested that people are so dazzled by Sunline, that Desert Sun's other stakes winners--nine of them so far, including the smart mare La Bella Dama (NZ)--are overlooked. "This is his first crop from Australian mares and he also has a lot of yearlings catalogued in the Adelaide Magic Millions sale [Feb. 18-20]," he said. "This horse has just had his first weanlings sell in England in October and November--he stood at 5,000 guineas and his weanlings sold up to 48,000 guineas--they were bought by pinhookers and people in the know. You can see his trademark athletic walk in all his yearlings, they are nice animals." Fleming nominates Lot 190, a grey half-sister to multiple stakes winner Scandinavia (Aus) (Snippets {Aus}) out of Song Of Norway (Aus) (Vain {Aus}), among Desert Sun's standout yearlings. "She could top the sale, she is a cracking filly," he said, adding that Lot 201, a colt from multiple stakes winner Sunny Lane (Aus) (Never Quit {NZ}), is attracting plenty of admirers as well. Another interesting prospect is lot 129, a bay filly from Pure Note {NZ} (Western Symphony {USA}), bred on the same cross as Sunline. The Premier Sale has been overshadowed by more glamorous Australian sales, but for buyers prepared to look thoroughly there are competitively-priced yearlings by under-rated Victorian-based sires. Premier Success stories include stakes winners Miss Kournikova, a A\$110,000 purchase; Maarstic, a A\$7,000 purchase who has earned more than A\$750,000; and yesterday's G3 Vanity winner Gold Lottey (Aus), a A\$50,000 purchase. Nine out of 10 yearlings in the catalogue are Super VOBIS qualified and the incentive scheme pays out \$6.7 million bonuses annually. The second and final session of the sale begins tomorrow at 10:30 a.m.

RECRUITING WINS INGLIS PREMIER

Trainer Bede Murray received an excellent consolation for enduring a disastrous Melbourne spring campaign after stable-star Universal Prince (Aus) (Scenic {Ire}) was injured before the G1 Melbourne Cup, when **Recruiting (Aus)** (Celtic Swing {GB}) won the 1200 meter A\$500,000 Inglis Premier Race at Flemington yesterday. The 3-1 favorite, Recruiting settled in sixth on the rail's side of the track early and rallied late as jockey Damien Oliver flattened on the colt's neck to push him over the line a short head in front of longshot **Peace Ruler (Aus)** (Rancho Ruler {NZ}) (25-1), with the front-running **Oronoko (Aus)** (Umatilla {NZ}) a length back in third. Both Universal Prince and Recruiting were selected by Murray from Collingrove drafts, with the latter bred by South Australian chocolate manufacturer John Haigh. The two-year-old colt was sold at the 2001 Premier sale for A\$15,000 as a second-crop representative of Celtic Swing (GB), who stood three seasons at Collingrove as the highest Timeform-rated (138) two-year-old to stand in Australia. The race restricted to graduates of the Melbourne Premier sale offers a A\$230,000 first prize, vendor bonuses for the first three totaling \$70,000 and a subsidy of \$8,000 for every runner. "The concept of this incentive race is great and it will only get better. It is good to see Bede have a change of luck after all the bad luck he had in spring," said Oliver, who advised the trainer that Recruiting still had much to learn and indicated he would be better as he goes longer. "He'll go back to Sydney and we will either find another race for him or he may go to the paddock," said Murray. Recruiting has won four of five appearances to date.
