TRIPLE CROWN GETS 405 EARLY NOMINEES

The Visa Triple Crown announced 405 early nominees yesterday, headed by Breeders' Cup Juvenile champion **Johannesburg** (Hennessy), who leads a cast of 34 three-year-olds nominated from outside the United States. The country of Japan sends its first two nominees, including **Flag Day** (Sunday Silence), who would be the 1989 Derby winner's first son to compete in the "Run for the Roses." Trainer D. Wayne Lukas and his former assistant Todd Pletcher led all trainers with 19 nominees each. Godolphin's Saeed bin Suroor is next with 17 nominees. Godolphin leads all owners with 17 nominees, with Michael Tabor second on the list with 11. Among sires, Storm Cat is represented by 12 horses, while A.P. Indy and Saint Ballado have 11 each. The early sign-up period ended Jan. 19. The late-entry period, at \$6,000 per nomination, ends Mar. 30.

DONN WRAP-UP

Both GI Donn H. winner **Mongoose** (Broad Brush) and entymate **Ubiquity** (Colonial Affair), who collapsed on the track after his 13th-place finish, appeared to be doing well in trainer H. James Bond's shedrow yesterday morning. "Everybody's excellent this morning," said Bond. "[They both] ate up their dinner last night and their breakfast this morning. To me, that's always a very good sign, and I'm very pleased with the way both of them are looking today." Although owner Gary West indicated Saturday that Mongoose would go next in the GII New Orleans H. at the Fair Grounds Mar. 3, Bond was non-committal. "We're going to discuss that some more," said Bond. "We have to take into consideration that Mongoose runs so well over the Gulfstream surface, so we have to consider the [GI] Gulfstream Park H. Mar. 30 as well." Favorite **Red Bullet** (Unbridled), who finished second after a terrible start, but was disqualified to fourth, was also in good shape. "He came back fine and is doing well," said trainer Joe Orseno. "There is no doubt in my mind that he was the best horse. I'm not sure what is next, but the Gulfstream Park H. is a definite possibility." **Graeme Hall** (Dehere), eighth in the Donn, may be headed to the Big Easy. "He didn't run the race I thought he would run," said trainer Todd Pletcher. "But he came out of the race in fine shape. I might run him next in the New Orleans H."

IT'S ALL YOU

You (You and I), fourth as the beaten favorite in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies last October, clawed her way back to the winner's circle with a game victory in yesterday's GI Las Virgenes S. at Santa Anita. The dark bay filly went to the front of the juvenile fillies division last season with back-to-back victories in the GII Adirondack and GI Frizette, but she offered no real threat in the Breeders' Cup. In her last start, You battled **Habibti** (Tabasco Cat) down the stretch and lost by just a head in the Dec. 16 GI Hollywood Starlet. Yesterday, the Bobby Frankel-trained runner was forced four-wide on the first turn. She bid five wide on the backstretch and was four wide into the stretch, but still had enough left to fend off the late challenge of Habibti. "They went a little wide, but I think [jockey Jerry Bailey] has confidence in her now," Frankel said after the race. "I think maybe, going a mile, he was scared to take her too far back off the pace here because I had told him that this is like a glorified sprint. He could have had a better trip, but it doesn't always work out perfect." Of Habibti's runner-up finish, trainer Bob Baffert commented, "She slipped leaving the gate a little bit, she fell behind, made up ground and finished nicely. She ran hard, she runs hard every time."

Back at his best distance, Insociable easily won his second graded race and his first Grade 1. The winner of the G2 Miguel Cane going a mile on dirt and second in the G1 Polla de Potrillos (Argentine 2000 Guineas) over this track and distance, he was stretched out to a mile and a half for his next two starts and finished fourth twice, first in a Grade 2 event and then in the G1 Carlos Pellegrini. Sent off as the favorite this time, he settled handily in third position early, three lengths behind the speedy leader Rey Rex (Arg) (L'Express {Arg}). The chestnut closed ground on the final turn, took control in the stretch and, without the need of the whip, he went on for a comfortable victory over graded winner Renombrado Tom and Grade 1-placed Oh Take (Brz).

Fappie's Notebook, on the board in nine of his last 12 starts, finished third in the Oct. 28 GIII Ack Ack H. at Churchill Downs before ending 2001 with a win in the seven-furlong Kenny Noe Jr. H. at Calder in December. In his 2002 debut, the chestnut never threatened when fifth behind Sir Bear and Red Bullet in the Jan. 12 1 1/16-miles GIII Skip Away. Back sprinting here, Fappie's Notebook was allowed to settle off the pace. He moved up inside to take the lead at the sixteenth pole and was fully extended to get up in the final strides. "I think he's trying to give me a heart attack, but he got there," winning trainer Manny Tortora said of his charge's late-running style. Winning jockey Jorge Chavez added, "He's the kind of horse that has speed and can come from off the pace. There was a lot of speed today, so the plan was to come from off the pace. He accelerated when I asked him and I thought we would have no trouble going by that horse [Twilight Road]. The last sixteenth I wasn't sure and I was very happy to see that other horse drift out." Fappie's Notebook will likely make his next start in the Mar. 9 GII Gulfstream Park Breeders' Cup Sprint Championship.

February 12, 1981...**Julie Krone** rode her first career winner, a \$3,500 claimer named Lord Farkle, who was owned and trained by Les St. Leon, in the sixth race at Tampa Bay Downs.

February 14, 1966...**Buckpasser** suffered the only defeat of his three-year-old season, finishing second in a non-betting race, the Black Caesar Purse, at Hialeah. He went on to win 13 straight races in 1966, 12 of them stakes, but missed the Triple Crown due to injury.

JOCKEYS SUSPENDED

Jockeys Robbie Fradd and John Egan have been suspended by the Hong Kong Jockey Club in the wake of the scandal concerning the investigation into alleged race fixing. Egan and Fradd, two of 19 people (including four members of the Jockey Club staff) arrested by the Independent Commission Against Corruption (ICAC), will be unable to ride in the territory until Mar. 8. Mr Lawrence Wong, chief executive of the Hong Kong Jockey Club, stated: "The Club has always cooperated with law enforcement agencies to maintain the integrity of Hong Kong racing. This is an ongoing investigation and there have not been any charges yet."

INGLIS PREMIER OPENER

Fairy King's Group 1-winning son Encosta de Lago (Aus) led the charge for local stallions at the first session of the Inglis Premier Yearling Sale in Melbourne Sunday night, with his nine sold averaging A\$54,278 off a 1999 fee of A\$8,500. The nine-year-old stallion, owned primarily by Coolmore's John Magnier and Joe Throsby, who raced him, covered 178 mares last season at Blue Gum Farm in Victoria. Bart Cummings will be likely to train last night's sale topper, a full sister to Saturday's G3 The Vanity S. winner Gold Lottey (Aus) and to the A\$70,000 Premier graduate La Quinta Gold (Aus), who was balloted out of the Premier race--to the disappointment of trainer Graeme Rogerson, who maintains the two-year-old is better than her older sister. Rogerson was underbidder on the session topper. The filly, Lot 39, was among Blue Gum Farm's draft. Stud spokesman Phillip Campbell said, notwithstanding the weekend's dream race result, he'd expected her to be popular. "We have a long, long list of applications for Encosta de Lago for 2002 and I have no doubt there are a couple of Group 1 winners in the wings at the moment," he said. "His owners have been very fair with his service fee. He is a magnificent looking horse and he is getting quality mares. We're pretty fussy about what we take on our roster and he fit our criteria. He raced in front of the Australian public." Victorian-based sire Rubiton (Aus) also took a prominent role, with astute trainer Brian Mayfield-Smith purchasing Lot 71, a full brother to Golden Slipper third-place finisher Millrich (Aus), for A\$130,000. "He's a real Rubiton type from a great winning family," said Mayfield-Smith. "We've had so much success with the Rubiton stock of late and I've had so many enquiries. I don't think I'll have any problem finding owners for him." The two-day Premier Sale concludes today, with bidding on the second and final session beginning at 10.30 am.

WRITERS UP

HORSES TO FOLLOW: MICK CHANNON

by Tom Frary

Having taken out his training licence in 1990, Mick Channon has scaled the heights thanks largely to a constantly replenished team of smart two-year-olds. Bint Allayl (GB), brilliant winner of the G2 Lowther S. and the G3 Queen Mary S. in 1998, was most famous of those, but was fatally injured on the gallops at the start of 1999. Now at West Ilsley in Lambourn, previous home to Major Dick Hern, Channon has some serious prospects for 2002, headed Queen's Logic (Ire), ante-post favourite for the G1 1000 Guineas May 5.

QUEEN'S LOGIC (IRE) (f, 3, Grand Lodge {USA}--Lagrion {USA}, by Diesis {GB}). O-Jaber Abdullah; B-Kip McCreery.

Unbeaten at two, Queen's Logic was the top-rated juvenile filly at 122 pounds in the International Classifications, eight pounds clear of Gossamer (GB). No two-year-old filly has been rated higher since 1987. A winner on soft (on her debut in a conditions event at Newbury in May) and on good-to-firm (in the G3 Queen Mary S. at Royal Ascot in June), she beat her rivals senseless in the G2 Lowther S. in August and the G1 Cheveley Park S. at Newmarket in October.

"I'm very pleased with her," Channon said. "She has been back cantering since Christmas and we will begin the gradual process of preparing her for the Guineas in March. She is well on target and she's been a dream to train; she's been professional all her life. The 1000 Guineas makes sense as does the G3 Fred Darling S. [at Newbury, Apr. 19], being just down the road, but only time will tell. I'll be happy wherever she goes and although soft ground is not something you want for a filly like her, I wouldn't be worried about it. Her dam won over a 1 1/4 miles and Grand Lodge has sired a Derby winner so who knows if she'll stay--she's very settled in everything she does, so we'll have to see."

YA HAJAR (GB) (f, 3, Lycius {USA}--Shy Lady {Fr}, by Kaldoun {Fr}). O-Jaber Abdullah; B-Gainsborough Stud Management Ltd.

Like her stable companion Ascension (Ire) in 2000, she ran out a convincing winner of the G3 Prix du Calvados at Deauville in August before disappointing in the testing conditions of the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac at Longchamp on Arc day, finishing sixth.

"She's done particularly well and wintered smashing. She ran one disappointing race last year in bottomless ground where she just rolled about. She won the Calvados in impressive style and I still think she's a very nice filly--she could be a possible for a Guineas, too, but I wouldn't think she and Queen's Logic will meet."

LIPSTICK (GB) (f, 3, Zamindar {USA}--Final Shot {Ire}, by Dalsaan {GB}). O-J Breslin; B-Whitsbury Manor Stud.

Highly touted before she made her debut when fifth in the Listed St Hugh's S. at Newbury in August, she went on to take the Listed Sirenia S. at Kempton the following month before finishing a fine second to Madame Boulangere (GB) in the Watership Down Stud Race at Ascot, giving the winner 10 pounds.

"She's moving very well and I love her. She could be more of a sprinter, but may well get seven. At Ascot, Steve [Drowne] said she lost her legs coming out of the stall and he thought she had broken down, so he left her alone and then she picked up and flew. After that we thought we had hit her quite hard and she had had lots of little niggles, so we decided to leave her alone. She has a different owner so its possible she could race against Queen's Logic, but is first a possible for the Listed European Free H. [Newmarket, Apr. 17]."

Channon's colts do not match the fillies in terms of strength-in-depth, despited the presence of **Anna Walhaan (Ire)** (Green Desert {USA}), third in the G2 Richmond S. at Goodwood in August; and **Kulachi (Ire)** (Royal Applause {GB}), winner of the Listed Rose Bowl S. at Newbury in July. Arguably his best colt, **Parasol (Ire)** (Halling {USA}), has been sold to Godolphin.
