FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH S.-GI, \$200,000, 3yo, 1 1/16m

Grey Beard (Unbridled's Song), who beat Monthir a nose in a Gulfstream allowance race at the Fountain of Youth distance Jan. 9, had his final tune-up for his stakes debut yesterday, going five furlongs in 1:02 4/5 around the "dogs" over a track labelled good. "I got him going out six furlongs in 1:17," trainer Graham Motion said. "He's really not a flashy work horse, but I'm happy with the way he worked this morning." The three-year-old had blinkers on for the first time in his latest start. "I really liked the way he gutted it out [in that race]," Motion said. "He fought back when that horse brushed him in the stretch and I thought it was an excellent effort. He's become a much more aggressive horse since I put the blinkers on him."

Showmeitall (All Gone), winner of the GII Hutcheson S. last time out, will skip Saturday's Grade I event. "I'm going to try and find an allowance race for him and then probably point him toward the Tampa Bay Derby [Mar. 17]," trainer Manny Tortora said.

PEDIGREE INSIGHTS

COVER STORY

Two of the weekend's big winners--Mongoose and Summer Colony--underlined how important it is for breeders to take into account the number of mares any particular stallion is covering. Neither Mongoose's sire Broad Brush nor Summer Colony's sire Summer Squall nowadays comes close to covering the type of three-figure book which has become commonplace throughout the industry and, consequently, they are at a marked numerical disadvantage compared to many of Kentucky's other high-class stallions.

Summer Squall's subnormal fertility means that he has averaged only 34 named foals in his first eight crops. With 29 live foals in his 1999 crop and 23 in his 2000 crop, lack of numbers is likely to keep him out of the headlines, but he continues to justify support with a very creditable four percent graded-stakes winners.

Broad Brush, for his part, has had to be carefully managed since he required two colic surgeries in 1995. He covered 63 mares in 1998, 51 in 1999, 48 in 2000 and 47 last year, so he may eventually struggle to maintain his very consistent record of regularly finishing in the top 15 sires on the general sire list.

However, he has been in fine form. His seven stakes winners last year included the Grade I winners Pompeii and Include, plus Nobo True and Broad Appeal, two prolific Group winners on dirt in Japan. The Gainesway stalwart has also made an excellent start to 2002. Broad Appeal and Maybry's Boy both won at the Grade III level prior to Mongoose's breakthrough victory in the GI Donn H. which improved Broad Brush's figure to 5.6 percent--few stallions can boast a higher percentage of graded-stakes winners.

Although Mongoose matured quickly enough to win a Saratoga maiden and the Miller Genuine Draft Cradle S. in his first three starts as a juvenile, it isn't too surprising that he is now showing the best form of his life as a four-year-old.

Broad Brush is a tall, rangy individual standing 16.2 hands and Mongoose's dam Salty Gal is by Cox's Ridge, a 16.3-hand son of the 17.2-hand Best Turn. That said, size didn't prevent any of the three from showing very good form as three-year-olds, with Broad Brush gaining seven wins from 14 starts at that age, Cox's Ridge eight from 11 and Best Turn six from 10. All three, though, were arguably even better at four.

Broad Brush has the distinction of being inbred 3x3 to Turn-to, a stallion whose name is often linked to unsoundness. Fortunately, Broad Brush proved to have more in common with his sire Ack Ack, with both being sound enough to race 27 times during careers which featured victories in the Santa Anita H. over 1 1/4 miles.

Broad Brush's trainer Dick Small once revealed that, "I realized right then [after an early defeat] that this horse needed very stern, hard training; he needed fast works close to his races to run to his best. We worked him whenever we could because we knew we couldn't miss a single day."

Broad Brush's very tough constitution has allowed him to do well with mares which possess more Turn-to blood. His son Include, winner of the GI Pimlico Special, is inbred 4x4x4 to Turn-to, as are his Grade III-winning daughters Brushed Halory and Magic Broad, and so is Mongoose.

In fact, Mongoose has an extra line to two of Broad Brush's three great-grandfathers: Broad Brush's dam, Hay Patcher, was a grand-daughter of Tom Rolfe, and so is Mongoose's second dam, Salt Spring. Interestingly another of Broad Brush's Grade I winners, Pompeii, also has two lines of Ribot in her pedigree, through Tom Rolfe and Graustark.

If Salt Spring's name sounds familiar, it is because she enjoyed a distinguished career in California after winning at the Group 1 and Group 2 level in Argentina. Her best victory in her adopted country came in the Yerba Buena H. over 1 1/2 miles on turf, and there is reason to think that Mongoose will cope well with the 1 1/4-mile route if the Gulfstream Park H. is chosen as his next target.

STRONG WINTER MIXED SALE FOR FASIG-TIPTON

Fasig-Tipton's 2002 Kentucky Winter Mixed Sale, held yesterday in Lexington, showed strong results, with the average gaining 23 percent and the median rising 13 percent over last year's two-day auction. John Stuart of Bluegrass Thoroughbred Services bought one of the day's co-sales toppers, and also sold several lots. "It's been a really strong sale," Stuart said. "We sold six and every one went for more than we expected. It's a carry-over from the Keeneland January Sale, which was surprisingly strong, especially at this level. I can't explain it, but I'm very happy about it." Stuart, acting on behalf of Mr. and Mrs. Gerald Stautberg, went to \$190,000 to secure **Joying** (Storm Cat), an 11-year-old broodmare in foal to MGSW Old Trieste. "Mr. and Mrs. Stautberg own Willow Oaks Farm, a very classy little commercial operation in Monkton, Maryland," Stuart said. "They consign at Saratoga and have 15 mares like this. They've been in operation for about a half-dozen years." He added, "We actually sold this mare's half-brother by Kingmambo as a yearling for \$360,000 and it looks like he's a coming star. He won second time out in Japan and was second in a stake in his third start. I hear he's the real deal." Consigned by David and Ginger Mullins (Doninga), Joying is a half-sister to Japanese stakes winner Washington Color and is the dam of stakes-placed Finn McCool (Meadowlake). Also bringing \$190,000 yesterday was the six-year-old mare **Rills** (Clever Trick), in foal to Thunder Gulch. Consigned by FitzGerald/Keogh, Agent IX, the stakes-winning dark bay was purchased by White Cross Bloodstock. The top-selling yearling was a colt from the second crop by GSW Tale of the Cat out of multiple-stakes winner Debs Angel (Raise a Cup). Consigned by Gainesway, agent, the bay was purchased by Kenneth and Sarah Ramsey for \$100,000.

BANDERIA (ARG) (m, 5, Big Play--Chantelle, by Bold Forli), who won a 1 1/16-miles off-the-turf maiden over a sloppy Calder track in December, was third over this track and distance Jan. 7 and was coming off a runner-up finish here Jan. 24. The 6-5 favorite, forced to steady behind horses on the far turn, shot through an opening on the rail to take the lead into the stretch and drew clear to a 4 1/4-length victory. Philly Cancels Race Card:

High winds caused the cancellation of Philadelphia Park's racing card yesterday after the first race. Wind gusts approaching 50 mph were recorded in the area and, after the first race, jockeys and management agreed to cancel the remainder of the card. Live racing is scheduled to resume today with a first post of 12:25 p.m.

Haskell Tops Monmouth Stakes Schedule:

The \$1 million GI Haskell Invitational H., won last year by Eclipse champion Point Given, heads the 2002 stakes schedule at Monmouth Park. The 1 1/8-mile Haskell will be run Aug. 4 this year. Also on the 15-race stakes calendar is the track's other Grade I event, the \$500,000 United Nations H., set for July 6. The Monmouth meeting is currently scheduled to open for two weekends of racing, May 11-12 and May 18-19, then begin it's traditional five-day schedule starting May 25 and running through Sept. 1.

Calder Releases 2002 Stakes Schedule:

Calder has released the stakes schedules for its Calder and Tropical meets. The Calder meeting, which runs from Apr. 26 through Oct. 25, will include 43 stakes worth \$5.5 million. The Tropical meeting, from Oct. 26 through Jan. 2, will feature a total of 22 stakes worth \$2.8 million. "This is the most money we've ever offered," said Calder Racing Secretary Bob Umphrey. "The quality of competition here is deep. We'll build on the success of 2001 and look forward to hosting some very competitive stakes fields at Calder and Tropical in 2002." The 2002 edition of the Summit of Speed, with stakes totaling \$1.4 million, will be held July 13. The event features the \$400,000 Smile Sprint H., the \$400,000 GII Princess Rooney H., the \$250,000 Carry Back S. and the \$250,000 GIII Azalea Breeders' Cup S. Nine stakes worth \$1.65 million will be run during the Festival of the Sun Oct. 12. The \$400,000 finals of the Florida Stallion Stakes series for two-year-olds will highlight the racing day and will be joined by the Calder Oaks and the GIII Calder Derby. Among the features of the Tropical meeting are the \$200,000 GII La Prevoyante H. and the \$200,000 GII W. L. McKnight H., both run on Dec. 28.

Magna After Lone Star Park?

According to published reports, Frank Stronach's Magna Entertainment could be close to making a deal for Lone Star Park in Grand Prairie, Texas. Stronach visited the track over Easter weekend last year, and negotiations have been ongoing. The city of Grand Prairie owns the Lone Star property, leasing it to a management company headed by Lone Star Chairman Bob Kaminski and Dallas real estate developer Trammel Crow. The Texas Racing Commission, which would have to approve the deal, has not yet been notified of a possible change in ownership.

Baron Georg von Ullmann's smart sprinter **Barrow Creek (GB)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) will take up stud duties at Einar Nagell-Erichsen's Meridan Stud in Norway. Having worked his way up through the handicap ranks, he claimed victories in the G2 Jacobs Goldene Peitsche at Baden Baden and G3 Premio Melton in Rome at the age of six. Barrow Creek's dam is Final Straw (GB) (Breadcrumb {GB}), whose other progeny includes the smart G2 Challenge S. winner **Last Resort (GB)** (Lahib {USA}), as well as being the granddam of the G2 Prix du Rond-Point and G3 Diomed S. winner **Trans Island (GB)** (Selkirk {USA}). Breadcrumb is also a half sister to the smart sprinter and sire **College Chapel (GB)**, a close relative to the leading sire **Mummy's Pet (GB)**.

OAKS D'ITALIA RECEIVES BOOST

Italy's pattern system remains basically unaltered for the coming Classic season, despite fears that the G1 Oaks d'Italia would be downgraded. The filly Classic has received an injection of prizemoney of 29 percent, raising the purse to €440,000, which brings it almost in line with the G1 Prix de Diane Hermes (French Oaks). Italy's authorities hope the larger purse will help attract runners of a better quality for the Milanese Classic in 2002. The G1 Derby Italiano remains at the same level of prizemoney as in 2001, worth over €1 million, but opportunities for the two-year-olds received a blow with the downgrading of the Premio Guido Berardelli in Rome to Group 3 status. Having once shared the honour with the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud of being the only pattern races for juveniles run at the distance of 1 1/4 miles, it has failed to recapture earlier glory after the distance was shortened to 1800 meters and was re-scheduled from mid-November to a week after the G1 Gran Criterium in Milan.

DANEHILL COLT TOPS INGLIS PREMIER FINAL

Gary Portelli gave A\$170,000 for the sole lot by Danehill (USA) at Inglis' Premier Yearling Sale finale in Melbourne yesterday. The Sydney-based trainer joked that the colt had just been made early favourite for the A\$500,000 Premier Race of 2003. "I am going to syndicate him--want to buy a share?" quipped the young trainer. "I am having trouble coming to terms with this, I have just bought a Danehill with no client! But we all like to see a Danehill in our yard. He is a real racehorse, a typical Danehill and not too big, and he'll have a great stallion's pedigree, if he goes well. He is the most expensive horse I have bought for myself." Portelli has some 80 horses in work at his Warwick Farm base and has enjoyed success of late with G2 Expressway S. winner Ateates (Aus). Portelli rates winning the A\$1 million Inglis Heroic race with Perfect Crime (Aus) (Marauding {NZ}) last year among his biggest achievements. Yesterday's top seller, Lot 302, was offered by Collingrove Stud. He is out of Sir Tristram (Ire) mare Captiva (NZ). Lindsay Park's Melbourne-based bloodstock agent Mark Pilkington purchased six yearlings, including a A\$100,000 Snippets (Aus) colt (Lot 108). "I thought he was good value, he is a nice colt and we had to go to A\$160,000 for a Snippets colt at Magic Millions," he said. "Encosta de Lago is also very promising--we've bid on quite a few, but only managed to secure one." First-crop sire General Nediym (Aus) had three offered and sold at an average of A\$83,300 to consolidate his excellent debut at Magic Millions in January. His chestnut yearling, Lot 139, was knocked down for A\$135,000 to Victorian trainer Robbie Griffiths. "We looked at all three of the General Nediym's and they were lovely horses, but this bloke was from a great winning family. I just think he's the ideal type for the Premier race next year," said Griffiths. Mid-sale consensus was that the Premier was stronger than anticipated given the tumble experienced by New Zealand Bloodstock recently, and final figures--an increase in average on last year from A\$34,000 to A\$36,000, underscored widespread opinion.

HKJC TO BOYCOTT INGLIS EASTER

The Hong Kong Jockey Club has announced that it will not participate in the upcoming Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale April 2-4 because of a disagreement over sales policies regarding turn-backs and pre- and post-sale X-rays. The HKJC was a major force at last year's sale, spending approximately A\$1.4 million. "I respect Inglis' right to make a business decision, but there are other sales and we will also look at buying privately before the yearling sales," Winfried Engelbrecht-Bresges, the HKJC's director of racing, told the *Racing Post*. "We are not talking about cheap horses and we are not talking about small problems. We want customer protection if post purchase X-rays show any yearlings we buy have lesions or old fractures." Reg Inglis, managing director of William Inglis & Son, countered, "The Hong Kong Jockey Club wants preferential treatment and that is unfair to others who come from around the world to buy at our sale."
