EIGHT HORSES IN THE FOUNTAIN

Eight three-year-olds hope to take the next step on the road to Kentucky and the Triple Crown in Saturday's GI Fountain of Youth S. at Gulfstream Park. The 5-2 morning-line favorite is **Harlan's Holiday** (Harlan). Trained by Ken McPeek, the colt was forced wide on both turns, but was still closing late to be second in his sophomore debut in the GIII Holy Bull at Gulfstream Jan. 19. "I kind of felt like we got robbed," McPeek said of the Holy Bull finish. "But I was very pleased with his effort. I think I had the best horse in the Holy Bull and I think it'll be proved in future races." Those "future races," start Saturday and among the seven three-year-olds standing in Harlan's Holiday's way will be stakes newcomer **Stephentown** (Wild Again). Stephentown, 4-1 on the morning line, impressed on-lookers with a five-length victory in a Jan. 9 Gulfstream allowance at Saturday's 1 1/16-miles distance. Of the many fans won over by that allowance triumph, trainer Tony Reinstedler said, "Everybody is looking for a big horse whose bandwagon they can jump on for the Triple Crown. It's a compliment to be the one a lot of people have picked. I have a lot of confidence in this horse and [jockey Pat Day] has a lot of confidence in this horse. I just hope he lives up to everyone's expectations." Trainer John Ward and owner John Oxley won the Kentucky Derby last year with Monarchos and the pair hope to get back to the big dance with Holy Bull victor **Booklet** (Notebook). Oxley purchased Booklet from Philip Cohen prior to the colt's front-running score in the Holy Bull. "I really liked the breeding and pedigree on this horse and that is why I bought him," Oxley explained. "He has the breeding to go longer and I've had Derby fever since last spring when we won the Florida and Kentucky Derbys with Monarchos. I'd love to be able to return and do it all over again." With an expected post time of 5:30 p.m., the Fountain of Youth will be shown on tape delay by ESPN from 6-6:30 p.m.

Trained in Britain by James Fanshawe, Oriental Express (formerly Ecclesiastical) displayed useful form, following a maiden win at Leicester last May with a victory over 17 rivals in a valuable Haydock handicap event May 26. Second of 29 in an Ascot handicap June 21, he was recently imported to Hong Kong and was coming into this off back-to-back runner-up finishes at Sha Tin Dec. 16 and Jan. 20. Settled off the pace and forced to race wide after breaking from the 13 hole, the gelding advanced while still deep into the stretch and overtook Jeune King Prawn in the waning stages to win going away. Super Molly closed well to snatch second on the line. The winner goes next in the G1 Hong Kong Derby for four-year-olds Mar. 17. "I don't want to make any predictions about the Derby, but obviously he is a good horse," winning trainer Ivan Allan commented. KEENELAND CATALOGS 249 APRIL JUVENILES

Keeneland has catalogued 249 horses for its 10th annual April Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale. The one-day auction will be held on Apr. 16 and bidding will begin at 1:30 p.m. Buyers will have two chances to watch the juveniles gallop or breeze during preview days on Apr. 8 and 15. Each preview gets underway at 10:30 a.m. Among the leading sires represented by two-year-olds in the sale are A.P. Indy, Deputy Minister, Gone West, Kingmambo, Mr. Prospector, Saint Ballado, Seattle Slew, Thunder Gulch and Unbridled. At last year's sale, Keeneland sold 91 horses for \$14,898,000. The sale average was \$163,714.

BAZE EARNS WOOLF AWARD Hall of Fame rider Russell Baze has been named the winner of the 2002 George Woolf Memorial Jockey Award. Baze becomes the 53rd winner of the award that has been presented annually since 1950. The 43-year-old Baze has won 7,697 races and has won captured riding championship at every major Northern California meeting at which he has competed since 1980. He was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1999. "It's very special because the Woolf Award is decided by my fellow riders," Baze said. "It's a great feeling to be recognized by your peers." The Woolf Award honors riders who, through their careers and character, cast Thoroughbred racing in a positive light. Since 1985, the award winner has been chosen by jockeys across the country. Past winners include Bill Shoemaker, Eddie Arcaro, Laffit Pincay, Angel Cordero, Chris McCarron and Pat Day.

SULTRY SONG TO MILLENNIUM FARMS Sultry Song (Cox's Ridge--Sultry Sun, by Buckfinder) has been purchased by Ro Parra and will be relocated from Claiborne Farm to Millennium Farms in Lexington, Kentucky. The 14-year-old stallion, a multiple Grade I winner on the racetrack, has been represented by five crops of racing age. He has sired Canadian champion **Kirby's Song**, as well as graded stakes winner **Prime Timber** and stakes winners **Lyracist** and **Song for Annie**. "Sultry Song will continue to allow us what we originally set out to do with the recently departed Unaccounted For, offering tremendous value to Central Kentucky breeders that are looking for proven sires," Millennium Farms managing partners William and Michelle Hardin said in a released statement. "His pedigree is impeccable, is free of Northern Dancer and Mr. Prospector and he has proven that he can sire runners." Sultry Song will stand for \$5,000 with a live foal guarantee.

Coa Suspension Amended:

Jockey Eibar Coa's 30-day suspension for extreme careless riding in the GIII Ft. Lauderdale H. Jan. 26 was reduced to 20 days (15 days if he doesn't appeal) by the Gulfstream stewards yesterday. Originally suspended for 30 days on Jan. 27, Coa hired attorney Jeff Weiner, who filed an appeal on behalf of the jockey. In the appeal, heard by Gulfstream President Scott Savin, Weiner argued his client wasn't given due process by the stewards. Savin agreed with Weiner and gave the case back to the stewards. During yesterday's hearing Weiner represented Coa successfully enough to have the 30 days reduced. Weiner said Coa would not appeal the second ruling and would begin serving his 15-day suspension on Sun., Feb. 17.

The total cost for a family of four at 18 TRA tracks produced an average of \$129.49 per visit. Major League Baseball's league average FCI is \$145.83; National Hockey League, \$274.66; National Basketball Association, \$277.19 and the National Football League, \$303.33, according to Team Marketing. The FCI includes general admission, parking, two small beers, four small sodas, four hot dogs, two track programs, merchandise and per capita wagering.
