POINT GIVEN TAKES HORSE OF THE YEAR

He made his final career start in August, but the 2001 campaign of **Point Given** (Thunder Gulch) was so impressive, the fiery chestnut was the unanimous choice of the voters as Horse of the Year. The Thoroughbred Corporation's colorbearer, the sole finalist for honors as champion three-year-old colt, lost only once last season, but his Kentucky Derby disappointment was easily forgotten as he rolled through Grade I victories in the Preakness, Belmont S., Haskell H. and Travers. "If he hadn't hurt himself, I think he would have dominated," trainer Bob Baffert said. "He was just getting started." This is the first Horse of the Year to come out of his barn, but Baffert has handled five champions. How does Point Given stack up against the likes of Silver Charm and Real Quiet? "He was head and shoulders above all the others," Baffert said.

WRANGLER ROPES GENERAL GEORGE

Wrangler (Carson City), who was dropped in for a \$35,000 tag back in July, continued his climb to the top of the sprinting ranks with a 2 3/4-length score in the GII General George H. at Laurel Park yesterday afternoon. Sent off the 3-1 third choice in the seven-furlong event, the dark bay was a handful in the post parade, but settled down once the running started, tracking 27-1 pacesetter **Rusty Spur** (West by West) through an opening half in :44 3/5. The four-year-old drove between horses as they raced around the turn and fought past the frontrunner at the eighth pole before pulling away for the win. "He has a mind of his own and he showed it in the post parade," jockey Aaron Gryder said. "He wanted to stand around and look. In the morning, you have time to play around, but in the afternoon you have to get down to business." Wrangler has been all business since moving to trainer Jimmy Jerkens' barn at the end of 2001. The colt notched an easy allowance win on New Year's Day and added a victory in the Paumonok H. Jan. 26 before picking up his third straight in the General George. "He came to us with a bit of a reputation for misbehaving, but we did a couple of things with him and it's turned out OK," the son of Hall of Fame trainer Allen Jerkens said. "He fired awfully well in both of his last starts and he proved himself today." **Here's Zealous** (Dehere), the 2-1 favorite, pressed the pace, but tired to finish last. Millionaire **Affirmed Success** (Affirmed) closed some ground late, but couldn't get past Rusty Spur and had to settle for third. (*Gen. George chart, p2*)

ASTRA SCRATCHED AT SANTA ANITA

Astra (Theatrical {Ire}), the 6-5 morning-line favorite for yesterday's GII Buena Vista H. at Santa Anita, was forced to miss the race because of a skin irritation. "It's a systemic problem," trainer Laura deSeroux explained. "We'll treat her with antibiotics. The worst thing is that it's right where the jockey's saddle sits, and where the overgirth is cinched. And, because it's a systemic problem, it makes her less than 100 percent." The six-year-old will be pointed for the Mar. 23 GII Santa Ana H. News cont. p2

REPENT TO DUBAI? Repent (Louis Quatorze), winner of Sunday's GIII Risen Star S. at the Fair Grounds, may start next in the G2 UAE Derby at Nad al Sheba Mar. 23. "We've already made the preliminary arrangements," trainer Ken McPeck told *The Blood-Horse* yesterday. "As long as he's physically strong, there's a good chance we'll go. It's a \$2 million race and it's run at a mile and a quarter this year. I'd rather not run him back in three weeks [in the GII Louisiana Derby], but if we didn't go to Dubai, then we'd either run him back at the Fair Grounds or in the Spiral S. [GII, Turfway Park, Mar. 23]." When asked about the arduous trip to Dubai, the trainer replied, "This horse really travels well--it's as if he almost likes it. He tends to go to sleep." The colt's connections will solidify their plans in the upcoming week. "We'll take him back to the track on Wednesday or Thursday and see how he came out of the Risen Star," said McPeck.

A Listed winner in France, Blue Moon concluded her European stint finishing a neck second in the Listed Prix de la Cochere at Chantilly in September of 2000. She started once more that season, falling 3/4 of a length short when the runner-up in the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup at Keeneland, then disappeared for nearly a year. The chestnut returned to take a Santa Anita allowance Sept. 27, then ended the year with a sixth-place showing in the GII Las Palmas H. Nov. 4. Making her first start since that event, the French-bred was rated along the rail as Queen of Wilshire cut out a pressured pace, was caught behind horses as she looked to make her bid at the top of the stretch, but dove through a hole late and finished with a flourish to catch the frontrunner at the wire. "They boxed her in for most of the race, but I figured if she could get through, she'd be tough," trainer Ron Ellis said. "When she got shut off in midstretch, I took a big gulp. On the board in seven of eight starts last year, People's Princess ended the season with a victory in the Sept. 28 Long Look S. at the Meadowlands. The bay returned in the GIII Affectionately H. at Aqueduct and was a game second behind Zonk. Looking to turn the tables on that rival this time, she tracked the pace from fourth, came with a three-wide bid on the far turn and outfinished Zonk for her first graded success. Jockey Jose Espinoza, aboard A.O.L. Hayes, claimed foul against the top two alleging interference at the top of the stretch, but the stewards determined that it was Zonk who drifted out, bothering Espinoza's mount; she was disqualified and placed fourth. "Man, was I anxious when they were flashing our number," assistant Seth Benzel, who saddled the winner for trainer Bill Mott, said. "But, from the head-on, it looked like Zonk caused the interference."

It is beginning to look as though the leading juvenile colts of 1995 were a particularly gifted collection. Of the seven which received weights between 121 and 126 pounds on the Experimental Free Handicap, Maria's Mon has already sired a Kentucky Derby winner; Unbridled's Song, Hennessy and Honour And Glory have all sired a Breeders' Cup winner; and now Louis Quatorze, who covered his first mares a year later than the others, has come up with a leading contender for the Triple Crown events in Repent.

A \$230,000 graduate of Fasig-Tipton's Kentucky Selected Yearling Sale, Repent ranked third among last year's juvenile colts with an Experimental weight of 123, 12 pounds above Silent Fred, another colt from Louis Quatorze's first crop.

Louis Quatorze, of course, ranked among the best colts of his generation not just at two, but also at three and four. His three-year-old achievements featured a clear-cut victory over Skip Away and Editor's Note in the Preakness S. (following a lacklustre effort in the Kentucky Derby) and a magnificent second in the Breeders' Cup Classic, when he divided Alphabet Soup and Cigar in a desperately close finish.

Louis Quatorze was similarly impressive at the start of 1997. After taking the GIII Creme Fraiche H. on turf, he returned to the main track to win the GIII Ben Ali S. by 13 lengths under top weight. Unfortunately, that proved to be the last public appearance by this big handsome colt. He made his debut at Ashford in 1998 at a fee of \$20,000 and attracted a three-figure book, which resulted in an initial crop of 65 named foals.

Surprisingly, Louis Quatorze struggled somewhat in his second year at Ashford, when his book fell to 61 mares (and a crop of 42 live foals), but the tactic of dropping his fee to \$10,000 restored demand for his services, with 120 visitors in 2000 and 162 last year.

Perhaps breeders' qualms in 1999 stemmed partly from the fact that Louis Quatorze is a son of Sovereign Dancer, who hadn't made much impact as a sire of sires at that point. The son of Northern Dancer had owed his place at stud more to his top-notch bloodlines than to anything he achieved on the racecourse.

A non-winner in four starts in the U.S., Sovereign Dancer finally earned some black type at Vichy in the French Provinces as a four-year-old. However, he defied the odds by siring a Preakness S. winner in both his first crop (Gate Dancer) and his last (Louis Quatorze). He also sired the top European miler Priolo and the very successful gelding Itsallgreetkome.

Gate Dancer never sired anything better than a Grade III winner, but Priolo has shown plenty of potential, overcoming limited opportunities to sire four Group 1 winners in Europe. The signs are that Sovereign Dancer's reputation as a sire of sires will eventually undergo further revision thanks to Louis Quatorze.

Louis Quatorze is certainly a well-related individual. He ranks with Royal Indy as one of two Grade I winners produced by the Grade II winner On To Royalty, herself a half-sister to the dams of those good fillies Forest Heiress and J J's Dream.

Louis Quatorze also has an intense amount of in-breeding to exceptional stallions in his third, fourth and fifth generations, including 3x4 to Bold Ruler, 4x4 to Native Dancer, 4x5x5x5 to Nasrullah, 5x4 to Mahmoud and 4x5 to Nearco.

Interestingly, Priolo is also inbred 3x4 to Bold Ruler. Although Repent is a half-brother to the durable King Ruckus, a champion sprinter in Canada, there is every reason to expect him to be suited by 1 1/4 miles. He is also a half-brother to Johansson, a Seattle Dancer horse who won a Listed race over 1 3/4 miles in Ireland, and his dam, Baby Grace, is a sister to Cacao, winner of the G1 Gran Premio Carlos Pellegrini over 1 1/2 miles in Argentina.

Narita Top Road, winner of the 1999 Japanese St. Leger, had been winless since taking the G2 Hanshin Daishoten last March and was coming off a disappointing 10th-place effort in the Grand Prix Arima Kinen. The six-year-old outdueled Matikane Kinnohosi to the wire for a narrow victory. "He is a wonderfully game horse," said jockey Kunihiko Watanabe. "I was worried about the weight, but he showed his true talent. He is getting better with age." Next up, Narita Top Road is expected to defend his Hanshin Daishoten title on Mar. 17.

The sale was hindered by a lack of buyers from South East Asia, although a couple of Hong Kong purchasers were active and Donald Baertschiger from Singapore also purchased. Eastern state trainers, including Graeme Rogerson, Colin Alderson and Rick Hore-Lacy overshadowed their local counterparts, while agents such as Mark Pilkington were also consistent purchasers. "I am disappointed in the pass-in rate and in the lack of buyers in the middle market; the top end buyers are there, but a lot of horses have already gone through the sales this year and Adelaide does not have the buyer base of Melbourne or Sydney," observed Magic Millions chief Rob Monsma.
