

FASIG-TIPTON CALDER SALE TODAY

Fasig-Tipton stages its Selected Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale today at Calder Race Course near Miami, Florida. Bidding on the 329 catalogued juveniles begins at 11 a.m. As activity built up at the sales ground yesterday, Fasig-Tipton's director of marketing, Terence



Collier said, "My impression of the crowd this morning is that we have a strong contingent of buyers both domestic and international." Among the stallions represented by two-year-olds in the one-day auction are A.P. Indy, Capote, Car-

son City, Deputy Minister, Forest Wildcat, Gone West, Hennessy, Holy Bull, Kingmambo, Louis Quatorze, Maria's Mon, Mr. Prospector, Mt. Livermore, Pulpit, Seattle Slew, Seeking the Gold, Siphon (Brz), Smart Strike, Storm Cat, Unbridled and Unbridled's Song. Sires who will be represented by their first crop of two-year-olds, include Acceptable, Announce, Arch, Awesome Again, Banker's Gold, Cape Town, Confide, Coronado's Quest, Deputy Commander, Distorted Humor, Elusive Quality, Favorite Trick, Formal Gold, Grand Slam, Indian Charlie, Ordway, Rodeo, Skip Away, Subordination, Tale of the Cat, Touch Gold and Wild Rush. "This is probably the best group of sires I've seen in a Calder catalogue," Collier admitted. "When you are talking in terms of Mr. Prospector, Storm Cat and A.P. Indy, you are talking about the bell ringers of the industry." At Sunday's under-tack preview for the sale, hip number 38, a colt by Carson City out of the graded stakes placed Delagating (Deputy Minister), turned heads with a bullet furlong work in :10. The juvenile is a half brother to multiple stakes winner Just Ruler (Cox's Ridge). He is consigned by Bailey-Ellenberg Select. Among the nine hips to share the fastest furlong-work time of :10 1/5 at the Feb. 17 under-tack show is hip 98, a daughter of Horse of the Year Holy Bull out of the Mr. Prospector mare In the Till. MORE NEUROLOGICAL PROBLEMS FOR SLEW

Seattle Slew (Bold Reasoning) may be suffering from a return of the neurological problems which forced him to undergo surgery and miss the breeding season in 2000, according to his owner and syndicate manager, Mickey Taylor. The 28-year-stallion, who stands at Three Chimneys Farm in Midway, Kentucky, has at least temporarily ceased breeding duties. Dr. Barrie Grant, who performed surgery on the Triple Crown winner two years ago, will fly in Tuesday to perform a neurological exam before a decision about the remainder of the 2002 breeding season is made, Taylor

said. Seattle Slew has covered eight mares thus far this year, with one mare already checking in foal. "Basically, we started our breeding season and things were going along fine, and then he was jogging back up the hill Saturday and made these funny steps," said Taylor. "The next day, we took him out and held his head high, and all at once, he just fell apart and started walking toxic behind." Taylor said that he feared the stallion was again experiencing a compressed spinal cord, the condition which required a hole to be drilled between his sixth and seventh vertebrae and a titanium basket inserted to reduce pressure on the bone. "The thing that is different this time is when you put his head down, he's perfectly normal," Taylor said. Taylor, his wife Karen and groom Tom Wade first began to worry about apparent neurological changes this January. "When he was a racehorse, he never had any overstep at all," Taylor said. "He stepped exactly in his tracks. After he was operated on last year, he overstepped about three inches. This year, he has an overstep of six inches, and that's the first thing we noticed about him that was different." *Cont. p. 2*

GOURMET GIRL RETIRED

Just a week after being named 2001 Eclipse champion older mare, **Gourmet Girl** (Cee's Tizzy--Rhondaling {GB}, by Welsh Pageant {Fr}) has been retired from racing, according to *The Blood-Horse*. "She's absolutely sound," trainer Pico Perdomo told the magazine. "She's a champion and she's proven everything already. She'll go later this week to Kentucky." During her championship season last year, Gourmet Girl won the GI Apple Blossom H. and GI Vanity H. In what would be her final start, she was second in the GII Clement L. Hirsch H. at Del Mar in August. The six-year-old won nine of 33 starts and earned \$1,255,373 for owner Gary Tanaka.

Taylor, who spends a good part of every day at Seattle Slew's side, said that any decision regarding his breeding career would be made strictly with the horse's ultimate comfort in mind. The team did receive good news yesterday regarding the stallion's fertility. Seattle Slew covered 46 mares last year, impregnating 43. Semen samples collected Monday and tested by Dr. Terry L. Blanchard, an equine reproductive consultant at Texas A & M University, showed that, "we're a little better than we were last year regarding fertility," according to Taylor. As for his future, he said, "It's a two-way street. He's taken care of Karen and me for years. The tough thing that hits me at times is we got him super last year and you think things will keep getting better and better and better. But what happens, happens. I'm not against operating on him again. If he breeds, he breeds. It would be nice to get him close to being normal. It would be nice to be able to turn him out in his paddock. I don't know if that's ever going to be." Shareholders and season holders received a letter stating, "We want to inform you that, as of this morning, Seattle Slew was taken temporarily out of service to undergo a neurological examination and semen analysis. A preliminary semen analysis today shows his semen quality is comparable to that of a year ago, when he got 90.5 percent of his mares in foal, prior to the pregnancy losses of MRLS."

The fastest quarter-mile work at Sunday's preview was shared by hip numbers 247 and 296. The two colts worked in :21.2. The first, a son of Hennessy--Sweet Little Lies (Raise a Native), is a half brother to stakes winner Malibu Light (Capote) and is consigned by Hoby and Layna Kight. Hip 296 is a chestnut by Pulpit--Alaskan Tide (Bering {GB}) and is from the consignment of Eisaman Equine. A filly by Gone West, hip number 274, also completed her quarter-mile drill in :21.2 at the Feb. 17 preview. From the consignment of Leprechaun Racing, the chestnut is out of the Grade I-placed mare Verbasle (Slewpy). Other lots of note are: hip number 10, a colt by Tale of the Cat--Charette (Chief's Crown), from the family of St. Jovite, L'Carriere, Salem Drive and Lac Ouimet; hip 19, a half sister by El Prado (Ire) to Kentucky Derby runner-up Invisible Ink; hip 135, a three-quarters sister by Touch Gold to multiple Grade I winner Left Bank; and hip 178, a filly by Tabasco Cat out of a full sister to Kentucky Derby winner Grindstone. Of the overall strength of the sale, Collier added, "Across the board it is a very versatile catalogue. I believe we have something for just about everyone." Collier is confident that economic conditions will not effect the sale. "I don't think the Thoroughbred sales industry is recession proof by any means, but it follows the economy in different ways and I don't think the current economy is going to have a negative impact on this particular sale," he said. "The relative weakness of the yen against the dollar, however, could, to some extent, affect the level that the Japanese participate. I think the diversity of the catalogue will allow buyers to focus on different places. The quality at the top will allow buyers to focus on different horses. This has to be considered a high-end two-year-old sale and I don't see the economy having too much of an effect on it. The whole key to the success of this book has been developing the middle market and I think this catalogue fulfills that need."

KIGHT HOPES BIDS FLY HIGH AT CALDER

You may not be familiar with the name, but pinhooker Hoby Kight could be making headlines at today's Fasig-Tipton Calder Selected Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale. His hip 247, a son of Hennessy, recorded the co-fastest quarter-mile work of Sunday's under tack preview. That colt is just one of three Kight has in the sale. He purchased all three as yearlings for a total of \$210,000.

Of Sunday's bullet work, Kight said, "I was excited, but I was pretty confident in him. He's a good, good horse and I was confident he would work well."

Kight, a Florida native, started out as a quarter horse jockey and trainer in Louisiana and Texas. He is based in Ocala now, where he and his wife Layna do most of the work on their horses. "This is the first year I've been at the sale with my own horses," Kight explained. "Last year I had horses for some clients from Texas and I found that it was an awfully good sale if you had a good horse. I tried to bring two-year-olds with both pedigree and conformation, the most I could get for my money. Ricky Leppela was a big influence in getting me started in this. I just got tired of being on the road so I started doing this full time in 1996. I buy a lot of horses for Tom Durant." Kight was part of the team that purchased stakes winner Touch Tone for Durant.

"We started out buying \$1,000 horses and this is where we are today," Kight continued. "Business has been really steady at this sale. They are all showing really well. We never have more than 16 to 18 in training. It's a hands-on operation. We're small and pretty selective." That approach could pay off today.

Stephentown Works:

Stephentown (Wild Again), much hyped after a Gulfstream allowance win but sixth in the GI Fountain of Youth, worked a half mile at Gulfstream yesterday morning in :49 4/5 over a fast track. "It was just a maintenance work," said trainer Anthony Reidstedler. "I can't make a commitment for him running in the [Mar. 16 GI] Florida Derby at this time. But you can say that it's not out of the picture for him."

Also at Gulfstream yesterday, GII Remsen S. winner **Saarland** (Unbridled) zipped four furlongs in :48. Trainer Shug McGaughey has entered the colt in three Gulfstream allowance contests that failed to fill and told the *Daily Racing Form*, "I'll just keep him here and train him up to the [Mar. 17 GIII] Gotham."

Maybry's Boy to Rood and Riddle:

Trainer Shug McGaughey has sent **Maybry's Boy** (Broad Brush) to Rood and Riddle Equine Clinic in Lexington, Kentucky, according to *Daily Racing Form*. "He's not lame or off, but he's just not right," McGaughey told the paper. "So I sent him to Rood and Riddle to find out just what the problem is." Maybry's Boy won the GIII Spectacular Bid in January, but was a disappointing eighth in the GI Fountain of Youth last time out.

PEDIGREE INSIGHTS

IN EXCESS DEFIES THE ODDS

The last couple of months have seen Mizzen Mast, an ex-European grandson of Caro, surprise Californian racegoers with his metamorphosis from very good turf performer into a potentially outstanding dirt horse. Perhaps we shouldn't have been so surprised, though, because Mizzen Mast represents an example of history repeating itself.

Back in 1990, another grandson of Caro, In Excess, arrived in California with a reputation as an above-average turf performer. This excitable son of Siberian Express had made his last appearance in England at Royal Ascot, when his record of three wins from five starts was good enough to make him second favorite for the G3 Jersey S. Unfortunately, he didn't reproduce his best form at Ascot and his breeder Ahmed Foustok quickly sold him to Jack J. Munari.

In Excess had shown himself to be well suited by firm ground in England and the three-year-old soon proved to be very much at home on America's fast turf tracks. After two defeats at Del Mar, he rounded off the 1990 season with three stakes wins on firm ground, including the GIII Volante H. and the GIII San Gabriel H. These victories were rewarded with a weight of 120 pounds--just five pounds below the top turf colt Royal Academy--on the *Blood-Horse* Free Handicap for three-year-olds, and In Excess looked an exciting prospect for the top turf races in 1991.

Trainer Bruce Jackson had other ideas, though. "He's worked much better on dirt than on grass," reported Jackson, who pitched the colt into the GII San Fernando S. under co-top weight of 126 pounds. The result was a spectacular debut on dirt--rather like Mizzen Mast's remarkable dirt debut in the GI Malibu S.--with In Excess setting a stakes record while winning by four lengths.

The rest of the story, as the saying goes, is history. In Excess went on to win four Grade I races on dirt

during 1991, including the Metropolitan H. over a mile, the Woodward over 1 1/8 miles and the Suburban H. in a new track record over 1 1/4 miles. It was a measure of In Excess's excellence that no horse had won these three events in a single season since the remarkable Kelso in 1961. No wonder In Excess found support in the balloting for the Eclipse Award for older male, finishing second to Black Tie Affair, and the *Daily Racing Form* handicappers placed him level with Black Tie Affair and Farma Way at the head of the weights for the older male division.

Sadly, In Excess suffered foot problems at five and never quite recaptured that level of form in five races. An injury to a splint bone in June 1992 forced his retirement, with his destination originally being named as Walmac International. However, it was announced a few months later that In Excess would start his stallion career in California, at his owner's Rancho Why Worry.

Perhaps his pedigree had failed to impress the Kentucky breeders. It certainly wasn't the type of pedigree most people look for in a potential stallion. At the end of 1992, In Excess had the unwanted distinction of being the only graded stakes winner to emerge from Siberian Express's first four crops of racing age and he was also the only stakes winner (with the exception of one in Norway) to represent any of his first three dams.

We know now, though, that In Excess was thoroughly worthy of a place among Kentucky's stallions. Despite having only 24 named foals in his first crop, they included In Excessive Bull (GIII Hollywood Prevue S.) and Fun In Excess (three stakes wins and second at Grade II level).

His next crop of only 26 named foals did even better. As many as six of them became stakes winners, headed by the imposing Indian Charlie, who started favorite for the 1998 Kentucky Derby on the strength of four wins from four starts, including the GI Santa Anita Derby. Indian Charlie finished an honorable third on what proved to be his final appearance and he has a large first crop ready to race this year, led by a colt bought by the Thoroughbred Corporation for \$1,100,000. *Cont. p. 6*

In Excess's early success inevitably earned him a lot more support from breeders and, at around 100 named foals, his 1998 crop is much larger than its four predecessors (of which the third and fourth were sired at fees of only \$3,000 after his move to Vesels Stallion Station). His 1998 crop has justified the increased support, featuring such good performers as Romanceishope (GII Del Mar Derby), Royally Chosen (second in GI La Brea S.) and Above Perfection, winner of Saturday's GIII Las Flores H. Above Perfection has been beaten only twice in eight starts, one of her defeats being an excellent second, beaten only a neck by Xtra Heat, in the GI Prioress S. last summer.

In Excess covered at least 100 mares in 1997, 1999 and 2000, so numbers are no longer going to be a problem. With his fee now in the region of \$25,000, he will also be benefitting from greater quality in his mares, so there is every reason to think that this top-class racehorse will keep on confounding those who wondered whether he had a stallion's pedigree.
