SALES SPOTLIGHT MOVES TO BARRETTS

The sales scene moves to California this afternoon for the one-day Barretts March Sale of Selected Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale at the Hinds Pavilion in Pomona.

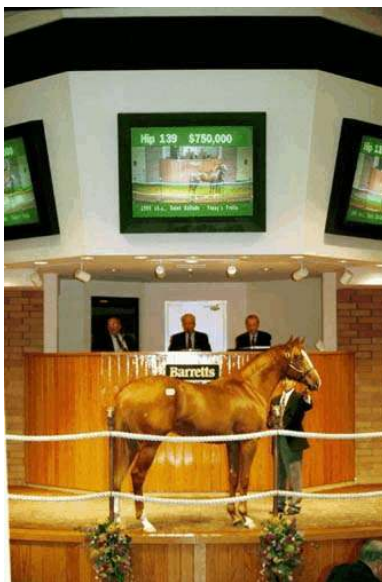
Consignors are expecting similar results to what they experienced at last week's Fasig-Tipton Calder sale. "The two-year-old market has been very spotty," Sequel Bloodstock's Becky Thomas said. "The buy-back rate has been high, higher even than the result sheets indicate. If any single thing is off, then you're in trouble. Everyone has been zeroing in on the right horse." Thomas believes her 12-horse consignment features juveniles with the right stuff. "I like our Tale of the Cat filly [#162]; she breezed well yesterday [:21.6, the fastest quarter-mile work of the day]," she said "I'm also high on the the Tabasco Cat filly [#74]. I really like her; she's got a great family." Thomas also tries to tailor her consignment to the potential customers. Several of her Barretts juveniles have California connections. "We brought the Deputy Commander colt [#103] here because [Deputy Commander] ran and won out here, and the Gone West colt [#46] is out of a half-sister to Bienamado, who was a good runner out here," she said.

Barretts Echoes Consignor Sentiment...

Mirroring consignor opinion, Barretts President Gerry McMahon said, "This year appears to be a continuation of last year's market. In terms of buyer selectivity at the select two-year-old sales especially, buyers focus on relatively few horses. That seems to be the heart of the charge-back rates, which are historically high at two-year-old sales." As for what he expects today, McMahon said, "I don't think that this sale will reach last year's average. The catalogue is a little smaller and the average pinhook prices are considerably lower than in the past. What we're really hoping for is a low charge-back rate. I think, realistically, a 35-percent rate would be a good performance."

Small But Select...

This year's Barretts catalogue is slightly smaller than a year ago, but Kip Elser of Kirkwood Stables feels the quality of the horses being offered, not only here but in the first few sales of the year, is high. "The quality of the catalogues for the first few sales is up," Elser said. "There's a better group of two-year-olds being sold. There are less horses at Barretts this year, but there aren't less people coming around, doing their homework. That leads to spectacular prices at the top--but it's very hard on the horses that aren't standouts." He expects the Kirkwood consignment to fare well today. "We have a solid representative group and they trained well here," Elser said. The group includes #99, a You and I filly who clocked a furlong in :10.1 Sunday. "There's more pressure now to have a spectacular first breeze to get on people's lists," he said. "It used to be that they could breeze OK the first time and better the second time--that's not the case anymore." Elser sells #176, a Danzig filly, for Claiborne Farm, which does not breeze its two-year-olds this early in the year. Will

her lack of a workout hurt her in the ring? "It didn't hurt us in Florida, and that was with a colt," Elser said. "I would certainly hope that a Danzig filly, especially a filly, wouldn't have to blister down there." Claiborne, with Kirkwood as agent, sold a Coronado's Quest colt at Calder for \$100,000. **Barretts Preview cont. p2**

Capitalizing on the Success of the Past...

Barretts sold three Grade I winners in 2001--Came Home, Habibti and Officer. Will that success boost 2002 results? "We've been really promoting that, but every year is now," McMahon said. "This is a more regional catalogue, with more of a focus on California breeding." Becky Thomas will sell two juveniles eligible for Cal-bred owners' awards, #20 and #150. "We like to buy in places that support their breeding programs, like California, New York and Canada," she said. "We bought [Cal-breds] Officer and Arabian Light at the Del Mar sale." Officer, a \$175,000 yearling purchase, sold for \$700,000 at last year's Barretts March Sale, while Arabian Light, a \$60,000 yearling, sold for the same amount in 2000.

The 2002 Catalogue...

A total of 167 lots have been catalogued for the 2002 Barretts March Sale, down just a tick from 172 lots last year. Top sires represented include Capote, Cherokee Run, Danzig, End Sweep, Gilded Time, Gone West, Mr. Prospector, Mt. Livermore, Pulpit, Saint Ballado, Siphon (Brz), Unbridled and Valid Expectations. There are also two-year-olds by promising young sires such as Cape Town, Coronado's Quest, Deputy Commander, Elusive Quality, Grand Slam, Swain (Ire) and Tale of the Cat. The Pulpit colt, #100, from Jerry Bailey Sales Agency, agent, brought the biggest price as a yearling, selling for \$450,000 at the 2001 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July Sale. His second dam is GISW Mississippi Mud (Delta Judge), who produced MGSW Dixieland Band. Bidding for today's sale starts at 2 p.m.

FLORIDA DERBY NOTES

Stephentown (Wild Again) worked five furlongs Monday at Gulfstream Park in 1:02 2/5. "I'm very pleased with the way he worked this morning," said trainer Anthony Reinstedler. "He had a strong workout and, more importantly, he finished up strong. His next start will be the [Mar. 16 GI] Florida Derby." A \$500,000 yearling purchase, Stephentown is coming off a sixth-place effort in the Feb. 16 GI Fountain of Youth.

Also working for the Florida Derby, **High Star** (Private Terms) went five furlongs in 1:00 4/5. It was the second fastest trial of 42 horses working that distance yesterday at Gulfstream. The Nick Zito trainee was third in the GI Kentucky Jockey Club S. last year. In 2002, he took a Jan. 26 Gulfstream allowance and was nosed out of a win in a Feb. 16 allowance.

Florida Derby hopeful **Personal Reward** (Personal Hope) worked a bullet five furlongs Sunday in 1:00... Trainer Graham Motion plans to work **Grey Beard** (Unbridled's Song) today at Gulfstream before deciding on a Florida Derby start for the colt. Of Grey Beard's seventh-place finish in the Fountain of Youth, Motion said, "I just don't know what happened to him. But, he's been doing so good and there really isn't anything else for him. The Florida Derby could be his last chance to prove to us what kind of horse he is or isn't."

Balance of Game earned his first graded-stakes win with a track-record setting performance in the G3 Niigata Nisai S. last September, but had been off since finishing fourth in the G1 Asahi Futurity S. in December. He was allowed to set easy fractions on the front end and held sway late for a half-length victory. "I really wanted to get him to relax during the race," jockey Yutaka Take said of the winner. "He rated much better today than in the Asahi Hai Futurity." Balance of Game is expected to make his next start in the Apr. 14 G1 Satsuki Sho (Japanese 2000 Guineas). Yamano Blizzard (Jpn) (Taiki Blizzard), the 9-5 favorite, never threatened and finished fifth.

Health Wall appeared poised for bigger and better things following a solid score in the Listed Dahlia Sho-Jpn last August, but the filly had to settle for third in her next start, the G3 Hakodate Nisai S. in September, before heading to the sidelines for 2 1/2 months. She came back to be fourth in the G3 Fantasy S. before a lackluster eighth in her 2001 finale, the G1 Hanshin Juvenile Fillies last December. Facing a classy group in this prep for the Apr. 7 G1 Oka Sho (Japanese 1000 Guineas), including Japan's 2001 champion juvenile filly Tamuro Cherry (Jpn) (Secreto), the bay took the lead soon after the break and held on in the stretch for a narrow win over favored Osumi Cosmo. Tamuro Cherry was a well-beaten 12th.

Beau Fete, the sole graded stakes winner in the field, defeated seven others to remain undefeated in her short career. Following an easy four-length maiden victory over the San Isidro turf course last December, the filly made it two-for-two in her dirt debut, the G2 C. Casares at Palermo next time out Feb. 2. Facing five unbeaten fillies here, the juvenile was sent off the third choice, but wired the field for the score.

PEDIGREE INSIGHTS

Considering that all 14 runners--including six six-year-olds and a seven-year-old--were looking for their first Grade I wins in the U.S., this year's Santa Anita H. looked a little substandard. However, we shouldn't have been too surprised that the horse which made the breakthrough into the big time--five-year-old Milwaukee Brew--should be a late-blooming son of Wild Again.

In this day and age, enormous emphasis is placed on precocity and a stallion's ability to get stock which blossom at two. There's a tendency, though, to forget that some of the richest harvests await the horses that are sound enough, and genuine enough, to withstand the demands of several years of training and racing.

Happily for Three Chimneys Farm, Wild Again has shown he can fulfil both roles. His figure of around 20 percent juvenile winners among the 767 named foals in his first 13 crops is perfectly respectable, and he has shown that there is every chance his progeny will produce bigger and bigger dividends as they mature.

Wild Again's APEX figures to the end of last year were 1.64 at two, 2.12 at three, 2.28 at four and 2.29 at five. Behind these figures, based on the last seven years, are numerous graded-stakes performers which--to continue the horticultural theme--proved to be hardy perennials. Among them are such good performers as Elmhurst, winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint as a seven-year-old; Chicago Six, Smile Again, Wild Event and Winfama, all of which gained their last graded-stakes successes at the age of six; and El Amante and Madame Pandit, whose last graded wins came at five.

Wild Again also had several four-year-old graded winners during the last seven years, including Bright Valour, Omi, Whiskey Kingdom, Wildly Joyous, Wild Rush and Wild Wonder. His record features two top Canadian performers, Wilderness Song and Wild Zone, which were stakes winners in four separate years.

Of course, this type of steady improvement was also a feature of Wild Again's own career. Having fetched only \$35,000 at the 1981 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky summer yearling sale, Wild Again did his two-year-old winning at Evangeline Downs and Louisiana Downs. Chips in his left knee required surgery that sidelined him from that October until December the following year.

Consequently, the son of Icecapade had earnings of only \$33,700 by the time he turned four, but he quickly made up for lost time, scoring twice at Santa Anita before moving on to win the GII New Orleans H., the GII Oaklawn H. (in track-record time) and the GI Meadowlands Cup. His finest hour came at Hollywood Park, when he held off Gate Dancer and Slew o'Gold to take the inaugural Breeders' Cup Classic, a race he contested at the cost of a \$360,000 supplementary fee.

Wild Again tried the turf often during his four-year-old season, but without much reward. Although he seemed much more effective on a fast dirt track, it mustn't be forgotten that the bottom half of Wild Again's pedigree is European and features the Derby winners Hyperion, Dante and Mahmoud. No wonder his progeny have enjoyed a degree of success on turf, thanks to such as Free At Last, Wild Event, Narita King O and Wild Zone.

It would have been no surprise had Milwaukee Brew also proved to be a turf performer. His dam, Ask Anita, was a confirmed turf runner and his broodmare sire, Wolf Power, was an outstanding performer over South Africa's turf courses.

Mention of some of these names also makes it clear why Milwaukee Brew was able to maintain his gallop when so many of his opponents were struggling to see out the 10th furlong of the Big 'Cap. Wild Again was very well suited by 1 1/4 miles--the distance of three of his graded victories--and Ask Anita gained her best win in the GIII Yerba Buena H. over 1 3/8 miles, while Wolf Power was a Group 1 winner at up to 1 1/4 miles.

Bettors assumed the race would come down to the wire between two horses, and it did, though one of their chosen mares failed to show for the expected duel. Atelier (Deputy Minister), the even-money favorite, came into the race off a three-month break, having finished fourth as a longshot in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff before rallying to be third in the GII Top Flight H. at Aqueduct Nov. 23. Away came back after nearly eight months on the sidelines to win the Minaret S. at Tampa Jan. 5, but switched to the turf for a Feb. 27 allowance test at Gulfstream and finished fifth. The two mares settled at the back of the pack during the early going, waiting until after the half to make their moves. Away came wide on the far turn under pressure from jockey Jerry Bailey, steadily gaining through the stretch and getting up in the last few strides to snatch victory away from longshot Curious Treasures. Atelier was forced wide of Away, looked as if she'd mount a bid, but lacked spark in the stretch and settled for a disappointing fourth.

Trying the turf for the second time in this one, the 5-2 shot chased the pace through relaxed fractions, made a bid entering the stretch and proved much the best in a 3 1/4 length victory. Golden Tent Rides into the Sunset:

After 11 years of competition and 118 starts, 13-year-old **Golden Tent** (Shelter Half) has run his final race. Entered in Monday's fourth race at Philly Park for a claiming price of \$4,000, Golden Tent was claimed by trainer Gary Contessa for owner Maryanne Robert. He will be retired to the New York Horse Rescue Farm on Long Island. "New York Horse Rescue contacted me a couple of days ago about the possibility of claiming Golden Tent," explained Contessa. "I've always supported them, they do great work, so I said I'd see what I could do. I started by chipping in \$1,000 of my own money and, through word of mouth and the internet, we had people putting up \$25, \$50, whatever they could to help. We raised the money, claimed him and will now officially retire him." In his finale, Golden Tent ran third. "I'm so glad we got this done," said Stefanie Maccario, a fundraiser at New York Horse Rescue, and the driving force behind the claim. "We were so worried about him. We have nearly 40 horses now, mostly Thoroughbreds, but we take anyone who needs a home."
