

ROARING START FOR STORMY ATLANTIC

When hip number 111 brought a record \$1.9-million bid to top Tuesday's Barretts March Sale of Selected Two-Year-Olds, she brought a rush of attention to her freshman sire **Stormy Atlantic** (Storm Cat--Hail Atlantis, by Seattle Slew). The eight-year-old stallion stands at Arthur Appleton's Bridlewood Farm in Ocala, Florida. "I think it was wonderful. I was pleasantly surprised [by the sale-topping filly]," said Bridlewood General Manager George Isaacs. Stormy Atlantic won six of 15 starts on the racetrack, including the 1998 Damitrius S. and Havre de Grace S. He earned \$148,126 and entered stud in 1999. "He bred 91 mares his first year, 138 the next and 130 last year, so booking has never been a problem," Isaacs said. "This will just be vindication and validation for everyone who has bred to Stormy Atlantic. We have always felt he has arguably as good a pedigree as any son of Storm Cat standing in North America and this will give him an even bigger opportunity for success." So far, Tuesday's seven-figure filly stands alone on Stormy Atlantic's public auction resume. His six weanlings sold at auction have averaged \$8,733, while his 11 yearlings sold have averaged \$16,009. A full brother to the Barretts topper was purchased for just \$3,700 at OBS January. Stormy Atlantic has 52 two-year-olds this year and stands for \$6,000 live foal.

SLEW RETURNS TO THREE CHIMNEYS

Seattle Slew (Bold Reasoning), who underwent surgery at Rood & Riddle Equine Hospital in Lexington, Ky. Saturday to repair a compression between his fifth and sixth vertebrae, returned to his stall at Three Chimneys Farm yesterday morning, according to owner and syndicate manager Mickey Taylor. "We left Rood & Riddle at 6:00 [yesterday] morning and got him back to his regular stall at 20 after six and he's full of himself," said Taylor. "They retook X-rays on the basket and it's firmly planted there, and [the doctors] are very pleased with it." A statement to shareholders from Taylor read, "We are very pleased with his progress and it is good to have him back home where the surroundings are familiar to him and where he is the most comfortable. We will keep you posted as to his progress." Reached by phone, Taylor added that the 28-year-old stallion would continue to dictate the pace of his recovery. "It's a day-by-day deal," he said. "After his last surgery, they said it would be 10 days and we came home on day eight. This time we were only there four days. Our biggest problem right now is keeping him quiet and doing whatever exercise we have to do with him so we can keep that basket in place. We'll probably walk him within the next couple of days. He amazes me. I'm the first one to always say that he makes everyone look good. He is the most unbelievable creature I've ever been associated with or heard of." Taylor said that three of Slew's first five mares bred this year have checked in foal.

CHIEF BEARHART BACK TO NEW ZEALAND

Eclipse Award winner and 1997 Canadian horse of the year **Chief Bearhart** (Chief's Crown--Amelia Bearhart, by Bold Hour) will return to Glenmorgan Farm in New Zealand for a second season. The deal was arranged by the Japan Bloodhorse Breeders' Association, owners of the nine-year-old stallion. "We at Glenmorgan believe achieving continuity with stallions is important to give breeders the opportunity to access the best bloodlines on more than one-off occasions and it is for this reason we are delighted to have secured Chief Bearhart for a further season," said Glenmorgan Farm stud master Brett Jenkins. The multi-millionaire will stand the 2002 breeding season for NZ\$18,000 (plus GST).

Siphonic Works Well for San Felipe:

GI Hollywood Futurity winner **Siphonic** (Siphon {Brz}) worked seven furlongs yesterday in a sharp 1:24 2/5 at Hollywood Park as he prepares the GII San Felipe S. at Santa Anita Mar. 17. Clockers caught the David Hofmans-trainee in splits of :36 4/5 for three eighths, 1:00 2/5 for five furlongs and out the mile in 1:38 2/5. Jockey Chris McCarron was aboard for the work, but Jerry Bailey has the call for the San Felipe. In other works for the San Felipe, recent allowance winner **Sunday Break** (Jpn) (Forty Niner) covered six furlongs in 1:13 3/5 for trainer Neil Drysdale, while stablemates **Mountain Rage** (Mecke) and **Puerto Banus** (Supremo) worked the same distance in 1:12 and 1:11 4/5, respectively, for trainer Bob Baffert.

Harlan's Holiday Stays Sharp:

Harlan's Holiday (Harlan), one of the early favorites for the Mar. 16 GI Florida Derby, drilled five furlongs yesterday morning in 1:00 1/5 breezing under the watchful eye of trainer Kenny McPeck. "He went very well this morning," the conditioner commented. "I had one of my exercise riders on him. I'll probably work him next Tuesday and that will be it. He's doing very well." A four-time stakes winning juvenile, the Ohio-bred has suffered gut wrenching defeats to **Booklet** (Notebook) in the GIII Holy Bull S. Jan 19 and most recently the GI Fountain of Youth S. Feb. 16.

Hennig Clarifies Florida Derby Plans:

Trainer Mark Hennig announced yesterday that **Personal Reward** (Personal Hope), a two-time winner during the current Gulfstream meeting, will likely make his next start in the Florida Derby while **Monthir** (Gulch), a close fourth to Derby hopeful **Nokoma** (Pulpit) in a Feb. 23 allowance test, will return to one turn and contest the GIII Swale S. at seven furlongs. "I'm going to give Personal Reward one more work and if everything is all right after that then I'll run him in the Florida Derby," Hennig explained. Monthir was beaten by a neck when second in the seven-furlong GII Hutcheson S. Feb. 2.

Grey Beard Likely For Derby Following Tuesday Work:

Grey Beard (Unbridled's Song) has had his Florida Derby status upgraded to likely following his solid six-furlong breeze on Tuesday. "I thought he worked a second faster than that," trainer H. Graham Motion said yesterday of the work, which was clocked officially in 1:13 4/5. "I'm leaning heavily towards running him in the Florida Derby and am trying to get Robbie Albarado to come in from the Fair Grounds to ride him." Albarado was aboard the bay colt when he broke his maiden at Keeneland last October. Grey Beard will be looking to rebound from distant seventh-place effort in the Fountain of Youth, an outing his trainer is willing to write off. "He just didn't run his race and you can always give a horse one race," Motion said.

Pelirrojo Off Triple Crown Trail:

Pelirrojo (Flying Continental), sixth to Came Home in the GII San Rafael S. last Saturday, is off the Triple Crown trail, according to trainer John Sadler. "He came out [of the race] with a hot [right] knee," he commented. "The X-rays are OK, but he'll probably go to the ranch for two or three months."

California Contingent Set for Saturday Sortie:

A plane is set to leave Los Angeles International Airport Saturday morning containing the Southern California participants for the Dubai World Cup program Mar. 23. **Val Royal** (Fr) (Royal Academy), fourth in last Saturday's GII F.E. Kilroe Mile in his first start since winning the GI Breeders' Cup Mile last October, has emerged from his effort unscathed and will go in the G1 Dubai Duty Free at about nine furlongs on the turf. "He came out of the race super and I still think he could have won if he had gotten out sooner," trainer Julio Canani told *Daily Racing Form* of the David Milch colorbearer. Milch also owns California bred sprinter **Echo Eddie** (Restless Con), who will be making the trip and goes in the 1200-meter G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen. Jockey Pat Valenzuela will ride the five-year-old and also has the call on GI Santa Anita H. runner-up **Western Pride** (Way West {Fr}) in the G1 World Cup. The rest of the shipment includes **Caller One** (Phone Trick), **Men's Exclusive** (Exclusive Ribot) for the Golden Shaheen; **Blade Prospector** (Brz) (Music Prospector) for the Godolphin Mile; and **Irish Prize** (Irish River {Fr}) for the Duty Free.

Hal's Hope Ready for Some Creme Fraiche:

South Florida favorite **Hal's Hope** (Jolie's Halo), hero of the 2000 GI Florida Derby, is "still on go" for a start in Sunday's GIII Creme Fraiche H. at Gulfstream, according to trainer Harold Rose. Runner-up to Sir Bear in the GIII Skip Away H. in his five-year-old bow Jan. 12, the homebred was most recently a midpack seventh in the GI Donn H. Feb. 9.

Purely Cozzene Euthanized:

Ed Friendly's dual Grade III winner **Purely Cozzene** (Cozzene) was euthanized Sunday after breaking down during the seventh race. The winner of the GIII Will Rogers H. and GIII La Jolla H. at three for trainer Bob Baffert in California, the chestnut was making his first start for trainer Elliott Walden but took a bad step after entering the backstretch in the \$80,000 claiming event on the turf. "He shattered both sesamoids," Walden told *Daily Racing Form*. Purely Cozzene won six of 22 starts and earned \$541,671 in his three-plus years on the track.

NYRA Reschedules Turf Classic:

The New York Racing Association has agreed to shift the date of the GI Turf Classic, the final New York prep for the Breeders' Cup Turf, from Sept. 28 to Sept. 29 in order to accommodate coverage by NBC as part of its Breeders' Cup Preview package. The change was necessitated by the rescheduling of golf's Ryder Cup matches, which were pushed back from last September following the terrorist attacks. That event is now scheduled for Sept. 28. NBC's coverage will be anchored from Belmont Park will feature four live races as well as two taped events and the stretch run of a seventh race. In addition to the Turf Classic, the program is to feature a pair of Breeders' Cup preps from Arlington Park and live coverage of the GI Canadian International from Woodbine.
