SAKHEE HEADS 2002 WORLD CUP

Sakhee (Bahri) heads an 11-strong list of acceptors for the \$6 million G1 Dubai World Cup at Nad al Sheba Mar. 23. Godolphin's five-year-old, winner of last year's

G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe and G1 Juddmonte International and runner-up in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, is joined on the list by stable companions **Street Cry (Ire)** (Machiavellian) and **State Shinto** (Pleasant Colony).

Also pointing to the race is Marcus

Tregoning's **Nayef** (Gulch), who was taken out of the \$2 million G1 Dubai Sheema Classic after an impressive one-mile workout under the lights at Nad Al Sheba last weekend. Japan will be represented by two entries--last year's World Cup runner-up **To the Victory (Jpn)** (Sunday Silence) and MG1SW **Agnes Digital** (Crafty Prospector). The only American representative in the World Cup is GI Santa Anita H. runner-up **Western Pride** (Way West {Fr}), but the U.S. will have a strong contingent for the \$2 million G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen, with champion **Xtra Heat** (Dixieland Heat), second in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, and last year's Shaheen winner **Caller One** (Phone Trick) ready to make the trip. In the 1 1/2-mile Dubai Sheema Classic, Nayef's stablemate **Mubtaker** (Silver Hawk), **Sagacity (Fr)** (Highest Honor {Fr}) and **Demophilos (GB)** (Dr Devious {Ire}) lead the European hopefuls. As expected, **Jim and Tonic (Fr)** (Double Bed {Fr}) will bid to retain his title in the \$2 million G1 Dubai Duty Free; the race also has attracted GI Breeders' Cup Mile winner **Val Royal (Fr)** (Royal Academy), who comes off a fourth-place finish in Saturday's GII F.E. Kilroe Mile. **Total Impact (Chi)** (Stuka), a Group 1 winner in Chile now trained in California by Laura de Seroux, will run in the \$2 million UAE Derby, while GISW **Peeping Tom** (Eagle Eyed) and **Skoozi (NZ)** (Prince Of Praise {NZ}), winner of Round 1 of the G3 Maktoum Challenge, head for the \$1 million G2 Godolphin Mile.

Tabor Buys Triple Crown Contender:

Michael Tabor, who won the Kentucky Derby and the Belmont S. with Thunder Gulch in 1995, has added the undefeated **Smooth Jazz** (Storm Boot) to this year's Triple Crown team. The dark bay, who won't actually celebrate his third birthday until three weeks after this year's "Run for the Roses," broke his maiden at Aqueduct Jan. 13 and came back to take the six-furlong Best Turn S. Feb. 23. Tabor purchased the colt privately from owner/trainer Tony Dutrow for an undisclosed sum. A \$95,000 Keeneland September yearling, Smooth Jazz arrived at Gulfstream Park Wednesday and will now be trained by Todd Pletcher. He is nominated to the GI Florida Derby and GIII Swale S., both set for Mar. 16, but it has not yet been decided where he will start next. "We'll get a line on him and see how he trains," Pletcher told the *Daily Racing Form*. "[His next start] depends on how he trains down here and how quickly he acclimatizes."

The Ins and Outs of the Florida Derby:

Grey Beard (Unbridled's Song), considered a likely candidate for the \$1 million Florida Derby after Tuesday's breeze, has developed a slight injury and will not make the race, according to trainer Graham Motion. "We hadn't originally nominated him for the Florida Derby," said Motion, "and a minor problem has developed. Since we're still not sure whether we can run him or not, we decided not to pay the nomination fee." Grey Beard, a winner in two of five career starts, ran seventh last time out in the GI Fountain of Youth S. Feb. 16. But trainer Shug McGaughey is leaning heavily toward running **D'Coach** (Dehere) in the nine-furlong event. The colt comes off a second-place finish in the Feb. 9 Whirlaway S. at Aqueduct.

Booklet Still on Florida Trail:

Booklet (Notebook), winner of the Fountain of Youth S. last time out, was out for a gallop at Gulfstream Thursday morning and will have his final major workout for the Florida Derby tomorrow. "He's doing awfully good," said trainer John Ward Jr. "I'll give him his last major prep for the Florida Derby this Saturday. I like the way he's coming up to the race."

Puck Nominated to Florida Derby:

Puck (Mr. Greeley) was thrown into the Florida Derby fray yesterday after connections paid \$3,000 to nominate their colt on the final day of regular nominations. "We're looking seriously at it," said trainer Bill White. "I would say we are getting ready to put a major work into him in the next couple of days and, depending how he comes out of it, we'll make a more definite decision on whether to run in there or not." The gray inspired confidence in his camp following a dead-heat second-place finish last time, when the sophomore came home three-quarters of a length behind Florida Derby candidate **Nokoma** (Pulpit) in an allowance test Feb. 23. "We realize that this is a somewhat ambitious step, but we thought he ran a super race last time and, based on that effort against some prime Florida Derby candidates, we decided to go ahead and nominate him. I think a mile and an eighth is a perfect distance for him," said White.

MAGNA TO ACQUIRE LONE STAR PARK Magna Entertainment Corp. Ltd. has forged an agreement with Lone Star Race Park Ltd. and LSJC Development Corp to buy the Grand Prairie, Texas facility for \$80 million in cash. Magna will also assume certain liabilities, including a capital lease obligation of approximately \$19 million. The transaction, subject to regulatory approval, is expected to close in the second quarter of 2002 and expands the Magna family of tracks to 11. "The acquisition of Lone Star represents another step in MEC's program of expanding its racing and wagering operations through the ownership of the country's premier racetrack properties," said Frank Stronach, chairman of MEC. Added Lone Star Park Chairman Bob Kaminski, "This is a great moment for the future of Lone Star Park at Grand Prairie and horse racing in Texas. Lone Star has had unprecedented success in its short history and now the baton is being passed to Magna Entertainment Corporation, a financially strong and committed ownership group. Lone Star Park will be very well positioned for the future." Kaminski, who stated that existing management at the track would remain the same, added, "For people that regularly interface with Lone Star Park, they should see no difference. They are going to see the same people and management style that has been our hallmark the past five years." Lone Star, the proposed site for the 2005 Breeders' Cup World Thoroughbred Championship, held its inaugural Thoroughbred meet in 1997.

KENTUCKY QUARTET FORM FOUR STAR SALES Four veteran Kentucky horsemen--John T.L. Jones Jr., Dan Kenny, David Greathouse and Kerry Cauthen--have joined forces to form a new sales company. Four Star Sales, which will combine the existing consignments of the four principals, will sell its first draft of yearlings at Keeneland July. Cauthen, who will serve as managing partner for Four Star while continuing to act as legal counsel for Walmac International, said, "Four Star will be a first-class sales company, not just in look, but in the quality of advice we give and in the quality of the handlers who care for and present our horses. We intend to use the best available methods to inform and advise our clients regarding their horses. Each partner will be active at our consignment and, with our collective experience, I believe we will be a successful team." The Four Star offices will be located at Walmac Farm until the new offices are ready. Jones, the owner and operator of Walmac and a founding member of the Breeders' Cup, said, "Four Star will be a combination of the strengths of each of the partners. We feel that together we can provide current and new clients with the highest level of service, sound advice and information available." Greathouse is the managing partner and co-owner of Glencrest Farm near Lexington. Kenny has operated an independent bloodstock agency since 1976.

Maryland Purse Supplement in Jeopardy:

The infighting between Thoroughbred and harness horsemen in Maryland has put the state's purse supplement, which could have amounted to as much \$5 million, in jeopardy. Casper Taylor Jr., the state's Speaker of the House, refused to introduce a subsidy bill this week because the two sides could not agree on the components of the legislation. There are ongoing discussions between the two factions, but Taylor told the *Baltimore Sun* it was a longshot that the purse supplement would be approved because of the current budget crisis in Maryland.

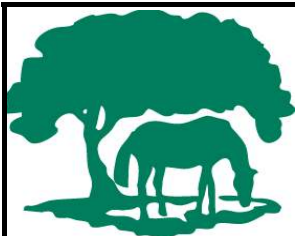

HKJC EXTEND SUSPENSIONS

John Egan and Robbie Fradd will be suspended until the end of June, ruling them out of the rest of the season, the Hong Kong Jockey Club has announced. While the jockeys await the outcome of the investigation carried out by the Independent Commission Against Corruption (ICAC), the Board of Stewards of the HKJC have, "determined it is necessary to continue the current licensing suspensions." Fradd and Egan were arrested Feb. 6 on suspicion of alleged race fixing and illegal bookmaking but have yet to be charged. In a statement, the Club continued: "The Jockey Club has been advised by ICAC that although neither jockey has been charged with a crime at this time, they remain subjects of an active criminal investigation by ICAC for alleged acts of corruption. ICAC has informed the Jockey Club of their intention to seek legal advice on these matters with the Department of Justice. The Board of Stewards have concluded that to ensure the public's confidence and to protect the integrity of racing and betting in Hong Kong, it is necessary to allow the legal authorities within Hong Kong to complete this investigation and legal review."
