ELEVEN ENTERED FOR FLORIDA DERBY

Headlined by the battle-toughened pair of **Booklet** (Notebook) and **Harlan's Holiday** (Harlan), a field of 11 three-year-olds has been entered for the \$1 million GI Florida Derby Saturday at Gulfstream Park. The 5-2 morning-line favorite, Harlan's Holiday has dropped a pair of close decisions to Booklet (4-1), missing by a 3/4-length in the GIII Holy Bull S. Jan. 19 and a nose in the GI Fountain of Youth Feb. 16. With Edgar Prado in the irons for the first time, the Ohio-bred bay will have added ground to run down his nemesis Saturday. "I think we'll get him [Booklet] this time," said trainer Ken McPeck. "That extra sixteenth of a mile is all we need." The tenacious Booklet comes from the same Oxley-Ward-Chavez team that was successful with Monarchos a year ago. **Blue Burner** (French Deputy) is 8-1 on the morning line on the strength of a third-place finish to the top pair in the Fountain of Youth. That marked the first career defeat for the Kinsman colorbearer, who tuned up for the Florida Derby with a five-furlong breeze in 1:04.60 at Payson Park Monday. Trainer Todd Pletcher has entered a 5-1 pair of runners owned by Michael Tabor, **Nokoma** (Pulpit) and **Smooth Jazz** (Storm Boot), but with John Velazquez named on both colts, only one is likely to start in the Florida Derby. Fourth in the Holy Bull, Nokoma bounced back to take a Gulfstream allowance Feb. 23 by rallying up the rail. "I was pretty pleased with his last race," said Pletcher. "He needs a sensible pace with solid fractions. Hopefully, he'll be finishing up well." Making his stakes debut Saturday is **Personal Reward** (Personal Hope), at 20-1 the longest shot in the field. The chestnut colt opened the year by breaking his maiden going seven furlongs over this surface Jan. 12 and came right back to take a two-turn allowance Feb. 6. "He likes the track at Gulfstream," explained trainer Mark Hennig, "and he's been doing really well since his last race."

TEMPERA RETURNS TODAY

Newly crowned Eclipse champion **Tempera** (A.P. Indy) will make her three-year-old debut in the UAE 1000 Guineas, a \$250,000 contest over 1600 meters tonight at Nad al Sheba in Dubai. One of three Godolphin entrants in the field, the bay filly has not raced since taking the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Oct. 27 at Belmont. **Infinite Spirit** (Maria's Mon) defeated stablemate **Seba** (GB) (Alzao) in a Nad al Sheba conditions race by 3 3/4 lengths Jan. 31; the latter went on to finish second to Breeders' Cup runner-up Imperial Gesture in the Moonshell Mile Feb. 24.

Sunday, Santa Anita

SAN FELIPE S.-GII, \$250,000, 3yo, 1 1/16m
 Winter-book Derby favorite **Siphonic** (Siphon {Brz}) drilled a bullet half in :47 from the gate yesterday at Santa Anita, galloping out five furlongs :59.60. The bay colt has not raced since nearly falling at the start of the GII Santa Catalina S. Jan. 17 before finishing second. "I worked him from the gate because of his experience last time," said trainer David Hofmans. "The ground broke out from under him [in the Santa Catalina] and I wanted him to have a good experience. He broke well, he came out of there running and the work was OK."
Puerto Banus (Supremo) tuned up for the San Felipe with a :59.40 five-furlong breeze Tuesday at Santa Anita for trainer Bob Baffert. With Neil Drysdale opting not to run **Sunday Break** (Jpn) (Forty Niner), there are only four definites for the San Felipe. In addition to Siphonic and Puerto Banus, **U S S Tinoso** (Foxhound) and **Shah Jehan** (Mr. Prospector) are scheduled to run, while **Gobi Dan** (Huckster) is listed as possible.

Sunday, Aqueduct

GOTHAM S.-GIII, \$200,000, 3yo, 1m
Two Shakes (Two Punch), a two-time winner at Aqueduct this year, worked five furlongs Tuesday in 1:02 1/5. The chestnut colt is expected to make his stakes debut in the Gotham...Another hopeful, **Tank's Expectation** (Valid Expectations) worked five furlongs at Laurel on Sunday in 1:00. The colt is coming off a runner-up finish in the Best Turn S. The Gotham will be shown live on espn2, beginning at 4 p.m.

Came Home Unhurt After Being Cast:

Trainer Paco Gonzalez cancelled a workout for his star **Came Home** (Gone West) after the colt became cast in his stall Tuesday night. With no apparent problems, the three-year-old galloped Wednesday morning instead of breezing. "We just want to make sure he's all right," said Gonzalez. The dark bay colt triumphed in the GII San Rafael S. Mar. 2 in his most recent outing.

BIEN BIEN DIES One of the best turf runners in California in the early 1990s, **Bien Bien** (Manila--Stark Winter, by Graustark) suffered a heart attack and died after covering a mare at Kirtlington Stud in England Mar. 12. "It all happened so suddenly," a farm representative told *The Blood-Horse*. "He was only 13 and fit and trim. He covered six of the 30 mares booked to him." The flashy chestnut had raced in the shadow of Horse of the Year Kotashaan (Fr), finishing second to that rival in the 1993 GI Breeders' Cup Turf, but captured four Grade I events and earned over \$2.3 million. From five crops, Bien Bien's best offspring has been millionaire Bienamado, who recently retired to stud in California.

TRADITIONALLY RETIRED Grade I winner **Traditionally** (Mr. Prospector--Personal Ensign, by Private Account) has been retired from racing, trainer Shug McGaughey confirmed yesterday. The five-year-old was considered among the top handicap horses of 2001 after winning the GI Oaklawn H., but went on to lose five straight races. In the final start of his career, Traditionally was 11th in the GI Donn H. "I think he did something to his back right leg and said, 'forget this,' after that," McGaughey said. On the board in eight of 20 starts, Traditionally won five races and earned \$495,660. He is expected to take up stud duties in Ireland. The chestnut is out of the unbeaten champion and Broodmare of the Year Personal Ensign, who also produced GISWs Miner's Mark (Mr. Prospector) and My Flag (Easy Goer).

Economic Stimulus Package to Help Horsemen:

The economic stimulus package signed into law last week by President George Bush will provide horse buyers with a significant tax break. The new rules are retroactive to include any purchases made since Sept. 11, 2001 and allow for a 30-percent bonus depreciation in the year of purchase. To qualify for the bonus, the horse must be purchased during the three-year period from last Sept. 11 to Sept. 11, 2004 and the original use of the horse must begin with the new owner. A statement from the National Thoroughbred Racing Association points out that this second requirement, "appears to leave out horses purchased after they have been raced by someone other than the purchaser. It is unclear whether a horse that has been raced, but has never been bred would qualify if purchased for breeding. But, it is clear that a horse purchased for racing that has never been raced can qualify for the new bonus write-off." Under the new policy, 37.5 percent of the purchase price of a yearling bought at a July 2002 sale can now be written off in 2002. That is more than three times the amount allowed under the old rules. Over 50 percent of the cost could be written off by the end of 2003, almost twice the old figure. For racehorses over two years, 47.5 percent of the purchase price can be written off in the year of purchase and 73.75 percent can be written off after the second year. "We are seeing a growing acceptance among legislators that horse racing, breeding and ownership are facets of a unique agribusiness that involve many small-business people," commented Greg Avioli, NTRA deputy commissioner. "The result of this legislation is that investment in Thoroughbreds now is more advantageous from the tax standpoint. This will benefit current investors in our industry and, we hope, encourage additional investment and job creation."

EIGHTEEN GO FOR GOLD

Looks Like Trouble (Ire) (Zaffaran {USA}) will face 17 rivals today in his bid for a repeat success in the Cheltenham Gold Cup. The winner of the 2000 edition of the race will be ridden this time around by Richard Johnson, who starred on the Cotswolds yesterday by taking the G1 Queen Mother Champion Chase on the heavily punted **Flagship Uberalles (Ire)** (Accordion {Ire}). Today's showpiece is supported by the G1 Stayers' Hurdle, in which Francois Doumen's **Baracouda (Fr)** (Alesso {USA}) is likely to start a short-priced favourite. Meanwhile, **Istabraq (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}), pulled up in the early stages of Tuesday's G1 Smurfit Champion Hurdle, was yesterday found to have damaged the equine equivalent of an Achilles tendon in his hock after a post-race examination by veterinarian John Halley. Although the gelding is expected to make a full recovery, it is increasingly likely that he will be retired. In a statement trainer Aidan O'Brien said yesterday: "Istabraq spent a very comfortable night in the race-course stables, ate up well last night and seems in good form this morning, but is understandably stiff on his off-hind. He will travel home to Ballydoyle with Darapour (Ire) this evening and will be re-examined by John Halley tomorrow morning. We all wish to express our sincere thanks to all those who showed so much concern for the horse's well being and we were touched by the number of faxes and e-mails we received." Owner J P McManus added: "I think he has obviously run his last race. I think it is asking a lot to have another one as good." Istabraq three-time Champion Hurdle winner, is the first national hunt horse to earn over £1million in prizemoney.
