SMOOTH SAILING FOR HARLAN'S HOLIDAY

Owner Michael Tabor put up the money for Florida Derby rabbit **Smooth Jazz** (Storm Boot), but it was Starlight Stable's **Harlan's Holiday** (Harlan) who reaped the rewards at Gulfstream Park yesterday afternoon. Smooth Jazz did his job, dogging GI Fountain Of Youth winner **Booklet** (Notebook) through suicidal fractions of

:45 1/5 and 1:10 1/5, but while his stablemate **Nokoma** (Pulpit) failed to mount a serious challenge, Harlan's Holiday motored past the frontrunners as they raced around the far turn and pulled away to win the \$1 million Grade I event by an impressive 3 1/2 lengths over **Blue**

Burner (French Deputy). "I told several people before the race that if they had somebody to soften up Booklet, I didn't think there was any way [Harlan's Holiday] was going to get beat," winning trainer Ken McPeck said. "He made a powerful move on the turn and I knew once he collared those horses that he was home free." It was sweet revenge for the athletic bay, who lost the bob in the Fountain Of Youth and was also a narrow runner-up behind Booklet in the Gill Holy Bull S. "He's been getting better and better everyday and I still think he has peaking to do," McPeck said. With his Florida Derby victory, the Ohio-bred moved past the million-dollar mark in earnings. Where will he point as he looks to add to that bankroll? His conditioner is sure of only one thing--he'll keep Harlan's Holiday and stablemate Repent, winner of the GII Louisiana Derby, separated until the first Saturday in May. "I'll make him eligible for all the races--the Blue Grass at Keeneland, the Wood Memorial in New York and the Illinois Derby--and we'll go from there," McPeck said.

Solid Effort for Blue Burner

While he was no match for the winner, Blue Burner, coming off a third-place finish in the Fountain Of Youth, put in a solid performance to finish second in what was only his second stakes try. "We had a good trip, but my options were pretty limited because of the post [11]," jockey Jerry Bailey said. "He handled the distance well. He wasn't going to beat the winner...but my horse is showing improvement every time he races and that's what you like to see."

Booklet Hangs On for Fourth

While Smooth Jazz beat only one horse home and Nokoma finished a disappointing seventh, Booklet showed a lot of grit to hang in there for fourth, albeit some 15 lengths behind the winner. "He went out there with that other horse and just went way too fast early," trainer John Ward Jr. said. "I'm not angry about it--that's horse racing. At least now we know what we have to work on with this colt. This was another lesson for us and him. We obviously have to teach him how to rate. This isn't over yet--we'll be back."

CHANGE OF PLAN FOR JOHANNESBURG Johannesburg (Hennessy) will prep for the GI Kentucky Derby on Lingfield's all-weather surface next month, it was revealed yesterday. Although the unbeaten colt was previously declared on target for the G3 Gladness S. at The Curragh Apr. 7, he will instead contest a £50,000 race at the Surrey track a day earlier. "Lingfield is going to stage a race for us at a mile on the all-weather surface," owner Michael Tabor said. The race will be the Eclipse Award winner's lone prep for the May 4 Kentucky Derby. "Every American I run into thinks I'm mad because my horse won't have three preps for the Kentucky Derby," Tabor admitted. "Americans have been doing this a long time, so who am I to argue with them?" Is there any chance the three-year-old will point for the European Classics rather than the "Run for the Roses?" Tabor said, "Anything is possible, but at the moment the agenda is the Kentucky Derby, no doubt about it." Trainer Aidan O'Brien told *The Daily Telegraph*, "This is a great opportunity to get a run into a horse like Johannesburg, indeed any horse being prepared for the Kentucky Derby. At this time of year, being able to run on a consistent, sound surface, whatever the weather happens to be, is most important."

SQUIRTLE SQUIRT SIDELINED Champion sprinter **Squirtle Squirt** (Marquetry) will undergo arthroscopic surgery on his left knee and will be out until the summer, according to trainer Bobby Frankel. "He had a spur and some filling, but the prognosis is good," Frankel explained to *Daily Racing Form*. "It's a two-month deal, that's why we're doing it now. He'll be out March and April, I'll put him back in training in May or June and he'll be ready for Saratoga." The dark bay colt capped his Eclipse Award-winning campaign with a victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, but finished second by four lengths to Snow Ridge in his 2002 debut, the GI Palos Verdes H. Jan. 27 at Santa Anita.

 Round one of the much-anticipated clash between Carnegie Express, a A\$45,000 yearling, and Don Eduardo, a A\$2.8 million purchase for Eduardo Cojuangco's Gooree Stud, went to the bargain-priced gelding. Carnegie Express, winner of the G1 Canterbury Guineas earlier this season, produced an eye-catching sprint to score by 1 1/4 lengths and, recording his sixth straight win for trainer Gai Waterhouse, continued to reap huge rewards for his connections following their modest investment. Ironically, Waterhouse was the underbidder on Don Eduardo when he sold as a yearling. "[Carnegie Express] just continues to improve, he's very exciting," she said. But Lee Freedman, trainer of the runner-up, was equally pleased. "I was prepared that he could be beaten today, but his finishing burst was sensational," Freedman said. "He was run off at the corner and was balked when Pentastic came under his neck, but didn't he finish it off from a Derby point of view." The top two will meet again in the A\$2.5 million AJC Derby in a fortnight.

Collingrove Stud's decision to retrieve the stallion Scenic (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) from Western Australia this season was underscored when Lord Essex, winner of the G2 Phar Lap S., became the 16-year-old's seventh Group 1 winner here. Pandemonium reigned at Rosehill after a transformer exploded into flames, resulting in a power blackout that lasted an hour and left racegoers trapped in lifts before an auxiliary generator kicked in. But the one-hour delay did not impede Lord Essex from scoring his first Group 1 win after withstanding a furious late challenge from odds-on favorite Shogun Lodge to outstay that rival by a short half head. "Lord Essex is not really a weight-for-age horse, but...the rest of the field...are all back markers," said stable foreman Peter Snowden. "[Trainer John Hawkes] thought Lord Essex could lead and dictate terms and they would have a job running him down, and the tactic worked to a nicety." Lord Essex, a A\$17,500 weanling who later sold for A\$50,000 at the 1998 Gold Coast Magic Millions Sale, reportedly pulled up lame after the race, however, and if he is to make his next start in the G1 Doncaster H., he will require a vet certificate.

Four-time G1 Golden Slipper winning trainer Lee Freedman could have a runner in this year's edition of the A\$2.5 million race next Saturday. Freedman's Pillaging may have earned a Slipper berth after scoring a comprehensive three-length win here, but the gelding, a A\$45,000 Inglis Classic yearling, is more likely to target the A\$1 million Inglis Heroic Championship at Randwick. Third in the G1 Blue Diamond S. at Caulfield last time out, Pillaging recorded his third victory from five attempts with an easy front-running victory over Delago Brom. "It's a tough decision," said stable spokesman Michael Freedman. "If the Slipper was two weeks away, you would say he would definitely go, but backing up next week there is some concern. It may depend on how we would have to get him up there [to Sydney]." Pillaging's sire, Marauding, has already produced Slipper winners Burst (Aus) and Prowl (Aus).

Continental Red had won just four of his 38 previous starts and was without a stakes victory coming into this race, but the six-year-old was exiting a pair of near-miss performances. The winner of an optional-claiming event in his 2001 finale, the chestnut returned after a two-month break as a 13-1 outsider in the Jan. 21 GII San Marcos S. and was second, just a nose behind Irish Prize. Let go at 5-1 in the Feb. 16 GII San Luis Obispo H., he had the lead in deep stretch, but was caught in the final strides by Nazirali (Ire) and had to settle for second once again. The second choice of the crowd this time, the Cal-bred tracked longshot Speedy Pick through soft fractions, kicked it up a notch to join the frontrunner in the final furlong and proved gamest to the wire to take the four-way photo. "If ever there's a horse that deserves to win, it's this guy here," trainer Ian Jory said. "I was just a little worried that he might have lost the bob with [Keemoon]." He added, "I guess the San Juan Capistrano [Apr. 21] is the next logical spot. I don't think distance is a problem for him." Keemoon, taking on the boys in her first start since finishing 11th in the Sept. 30 GI Beverly D. over a boggy Arlington course, finished full of run to just miss. She could be back for the 1 3/4-mile San Juan Capistrano as well, or may ship to Keeneland for the GIII Bewitch S. Apr. 25. GI Hollywood Derby winner Denon (Pleasant Colony), the even-money favorite despite a fifth-place finish in the San Luis Obispo last time out, was off a bit awkwardly and raced wide throughout before finishing a lackluster fifth.

No Slip, winner of the GII Oak Tree Derby at Santa Anita in his second start after arriving from France, ended 2001 with a solid fourth despite getting boxed in late in the Dec. 30 GII San Gabriel H. Off at 18-1 in his 2002 debut, the Mar. 2 GII Kilroe H., he found himself caught in traffic at the three-eighths pole and could do no better than ninth. The even-money chalk this time, the bay was last of the tightly bunched quintet through the opening half, but came with a four-wide bid at the top of the lane and responded to jockey Kent Desormeaux in the final drive to win going away. "They were going slow early and I ran into some traffic on the [first turn] and had to take a strong hold of him," Desormeaux said. "He settled right back into a canter like a pro and when I got him outside on the backstretch he moved right into contention. A modest \$55,000 OBSFEB juvenile purchase, Ethan Man made his debut at Churchill Downs Oct. 28 and dueled to a 1 1/2-length victory over subsequent GII Louisiana Derby runner-up Easyfromthegitgo. The bay was put away after fading to third in a Nov. 23 allowance test at the Louisville oval, but came back with a powerful six-length score in a Gulfstream allowance race Feb. 2. Odds-on to make it two in a row in his first stakes attempt, the Triple Crown nominee settled in third as outsider Vinemeister (Williamstown) led through the opening quarter. He moved to challenge after a half in :44.66 and easily held off Listen Here. "It was a strong performance and I couldn't be happier," trainer Pat Byrne said. "It was an important race...and now it's time for the next step up." The colt will join the Kentucky Derby trail. "I'll send him around two turns--I'm looking at either the [GI Toyota Blue Grass S., Apr. 13] or the [GII Coolmore Lexington S., Apr. 20]," Byrne said. "I don't know whether he is a mile-and-a-quarter horse, but, if he is, the Kentucky Derby is in the picture. He may be just a good miler. We'll find out." Vinemeister tired badly and was eased.

Mayakovsky hasn't raced since suffering a hairline fracture in his left hind leg last autumn, but showed plenty of promise prior to that. "He's worked fast, but he's been very relaxed," a cautiously optimistic Biancone said. "It's a tough field and going a mile off a long layoff won't be easy, but the one turn may help him." **Saarland** is likely to be Mayakovsky's chief rival, but he's coming off an extended respite as well. After a disappointing eighth-place finish in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Belmont last October, the son of Unbridled rebounded with a neck score against Nokoma in the GII Remsen S. at Aqueduct Nov. 24. For his effort, he was rewarded with a four-month vacation, making his sophomore bow here. Trainer Shug McGaughey is also optimistic about his colt's chances in the Gotham. "He's had time to develop," he said. "He's grown a lot since last year. I'm hoping he relaxes and comes with a good run through the stretch." For those handicappers looking for a longshot, they may find their horse in **Tank's Expectation**. Coming off a second-place finish against Smooth Jazz in the Best Turn S. at Aqueduct Feb. 23, the gelding likes to be near the front and, in the event of a misfire from the big names, he could still be there at the wire to cash in.

TATTS DROP LITIGATION

Tattersalls have dropped their litigation against Hong Kong-based trainer Ivan Allan and bloodstock agent Anthony Stroud, it was announced yesterday. Tattersalls' writ involved the non-payment of a Darshaan (GB) colt knocked down for 450,000 guineas at 2000 October sales in Newmarket. Allan disputed that the yearling had been sold on the eve of the auction to a third party, and therefore was not the property of the vendor listed in the sales catalogue. After a lengthy process, the sales company has agreed terms with all parties, including the payment of Allan's costs for upkeep and insurance for the colt, as well as covering his legal costs. Allan told *PA Sport* yesterday: "I have been a genuine buyer of yearlings for 25 years on a worldwide scale and I have no desire to be shafted by a sting. I could not believe that Tattersalls were prepared to condone such clandestine behaviour."

CLUB LOOK INTO STALLS FARCE

Following the fault of Wolverhampton's starting stalls on Friday, the Jockey Club have approached Racetech to issue a full report. Friday's incident, where several stalls failed to open, served as the latest of a series of recent starting stalls malfunctions. Jockey Club spokesman John Maxse told *PA Sport* yesterday: "It is fair to say that it comes on the back of an almost unprecedented number of technical faults in recent weeks. It is very frustrating for participants and punters alike--a very worrying trend. The operation of the stalls is contracted out to Racetech and they will deliver a detailed report to us. We will be seeking assurances that this will be the last in a line of what I can only describe as a 'London bus' syndrome of problems."
