Mayakovsky (Matty G) hadn't been out since finishing second in the GI Hopeful S. back on Sept. 1, but the dark bay had no trouble shaking off the dust. Sent

off the 8-5 favorite in the GIII Gotham S. at Aqueduct yesterday, the eye-catching colt broke well, went right to the front and was left to his own devices, dashing through six furlongs in a sparkling 1:09 2/5 before drawing off in the final quarter to beat **Saarland** (Unbridled) by a handy 3 3/4 lengths despite drifting out in the final sixteenth. "He got to playing around a bit at the end--he's done that before," jockey Edgar Prado said. "If something had taken a run at us, he would have given me more." The race could put Mayakovsky in the thick of the Triple Crown fray. "Tonight, I am going to dream about the Derby," trainer Patrick Biancone said. "Maybe tomorrow, when I wake up, I can change my mind. He is going back to California Tuesday morning. If we decide to go on the Dreby trail, we will send him back for the Wood Memorial [GII, Apr. 13]." Saarland, making his first start since taking the Nov. 24 GII Remsen S., will also target the Wood. "This race gives me a lot of confidence," trainer Shug McGaughey said. "We knew if Mayakovsky got an easy lead, he wasn't going to be easy to catch. But I liked the way [Saarland] was close to the pace, and he finished up good. This is what he needed, both physically and mentally."

SIPHONIC SETTLES FOR THIRD IN SAN FELIPE

Siphonic (Siphon {Brz}) was sent off the 2-5 favorite in yesterday's GII San Felipe S., but couldn't live up to the role. The bay took the lead as they headed into the stretch, but could not hold off a resurgent **Medaglia d'Oro** (El Prado {Ire}), who went on to win by 2 1/2 lengths, with **USS Tinosa** (Foxhound) coming on for second. *(More on the Story, p2)*

MEDAGLIA STRIKES GOLD IN STAKES DEBUT

Medaglia d'Oro (El Prado {Ire}) had started just twice before, but he looked anything but inexperienced in the GII San Felipe S. at Santa Anita. The dark bay, second in a Dec. 7 Turfway Park maiden race in his lone start at two, was coming off a 4 1/4-length victory in a six-furlong test at Oaklawn Park Feb. 9 for trainer David

Vance. Making his first start since switching to the barn of 2001 Eclipse winner Bobby Frankel, the Kentucky-bred was sent right to the front and cut out the early fractions. Odds-on **Siphonic** (Siphon {Brz}) came at him after a half in :46 4/5, forging to the front as they raced around the far turn, but

Medaglia d'Oro battled back from the inside, gaining the advantage once again in the stretch and drawing clear. **USS Tinosa** (Foxhound), never far from the front, also drove past the tiring favorite to get second, with Siphonic no better than third best on the day. "Well, I knew the horse could run, but I didn't know if he was going to be ready today against these horses," winning jockey Laffit Pincay Jr. said. "When Siphonic started driving by him at the five-eighths pole, I let him go. I took my time and hoped for the best and sure enough, I got through on the rail and he finished very well, like a very good horse. The good thing is, he's still got a lot of room to improve. He might be a really top horse." Frankel said the colt could make his next start in the Apr. 13 GI Toyota Blue Grass S. at Keeneland. And what happened to Siphonic? "He broke well, felt good and I had him in a comfortable position," jockey Jerry Bailey said. "He made the lead pretty easily and...turning for home, I thought I had a lot of horse. But Pincay's horse ran up in there again and [USS Tinosa] came to me from the outside and I really had nothing left." Added trainer David Hofmans, "I think he just got tired. He was rubber-legged and just didn't finish. We'll scope him to see if anything went wrong and re-evaluate where we're going from here." Jerry Hollendorfer, the trainer of the runner-up, is leaving his options open. "I have several things planned," he said. "The Santa Anita Derby [GI, Apr. 6] is one option. We'll just have to wait and see what happens."

Equality, a maiden winner at Delaware Park in his first start at two Oct. 24, made his three-year-old bow in a Jan. 9 allowance test at Gulfstream Park and finished fifth, eight lengths behind Stephentown. The gray was entered in a turf allowance next time out Feb. 11, but was sent off at 4-5 when the race was moved to the main track and cruised to an impressive 16 1/2-length score. Trying stakes company for the first time, the Pin Oak colorbearer was off a step slowly, but recovered quickly to sit just behind pacesetter Political Attack through honest splits. He took over after five furlongs and held Tails of the Crypt safe down the lane for a decisive victory. But trainer Graham Motion was not looking to throw his hat into the Triple Crown ring immediately. "This is the first time we've won a Derby, so we're going to take some time and let it sink in," he said. "He might have won a place in one of the [Kentucky Derby] prep races. [Jockey Ramon Dominguez] doesn't think distance is going to be a problem, so the [GI Toyota Blue Grass, Apr. 13] may be a nice race. He's a maturing horse and is really getting it together now." Added owner Josephine Abercrombie, "He showed us what he was made of, and we are very pleased. He's certainly one of the best we've ever had." Previously undefeated Bunk N Ted (Belong to Me), sent off the 2-1 choice, made a middle move, but came up empty in the drive and finished fifth.

Harlan's Holiday Headed to Keeneland:

GI Florida Derby winner **Harlan's Holiday** (Harlan) will likely make his next start in the Apr. 13 GI Toyota Blue Grass at Keeneland, said trainer Ken McPeek, who is in the process of formulating plans for his top three-year-olds. GI Louisiana Derby winner **Repent** (Louis Quatorze) is scheduled to run next in the Apr. 6 GI Illinois Derby at Sportsman's Park and sophomore filly **Take Charge Lady** (Dehere) is still on schedule for the Apr. 6 GI Ashland at Keeneland. "The Blue Grass should be a good spot for Harlan's Holiday," McPeek said. "He'll already be at Churchill Downs, so we won't have to ship far, and he has run a couple of times over the track." McPeek may have to find a new rider for Repent. Jerry Bailey, who rode the colt in Louisiana, also rides **Siphonic** (Siphon {Brz}), who was scheduled to compete in the GI Santa Anita Derby on the same day as the Illinois Derby. McPeek said that he has had discussions with Pat Day about riding Repent if the mount is available, and he wouldn't rule out going back to Tony D'Amico.

Booklet Ready for Rematch:

Booklet (Notebook), who posted the fastest half-mile in Florida Derby history, dashing through the opening four furlongs in :45 1/5 before tiring to finish fourth, will go after arch rival Harlan's Holiday once again at Keeneland. "He came out of the race in great shape and, if everything goes as planned, we'll run him next in the Blue Grass," trainer John Ward Jr. said.

An Excuse for High Star:

High Star (Private Terms), who finished eighth in \$1 million Florida Derby, had an excuse for his disappointing performance, according to trainer Nick Zito. "He bled in the race," Zito said. "He bled pretty good. The first thing I have to do is fix the problem, then I'll worry about where and when he runs next."

Clean Bill of Health for Came Home:

Came Home (Gone West), who underwent a precautionary nuclear scan Friday after getting cast in his stall Tuesday night, was given a clean bill of health after the exam. The colt, a winner of five of his six starts including the Mar. 2 GI San Rafael S., was back on the track Saturday morning for a routine gallop.

Ivan Allan, who has a knack of winning Hong Kong's best races, picked up his third Hong Kong Derby victory here. Purchased with the Derby as his main target, Olympic Express was sent out as a warm favorite after dominating his opposition last time in the Classic Mile. Settling behind horses while racing midfield this time, he traveled easily before being asked for his best by South African jockey Weichong Marwing. "He really let down like a special horse when I asked him," Marwing said. "I always felt that he would run the distance right out to the wire, but you are never certain when it is their first time to step up to the trip as it was today. I've now won seven Derbies, six in South Africa and now my first here." Allan, who had earlier saddled Firebolt (Ire) to take the G1 Centenary Sprint Cup, has big plans for his Derby winner. "He was only 80 percent last time and you saw what he did and now he has beaten the best of his age here," the trainer said. "He deserves a chance in our QE II in April and when the big guns come to town, they better be at their best." The Apr. 21 Audemars Piguet Queen Elizabeth II Cup is the second leg of the Emirates World Series. The winner raced under the name Ecclesiastical for trainer James Fanshawe in Britain last year and was second in the Britannia H. at Royal Ascot. Second favorite Precision, ridden by Michael Kinane, stayed well after rallying from off the pace to be second. "He did everything right in the run, but the winner was just too good on the day--not many would have gone with that winner," Kinane said. Irish-bred import Firebolt started his Asian campaign the greatest way possible, winning this in his first Hong Kong appearance. Having raced in England under the name Volata, he had built a reputation as a high-grade horse with wins in the Listed Weatherbys Gen. Studbook H. and the G3 Chipchase S. and a creditable eighth behind Mozart (Ire) in the G1 Darley July Cup last summer. Starting quickly from a center gate, he went right with the frontrunners, then broke away to lead by two lengths before the 200-meter mark. The winner fought on genuinely to the wire with Frankie Dettori aboard. "He has natural pace and, although he was getting a little tired, I like the way he fought it out right to the line," Dettori stated. Ivan Allan, who purchased the horse especially for Hong Kong's big sprint races, was thrilled with the win. "To do that first out shows what a classy type of horse he is, and to hold off All Thrill Too shows that he is going to be a major force in all of our best races," he said. The 3-2 favorite to carry her speed all the way this time, she set a pressured pace and pulled clear in the final drive for her first graded score. "It was just a matter of getting a nice comfortable lead," jockey Ramon Dominguez, who also took the GIII Tampa Bay Derby yesterday, said. "Turning for home, I kept up the pressure and she always had a little left." Added trainer Steve Standrige, "Obviously, we're real happy today, and she's young and getting even better. There are a lot of options now for her. I think we'll pick our spots and do real nicely with her."

Still looking for his first Group 1 success here, the sophomore settled into an easy lead early and held the advantage all the way to an impressive five-length score.

☆ **DUBAI WORLD CUP** ☆

Rio Ready for Gold:

Captain Rio (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) was reported on course for the \$2 million G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen by trainer Richard Whitaker yesterday. The three-year-old, who will face older horses in the six-furlong dirt contest, was the impressive eight-length winner of the G2 Criterium de Maisons-Laffitte in October, which earned him the honour of joint top-weighted British-trained juvenile colt on 119 pounds in the 2001 International Classifications. He comes off a fourth-place finish behind fellow Shaheen candidate **Conroy** (Gone West) at Nad Al Sheba Mar. 2. "Captain Rio was only 90 percent fit when fourth to Conroy last time," Whitaker said. "We might reverse the form with Conroy, but the Americans are going to be hard to beat. I don't expect we will be able to lay up with **Xtra Heat** (Dixieland Heat), though I am more worried about our inexperience rather than the opposition." He added, "We purposely came over on Feb. 1 to get properly acclimatized. He worked beautifully Monday morning, covering the last three furlongs in :34.6 seconds, though we never train by the clock back home." The colt clocked three furlongs in :35.07 yesterday morning and will have a final bit of work Wednesday.

Del Mar Show Tours Nad Al Sheba Turf:

Meshaheer (USA), Firebreak (GB), Henri Lebasque (Ire) and the other 'Europeans' could be good enough for the [G1] French or the [G1] Italian Guineas!"
