

MEDAGLIA D'ORO HEADED TO WOOD

Medaglia d'Oro (El Prado {Ire}), who scored the upset in Sunday's GII San Felipe S., will make his next start in the Apr. 13 GII Wood Memorial at Aqueduct, trainer Bobby Frankel reported yesterday. Following the San Felipe, Frankel had indicated he was leaning toward the GI Toyota Blue Grass at Keeneland, but said yesterday, "I like the racetrack at Aqueduct, though Keeneland is a speed-favoring track, which would also be good for us. But it's New York and I always like to

take care of my man [New York Racing Association Racing Secretary] Mike Lakow." Frankel added he wasn't surprised by Medaglia d'Oro's win, which came in his first start for the Frankel barn. "I just wanted him to run a good race and he ran a great race," he said. "The only question in my mind was whether or not he'd get the distance. You never know that until you run them."

CORRECTION RE: TATTERSALLS LIMITED VS IVAN ALLAN AND ANTHONY STROUD BLOODSTOCK:

Several items were misreported in a story in the Sunday, Mar. 17 edition of the *Thoroughbred Daily News* regarding the litigation of Tattersalls against defendants Ivan Allan and Anthony Stroud Bloodstock over the sale of lot 738 at the 2000 Tattersalls October Yearling Sale. The *TDN* incorrectly reported that, under the terms of the settlement, Tattersalls had paid Allan's legal costs. In fact, before the current settlement terms were reached, Tattersalls had been required to pay simply the costs of appeal while Allan was ordered to pay the costs of changing his defense after it had not been accepted at the application for Summary Judgment. Also, contrary to our report, the costs of keeping the colt and the colt's insurance have not been met by Tattersalls. Under the terms of the settlement, the vendor, whose critical illness would have prevented attendance at the scheduled trial, reached agreement with Allan to take back the horse.

Royal Tryst Wins World Cup Trial:

Royal Tryst (Kingmambo) took on three stablemates in a work out of the starting gate at Nad Al Sheba yesterday morning and proved much the best, cruising to the finish line eight lengths ahead of his rivals to complete the six-furlong trial in 1:13.75. Trainer John Sadler was looking to boost the confidence of his G1 Dubai World Cup candidate, who was the runner-up in the second round of the Maktoum Challenge and third in the first and third races in the series. Jockey Craig Williams was aboard for the breeze. Sadler saddled State Shinto (Pleasant Colony) to a fourth-place finish in the 2001 World Cup; the six-year-old will be back for this year's edition of the \$6 million event, but this time is under the care of trainer Saeed bin Suroor.

Canani Smiling After Val Royal Breeze:

Trainer Julio Canani was all smiles after watching his G1 Dubai Duty Free H. hopeful Val Royal (Fr) (Royal Academy) work yesterday morning. With jockey Gerard Melancon in the irons, the GI Breeders' Cup Mile hero went five furlongs in 1:00.66 at Nad Al Sheba. "This horse does everything so easily," Canani said. "He went nice. It's better to come out with something left inside than to go too fast." The six-year-old galloped out six furlongs in 1:13.98. In his one start since the Breeders' Cup, Val Royal was fourth, beaten a half-length, in the Mar. 2 GII Frank E. Kilroe Mile H.

Men's Exclusive Preps for Golden Shaheen:

MGSW Men's Exclusive (Exclusive Ribot) had his final prep for the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen yesterday morning, going a half-mile before dawn in Dubai. Blake Heap, assistant to trainer Wesley Ward, timed the move in :46.20. The nine-year-old gelding was second in this race last year, but Heap said, "He's doing a lot better this year. He's eating more and drinking more water this time. Everything is going very well with him right now."

Since finishing second in his debut last August, Tanino Gimlet had won four in a row, including a string of three straight Group victories. Coming off a win in the Feb. 23 G3 Arlington Cup, the bay raced near the back of the pack early, angled to the outside for the drive and overtook Telegnosis late. "I was worried for a moment because I couldn't find an opening," admitted jockey Hirofumi Shii. "But he showed an impressive turn of foot to win the Arlington Cup last time out, so I trusted in him and he did it." Tanino Gimlet will now be aimed for the Apr. 14 G1 Satsuki Sho.

PEDIGREE INSIGHTS

Nearly three years ago, when reporting on Menifee's victory in the GI Blue Grass S., I commented in this column that breeders must be wishing they had made fuller use of his sire Harlan, who had succumbed to a ruptured aorta a few weeks earlier.

The bare facts of the matter were that the number of live foals by the 1994 Vosburgh S. winner amounted to only 30 in 1996, 18 in '97, 17 in '98 and 28 in '99, giving Harlan a not-so-grand total of 93 foals in four completed seasons at Stone Farm. Considering that these foals were sired at the modest fee of \$5,000, it is remarkable that Harlan has now come up with a second son, Harlan's Holiday, who appears to have an excellent chance in the Triple Crown events. Menifee, you'll remember, followed up his Blue Grass triumph with strong seconds to Charismatic at Churchill Downs and Pimlico before failing to stay at Belmont. He went on to win the GI Haskell Invitational at 1 1/8 miles.

Will the consistent Harlan's Holiday prove similarly effective over 1 1/4 miles? The way he finished in the GI Florida Derby certainly suggested that he has every chance of staying the Kentucky Derby trip, even though he is by a sprinting son of Storm Cat. Although Harlan gained his only stakes success in 30 starts at seven furlongs, it's worth remembering that he twice won over 1 1/16 miles and that he had a fair amount of staying blood in the bottom half of his pedigree. His dam Country Romance, third in the Canadian Oaks over 1 1/8 miles, was by Halo, the sire of two Derby winners, and his second dam, Sweet Romance, was by Gun Bow, a top-class winner at up to 1 1/2 miles.

With a background like this, there was always a chance that Harlan would sire the occasional horse who stayed better than himself, given mares with some stamina in their make-up. Harlan's Holiday's dam, Christmas in Aiken, is just such a mare. She has the advantage of being a winning daughter of the great Affirmed, who still holds the distinction of being the last Triple Crown winner.

The next dam, the Claiborne-bred Dowager, was a lightly raced daughter of the champion juvenile Honest Pleasure, who started a hot favorite for the 1976 Kentucky Derby on the strength of victories in the Flamingo S., Florida Derby and Blue Grass S. Although Honest Pleasure went down by a length to Bold Forbes on the big day, he later confirmed that he stayed 1 1/4 miles well by winning the Travers S. in record time.

Another record breaker over 1 1/4 miles is Harlan's Holiday's third dam, Princessnesian. This very talented mare set new figures when she won a division of the Santa Barbara H. by eight lengths and she later defeated the males over the same distance, coming with a powerful late run to take the Hollywood Gold Cup.

Of course this is an extremely good family. As a daughter of Princequillo and Alanesian, Princessnesian was a sister to Quillesian, dam of that outstanding filly Revidere, and she was also a half-sister to Boldnesian (grandsire of Seattle Slew) and to Stay At Home (dam of the top Irish colts Home Guard and Boone's Cabin). Princessnesian's best winner was Lords, a winner at Group 2 and Group 3 level over 1 1/2 miles in Ireland, and two of her daughters, Bold Enchantress and Passing Fancy, also produced Group winners in Ireland.

The Dowager branch of this family hadn't made a significant contribution to the family fortunes until Harlan's Holiday came along, and Christmas in Aiken changed hands for as little as \$15,000 as an in-foal five-year-old. Christmas in Aiken's mates in 1999 and 2000 were Railway Cat and Spirit Voices, two non-stakes-winning stallions based in Ohio at the Double D Farm Corp where Harlan's Holiday was bred. I don't know which stallion Christmas in Aiken is visiting this year, but I'd guess he has a much higher profile.

DU PONT MILLS DIES Alice duPont Mills, owner of Hickory Tree Farm, died last Wednesday, according to *Thoroughbred Times*. She was 88. Hickory Tree Farm in Middleburg, Virginia, bred and raced Believe It, third in the 1978 Kentucky Derby and Preakness, as well as champion juvenile Devil's Bag and Grade I winner Gone West. A member of the Virginia Thoroughbred Association, Mills was named the state's outstanding owner and breeder by the Virginia Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association in 1991. A pioneer aviatrix, duPont Mills was the daughter of Felix duPont, a majority shareholder of chemical giant E.I. DuPont de Nemours & Co. She was predeceased by her husband James P Mills.
