TEAM GODOLPHIN READIES FOR BIG DAY

Just days before welcoming the racing world to its backyard, team Godolphin held an open house, inviting media members covering the Dubai World Cup meeting at Nad al Sheba Saturday to watch its horses finalize preparations for the big day. "This is our way of thanking the media for all the work they have done with the coverage of our horses throughout the year," explained Godolphin Racing Manager Simon Crisford. One of the most watched Godolphin runners is Arc winner **Sakhee** (Bahri). After watching his charge work on Wednesday, trainer Saeed bin Suroor said, "I was very happy with the work and he has come on well; we couldn't be happier with him. He's ready." Bin Suroor's confidence was echoed by Crisford. "We are focused on the next few days and feel that our team is going to perform at the level required," he said. "We may also provide some answers for our Kentucky Derby chances this year after the running of the \$2-million UAE Derby. We had 19 colts in the list for the Kentucky Derby and if you look at the results in the lead-up races in America so far, there is not just one or two high-profile names that have clearly emerged. We now have a small select team and our chances of success in Kentucky should be clear after Saturday's event for three-year-olds." Godolphin has six entries in the UAE Derby, including \$2.3-million yearling and GII Norfolk winner **Essence of Dubai** (Pulpit). On the absence of the world's other racing superpower Coolmore, Crisford said, "We all have a lot of horses in training, but maybe they just don't have the right type of horse to bring here to Dubai." Sounds like a challenge.

There has been concern over how Japanese invader **Agnes Digital** (Crafty Prospector) handled the trip to Dubai, but trainer

Toshiaki Shirai remains confident. "He had lost some condition, but he is getting better every day and it just took a little longer to get over the trip than what would be considered normal. I have confidence in my horse." The five-year-old chestnut has captured his last five starts, including the G1 Hong Kong Cup over 10 furlongs on turf Dec. 16 and the G1 February S. going a mile on dirt at Tokyo Racecourse Feb. 17.

Meanwhile, Sakhee's jockey Frankie Dettori has named Agnes Digital as his mount's biggest rival. "The Japanese horses will be hardest to beat and Agnes Digital is the one I fear most," Dettori said. "Agnes Digital is in winning form and at his best he defeated Japan Cup winner TM Opera O (Jpn). Sakhee is the best racehorse in the world, but he is going to need to run at his best to beat these tough Japanese horses." Coral Eurobet quote the Dettori as 6-4 to ride two winners on the World Cup card, 9-4 to ride just one and 5-1 to draw a blank at the meeting.

APPROVAL FOR LINGFIELD RACE The British Horseracing Board has granted approval for a new race to be run at Lingfield Park on Apr. 6. To be run on Grand National Day, the one-mile conditions event will be worth £50,000 and will be open to three-year-olds. The race, to be run over Lingfield's Polytrack surface, has been targeted as a possible Kentucky Derby prep for juvenile champion **Johannesburg** (Hennessy). "This is tremendous news and we are delighted that the racing planning department have agreed with our proposals," said Arena's Director of Racing Ian Renton. "Furthermore we are thrilled to announce that we have secured the backing of a major international brand name in Foster's, who have agreed to sponsor the race."

GODOLPHIN ANNOUNCES EMIRATES SPONSORSHIP Godolphin has announced a multi-million sponsorship agreement with Emirate Airlines. Under the terms of the deal, Godolphin horses will carry the new Fly Emirates logo. The logo will also be displayed on all other livery of the Godolphin Group. The Emirates Airline recently discontinued its sponsorship of the World Series Racing Championship. "It was a three-year deal acting as the sponsor for the World Series and it served our purpose, but we want to go in a different way now," said Emirate Airlines' executive Boutros Boutros. "We still continue to support the racing industry with sponsorship of many of the world's bigger events, but with Godolphin horses present in almost 60-70 of the world's biggest horses races, we felt that we could get the desired exposure in this manner."

SPRINGS SALE A colt from the first crop of GI Breeders' Cup Classic hero Awesome Again (Deputy Minister) brought a bid of \$80,000 from Sue Leslie to top the inaugural Adena Springs Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training conducted by the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company yesterday afternoon. The dark bay colt, a registered Canadian-bred, was produced by Opinionated Lady (Known Fact), a half-sister to stakes winners Zuno Star and Pastourelles. Another Breeders' Cup Classic winner, Alphabet Soup sired the second-highest lot, a \$75,000 son of SW Dial a Song (Mining). Francis McDonnell purchased the Kentucky-bred chestnut. Hollywood President's Daughter Killed:

Jillian Baedecker, the daughter of Hollywood Park President Rich Baedecker, was killed in a car accident in Huntington Beach, California, on Wednesday. The 19-year-old was one of three teenagers who died when their car was broadsided by a second driver who allegedly ran a red light. The second driver was arrested at the scene on suspicion of felony drunk driving and was hospitalized in critical condition Wednesday night. One of the two other passengers in the car with Ms. Baedecker was also pronounced dead at the scene while the third passenger died eight hours later.

WRITERS UP

REID'S ON A ROLL

Mark Reid isn't the first bloodstock agent to discover and buy a horse in training with untapped potential who wound up delivering. He won't be the last. But no one in his business is on a better run, which Reid attributes to the experience he gained during his long training career, his willingness to look beyond a horse's pedigree and his association with Hall of Fame trainer Bobby Frankel. And no one has taken a more irregular path to the bloodstock profession.

Under ordinary circumstances, **Medaglia d'Oro** (El Prado)'s victory in Sunday's San Felipe at Santa Anita would have been a stunning form reversal. Though the colt had showed some potential, he had merely won a six-furlong maiden special weight race at Oaklawn Park before jumping into Grade II company. But his 2 ½-length win was just the latest case of Frankel, Reid and owner Edward Gann teaming up to snare a graded stakes with a recent purchase who, quite frankly, didn't look all that good on paper.

On behalf of Gann and Frankel, Reid also discovered and purchased **You** (You and I), who has since won three Grade I stakes; and **Labamta Babe** (Skywalker), who upset Siphonic in the GII Santa Catalina before being sidelined with a suspensory injury. All three raced in the Midwest, have modest pedigrees and had never so much as run in a stakes race before switching to the Frankel barn.

Reid was a successful trainer on the New Jersey and Pennsylvania tracks for over 25 years, and his accomplishments include winning 216 races in 1992 and developing the top sprinter Mr. Nickerson. But it was the death of Mr. Nickerson in the 1990 Breeders' Cup Sprint that started to sour Reid on his profession.

"It bothered me greatly," he said. "I just kept going back and sitting at my desk and saying, 'This business is terrible.' You can do everything right and still get the wrong answer. He had trained beautifully up to the race. He had run his whole career without a drop of Lasix. He was drug free. He was sound. Ben Walden already had him booked to 40 some mares. All he had to do was make it around there alive. It bothered me for a long, long time."

Growing further disillusioned when he found that no matter how many races he won, purse earnings never seemed to keep up with costs, he walked away from the game in 1995 to open up an air conditioning and heating business in Berlin, New Jersey. But he soon discovered that being a working stiff wasn't the answer, either.

Reid launched a comeback in 1998, but said he no longer had the drive and determination to build up a large stable, so he headed down still another career path and created Rancocas Valley Bloodstock.

"I have the benefit of having trained a large stable," he said. "I've had as many as 120 horse at a time and have seen a lot of horses and a lot of races. No matter who you are, you have to absorb a lot in that situation. There are things in a horse I can live with and things that I can't live with. That comes from experience."

He had a few success stories early on, like **Good Game** (Fly Till Dawn), who was bought for Will Farish and won the 2000 GIII Valley View S. at Keeneland. But the best was yet to come.

"I want a rugged, physical horse," he said. "The horse doesn't have to be perfect, but the overall picture has to be that this is the horse I'd take in a street fight. Of course, I want an attractive head, straight legs and all that, but I'm also looking for the kind that looks to me like a real race horse. I look for a horse that I think is rugged enough that they can stick around, which is especially important in a day and age where there are so many frail horses."

Pedigrees?

"It's not that important, particularly with Frankel," he said. "He's looking for an athlete. Of course pedigrees are important, but it's more important that the horse is fast and is a nice physical specimen and has a big future. That's much more important than if a horse is by a fashionable sire out of a fashionable dam."

Of course, Reid's success stories could not have happened if not for Frankel and his Midas touch.

"Somebody asked me how do I do it?" he said. "It's a real tough thing. I spend a lot of money for a good prospect and hand them to Frankel. He's a genius, a great horse trainer."

Medaglia d'Oro will run next in the GI Wood Memorial at Aqueduct and then will shoot for the Kentucky Derby. Even Reid never thought this horse could come so far so fast or emerge as an overnight Derby contender. But these things happen, at least when you have the hottest touch in the game. *Courtesy ESPN.com*

Istabraq will be shipped to County Limerick where he will begin his retirement at the Martinstown home of his owner JP McManus. In yesterday's statement, O'Brien said: "Istabraq has given us wonderful memories to cherish and all who were associated with him feel especially privileged. We would like to thank all who sent letters, cards and messages of goodwill. The outpouring of affection and appreciation for him has been overwhelming."

The 11-time champion jockey told *PA Sport*: "I have been riding out but this is the first time I have ridden in a race for four months. I used to go to Hong Kong in the winter but I packed that in a couple of years ago to come back fresh." Also off the mark quickly was Johnny Murtagh, who travelled from Ireland to ride handicap topweight **Manorson (Ire)** (Desert King {Ire}) to success in the fifth race on the card.
