FIVE ENTERED IN GULFSTREAM PARK 'CAP

A small but talented field of five has been entered for Saturday's GI Gulfstream Park H. and four of those five entrants already have Grade I victories on their re-

sumes. The 6-5 favorite is 2000 GI Preakness winner **Red Bullet** (Unbridled). The five-year-old is still looking for his first stakes win since the Preakness. In his most recent outing, he overcame a troubled trip to finish second in the GI Donn H. at Gulfstream Feb. 9. He was subsequently disqualified and placed

fourth. "There was no doubt in my mind that he was the best horse in the Donn," commented trainer Joe Orseno. "To overcome the bad start he had, then he had trouble in the backstretch and he still almost won the race." The Donn winner **Mongoose** (Broad Brush), who defeated Kentucky Derby winner Monarchos in a Jan. 19 Gulfstream allowance, is unbeaten in two starts this year and was installed the 2-1 second choice on the morning line. Local hero **Hal's Hope** (Jolie's Halo), winner of the 2000 GI Florida Derby, is 4-1 on the morning line. The five-year-old is coming off an authoritative 2 1/4-length win in the Mar. 10 GIII Creme Fraiche. "It certainly won't be any piece of cake," admitted owner-trainer-breeder Harold Rose. "But he's doing fine lately."

SMOK'N FROLIC OUT OF TRAINING Dogwood Stable's **Smok'n Frolic** (Smoke Glacken), one of the top two-year-old fillies of 2001, has been taken out of training for 30 days after bleeding during a recent workout in Florida. "There are numerous opportunities for three-year-old fillies during the fall and summer months, so every precaution is being taken to make sure we're in good shape for the rest of the year," said Dogwood President Cot Campbell. Winner of the GII Demoiselle S. last winter and second in the GI Spinaway S., the grey filly is expected to rejoin trainer Todd Pletcher's stable Apr. 20 and will be pointed towards the GI Acorn S. at Belmont Park June 7.

AT THE THRESHOLD DEAD **At the Threshold** (Norcliffe--Winver, by Vertex), sire of 1992 Kentucky Derby winner Lil E. Tee, died last Saturday at Purdue University School of Veterinary Medicine in West Lafayette, Indiana, according to *The Blood-Horse*. The 21-year-old stallion apparently suffered a stroke. Purchased by W. Cal Partee as a two-year-old in 1983, **At the Threshold** won the 1984 editions of the GI American Derby, GI Arlington Classic, GII Ohio Derby and GIII Jim Beam S. He was third in that year's Kentucky Derby. He began his stud career at Southland Farm in Ocala, Florida and most recently stood at Stoney Creek Farm in Indiana. In addition to Lil E. Tee, **At the Threshold** also sired stakes winners Seahawk Gold, Gateway South, No Comment Baby and Darla's Rush.

TRIPLE CROWN NOMS DUE SATURDAY Late nominations to this year's Visa Triple Crown races are due Saturday. The late nomination fee is \$6,000, which qualifies horses for all three races. The early nomination period, which ended Jan. 19, attracted 405 nominees. Nomination fees become part of the \$1-million guaranteed purse for each race. The 2002 Kentucky Derby will be run on May 4. The Preakness follows on May 18 and the Belmont will be run on June 8.

ESSAYONS (c, 3, Deputy Minister--Strategic Maneuver {MGISW, \$414,340}, by Cryptoclearance) stamped himself a horse to watch with an eye-catching victory. Second to subsequent Whirlaway S. runner-up Smoked Em in his Dec. 16 bow over the inner, the Brushwood homebred was last seen when a troubled third as the favorite in a Gulfstream maiden Feb. 2. A 1/2 to Isihguru (Danzig), GSW-Ire, \$114,781, the 2-5 chalk set an even pace along the inside before sprinting away from his four overmatched rivals leaving the far turn to score by 15 1/4 lengths. "He caught a wet, heavy and deep track at Gulfstream, but he's been training well down here at Payson Park," winning trainer John Kimmel said from Florida. "It looks like he'll stay the distance. We'll look for an allowance and then possibly the [GII] Peter Pan S. if he continues to move forward." The final time was 1 3/5 seconds faster than Sunday Break's winning mark on Wednesday. Web Site to Feature Equine Research Projects:
 EquineResearch.net, a cooperative effort between the Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation, the American Quarter Horse Association, the Morris Animal Foundation and the American Association of Equine Practitioners, will make details of current equine research available to the public. Currently, 76 projects are listed and described in layman's terms on the web site. "This joint effort grew out of our four organizations having annual meetings together," explained Edward Bowen, president of Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation. "We came to the realization that we could serve both the horse owner and the scientist by creating a quick, convenient way of letting them know what we all are doing in horse-related research." Research currently available on the site includes information on laminitis, colic, infectious diseases, athletic soundness, and reproductive issues.

Belterra Preps for Ashland:

Belterra (Unbridled), the promising filly who went undefeated in her two-year-old campaign last year, worked five furlongs in 1:02 2/5 at Churchill Downs Tuesday in advance of her next start in the GI Ashland S. at Keeneland Apr. 6. The winner of the GII Golden Rod S. in her final start last season, the bay suffered her first loss in the Mar. 15 GII Bonnie Miss S. at Gulfstream when she finished third behind front-running longshot **Dust Me Off** (With Approval). She is expected to face that rival as well as GII Fair Grounds Oaks heroine **Take Charge Lady** (Dehere) in next Saturday's race.

Cashel Castle Works for Lafayette:

Undefeated **Cashel Castle** (Silver Ghost) worked four furlongs in :49 4/5 at Hawthorne on Wednesday and remains on track for his next start in the seven-furlong GIII Lafayette S. at Keeneland Apr. 7. The winner of the Hoosier Juvenile S. last November, the grey made his belated three-year-old debut with an allowance victory going six furlongs at Sportsman's Park Mar. 17. "The idea has been to stretch him out-six furlongs, seven furlongs, one turn then two," trainer Chris Block told the *Chicago Sun-Times*. A solid performance in the Lafayette could earn the colt a start in the GIII Derby Trial Apr. 27, but Block is realistic about the future. "An optimal goal might be the Iowa Derby or one of the sprint classics out East later this summer, like the [GII] Riva Ridge S. or the [GI] King's Bishop S. The Preakness remains a possibility, although remote," the trainer added.

Purse Increase at Oaklawn:

Horses at Oaklawn Park will once again be running for more money after officials at the Arkansas track announced yesterday that purses will be boosted for the fourth time this meet. Beginning Mar. 30, all races except stakes events will see an increase of \$500. The success of the Instant Racing System and the off-track mutuel handle were cited as reasons for the jump, which will affect the final two weeks of Oaklawn's season. "We want to thank all the horsemen who have helped put on attractive programs through the season," said racing secretary Pat Pope.

LONGCHAMP CANCELLED Yesterday's opening day of Longchamp's Spring meeting was cancelled following a strike by employees of France Galop. As negotiations for better salaries and working conditions could not be finalized last week, France Galop's employees threatened to take action, determined to not let racing get underway. The weekend's features, the G3 Prix Edmond Blanc and the G2 Prix d'Harcourt, could be in jeopardy if an agreement is not reached before then. All employees gathered in the walking ring at 12:30 p.m. yesterday and met with France's Galop Director of Racing, Mr. Thierry Delegue. Delegue told those present, "I do not have the power to negotiate in the name of France Galop, but we can propose another round of talks on Tuesday if racing can take place today." Representatives of France Galop's workers declined almost immediately. Other proposals to meet today were also refused and France Galop's workers clearly indicated they wanted negotiations to take place immediately. Mr. Delegue argued that it was impossible and then had no other choice, but to call the race meeting off. Two Listed races, the Prix de Courcelles and Prix Lord Seymour, were due to take place, but have now been re-scheduled. The Prix de Courcelles will be run on this Sunday's card at Longchamp and the Prix Lord Seymour will be run on Saint-Cloud's Saturday card. The remaining races will be run on Monday at Fontainebleau without the support of PMU national betting.

IRELAND CLOSER TO ALL-WEATHER RACING

Five existing racecourses are believed to be under consideration to be the site for Ireland's first all-weather track, reports *Racing Post*. Horse Racing Ireland (HRI) is also considering the possibility of building a new course. HRI Chief Executive Brian Kavanagh told *Racing Post*: "I wrote to every course in the country to see which ones were actively looking at the idea of an all-weather track and I found that the ones considering it were Fairyhouse, Limerick, Naas, Dundalk and Tipperary. I will meet them next week to discuss matters. The other possibility is whether a green-field site should be looked at rather than trying to force an all-weather track into an existing grass course that could bring engineering or architectural difficulties. Abbotstown [on the outskirts of Dublin] is one that has been mentioned, but I will want to see if there are any other suitable sites we should look at." HRI has agreed in principle that there should be an all-weather track, but with the likely costs involved, it is thought that HRI will have to input a sizeable financial amount for the project to go ahead. It would be at least three years before any new track would be ready to host racing.

END OF THE ROAD FOR TIE THE KNOT?

Trainer Guy Walter is expected to announce Friday whether **Tie The Knot (Aus)** (Nassipour {USA}) will continue toward the G1 Queen Elizabeth S. at Randwick or be retired immediately. The seven-year-old gelding has won 21 times from 62 starts, including 13 Group 1 wins, and has amassed A\$6,212,410 in earnings, placing him second on the all-time highest prizemoney earners list, trailing only Sunline (NZ). Fifth last time out in the G1 BMW S. with jockey Shane Dye aboard at his fifth start this campaign, the gelding's best effort for this autumn was his G1 Chipping Norton S. win Feb. 23. "A decision could be reached by the end of the week, but yes, he may have run his last race," said Walter. "On the other hand, he has pulled up so well, he's in great order. There is a chance he could start again at Randwick in a race like the Queen Elizabeth S."

TIGHTENING THE SCREWS FOR THE AJC DERBY

San Miguel Chairman Eduardo Cojuangco's Derby dreams are fast-crystallizing with **Don Eduardo (NZ)** (Zabeel {NZ}) set to clash with **Carnegie Express (NZ)** (Carnegie {Ire}) in tomorrow's San Miguel A\$2 million G1 AJC Derby at Randwick. Cojuangco, a major purchaser of Australasian yearlings for his Gooree Stud in New South Wales, outbid trainer Gai Waterhouse for Don Eduardo at the 2000 NZ Premier sale, paying a Southern Hemisphere record of A\$2.8 million (NZ\$3.6 million) for the colt. Carnegie Express, by comparison, was purchased privately by syndicator Harry Lawton for A\$45,000 after failing to sell. Carnegie Express is aiming to become only the fifth horse to win the three-year-old Triple Crown after taking the first two legs; the G1 Canterbury and G1 Rosehill Guineas. "Carnegie Express worked like a Maserati," said Waterhouse Tuesday, after the colt galloped 1200 meters at Randwick in 1:18.2, covering the final 600 meters in :36.5 seconds and the last 200 meters in :12.1 seconds. Don Eduardo, on the other hand, has won four straight at Melbourne before chasing Carnegie Express home in the Rosehill Guineas, with jockey Damien Oliver declaring that the blue-blooded colt would be something special if he concentrated on the task at hand. Don Eduardo also galloped Tuesday; a 1600-meter move in 1:49.3, with a final 600 meters sectional of :36.4 and a final furlong in :12.3 seconds. Trainer Lee Freedman has given the lackadaisical Don Eduardo plenty of work recently in a bid to focus him, including another 1600-meter work on the inner-turf track 1:58.7. According to Freedman, the Derby will not be a match race, "I don't think you can ever say these Group 1's are two-horse races, I would think there are at least three or four definite chances in this race." **Pentastic (Aus)** (Pentire {GB}), 1 1/2 lengths back in third in the G1 VRC Derby last spring and a recent second-place finisher in the Rosehill and Canterbury Guineas, looms large with trainer David Hall, who will fit his charge with blinkers for the event. "At least he's got a plus on the statistical side--he's run over the 2400 meters, but the other pair are certainly bred to run out the trip too," said Hall. Trainer Bart Cummings is a master at producing his charges at their best on big days and **Ustinov (Aus)** (Seeking the Gold {USA}), who hasn't appeared since an unplaced finish in the G1 Australian Cup effort at Flemington Mar. 11, could cause an upset, while the Graeme Rogerson-trained **Prince Of War (Aus)** (Royal Academy {USA}), a A\$30,000 purchase who won the G2 Tulloch S. on Golden Slipper day, is an emerging star.

SUNLINE FACES 22 IN DONCASTER H.

Sunline (NZ) (Desert Sun {GB}) is 3-1 favorite for tomorrow's A\$2.5 million Doncaster H. at Randwick, drawing in barrier eight among a capacity field of 20. The 11-time Group 1 winner captured the race in 1999, but lost by a head to Over (Aus) in 2000, when carrying 57.5kg. Thoroughbred Racing Board (TRB) handicapper Mark Webbey sparked debate with trainers, including Lee Freedman and John Hawkes, criticizing his allocation of 58kg for the supermare. Webbey declined to issue a penalty for her G1 Coolmore Classic win under 60kg. "Sunline did not rate anywhere near her peak of 121 in this year's Coolmore--she probably rated around 114. She met a field rated 3kg inferior to the Doncaster," Webbey said. "Each of the horses she defeated will meet her on superior weight terms in the Doncaster, due to the compression of weights in the Coolmore." Sunline, Australasia's leading all time prizemoney earner with A\$9,186,921, is set to become the first mare to win two Doncasters, and the first horse to break the A\$10-million prizemoney barrier in the Southern Hemisphere. She is the only mare to carry more than 57kg and win a Doncaster since Cuddle (Aus) carried 59kg in 1936. In her final hit-out on the dirt track at Randwick yesterday, Racenet's Craig Tompson clocked Sunline at 1.29.1 over 1400 meters, running the last 600 meters in :38.4 and the final furlong in :13.2. With few on-pace runners and the chances of **Ha Ha (Aus)** (Danehill {USA}) (51.5kg) and **Shogun Lodge (Aus)** (Grand Lodge {USA}) dampened by persistent rain in recent days, Sunline is expected to bounce straight to the front and prove hard to run down. Trainer Gai Waterhouse is chasing her fifth Doncaster trophy with Ha Ha and rapid improver **Hey Pronto (Aus)** (Faltaat {USA}), a NZ\$15,000 yearling purchase who won the G3 Newmarket H. at his most recent appearance, earning a 1kg penalty to bring his weight to 51kg.
