

PERFECT EXECUTION

Second in last season's Listed Prix Edellie at Saint-Cloud, **Execute (Fr)** (Suave Dancer) won a 10-furlong conditions event at Compiègne in a canter on his seasonal return and retained his unbeaten record for the year in yesterday's G2 Prix d'Harcourt at Longchamp. Recording his first Group success with a competent display, the five-year-old was positioned in third on the inside as the Italian raider **Sunstrach (Ire)** (Polar Falcon) set the pace under Frankie Dettori. The field bunched up in early stretch, but Execute made smooth headway to challenge going to the final quarter mile. He was ridden to the front at the eighth pole and looked set fair for an easy victory; Sunstrach fought back, but winning jockey Thierry Gillet coaxed extra effort from Execute, who stayed on strongly to deny the game runner-up. Winning trainer John Hammond said, "Execute is a nice horse who didn't perform as well as we expected last year, but he is now back to his best. He will return in the G1 Prix Ganay at this course Apr. 28."

UZBEKI 'FREAK' EYES AMERICAN PRIZE

The line-up for the Kentucky Derby gets more diverse all the time. Horses come from the Far East, the

Middle East and Europe, joining horses from big and small American outfits, some who have prepped in traditional places and some who have not. But it's a safe bet the Kentucky Derby has never seen a more unusual horse than **Uzbeki's Secret** (Le Trompeur {Fr}).

Uzbeki's Secret's name will be on the soon-to-be-released list of horses who are late nominees to the Triple Crown. His name will mean nothing to American racing fans, but he is a God-like figure in his native country, Uzbekistan, a former republic of the Soviet Union. It is there, at the one small race course, Oliy Majilis, in the country of 24 million, that he has performed astounding feats, winning races by as much as 100 lengths in times that are spectacular, even by American standards.

"I know people will look at our country and the type of racing we have here and think this horse is a joke," said his 52-year-old trainer Otkir Sultonov. "I realize our racing industry is in its infancy and we do not have horses with fashionable bloodlines, but this horse is the real thing. He is a freak of nature, a grandson of your greatest horse, Secretariat. I firmly believe he will be competitive in your Derby and I would not be surprised if he were to win."

Sultonov should know. Born in Brooklyn to his American mother and Uzbeki father, he began his career on the racetrack in New York with legendary trainer Woody Stephens and was the groom of 1974 Kentucky Derby winner Cannonade. He left the racetrack in 1976 to work in his family's import and export business before emigrating to Uzbekistan in 1991, shortly after it declared its independence from the Soviet Union. He was working with an uncle in an anthracite mine when the businessman who owned the mine, Rustam Azimov, opened Oliy Majilis in 1997. Knowing Sultonov had a racing background, he hired him as his trainer, and as the track's general manager, and put him in charge of finding racing and breeding stock, which he acquired primarily from Russia.

It was there that he found the sire Le Trompeur, an unraced son of Secretariat who was having fertility problems, and Uzbeki's Secret's dam, Zhest, whose bloodlines trace back to Nasrullah and Count Fleet.

"If you think about it," Sultonov said, "this horse has some great, great horses in his pedigree and this wouldn't be the first time that the quality of those horses showed up two or three generations later. I can't tell you how good your top horses are. I haven't seen them run, but I was around a lot of good horses with Mr. Stephens and I know how this horse compares. I guarantee you he is better than Cannonade."

They race just 30 days a year in Uzbekistan and the country's entire horse population numbers only 250, 90 of which are owned by Azimov. Uzbeki's Secret has raced just four times, one of which was a walkover. He won three times as a two-year-old, including a 100-length victory in the Uzbeki Futurity, before the walkover in the Samarkand Purse. He has raced just once this year, winning a 2000-meter conditions race by 40 lengths. Who did he beat? Undoubtedly a bunch of inferior animals, but he completed the race over a good turf course in 2:01, faster than most Kentucky Derbies.

It was after that race that the legend of Uzbeki's Secret started to get out. Tipped on the horse by an owner with business interests in the region, John Kimmel tried to purchase the Uzbeki wonder horse.

"I didn't believe it," Kimmel said. "But some people whose opinions I trust told me that this horse was for real. I had him tested from top to bottom. We looked at his heart, his biomechanics, lung capacity, you name it. He tested off the charts. I don't know if he can win the Kentucky Derby, but this is a very talented horse."

According to sources, the Kimmel group offered \$400,000 for the horse, but Azimov declined.

"Why would I sell this horse?" Azimov said through an interpreter. "I own the greatest horse God ever created. Secretariat never reproduced himself. Now he has."

It was Sultonov's idea to point for the Derby.

"We thought about sending him to England or France because there is not a horse in our country that has a prayer of competing with him and, of course, the purses are very small," the trainer said. "But I have no experience in Europe. At least in America, I am familiar with the racing and have seen first hand what it takes to get a horse ready for the Kentucky Derby."

Uzbeki's Secret is not expected to race again before the Derby and is scheduled to ship to Kentucky two weeks before the race. He will be ridden by regular rider Risboy Juraev, who is also a colonel in the Uzbeki Army. Of course, he will have a problem if the race is oversubscribed. His career earnings total less than \$6,000. Sultonov said he will nominate the horse to the Derby Trial and run there if his earnings are a problem.

"I do not want to run in the Derby Trial, but I realize there will be obstacles," Sultonov said. "There is the travel, the fact that he has never raced on the dirt, he has never raced in a left-handed course. But I also that he is a special, special horse and I believe he can beat anybody in the world."

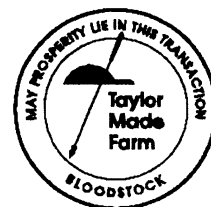

SEATTLE SLEW TO HILL 'N' DALE The 1977 Triple Crown winner **Seattle Slew** (Bold Reasoning), who underwent his second spinal surgery Mar. 2, is to be moved from Three Chimneys Farm in Midway, Kentucky, where he has stood since 1985, to Hill 'n' Dale Farm near Lexington, it was announced yesterday. Explaining the decision to move the 27-year-old stallion, syndicate manager Mickey Taylor stated in a letter to shareholders, "I believe that it is in Slew's best interest to be in a setting which allows him to be more isolated from mares coming to the breeding shed. Hill 'n' Dale provides that opportunity." He added, "The Seattle Slew Syndicate is grateful to Three Chimneys, and in particular Robert Clay, for the years of attention and devotion to Seattle Slew." Taylor also said that Slew is recovering well from his operation and will be starting on a program of short walks. His longtime groom, Tom Wade, will accompany Slew to Hill 'n' Dale.

LIMITED WARRANTIES AVAILABLE AT EASTER SALE In a move aimed at providing comfort to Hong Kong purchasers concerned about tough new import criteria, vendors at the Inglis Easter Yearling Sale, which starts tomorrow in Sydney, Australia, will be able to offer purchasers a limited warranty against conditions such as OCD lesions. The Hong Kong Jockey Club announced Mar. 19 that all horses imported to Hong Kong would be subject to stringent veterinary assessment including X-rays. Aushorse, which represents 55 Australian studs, had previously examined the issue and implemented a policy stating that pre-sale X-rays would not be offered, with Australian vendors solidly against a repository system. But the policy allowed exceptions for horses exhibiting clinical signs, such as scarring and swelling of a joint, and implicitly stated that post-sale, vendors could negotiate with purchasers if serious problems--identified on X-rays conducted by the purchaser after the fall off the hammer--emerged. "The board resolved that the most appropriate solution, given these changed circumstances, was for Aushorse to adopt a policy whereby members acting as consignors of yearlings may choose to offer a limited warranty against the criteria of concern to Hong Kong purchasers--namely, issues in relation to bone cysts, OCD of stifle or hock, pre-existing fractures, ringbone and rotation of the pedal bone as a result of chronic laminitis," Aushorse Chairman John Messara said in a letter to members Friday. Messara added that Aushorse recommended X-rays be completed before the horse leaves the sales complex. Melbourne University veterinarian Dr. Alister McLean, Aushorse's recommended practitioner, would have complete discretion regarding the interpretation of radiographs on horses purchased for export to Hong Kong. Messara also stated that Aushorse would revisit the issue of X-rays after the Easter sale in a bid to come up with a lasting solution. Inglis Managing Director Reg Inglis also issued a brief statement advising of the policy, which targets retaining Australia's most significant export market, but he remains vigorously opposed to vendors offering pre-sale X-rays. But it is likely that a repository system will be among options canvassed for the future.

Field Takes Shape for Aventura:
Charioteer (Silver Deputy), fourth in the Mar. 10 GII Louisiana Derby last time out, will make his next start in the \$250,000 Aventura S. at Gulfstream Park Apr. 6. The Aventura, at a mile and a sixteenth, subs for Hialeah's Flamingo S. on the three-year-old calendar. Charioteer has won two of six starts, including an 8 1/2-length romp in a Gulfstream allowance two starts back. He was making his two-turn debut at Fair Grounds. "He's a genuine colt and he always gives you a game effort," trainer Todd Pletcher said. "He has already shown he can handle this track--he has a nice win over it." The bay breezed Sunday morning, going five furlongs in 1:03.
 Also pointing for the Aventura is **Marasca** (Take Me Out), runner-up in an entry-level Gulfstream allowance last time out Mar. 2. The dark bay, a May 9 foal, worked five furlongs in 1:01 Saturday. "It was a very good work and he came back in great shape," Vinnie de Paolo, assistant to trainer John Kimmel, said. Chris DeCarlo will have the mount Saturday.

Valenzuela to Ride Mayakovsky:
 Trainer Patrick Biancone said yesterday that Pat Valenzuela will be aboard **Mayakovsky** (Matty G) for the Apr. 6 GI Santa Anita Derby. Valenzuela, 39, has had a troubled career marred by drug suspensions, but has won the Santa Anita Derby twice, with Codex in 1980 and with Sunday Silence in 1989. "I have a lot of respect for Patrick, for his talent and his experience," Biancone said. "Since he has come back, he's riding like he's 22 years old again. He's like a rookie with experience." Also getting his jockey assignment yesterday was the maiden **Jack's Silver** (Soft Gold {Brz}), who was second to Came Home in the Feb. 2 GII San Vicente S. The Cal-bred, third facing fellow maidens on the turf last time out Feb. 23, will have Victor Espinoza in the irons Saturday. He worked Sunday morning, going five furlongs in 1:00 2/5.

The book covers the Rose's lives from 1994 to 2002 and chronicles the career of the family's stable star, who became the first horse in history to take the GI Florida Derby and GI Gulfstream Park H. with his win Saturday. Anything Hal's Hope does from now on I can document in magazine articles."

Alexine, a Group 1 winner in her native country back in 1999, was third in the 2000 GI Ramona H. in her first year in the States and added a couple of American stakes wins in just three appearances during her second season north of the border. The gray had already made three starts this term, finishing fifth in the Jan. 13 GII San Gorgonio H., third in the Feb. 2 GIII Brown Bess H. and, trying the dirt for the first time since coming to the U.S., getting fourth in the Mar. 10 GI Santa Margarita H. last time out. RACING PAYS TRIBUTE TO THE QUEEN

MOTHER Racing yesterday paid tribute to Her Majesty Elizabeth the Queen Mother, who died at the age of 101 on Saturday afternoon. Renowned for her intense love of the sport, particularly national hunt racing, she entered as an owner in 1949 and was responsible for some of that sphere's great names. These included Manicou, winner of the King George VI Chase; the infamous Devon Loch, who slipped under Dick Francis just 50 yards from the line when in front in the 1956 Grand National; and Game Spirit, twice a winner at the Cheltenham festival in the seventies. Her light blue and buff-striped silks were also carried by Makaldar, second in the 1967 Champion Hurdle; and Gay Record, who provided her 200th winner; as well as Double Star, The Rip, Inch Arran, Isle Of Man, Special Cargo, and her favourite, The Argonaut. Her trainers included the legendary Peter Cazalet, Fulke Walwyn and, most recently, Nicky Henderson. Henderson told the *Racing Post* Saturday, "For the whole of racing and the country it is a day I think we all dreaded. It's just very, very sad news. I think it goes without saying how everybody is going to miss her. Nobody ever cared more about her horses and the people and everything that was involved in racing. It's something I think and hope she enjoyed enormously. We certainly enjoyed it and were very privileged to be a part of it." The Queen Mother also had been patron for the Injured Jockeys' Fund since 1971. Racing went ahead as planned, with suitable marks of respect being paid at racetracks around the country.
