DERBY FEVER AT SANTA ANITA

It has been 13 years since the last Santa Anita Derby winner went on to victory in the Kentucky Derby. With aspirations to break that streak, eight Triple Crown nominees line up for the 65th running of the Grade I event at Santa Anita this afternoon. Jockey Pat Valenzuela was aboard the last three-year-old to score the double, guiding Sunday Silence to victory in both races, as well as the Preakness, in 1989.

Despite a career often derailed by drug problems, Valenzuela will be back aboard a Derby colt today after picking up the mount on **Mayakovskiy** (Matty G). The 39-year-old rider, who won the Santa Anita Derby for the first time with **Codex** when he was just 17, worked Mayakovskiy Tuesday and was happy with the move. "He felt great," Valenzuela said. "He switched leads perfectly and relaxed the first part of the work and picked it up nicely on his own. I look for him to run a very big race and, if he runs his race, I think he'll win." It's a tough assignment for the lightly raced colt. Mayakovskiy, who posted a front-running tally in the Mar. 17 GIII Gotham S. in only his third career start and his first of the season, makes his first appearance outside of New York and his first at two turns in the nine-furlong Santa Anita Derby. Historically, it would not be the worst thing if he wasn't first today. It has been a while since a Santa Anita Derby hero has gone on to success on the first Saturday in May, but three of the last five Kentucky Derby winners prepped in Arcadia--Silver Charm (1997), Real Quiet (1998) and Charismatic (1999). Still, Valenzuela, who came back from his most recent suspension Dec. 26 and is currently sixth in the standings (through Thursday) with 28 wins and more than \$1.6 million in purses, would like to make it all the way back to the winner's circle. "It would make it a sweet meet," he said.

Betting on Experience?

Only one horse in the Santa Anita Derby field has tried a mile and an eighth before. **U S S Tinosa** (Foxhound) took the Feb. 8 Sham S. at the distance by 4 1/2 lengths two starts back and was most recently the runner-up in the Mar. 17 GII San Felipe S. **Came Home** (Gone West) has the most experience in the winner's circle, with five victories from his six tries. But jockey Gary Stevens, rider of longshot **Easy Grades** (Honor Grades), goes for a record ninth Santa Anita Derby victory today. His mount closed to be second behind **Came Home** in the Mar. 2 GII San Rafael S. "I just want to win the race," Stevens said. "I'm not worried about any records right now." Stevens, who won six of 10 editions of the race in the '90s, also won with **Point Given** last year and with **Winning Colors** in 1988.

Take Charge Lady is the only filly in the field to get a three-digit Beyer figure and she has done it in her last two races, earning a 109 for her 8 1/2-length victory in the Feb. 16 GIII Silverbulletday S. and a 107 for her five-length score in the Mar. 9 GII Fair Grounds Oaks. She is also three-for-five at the Ashland distance and a perfect two-for-two at Keeneland. She is nominated to the Triple Crown, as is the once-beaten **Belterra**, who is also the last horse to finish in front of the favorite. **Belterra** beat **Take Charge Lady** by 4 1/2 lengths in the Nov. 24 GII Golden Rod S. at Churchill Downs. The bay came back after a 3 1/2-month vacation and suffered her first defeat, finishing third as the odds-on chalk in the nine-furlong GII Bonnie Miss S. at Gulfstream Park Mar. 15, but should be tighter in her second start of the season. **Colonial Glitter**, on the board in all seven starts, tried two turns for the first time in the Feb. 24 GII Davona Dale S. at Gulfstream and was a solid second. She came back in the Mar. 23 Bourbonette Breeders' Cup S. at Turfway Park and won by an eye-catching 10 1/2 lengths.

The winner of the GII Arkansas Derby over course and distance in 2000, **Graeme Hall** ended his four-year-old season in smart fashion, taking the GIII Stuyvesant H. by 6 1/4 lengths before finishing runner-up in the GI Cigar Mile H. Nov. 24. A distant eighth in the GI Donn H. at Gulfstream Feb. 9, the Eugene and Laura Melnyk colorbearer comes into this off a solid second in the GII New Orleans H. at the Fair Grounds Mar. 3. **Mr Ross** sports a record of 15-7-1-5 at Oaklawn, including four graded-stakes victories and a runner-up finish to Traditionally in this event a year ago. The Oklahoma-bred was most recently proved a neck best in the GIII Razorback H. in Hot Springs Mar. 16. **Crafty Shaw**, winner of the GIII Rebel S. last season, has won four of his last five starts, including the GIII Essex H. two back, but was a disappointing fourth at odds-on in the Razorback in his latest. Azeri has been beaten only once in her short career, finishing second to Summer Colony in the Feb. 9 GII La Canada S. in her stakes debut. She bounced right back, however, taking the Mar. 10 GI Santa Margarita H. and looks to make it five-for-six lifetime in her first appearance outside of California. **Miss Linda**, a Group 1 winner in her native Argentina, captured three in a row last season, including the GI Spinster S. at Keeneland in October, but ended the campaign with a pair of off-the-board efforts, finishing sixth in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff and fourth in the GII Falls City H. at Churchill Downs. The five-year-old returned after a 2 1/2-month freshening and posted a 4 1/4-length tally in the GIII Sabin H. at Gulfstream Park Feb. 8. **Fleet Renee**, winner of the GI Ashland S. and GI Mother Goose S. at three, has not been out since running third in the GI Gazelle H. at Belmont Park last Sept. 8. The filly has been working steadily at Tapeta Farm in Maryland since the end of January and had a final breeze at Oaklawn Apr. 3, cruising through a half mile in :51 3/5.

Repent and his nine rivals have added incentive to win the 45th edition of the Illinois Derby because of the \$1 million bonus that would go to the connections of the horse that could win here and then go on to take either the GI Kentucky Derby, the GI Preakness S. or the GI Belmont S. Repent was a fast-closing second to Johannesburg last fall in the GI Bessemer Trust Breeders' Cup Juvenile before his 2001 finale, an impressive score over Request for Parole in the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. at Churchill Downs Nov. 24. The sophomore is undefeated in 2002, posting a 2 1/4-length win in the GIII Risen Star S. Feb. 17 and a late-closing nose victory over Easyfromthegitgo in the GII Louisiana Derby Mar. 10, but failed to switch leads late in both 1 1/16-mile events at the Fair Grounds. Jockey Jerry Bailey, aboard for the Louisiana Derby, looks for his fourth victory in this event. **Changeintheweather**, the winner of the GI Grey Breeders' Cup S. at Woodbine last fall, scored a narrow win with Jorge Chavez aboard last time in a Gulfstream allowance Mar. 9, but will be reunited with Canadian jockey Mickey Walls this time. "He is still a little green and I'm not sure he likes to be ridden aggressively," trainer David Bell said, explaining the switch. "That win wasn't all that impressive, but Chavez said there was more horse underneath him at the wire." **Fonz's**, winner in the GIII Hollywood Prevue at Hollywood last November, capped off his juvenile season with a second-place finish behind Siphonic in the GI Hollywood Futurity Dec. 15. He looks to improve off his 2002 debut, a fifth-place finish behind Came Home in the Mar. 2 GII San Rafael S.

A multiple Group 3 winner on the turf in France two years ago, **Agol Lack** (113 pounds) made his final start of 2000 in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup and handled the surface switch reasonably well, missing third by just a nose. Campaigned exclusively on the turf last season, the chestnut managed just a third-place finish in the Steinlen H., but adds blinkers this afternoon and has been training well over the main track at San Luis Rey. **Freedom Crest**, highweighted at 115 pounds, is the lone member of the field with a graded victory on the main track. Winner of the GII Goodwood Breeders' Cup H. last October, the gelding was last of 13 in the Breeders' Cup Classic and was a well-beaten 10th in the GI Santa Anita H. in his seasonal bow Mar. 2.

Sligo Bay won the GIII Cinema H. on the Hollywood Park turf for his only win as a sophomore and ended the season with consecutive runner-up finishes in the GII Oak Tree Derby, the GI Hollywood Derby and to **Irish Prize** in the GII San Gabriel H. at Santa Anita Dec. 30. There is cause for concern in the camp of the latter after his lackluster seventh in the GII Kilroe Mile H. Mar. 2. The chestnut gelding, hero of the GII San Marcos H. Jan. 21, is making his 11th start in the span of 11 months. **El Gran Papa**, third in the San Gabriel, shipped to Texas for the John Connally Breeders' Cup and might have won, but lost all chance when shut off in deep stretch. Perfect Drift Preps for Kentucky Derby:

Perfect Drift (Dynaformer), winner of the Mar. 23 GII Lane's End Spiral S. at Turfway Park, worked at Churchill Downs' Trackside training center yesterday morning, going a half-mile in :48.80 and galloping out five-eighths in 1:01.80. "The work went perfect--a nice and easy stretch of the legs," trainer Murray Johnson said. "He did it professionally. He's right on track." The colt will head straight to the May 4 GI Kentucky Derby, with time for four more workouts before the "Run for the Roses." "One of them, not the next one but the one after that, will be a very serious work and then we'll have a couple of easy works going into the race," Johnson said. As for giving his colt six weeks off before the Derby, the trainer said, "To think that a horse can't be ready after six weeks is ridiculous. In Europe they do it all the time. It's just knowing your horse and having the right program, then getting lucky in the big one."

**JAN SIEGEL DIES** Jan Siegel, who owned and bred Thoroughbreds in partnership with her husband Mace and her daughter Samantha, died Thursday in Los Angeles after a prolonged battle with cancer. She was 69. A native of Ohio who performed as a jazz singer in the early '60s, Jan met Mace Siegel on a blind date at Aqueduct in 1962 and the two were married just two months later. They purchased their first horse, later named Najecam (Mace and Jan spelled backwards) in 1964, but didn't celebrate their first stakes winner until 1976, when Wininreno took the Julian Cole H. at Calder. Over the years, the family also campaigned top runners such as I Ain't Bluffing, Urbane, Miss Iron Smoke, Stormy But Valid, Hedonist, Latin Dancer and I Believe In You. "She always enjoyed racing," Samantha Siegel told the *Daily Racing Form*. "Even [Wednesday], she said, 'When are we going to the track?' She took a lot of pleasure in coming up with good and clever names. When the homebreds won, those were like her kids." A funeral service will be held Tuesday at 2 p.m. at the Church of Good Shepherd in Beverly Hills, California. In lieu of flowers, the family has requested that donations be made to the City Of Hope and St. Jude's Hospital.

Flying Dash ended his German campaign with a victory in the G2 Maurice Lacroix-Trophy on the final day of August and was making his U.S. debut here. The Triple Crown nominee, getting Lasix in his stateside bow, didn't immediately take to the American way, getting unruly in the post parade and giving the assistant starters a hard time at the gate. Finally backed into his stall with the aid of a blindfold, the bay broke well and settled off an honest early pace. He came with a wide rally at the top of the lane, took command at midstretch and, as a foal of Apr. 5, celebrated his birthday with a decisive score. "We schooled him yesterday and he walked right in," trainer Neil Drysdale said. "I think he was just feeling very fresh. He just needs to get used to everything here." Added jockey Jerry Bailey, "I didn't know how much horse I'd have after all that happened at the gate, but he's got a tremendous turn of foot."

Storm Craft returned from a three-month respite to win versus allowance company at Gulfstream Feb. 9, then was sidelined again for two months before reappearing here for Keeneland's opening day. Off slowly in seventh, the brown colt made up ground on the inside and had gained the lead by the half. The operation, which lasted more than three hours, removed a large blood clot from the right side of the 25-year-old rider's brain. Arriaga was conscious and communicating with members of his family yesterday. "He's breathing on his own, moving all of his extremities and verbalizing some," Bay Meadows track physician Dr. David Seftel said. "His blood pressure and vital signs are normal. It's a slow, progressive recovery, but right now signs are good." A native of Mexico City, Arriaga was injured when his mount, Mother Fear, ducked out sharply on the far turn. He came off, and may have been clipped by a trailing horse. Arriaga was second in the standings at the recently concluded Golden Gate meeting, winning 71 races. He was the leading apprentice rider in Northern California in 1997.

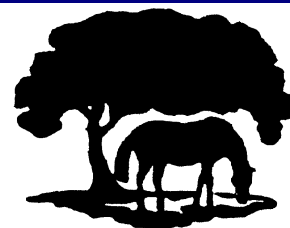
