

JOHANNESBURG BEATEN

Juvenile champion **Johannesburg** (Hennessy) made his highly anticipated three-year-old debut in the G3 Gladness S. at The Curragh in Co. Kildare, Ireland yesterday, but it wasn't the return his fans were hoping for. The colt, sent off the 1-3 favorite in the seven-

furlong event, finished second, a short head behind four-year-old filly **Rebelline (Ire)** (Robellino). In the early going, Johannesburg raced wide, traveling on the bridle throughout before being asked to quicken away in the final 150 yards, but he could not hold off the late-closing filly. A disappointed trainer Aidan O'Brien said afterwards, "Johannesburg just ran too keen and over-raced early on. I don't know where he will go now, but it's a long way away from being a problem." HARLAN'S HOLIDAY EARLY DERBY FAVORITE

When wagering closed on the third pool of the Kentucky Derby future wager yesterday, GI Florida Derby hero **Harlan's Holiday** (Harlan) was made the slight favorite. The Ken McPeek-trained sophomore closed at odds of 7-1, while champion two-year-old **Johannesburg** (Hennessy) closed at 8-1. Johannesburg had been favored during the first three days of wagering on pool three, but his odds drifted up after he suffered the first defeat of his career at the Curragh on Sunday. **Came Home** (Gone West), who captured the GI Santa Anita Derby on Saturday, also closed at 8-1. A total of \$524,847 was wagered on the pool, which opened Thursday and concluded at 5:30 p.m. (EDT) yesterday. Combined wagering for all three pools reached \$1,503,806--an increase of 15 percent from last year's previous record of \$1,309,647.

TAKE CHARGE LADY TRIPLE CROWN BOUND?

Take Charge Lady (Dehere), a 4 1/4-length winner in Saturday's GI Ashland Stakes at Keeneland, could face males in the Triple Crown races, trainer Ken McPeek said yesterday. While downplaying the chances of her running in the Kentucky Derby, McPeek said a start in the Preakness is a possibility. "It's tempting to run her in the Kentucky Derby because she's that good," McPeek said. "I firmly believe she could win the race. But it's probably a smarter move to run her in the Kentucky Oaks. There's a better shot that she'll run in the Preakness." McPeek added that if GI Illinois Derby runner-up **Repent** (Louis Quatorze), who, like Take Charge Lady, is owned by Select Stable, were to somehow miss the Kentucky Derby, then Take Charge Lady might take his place in the Derby lineup. Though Repent was beaten as the odds-on favorite in the Illinois Derby, McPeek said he wasn't discouraged by his race and would continue to point him toward the Kentucky Derby. "He can't win when they go :48 and 1:13 in front of him," McPeek said. "But let's not take anything away from the winner. He ran a great race. For us, it's onward and forward." *Triple Threats cont. p. 2*

Santa Anita Derby Runners OK:

Trainer Paco Gonzalez said GI Santa Anita Derby winner **Came Home** (Gone West) came out of Saturday's race in good order. Also in good shape after the race was runner-up **Easy Grades** (Honor Grades). "It looks like we've got a ticket to the big dance with a horse that we feel has a legitimate chance," said trainer Ted West. "He's amazing really. After a hard race like that, even the aggressive horses usually aren't up to fighting with you. But this morning, it was like he didn't race. He was as feisty as ever." **Mayakovsky** (Matty G) exited his fourth-place effort in good shape, but his next start is still to be determined. "Yesterday, we had what I call 'limited bad luck,'" explained trainer Patrick Biancone. "Real bad luck would be if the horse injures himself. But he came back in good shape, so all we had was 'limited' bad luck."

No Derby for War Emblem & Aventura Runners:

War Emblem (Our Emblem), runaway winner of Saturday's GI Illinois Derby, came out of the race in good shape, but will likely skip the Kentucky Derby. "I don't think we'll do the Derby," said Ben Allen, assistant to trainer Frank Springer. "He'd be better suited for the Preakness. The main thing is we have to take care of the horse and let him tell us where to go."

Marasca (Take Me Out), winner of Saturday's Aventura S. at Gulfstream Park, will not be running in the Kentucky Derby. "He's an improving three-year-old and those kind of horses are the most dangerous," explained trainer John Kimmel. "But I think it's too early in his career to tackle the kind of horses he will be meeting in the Kentucky Derby." Also out of Derby consideration is Aventura runner-up **Equality** (Mt. Livermore). "The Preakness S. is an option we have and I wouldn't rule that race out at this time," said trainer Graham Motion.

Easyfromthegitgo to Lexington:

Easyfromthegitgo (Dehere), once expected to make his next start in the Apr. 13 GI Toyota Blue Grass S., will instead make his final Kentucky Derby prep in the Apr. 20 GI Coolmore Lexington S. at Keeneland.

Sophomore Works:

Booklet (Notebook), winner of the GI Fountain of Youth, worked five furlongs yesterday at Keeneland in :59 3/5. The colt, trained by John Ward, is expected to start next in the Apr. 13 GI Toyota Blue Grass. "I couldn't have been more pleased," Ward said of the work. "The time was good and I was happy with his attitude. He's really responding to the Kentucky climate."

Buddha (Unbridled's Song) worked five furlongs at Payson Park yesterday in 1:01 2/5. The colt is expected to make his stakes debut in Saturday's GI Wood Memorial. "He went easy," said trainer James Bond. "He'll just gallop up to the race."

Also aiming for the Wood, **Medaglia d'Oro** (El Prado {Ire}) worked six furlongs at Hollywood Park yesterday in a bullet 1:12 2/5. "He went good and looked good," said trainer Bobby Frankel. "We're still on schedule with him." Medaglia d'Oro will ship to New York on Wednesday.

Rebeline Beats the Champ in the Gladness...

Rebeline (Ire) (Robellino) overcame adversity to end Johannesburg (Hennessy)'s unbeaten run in a thrilling finale to yesterday's G3 Gladness at The Curragh. Trapped on the rail in fifth, where she had settled off the early pace set by Tarry Flynn (Ire) (Kenmare {Fr}), she lacked racing room as Johannesburg arrived on the outer of stable companion Shoal Creek (Ire) (Fairy King) a furlong out. As the favourite swooped to the front with 175 yards remaining, a gap opened for Rebeline and she quickened instantly. Although there was slight contact with Gaelic Queen (Ire) (Fairy King), Rebeline's momentum was enough to carry her past Johannesburg in the shadow of the post. The four-year-old filly's six-pound penalty was a result of her success in last year's 10-furlong G2 Pretty Polly S. at The Curragh last July. She also won the Listed 1000 Guineas Trial S. at Leopardstown over this trip last April, but was slightly disappointing when fifth in the Irish 1000 Guineas in May and seventh in the G1 Irish Oaks in July. Third in the G1 Prix de l'Opera at Longchamp in October, she was eighth in the G1 Champion S. later that month. Rebeline may now head for the G1 Prix Ganay at Longchamp Apr. 28. "Rebeline always goes well fresh and I thought Johannesburg looked ring-rusty before the race," said trainer Kevin Prendergast. According to jockey Declan McDonogh, "Rebeline's stamina came into play in the last half furlong. She was idling a bit early on and I had to give her a tap of the whip to pick up, but she really battled bravely for me to the line and has been a star for us."

O'Brien's Take...

Trainer Aidan O'Brien's multiple Group 1 winner Johannesburg suffered the first loss of his much-celebrated career yesterday. The colt had not raced since winning the Breeders' Cup Juvenile last October. "He didn't over-blow afterwards, but it's a tough race and there's nowhere to hide in that type of race," O'Brien said after the loss. "He did come there cantering, but then he just got tired in the last 50 yards. He was well, ready for a run, but last year our horses needed two or three runs. He was beaten by a good filly and Kevin Prendergast obviously had her spot-on. If we are going to have two runners [in the G1 Kentucky Derby] as we thought, Johannesburg and Castle Gandolfo (Gone West), which won yesterday at Lingfield, would be the ones."

Ballingarry is getting into the habit of impressing the locals here and produced a smooth performance to outclass his rivals on his sophomore debut. Under a confident ride from Jamie Spencer, the colt swept aside this select field with a fine turn of foot in the straight. Although he did not need to improve on his length success over Castle Gandolfo in the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud last November, Spencer is intent that the colt has progressed. "He's improved--he's got very strong and he was much too good for those," the rider said. Settled in third early on the rail as Stydahar took the lead, Ballingarry angled out when the gap opened on the turn into the final straight. From there, he was always in control, hitting the front with 300 yards remaining before quickening when Spencer reached for the whip. "He's done it very, very easily--he was cruising the whole way and he loved the ground," said an animated Spencer. "I just got a lead for the first half of the race and he won easily. It wasn't even a test for him. He wasn't doing much when I went to the front--it was just easy for him. He will have no trouble staying the Classic 1 1/2-mile distance, and there is no doubt that he will be one of the stable's main hopes for the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club [French Derby at Chantilly June 2]."

Cashel Castle ended his unbeaten juvenile campaign with an eight-length victory in the Hoosier Juvenile S. and returned in similar fashion, defeating older horses by 5 1/4 lengths in a Mar. 17 Sportsman's allowance contest. The grey colt bided his time, racing just behind the early leaders. He moved out three wide nearing the stretch and stormed clear with ease. "He's a joy to ride," said Pat Day, who was celebrating his 800th Keeneland win. "We just kind of followed them along and we were able to angle out at the right time. When you ride a horse with that much ability, often times they make their own trip." On his milestone victory, Day added, "What an awesome feeling. I am so incredibly fortunate, so blessed to participate in this great sport of horse racing and to be here at Keeneland today and to have this victory for [trainer] Mr. [Chris] Block. What a way to win 800 races." Block said, "We've tried to bring this horse along the right way. This is the best horse I've ever had and I don't want to make any mistakes. We've never been on the Derby trail with him. We didn't want to burn him up and having nothing for the summer. The Breeders' Cup Sprint is at home [Arlington] this year." Winning jockey Kent Desormeaux added, "I thought maybe she had too much to do, but when I spanked her, she took off even faster. That's when I knew I was going to get up." 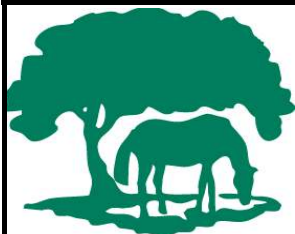
