

SLEW UNLIKELY TO BREED AGAIN THIS YEAR

Seattle Slew is unlikely to cover any more mares in the 2002 breeding season, according to a statement released by Mickey Taylor, his owner and syndicate manager. "His recovery is good, but somewhat slower than we had anticipated," reads the statement. "With the goal being the health and comfort of Seattle Slew, it appears unlikely he will resume breeding this season."

DERBY & OAKS HOPEFULS WORK

GI Santa Anita Derby winner **Came Home** (Gone West) worked six furlongs at Churchill Downs yesterday in 1:12.60. "He went a little faster than I thought he would," trainer Paco Gonzalez said. "The track is not a fast track like in California, and I thought he would go in 1:14, but he went a little faster and did it easy."

Jockey Chris McCarron, aboard for the work, added, "He went very well and got across the track beautifully. I expect to him to improve off the Santa Anita Derby. It is not a hope, it's an expectation."...**Medaglia d'Oro** (El Prado {Ire}), second in the GI Wood Memorial, worked five furlongs at

Churchill yesterday in 1:01.40. "I didn't want to do too much," said trainer Bobby Frankel. "He had a hard race the other day, so we'll just keep him happy." Medaglia d'Oro galloped out in 1:16.60...**Ocean Sound (Ire)** (Mujadil), third in the GI Toyota Blue Grass, worked seven furlongs at Churchill in 1:28.20. "We have been trying to get him to relax," trainer Jim Cassidy said. "This work was perfect." McCarron was up for Ocean Sound's work, but the Irish-bred colt will be ridden by Alex Solis in the Derby.

Aiming for the Kentucky Oaks, **Belterra** (Unbridled) worked five furlongs at Churchill yesterday in 1:01.60. **Take the Cake** (Fly So Free) went the same distance in :59.20.

BRITISH GUINEAS TRIALS

A lot has already been written about Spinning World this week. Yesterday both Andrew Caulfield in *TDN* and Tony Morris in the *Racing Post* featured him as the sire of last week's G3 Craven winner at Newmarket, King of Happiness. Since she had been Europe's unbeaten champion two-year-old filly last year, and really had just about a public workout when winning Newbury's G3 Fred Darling, less was written about Queen's Logic and her sire, Grand Lodge. But what the two trial winners who go into their May 4-5 Guineas races at single-figure odds have in common is that they are both by Coolmore sires whose big foal crops are skewing their progeny performance averages downward, yet, crucially, are in the news and attracting big 2002 books precisely because of their big winners, not their averages. Why? Because Coolmore knows that averages attract statisticians, but it's those home run balls that attract mares.

Last week's trials consisted of three seven-furlong races and one mile race, all Group 3s--within a five-day span at Newmarket and Newbury. As noted last week, Misterah, from Alhaarth's first crop, won the Nell Gwyn on Tuesday, Apr. 16 at Newmarket to confirm her place in the 1000 Guineas field. Then, on Thursday, King of Happiness ran the best of the four Guineas trials, winning the one-mile Craven decisively from Della Francesca, an Aidan O'Brien second-stringer, running a Postmark 115 (the *Racing Post's* speed figure), which puts him firmly in the picture for the 2000. He is one of four horses now trading at under 10-1 for the 2000. The favorite is Aidan's Hawk Wing (no trial) at around 7-4. King of Happiness is second favorite, around 4-1 and at around 7-1 are Godolphin's Naheef (unraced this year but winner of the Godolphin trial) and Love Regardless, a once-raced Storm Bird colt trained by Mark Johnston (no trial). So only one recognized trial winner is under 10-1. Times have changed. The Newbury colt

trial (Greenham) winner was Redback, a Mark of Esteem colt, but he may go for the French 2000.

Queen's Logic's win in last Saturday's Fred Darling (or Dubai Duty Free, I'm not really sure what it's called) was equally decisive, but nonetheless less convincing, primarily because of the slow time. She ran only a Postmark 103 Saturday, whereas in last year's seven-length Cheveley Park romp, she ran a massive 122. But I thought it was a very good trial, nonetheless.

Whereas last year Queen's Logic was totally settled, she was quite keen on Saturday, and raced fresh, running in second behind not a particularly fast pace, but then cruised into the lead when asked and won easily. It should have knocked the freshness out of her and tightened her up. Quite why her odds have been tightened by the bookmakers is problematical, and no doubt she'll be more like 9-4 or even 5-2 on the day. The second favorite is Barathea's sister Gossamer (no trial), and the only other filly under 10-1 is Aidan's number one, Quarter Moon (no trial). And then of course there will be Godolphin's number one, which will be Frankie's mount--probably their trial winner, Silent Honor. Speaking of which, it is surely significant that Frankie is coming back to Newmarket to ride Naheef in the 2000 after riding the Langfuhr filly Imperial Gesture in a very hot-looking Kentucky Oaks, leaving David Flores the mount on Essence of Dubai in the Kentucky Derby, the same day as the 2000.

As I noted, quite a bit has already been written this week about Spinning World. Regardless of the size of his foal crop and consequent lower average figures, Spinning World is looking increasingly like the real deal as a sire. He has 20 first-crop winners, and besides King of Happiness, has sired the Group 3-winning filly Quad's Melody, definitely one of the top fillies in France last year, and Tendulkar, who ran a bang-up third in last year's G1 Dewhurst in only his second career start. He has a couple of other pretty decent SW, and also has a quite-promising SW in his first Australian crop, now two. Whatever other discussions surround him, Spinning World is siring class, and class is what we're after.

Equally noteworthy last week was the performance of trainer John Gosden, who sent out six three-year-old maiden winners at Newmarket and Newbury for six different owners. The two 10-furlong winners are being talked about as Derby prospects; Khaled Abdullah's With Approval (how about that?) colt, Royal Stamp, and Sheikh Mohammed's (the old red-and-white again) Proven, from the first crop of Benny the Dip, who Gosden trained to win the 1997 Epsom Derby. Never did a stallion need a talking horse more than Benny the Dip, so, hopefully for him, this colt and one or two others will get his name back in the news.

Interestingly, an old adversary of Benny the Dip has come out running with his first crop of two-year-olds. Desert Story (Green Desert), who nearly made a career of running second to Benny the Dip (including the G2 Royal Lodge at two and the G2 Dante at three), had two pretty good two-year-old winners from his first crop last week, and joins Titus Livius (by Machiavellian) and the unheralded Averti (by Warning) with multiple early winners, among 2002 European freshman sires.

2YO Sales...

Earlier this month we previewed three sales of two-year-olds. Here's the report card. Keeneland sold only 41 percent of the horses catalogued, meaning it really is tough at the top, so fell short of the 1999-2000 grosses of \$18.5 million. Their gross was a hair under \$17,750,000, but still a 19-percent gain over last year, and the average was \$174,015, a six-percent gain. Overall, it meant the clearance rate for five major North American two-year-old sales was a scary 46 percent of those catalogued. If you consign a horse to a major North American two-year-old sale right now, you have less than a 50-50 chance of it getting sold in the ring. So you need to have a few to sell, and, as always, one home run horse to cover the many losers.

The two British sales went very well. Doncaster sold 201 horses--a massive 79 percent of those catalogued--grossed just under 2.3-million guineas, and averaged a record 11,441 guineas (up exactly 1,000 guineas from last year). Tattersalls last week sold 116 over two nights, a 65-percent clearance rate of those catalogued, broke their gross record with over 3.9-million guineas, and shattered the average record, at 33,842 guineas. Those numbers were 52 percent and 45 percent gains over last year, respectively. They had six colts bring 100,000 guineas-plus; four of those were bought for

Japan, including the new record 180,000 guineas saletopper. Of course, it has to be noted that the European two-year-old market operates in the five-figure range, whereas we're talking six-figure horses in America. Nonetheless, the two-year-old in training market in Europe is really starting to figure, for the first time.

Slewvescent certainly comes into the category of moderately performed. A \$475,000 yearling at the 1989 Keeneland July Sales (the sixth most expensive Seattle Slew yearling of his crop), Slewvescent started only seven times, and achieved his only top three placing when winning a mile maiden event at Belmont Park as a three-year-old. Although Slewvescent didn't own the race record of a prospective sire, the same criticism couldn't be leveled at his pedigree. A half brother to the dam of GI Breeders' Cup Sprint hero Elmhurst, Slewvescent is out of champion three-year-old filly Our Mims, herself a half sister to Alydar.

These credentials earned Slewvescent a stud career in California, first at Longview Stud in Los Alamos and subsequently at Special T Thoroughbreds in Temecula. A review of Slewvescent's record reveals it to be one of the most unusual we have ever seen. From 118 foals, he has been represented by 84 starters and 43 winners. He has only four stakes winners, but remarkably, three of the four are Grade I winners. In addition to Ringaskiddy, these are the fillies Tout Charmant and Lazy Slusan. Tout Charmant, a member of the same crop (of only 18 foals) as Ringaskiddy, has amassed earnings of \$1,721,877, her major victories coming in the GI Del Mar Oaks and GI Matriarch. Lazy Slusan, who was claimed for \$62,500 as a five-year-old when already a stakes winner against Cal-breds, went on to add the GI Santa Margarita Invitational H. and GI Milady Breeders' Cup H. to her record.

Oddly enough, Ringaskiddy has also made the odyssey from claiming ranks to Grade I winner. Claimed as a five-year-old in January 2001 for \$50,000, Ringaskiddy subsequently earned black type with a win in the Quicken Tree S. at Hollywood Park. He has continued to improve and, in his most recent outing prior to the San Juan Capistrano, he had been beaten just a half-length in the GII San Luis Obispo H.

Ringaskiddy is out of Halo at Dawn, a Halo mare who earned \$86,232, with four of her five victories coming in route events, appropriately enough for the dam of a winner of the marathon San Juan Capistrano. A half sister to the minor stakes winner Duke Mitchell, Halo at

Dawn is out of Stolen Beads, an unraced daughter of Protanto. None of Stolen Beads' half brothers or sisters took a stakes event, although her half sister Cold Storage took third in the English St. Leger, the third leg of the English Triple Crown, and run over a distance which is 110 yards further than the San Juan Capistrano, and her dam Snow Court showed similar tendencies with a win in the Ripon St. Leger Trial. Two of Stolen Beads' siblings achieved less than Cold Storage on the track, but made an impact at stud. Snowmount, a Sallymount filly, won her only start and became dam of Canadian champion Christy's Mount and also figures as third dam of graded stakes winners Time Limit and Miss Indy Anna. Dancing Count, a Northern Dancer colt, also won his only start and sired 19 stakes winners as well as Count on Bonnie, dam of 1991 GI Belmont S. and GI Preakness S. winner Hansel.

The cross which produced Ringaskiddy--that of Seattle Slew and his sons over Halo-line mares--has previously been spectacularly unsuccessful with only one other unrestricted stakes winner to its name. Perhaps it's significant that Slewvescent is out of Our Mims, a daughter of Herbager. Halo sired champions Glorious Song and Devil's Bag and their brother Saint Ballado out of a mare by Herbager, and graded stakes winner Radiant Ring out of a mare by Herbager's son Gleaming. It's also worth mentioning that Ringaskiddy goes back in male line to Bold Ruler, while Protanto, the sire of his second dam, is out of a half sister to Bold Ruler. Bold Ruler appears in the pedigree of at least six other stakes winners out of mares carrying Protanto or his half-brother, The Irishman. The connection is particularly close in the case of Seattle Slew's grandsire Boldnesian and Protanto. Boldnesian is by Bold Ruler out of a mare by Polynesian, and Protanto is by a son of Polynesian out of a half-sister to Bold Ruler. Seattle Slew's sire Bold Reasoning is by Boldnesian out of a mare by Halo to Reason. The latter is also the grandsire of Ringaskiddy's dam Halo at Dawn, so Bold Reasoning and Halo At Dawn actually have a very similar background. So Ringaskiddy is another example of a good runner bred on a bad sireline/broodmare sireline cross, but having significant linebreeding to genetic relatives.
