

DAY TABBED FOR BOOKLET

Pat Day has picked up the mount on **Booklet** (Notebook) for the Preakness S. May 18, trainer John Ward Jr. said yesterday. He will replace Jorge Chavez. Booklet is among 14 horses currently eyeing the middle jewel of the Triple Crown. Explaining the switch, Ward said, "We're going to race a little more in the Midwest this year than we have and Pat is based here. He also knows the Preakness and that racetrack very well. With Pat doing more riding for us, it was a logical move." Day has won the Preakness five times. Booklet's presence in the Preakness all but guarantees that Kentucky Derby winner **War Emblem** (Our Emblem) won't be allowed to relax on the lead, as he did in the Derby. And Ward doesn't think Booklet will be the only horse pressing the Derby winner. "I think War Emblem is going to be attacked by everyone in the field," he said. "With Booklet, the kind of fractions that horse set in the Derby is coasting." In other Preakness news, trainer Ken McPeck said he is still on the fence regarding the status of **Harlan's Holiday** (Harlan) for the race, adding that he blundered in not telling jockey Edgar Prado to use the horse's tactical speed in the Derby. "We'll make up our minds about the Preakness in about a week," he said. "It's a possibility. He came out of the Derby in great shape, but we'd like to get him back to the track before we make up our minds. I said repeatedly that there wasn't going to be any pace in the race. I should have told Edgar [Prado] to send this horse. I'm very angry with myself. I'd rather tell him something like that and let it be my own fault if it backfires rather than just leaving everything up to him." As far as **Take Charge Lady** (Dehere), the beaten favorite in the Kentucky Oaks, McPeck said he is leaning toward running her next in the GI Acorn S. June 7 at Belmont.

TEMPERA BURIED AT JONABELL

Champion **Tempera** (A.P. Indy) was buried last week at Sheikh Mohammed's Jonabell Farm in Lexington, Kentucky, reports the *Blood-Horse*. The GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies' winner was euthanized Apr. 28 following an attack of colitis and laminitis. The filly was preparing for last weekend's Kentucky Oaks when her fatal affliction surfaced.

Dancer male line, represented by Harlan's Holiday, Medaglia d'Oro, Johannesburg, Lusty Latin and Easy Grades, and the Raise A Native line, whose hopes rested on Came Home, Saarland, Castle Gandolfo, War Emblem, Private Emblem and Proud Citizen.

The contest proved one-sided, with the Raise A Native line--or, more accurately, the Mr. Prospector branch--increasing its domination of this premier dirt classic. First and second places went to colts by sons of Mr. Prospector and War Emblem's impressive display made him the sixth member of the Mr. Prospector clan to win in the last 13 years. This magnificent collection comprises one son (Fusaichi Pegasus), three grandsons (Unbridled, Thunder Gulch and War Emblem) and two great-grandsons (Grindstone and Real Quiet).

If this statistic makes you think that Mr. Prospector's domination is bound to continue for many years, perhaps I should remind you that Bold Ruler had an even more impressive record in the Derby in the 1970s. Thanks to his son Secretariat, his grandsons Dust Commander, Cannonade, Foolish Pleasure, Bold Forbes and Spectacular Bid and his great-grandson Seattle Slew, Bold Ruler's male line provided seven winners in the space of 10 years. This year the Bold Ruler male line, which survives mainly through Seattle Slew, was responsible for only one Derby contender, Essence of Dubai.

Considering that War Emblem's sire Our Emblem never won a stakes race during a 27-race career, he could be considered a very unlikely candidate to sire a Kentucky Derby winner. However, he was a much better horse than the bare facts seem to indicate. He was beaten only a nose by Lite The Fuse in the GI Carter H. as a four-year-old, when he was also second in the GII Tom Fool H. and GII Forego H. His other efforts in 1995 included an excellent third, beaten a nose and the same by Not Surprising and You And I, in the GI Vosburgh H., a creditable third in the Metropolitan H. and a five-length sixth in the Breeders' Cup Sprint. The International Classification handicappers awarded him 119 pounds, just eight pounds less than the year's top sprinters.

That Our Emblem was essentially a sprinter could also be held against him as a potential sire of a Kentucky Derby winner, except that the same could be said of Mr. Prospector, sire of Fusaichi Pegasus. Mr. Prospector's son Gulch earned the title of champion sprinter but that didn't stop him siring Thunder Gulch.

Gulch was no doubt helped by the fact that his dam, Jameela, was a top-class winner at up to 1 1/4 miles and Our Emblem has a similar background. His extraordinary dam, Personal Ensign, gained two of her eight Grade I victories over 1 1/4 miles, with another three coming over 1 1/8 miles. Her brother Personal Flag was runner-up in two Grade I races over 1 1/2 miles.

Personal Ensign produced a total of five foals by Mr. Prospector and among them were Miner's Mark, winner of the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup over 1 1/4 miles, and Traditionally, winner of the GI Oaklawn H. over 1 1/8 miles. Bred to Easy Goer, a Raise A Native line horse with considerably more stamina than Mr. Prospector, she produced the excellent My Flag, winner of the CCA Oaks.

Of course, it was Our Emblem's illustrious lineage, as much as his racing record, which earned him a place alongside his sire at Claiborne at a fee of \$10,000 in 1997. He proved popular enough, attracting books of 49, 67, 60 and 69 mares in his first four seasons. Unfortunately, his first juvenile runners failed to make much of a splash in 2000, with only three of them winning, and a reduction in his fee to \$7,500 wasn't enough to prevent his book slipping to 31 mares in 2001. With no great upturn in his first crop's results, Our Emblem was relocated to Maryland last fall, with his fee adjusted to \$4,000.

Our Emblem's second Claiborne crop has quickly proved much superior to its predecessor. As many as 10 of his two-year-olds were successful, which is a respectable effort by a stallion who didn't show his true worth until he was four, and two of those 10, War Emblem and the Arkansas Derby winner Private Emblem, improved enough to make it into the Derby field. Our Emblem clearly merits much more respect than he received at last year's yearling sales, when his third-crop youngsters averaged less than \$10,000.

War Emblem made only \$20,000 at Keeneland the previous year. With his first three dams respectively being daughters of the Argentine import Lord At War, the turf-loving The Pruner and the Australian import Sky High II, he couldn't exactly be said to have a stallion's pedigree, but that doesn't mean his pedigree isn't respectable.

Lord At War was consistently under-appreciated as a stallion. The facts are that this winner of the Santa Anita H. ranked as high as sixth on last year's APEX table of leading sires by "A" runners index.

The stallions above him were A.P. Indy, Danzig, Storm Cat, Nureyev and Sadler's Wells and those immediately below him were Kingmambo, Rainbow Quest, Deputy Minister, Sunday Silence and Mr. Prospector. On the table of leading sires by "ABC" runners index, Lord At War was second only to Danzig.

Another daughter of Lord At War produced E Dubai, one of last year's leading mile-and-a-quarter three-year-olds, to Mr Prospector, so this type of cross looks to be an avenue worthy of further exploration.

War Emblem's dam, Sweetest Lady, reached the first two in nine of her 16 starts and his next dam, Sweetest Roman, earned an Experimental Free Handicap mark of 106. Sweetest Roman also produced three stakes-placed performers, but she didn't do nearly so well as War Emblem's fourth dam, Roman Song. This daughter of Roman produced three sons which were well above average, led by Proudest Roman, one of the best juveniles of 1970, and Bravest Roman, a Grade II winner who did very well as a stallion in Japan.

Mention of Japan reminds me that another Kentucky Derby winner, Sunday Silence, didn't have a conventional stallion's pedigree packed with fashionable names. His first three dams were by Understanding, the Argentine import Montparnasse II and Hillary, but this hasn't stopped him being even more effective as a stallion than he was on the track.

Crimson Hero Leads Churchill Work Tab:

Crimson Hero (Capote), second in the GII Lexington S. Apr. 20, breezed five panels in 1:03 1/5 yesterday at Churchill Downs while preparing for his next start in the Preakness S. at Pimlico May 18. Exercise rider Jamie Sanders was in the saddle. Also on the work tab, GIII Rebel S. winner **Windward Passage** (Captain Bodgit), who was excluded from the overflow field in the Kentucky Derby, worked four furlongs in :49 1/5 for trainer Steve Asmussen. The conditioner also sent out GII Louisiana Derby winner **Easyfromthegitgo** (Dehere), who covered seven furlongs in 1:27 4/5. Both colts could make their next start in the second jewel of the Triple Crown, however, Windward Passage is also eligible for the Sir Barton S. on the Preakness undercard and Saturday's GIII Lone Star Derby.

Buddha Heads to Travers:

Buddha (Unbridled's Song), who was withdrawn from the Kentucky Derby Friday morning because of lameness in his left foreleg, reportedly will now head to the GI Travers S. at Saratoga Aug. 24. Trainer James Bond will ship the colt to Saratoga tomorrow. The grey looks likely to prep for the 'Midsummer Derby' in the GII Dwyer at Belmont July 7 or Saratoga's GII Jim Dandy S. Aug. 4.

Essence of Dubai heads to Belmont:

Group 2 UAE Derby winner **Essence of Dubai**, ninth in the Kentucky Derby, will bypass the Preakness and point toward the Belmont S. June 8, reports the *Thoroughbred Times*. The colt is scheduled to ship to Belmont Park on Sunday.

☆ **CLASSIC CORNER**

A Classic Winner for Zinaad:

Zinaad (GB) (Shirley Heights {GB}--Time Charter {Ire}, by Saritamer), a fifth-crop sire who stands at Germany's Gestut Graditz for a fee of €4,000, celebrated his first Classic winner Sunday when his three-year-old daughter Kazzia (Ger) pulled off the upset in the G1 Sagitta 1000 Guineas at Newmarket. Now a perfect three-for-three, Kazzia is the stallion's lone stakes winner, also accounting for the G3 Premio Dormello in Italy last year. Zinnad is also the sire of the German stakes-placed Rosarium (Ger). The bay is out of the 23-year-old Time Charter, who was named champion older mare in England after winning the G1 Dubai Champion S., G1 King George & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. and G1 Coronation Cup. The Irish-bred took the G1 Oaks S. and was the runner-up in the G1 1000 Guineas as well. In addition to Zinaad, winner of the G2 Jockey Club S., the broodmare produced Time Allowed (GB), who herself notched a victory in the Jockey Club S. and was named heavyweight older mare in England at 11 to 14 furlongs. The 13-year-old Zinnad won three of his 12 lifetime starts, with a second and four thirds, and earned \$131,918.

Rock and Hawk Wing Fine:

Trainer Aidan O'Brien yesterday reported Saturday's 2000 Guineas first and second **Rock Of Gibraltar (Ire)** (Danehill) and **Hawk Wing** (Woodman), respectively, to be "fine" after their runs at Newmarket. O'Brien, speaking at The Curragh yesterday, suggested they could renew their rivalry in the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas at that track May 25. "Both are fine after the race and both are still possibles for the Irish Guineas," said O'Brien. O'Brien also confirmed that **Johannesburg** (Hennessy) and **Castle Gandolfo** (Gone West) have returned to Ballydoyle after their runs in the G1 Kentucky Derby on Saturday. "They are both back from America and they seem fine. They will now have a rest before we decide on what to do with them later in the season," he said.

O'Brien Reveals Weekend Plans:

Trainer Aidan O'Brien yesterday declared **Sophisticat** (Storm Cat) on target for Sunday's G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches (French 1000 Guineas) at Longchamp. Michael Kinane will partner the winner of the G3 Prix de la Grotte, and will choose from **Della Francesca** (Danzig), **Sahara Desert (GB)** (Green Desert) and **Landseer (GB)** (Danehill) for the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains (French 2000 Guineas). Kinane is also scheduled to ride **Ballingarry (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) in Longchamp's G1 Prix Lupin as that colt bids to follow up his smooth success in the G2 Prix Noailles at the track Apr. 7. Seamus Heffernan will ride **High Chaparral (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) in the G3 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial S. at Leopardstown on Sunday as that colt aims to follow in the steps of last year's G1 Epsom Derby winner Galileo (Ire). He was the impressive winner of the Listed Ballysax S. at Leopardstown Apr. 14 last time.

Logic to The Curragh:

Queen's Logic (Ire) (Grand Lodge), who was forced to miss the G1 1000 Guineas on Sunday, will be aimed at the Irish equivalent at The Curragh May 26, trainer Mick Channon announced yesterday. Queen's Logic, who was pulled out of the mile Classic on the morning of the race, was reported fine by the handler yesterday. "She's fine, and sound this morning," said Channon. "Hopefully within a day or two, we will get a shoe back on her. That's history now--we've just got to get on with it. The Irish Guineas then the Coronation is the plan. I've just spoke to the owner [Jaber Abdullah] and everything's good and he's thrilled that she's sound again."

Diaghilev had to battle in the end to deny the fast finish of Le Fou, but proved equal to the task to record his first stakes success. Having cost 3.4 million guineas as a yearling, Diaghilev was given time to develop as a two-year-old and debuted only in August in a Leopardstown maiden where he was outbattled by Stage Call (Ire). Fourth in a similar event at Newmarket in October, he was green when fifth in the G1 Criterium International at Saint-Cloud in November. Returned to maiden company at Leopardstown last time Apr. 14, he showed a fine turn of foot to score impressively. Here, he settled in third travelling easily off the strong pace set by stable companion Twentytwoandchange (Ire) (Lure). He was still on the bridle approaching the quarter-mile marker as Olivier Peslier forced Martaline past the rabbit. Tackling Martaline soon after, he led with 1 1/2 furlongs. Idling in front, he quickened again as Le Fou drove towards the line under Yutaka Take and that final burst proved decisive. "Jamie said he just got there. He would want a bit better ground like he had at Leopardstown the last day and I think he will get a mile and a half," said trainer Aidan O'Brien.

CONSOLIDATION IN CHICAGO? The *Chicago Tribune*, quoting both Harness Tracks of America director Tom Carey III and Charles Bidwell III as sources, says consolidation of Hawthorne Race Course and Sportsman's Park into one corporation could be as close as a month away. Bidwell told the paper, "We've kind of set deadlines for each other to have something more definitive in writing. I think within 30 days we're going to be able to show the racing board some real definitive stuff. We've worked out everything else as far as organization. I think we're very close." Carey also said the merger could come within a month, indicating that the problem is in economics and that "certain aspects need to be attended to." The "certain aspects" are believed to include Sportsman's debt rising from its renovation costs in converting the facility to an unsuccessful auto racing track several years ago, Sportsman's right to operate off-track betting parlors once live racing ceases there, the continuing real estate taxes on the track, and potential revenues from the Rosemont casino, when and if it gets built. Under the proposed agreement, all live racing would take place at Hawthorne, and 78 years of Thoroughbred racing at Sportsman's Park would end.

IMPERIAL GESTURE FINE AFTER OAKS Imperial Gesture (Langfuhr) appeared to be in good order Saturday after she was eased in the final stages of Friday's GI Kentucky Oaks. "Frankie thought she was wobbly and by the time we got her back to barn, she seemed a little stressed, although after walking her around the shed, she seemed OK," assistant trainer Tom Albertrani told the *Daily Racing Forum*. "It seemed to be a heat problem, even though you wouldn't think that would happen since it wasn't a hot day. We'll keep an eye on her for the next few days and hopefully, that's all it will turn out to be."

DERBY RATINGS UNCHANGED The television rating for the 2002 Kentucky Derby was an 8.3, identical to the rating the race earned a year ago. That figure represents the 53 largest markets in the U.S., with each rating point equating to slightly more than 1 million viewers. The Derby broadcast, televised on NBC for the second straight year, began at 5 p.m. and ran just over its originally scheduled 90-minute slot.

Renovations Begin At Churchill Downs:

Just two days after longshot War Emblem renovated the wallets of many handicappers with a wire-to-wire win in Saturday's Kentucky Derby at Churchill Downs, plans went into effect to renovate and modernize the famed track. The first of two scheduled phases of construction will feature the creation of 70 luxury suites atop the existing grandstand area. A new club and meeting space that will provide a scenic view of the downtown Louisville skyline is also in the works. In addition, repairs will be made to the celebrated Twin Spires and to the first floor of the grandstand. The \$30 million first phase is scheduled for completion next summer. Upon approval from the Churchill Downs Inc. board of directors, a \$100 million second phase would tear down and reconstruct a large section of the clubhouse, with the entire project aimed to be completed by the 2004 Fall Meet. Churchill Downs originally opened in post-Civil War America in 1875 and has been hosting the Kentucky Derby ever since.

Danthebluegrassman Aimed Towards Lone Star Derby:

Danthebluegrassman (Pioneering), last week's surprise entry into the Kentucky Derby who was forced to scratch from the race after tying up on Saturday morning, will likely start in the GIII Lone Star Derby at Lone Star Park this Saturday. The colt's owner, Mike Pegram, confirmed that the Bob Baffert-trained 'Dan' will "very likely" take a shot at the richest race in Texas, adding, "There's nothing better than to have a Derby-winning trainer and to run for \$500,000 in Texas." In an interesting twist of fate, the horse that 'Dan' knocked out of the Derby, Steve Asmussen's **Windward Passage** (Captain Bodgit), may also run in the Lone Star Derby.

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a + will denote winners who are first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races, a (C) will be used for maiden-claiming races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races. Purses for Canadian races are in Canadian dollars.

KIM & JOHN LOVE KIM LOVES BUCKY

When Moondust Mink (Great Above) gave birth to a bay colt by Green Dancer in March of 1997, the foal was so immediately rambunctious that Kim and John Glenney couldn't help but be a little surprised. The Glenneys were new to the breeding game, and this was their first foal, so they weren't exactly sure the little fellow should be displaying such verve so soon after entering the world. But accompanying the high energy was an irresistible, endearing personality and when John gave to Kim his half of the colt as a birthday gift--and with it the right to name him--there seemed only one proper moniker.

Little did they know that five short years later, the spunky little bay with the funny name would provide for them the opportunity to stand in the winner's circle at storied Keeneland as owners and breeders and, for John, trainer, of their first graded stakes winner.

When Kim Loves Bucky, a longshot at odds of 12-1 whose previous claim to fame was a fourth in the GII Kentucky Cup Turf at Kentucky Downs last September, sprung from a stalking position to capture the Apr. 24 GIII Elkhorn S. at Keeneland, he provided a classic ending to what has so far been a classic tale.

As longtime residents of Lexington, the Glenneys were drawn to Thoroughbred racing after John, a doctor of biochemistry, retired in the mid-nineties from a position at the University of Kentucky. They acquired a broodmare in 1996, the aforementioned Moondust Mink, and the next year purchased a few runners. It wasn't long before it occurred to John that training horses was something that he'd like to do.

"I watched other people train my horses," he recalls, "And I wanted to be more involved, to have more input. I was interested in the exercise physiology of it, the problem solving aspects of it. Each horse is unique and has its own issues, which is a scenerio of problem solving not unlike the research lab."

So, four years ago, he took the helm with a Rahy filly named My Fast Lady. She won just two races in 25 starts, but lured John deeper into the racing business and convinced him to add more horses to his stable.

Around the same time the Glenneys made a sizeable splash on the breeding end of things with the purchase of Lady's Secret for \$750,000. The daughter of Secretariat is a multiple Grade I stakes winner--including a victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff--and was named Horse of the Year in 1986. She has yet to produce a stakes winner, but has an unraced three-year-old gelding by Seattle Slew named Vigor whose debut is imminent and a two-year-old colt by Skip Away, both of whom have been allowed to develop at a comfortable pace.

In the meanwhile, admission into the gallery of graded stakes-winning trainers hasn't sparked any grandiose dreams in the soft-spoken 51-year-old from Texas. He is content to train a small stable of nine or so horses, mostly homebreds. The Glenneys also have about a dozen young horses currently being stabled on a 40-acre plot of land that adjoins the Thoroughbred Center in Lexington, Kentucky, and they take advantage of the nearby training facilities to groom their prospective talent.

After his victory in the Elkhorn S., Kim Loves Bucky shipped with some of his stablemates to Hollywood Park for the summer meet. John took a late flight the next day to join them, while Kim stayed on the farm in Kentucky to keep a watchful eye on their expecting broodmares.

They haven't yet picked a spot for the five-year-old, but insist that they'll take a relaxed approach and not force him into anything that he's incapable of handling. "I've never put a horse into a race that I thought he didn't have a legitimate shot at winning, even if he went off at odds of 50-1."

And as for goals for the future? Simply, "to win the next race."

Milan (GB) (Sadler's Wells {USA}) faces a spell on the sidelines after suffering a fracture during his comeback run at The Curragh yesterday. Aidan O'Brien's four-year-old was pulled up at the turn into the straight in the Listed Peintre Celebre EBF Mooresbridge S. and was subsequently found to have suffered a fracture of his right front cannon bone. O'Brien said: "Milan suffered a spiral fracture of his off-fore cannon bone and has gone to Troytown. He should be back and it is far from being a problem. It has cost us the first half of the season." Yesterday's race was Milan's first outing since finishing second behind Fantastic Light (USA) in last year's G1 Breeders' Cup Turf. The bay colt won last year's G1 English St. Leger and was third in the G1 Prix Lupin. On the board in six of nine starts, Milan has won three races and has earned \$990,247.

Frankie Dettori was yesterday handed a suspension which will rule him out of top-flight action at York and Newbury next week. Dettori was judged guilty of excessive frequency with the whip aboard Al Moughazel (USA) in the Doncaster Racecourse Sponsorship Club Conditions S. and was banned for four days, from May 15-18. He will miss the Wednesday and Thursday of York's Dante meeting, as well as Newbury's G1 Juddmonte Lockinge S. meeting on Friday and Saturday. Dettori joins Pat Eddery in suspension during next week's York meeting, after Eddery was handed a five-day suspension for his use of the whip on Snowfire (GB) in Sunday's G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket.
