SEATTLE SLEW DIES

Seattle Slew (Bold Reasoning--My Charmer, by Poker), the last surviving Triple Crown winner, died in his sleep Tuesday morning at Hill 'N' Dale Farm in Lexington. He was 28. "Things were nip and tuck the past few days," Mickey Taylor, the Seattle Slew Syndicate manager, said. "He had good days and bad. We knew he had some more spinal problems--it really started to multiply the last five or six days. He was basically tired. He laid down and went to sleep...it was time to let go." He added, "He was my best buddy." Slew died on the 25th anniversary of his Kentucky Derby victory.

From Bargain Basement to Triple Crown Winner:

Seattle Slew, who was from the very first crop of Bold Reasoning out of a minor stakes-winning mare, was purchased by Mickey and Karen Taylor and Dr. Jim Hill and his wife Sally for just \$17,500 as a yearling in 1975, but belied his sticker price with an undefeated two-year-old season, registering three wins from as many starts, including a 9 3/4-length victory in the GI Champagne S. After he was named the champion juvenile of 1976, attention turned to his three-year-old season and an attempt to duplicate the Triple Crown efforts of Secretariat just four years earlier. He did nothing to tarnish his image in early spring, setting a track record for seven furlongs in his allowance return at Hialeah (1:20 3/5) before annexing the GI Flamingo S. and the GI Wood Memorial. Sent off the 1-2 favorite in the Kentucky Derby two weeks later, the dark bay missed the break, but rushed up to contest the pace entering the clubhouse turn. Full of run, he assumed command just outside the quarter pole and was 1 3/4 lengths clear of Run Dusty Run under the line. A workmanlike 1 1/2-length victory over Iron Constitution in the Preakness S. set up a date with destiny before a crowd of 71,026 at Belmont Park three weeks later.

The Test of the Champion...

Jockey Jean Cruguet, aboard the colt throughout his sophomore campaign, left nothing to chance that Saturday afternoon and sent Slew immediately to the front. A handy four-length leader turning for home, he made the final quarter mile a mere formality, maintaining that margin to the finish to become racing's 10th Triple Crown winner (Affirmed would become the 11th and most recent the following year). A fourth-place finish in the GI Swaps S. at Hollywood Park marked the final three-year-old start for Slew, but did little to tarnish a remarkable season, for which he earned honors as both champion of his division as well as Horse of the Year.

The Beat Goes on at Four:

Victorious in his first two outings as an older horse, Seattle Slew was upset by Dr. Patches in the Paterson H. at The Meadowlands, but atoned for that loss with a three-length success over Affirmed in the GI Marlboro Cup H. in a battle of Triple Crown victors. He defeated Exceller in the GI Woodward S. two weeks later before finishing second to that rival in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup in what many believe was the best race of his career. After dueling the younger Triple Crown winner into submission, Slew braced for a challenge from the onrushing Exceller beneath Bill Shoemaker along the inside. The latter looked an easy winner, but Slew dug in to lose by just a nose. He treated race fans to one more virtuoso performance, toting 134 pounds to victory over four overmatched rivals in the GIII Stuyvesant H. at Aqueduct before heading off to stud. He retired with a record of 17-14-2-0 and earnings of \$1,208,726.

A Champ in the Shed As Well:

After being syndicated for \$12 million, he began his second career at Spendthrift Farm in 1979 and it didn't

take Slew long to make his mark as a stallion, siring seven Grade I winners from his first two crops of a combined 70 foals, including champions Landaluce, Slew o' Gold and his lone Kentucky Derby winner Swale. The leading sire in North American in 1984, his final year at

Spendthrift, with progeny earnings of a remarkable \$5.5 million, Seattle Slew was a consistently excellent sire. The bay, who moved to Three Chimneys Farm in 1985 and remained there for the duration of his stud career, produced at least one Grade I winner in 12 out of his first 13 crops to race. Notable among these were the champion two-year-old of 1986, Capote; Seaside Attraction, subsequently the dam of 1995 two-year-old filly champ Golden Attraction; and 1992 Horse of the Year A.P. Indy. In 2001 alone, he was represented by three new female Grade I winners--Kentucky Oaks winner Flute, Ashland and Mother Goose heroine Fleet Renee and Go For Wand upsetter Serra Lake. Seattle Slew was also a perennial leading broodmare sire and was tops in this category in 1995 and 1996. In North America alone, Slew sired 309 producing daughters, 78 of which went on to produce black-type performers. Chief among them was Solar Slew, the dam of two-time Horse of the Year and North American career money leader Cigar. He also sired the dams of two other prominent Allen Paulson runners, champion older mare Escena (Claxton's Slew) and Grade I winner Astra (Savannah Slew). In addition to Seaside Attraction, the dam of GI Florida Derby winner Cape Town, Seattle Slew was the broodmare sire of 1999 GI Belmont S. winner and 2000 champion older horse Lemon Drop Kid (Charming Lassie) and top international sprinter Agnes World (Mysteries), as well as full siblings Stormin Fever and Raging Fever (Pennant Fever). All totaled, Seattle Slew sired 102 stakes winners, 60 of those graded and 29 at the Grade I level. He also was the broodmare sire of 99 stakes winners. His progeny have earned more than \$75 million. (Grade I winners by Slew, p4)

Slew Undergoes Back Surgeries:

In 2000, Seattle Slew began to show decreased coordination and, after getting seven of the nine mares he covered in foal, was taken out of service and underwent spinal surgery at Rood and Riddle Equine Hospital. The surgery was a success and Seattle Slew was back in the breeding shed for 2001. But the back problem resurfaced this February and a second surgery was deemed necessary. Returned to Three Chimneys Mar. 6, just three days after the surgery, Seattle Slew reportedly became agitated by the flurry of breeding activity near his stall and it was decided to move him to more serene surroundings at John Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale Farm, where he will be buried. "What a class act John Sikura and Hill 'N' Dale Farm are," Mickey Taylor said. "John and [groom Tom Wade] picked out a place for him on the farm and he'll be very happy there."

Slew's Connections Remember

Angel Cordero Jr.: *He was by far the best horse I ever sat on. He reminded me of Muhammad Ali. He was that good and he had the same sort of presence. He'd come into the paddock and you could tell he was showing off. This is a great loss for racing. He made a lot of people happy and gave a lot of people great thrills.*

Billy Turner, former trainer: *He was such a remarkable horse. Everything he did on the racetrack was phenomenal and it was the same with his stud career. Everything he did was extraordinary, which includes his longevity and his durability.*

Dr. Jim Hill, former co-owner: *It's certainly a sad day, though it was inevitable and he had a great life and did a whole lot for a lot of people. He also did something remarkable for the Thoroughbred breeding industry and his influence will be felt for many years. It was good to know him when he was around."*

Dan Rosenberg, President, Three Chimneys Farm: *It's a sad day for me and for everybody at Three Chimneys. Having Seattle Slew here was a dream come true, a chance of a lifetime. Everyone who loves horses wants to get close to a great one and a great one he was.*

John Sikura Jr., owner, Hill 'n' Dale Farm: *He was a true champion. He just seemed to have an extra something that horses just don't have. You can equate it to Michael Jordan or anyone great in their fields. That what makes you so appreciative of true greatness. You see it so rarely."*

Fight Your Corner overcame adversity to prevail in impressive style, breaking the course record set by Old Vic (GB) in this race in 1989 in the process. Despite being drawn in stall one, a distinct advantage at this track, he missed the break and had to clamour for position in the early stages, settling in sixth as Sparkling Water led. Taken wide on the sweeping turn into the straight, he quickened well, headed the long-time leader with 150 yards remaining and was pushed out to go clear and win comfortably. "He didn't have it easy--we were hoping to jump well and be up front and relax and dictate the pace," said winning trainer Mark Johnston. "He was in trouble from the word go...yet he's managed to pull out of it and shown that he's got a great turn of foot at the end of a race." Having won a competitive conditions event at Newbury in September, he ended the season with a powerful score in the Listed Autumn S. at Ascot. The colt returned to finish seventh in the Listed Fielden S. at Newmarket Apr. 18. He could go next in the June 2 G1 Prix du Jockey Club.

THE CLASSIC WEEKEND

Let's count the GI Kentucky Oaks as a Classic, since it's the fillies' equivalent of the Kentucky Derby. It was a wild weekend, wasn't it? None of it was impossible to fathom; nonetheless, there were some pretty unexpected results.

Looking back on it now, Friday's Kentucky Oaks upset win by 20-1 shot Farda Amiga made as much sense as any of the weekend's four Classic results. Two of the five logical contenders didn't figure: Bella Bellucci was scratched when her blood work came back wrong, and Godolphin's Imperial Gesture lost all chance when crunched at the start. The remaining 'logical' horses (Take Charge Lady, Habibti, You) ran 2-3-4, but Farda Amiga, a \$45,000 yearling by Broad Brush out of a Pleasant Colony mare, trucked by them all to win the race. She wasn't friendless--a few people had mentioned her and, on the British Racing Channel, *Racing Post's* James Willoughby tipped her to win.

Next up was the English 2000 Guineas at Newmarket, and again the result made sense-- Aidan O'Brien ran 1-2 with Rock of Gibraltar holding off favored Hawk Wing. This couldn't be regarded as anything like a shock result, since Aidan O'Brien trainees won 12 of the 13 Group 1 races for two-year-old colts in Europe last year. But there was a spectacular bias for the far rail in the race; only about six of the 22-strong field raced against the far rail--they included the winner and four of the first five. Hawk Wing, racing on the stands side, made up seven lengths in the final furlong and finished five lengths clear of the eventual sixth (second horse on the stands side), but couldn't catch his stablemate--who, obviously, also ran a great race, since he won.

Time may reveal that it wasn't a bias at all--if Redback, Zipping, and Twilight Blues (who all came into the race with very respectable form) go on to win or run close in other big races next time out, we may have to revise our impression about this huge bias. But, from what we could see on the day--and I mean the royal 'We,' defined as virtually all the professionals I talked to--Hawk Wing should have won. Interestingly, the European handicapping officials clearly shared that view, as Hawk Wing emerged from the race still rated two pounds higher than Rock of Gibraltar.

At least the weekend's first two Classics were won by a Broad Brush filly and a Danehill colt. For the weekend's final two Classics--the Kentucky Derby and the English 1000 Guineas--the winners' sires were, shall we say, less established. But not, in the case of War Emblem's sire, Our Emblem, less well known. Plenty has been written in the last month about Our Emblem, first after War Emblem's six-length win over Repent in the Apr. 6 GII Illinois Derby, then after Private Emblem's win in the GII Arkansas Derby a week later. He's a household name--in industry terms--now.

Our Emblem's stud career is the most dramatic illustration in recent years of a long-established (by me) rule of stallion analysis: don't make your mind up about a sire until his second crop of three-year-olds has raced. But the fact that the occasional Our Emblem emerges doesn't alter the fact that Claiborne would have gotten virtually no mares to him this year: at the end of 2001, he had 86 foals in his first two crops, 61 'year-starters,' one A Runner (0.82 A Index), and four ABC Runners (0.82 ABC Index). At the end of last year, he looked a somewhat below-average sire, who frankly didn't belong in Kentucky.

What a lot of us overlooked--or, rather, discounted--for the race itself was War Emblem's 112 Beyer in Illinois. He went the first half in :48 1/5, the first six furlongs in 1:13, and the final three-eighths in :37:4 at Sportsman's--easy lead, didn't stop. Not many figured he'd get an easy lead at Churchill, but so it proved.

Last year, Songandaprayer motored the first half in 44:4 and the first six in 1:09:1 to set up Monarchos' final time of 1:59 4/5. By comparison, War Emblem's :47 half mile and 1:11 3/5 three-quarters were covered over two seconds (10 lengths) slower; no wonder the first three halfway through the race were the first three at the finish. War Emblem ran a 114 Beyer to win the Derby. It set up perfectly for him, to be sure; but any horse that can run a 112-114 is a very fast horse. Booklet might soften him up enough in the Preakness--or War Emblem might shrug him off, too.

But, for sheer obscurity, the English 1000 Guineas winner Kazzia's sire, Zinaad, takes the cake. A yearling buy in 1990 for Sheikh Maktoum, by Shirley Heights out of Time Charter, and trained by Michael Stoute, Zinaad won the 1993 G2 Jockey Club S. over 12 furlongs at Newmarket and placed in Group races up to two miles. He went to stud in Germany, but had just 76 foals in four crops of racing age through 2001. From 104 year-starters, he had no A Runners (0.00) and just two ABC Runners (0.24) through the end of last year.

On to France...

The Aidan train pulls into Longchamp this weekend with Sophisticat for the French 1000, a couple for the French 2000 and Ballingarry versus Act One in the key French Derby prep, the 2100-meter G1 Prix Lupin. Sophisticat gets a day off from meeting Queen's Logic, who now heads for Ireland after having to miss Newmarket, while Gerald Leigh's Act One, an In the Wings colt, was the only two-year-old Group 1-winning colt in Europe last year not trained by Aidan O'Brien. The other big Coolmore Epsom hope, High Chaparral, stays on the Galileo Trail in Ireland.

Death of Seattle Slew...

Really the end of an era this time. I know Mickey Taylor will be devastated, but as he's said himself, it was a privilege--for all of us--to have a horse like him around for so long. Slew was a for-real superstar, and he singlehandedly saved the Bold Ruler line from premature extinction to boot. One of the greatest I--and many of us--have ever seen, for sure. Godspeed, old son.

Three weeks ago, when we reviewed the pedigree of the GI Arkansas Derby winner Private Emblem (Our Emblem), it never occurred to us that we might soon be considering the pedigree of another son of Our Emblem as a winner of the GI Kentucky Derby.

The racing career of Our Emblem was covered in depth in that article, and also by my colleague, Andrew Caulfield, in yesterday's *TDN*. Still, we have to remark how ironic it is that Our Emblem, a late closing sprinter, should get a horse who is such a formidable front-runner over a distance of ground, and that it should be Our Emblem who has turned out to be a Classic sire, rather than his GI Jockey Club Gold Cup-winning brother, Miner's Mark. At this juncture, we should also note that War Emblem's victory also provided a fitting tribute to the late Ogden Phipps, who recently passed at the age of 93. Phipps not only bred and raced Our Emblem and Miner's Mark, but also their dam, the superlative Personal Ensign, and several other stars in this section of the pedigree, including Private Account, his dam, Numbered Account, and her sire, Buckpasser.

As splendidly as Our Emblem has been doing this year, we also feel a significant amount of the credit for War Emblem's ability should go to his maternal grand-sire, Lord At War. An Argentine-bred grandson of Brigadier Gerard, one of the greatest ever to grace the turf in Europe, Lord At War made a real name for himself as both a runner and sire in North America. Lord At War started but three times in his native land, and won all three, earning status as Champion Miler with a win in the GI Gran Premio Internacional Joaquin S. de Anchorena. In North America at four and five, Lord At War, won six of 14 starts, including the GI San Antonio H. and GI Santa Anita H., the latter over the Derby distance of 10 furlongs.

Pedigree Perspectives cont.

Despite owning a pedigree which was a mystery to most North American breeders, and an outcross for most North American broodmares, Lord At War became a very successful sire. To date his record stands at 40 stakes winners from 381 foals, better than the 10-percent mark which has generally been held as the benchmark of a top sire. Many of his runners have stayed well--his best include veteran turf staying star John's Call, the GI Queen Elizabeth Challenge Cup heroine La Gueriere and graded-stakes winners Mighty, Lady At Peace, War Thief, Trip, Ioya Two, Don't Be Silly, Added Asset, Only To You, Lord Joe, Road of War, Cuando Puede, Ascutey and Must Be War.

Even before War Emblem, Lord At War was showing serious promise as a broodmare sire. His daughters have already produced two earlier Grade I winners in No Matter What and Tali'sluckybusride, as well as graded scorers Whiskey Wisdom, Lasting Approval and E. Dubai. As Andrew Caulfield pointed out yesterday, E. Dubai is a son of Mr. Prospector and therefore bred on the same cross as War Emblem, who is by a son of Mr. Prospector. It's no surprise to see Lord At War mares work well with Mr. Prospector and his sons, since Lord At War sired six stakes winners, four of them graded, out of mares by Mr. Prospector and his sons.

The pedigrees of Mr. Prospector and Lord At War have very little in common, at least in the first four or five generations, but War Emblem does have some other significant linebreeding. Our Emblem's granddam, Grecian Banner, is by a grandson of Ribot out of a mare by Aristophanes, and Lord At War's dam, Luna de Miel, is by a son of Ribot out of a mare by Aristophanes. Ribot, undefeated and twice winner of the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, was one of the greatest runners of all time, and Aristophanes was a stakes winner by English Derby winner Hyperion out of English Oaks winner Commotion. Aristophanes is best known in North America as the sire of Forli, perhaps the best horse ever bred in Argentina, and subsequently sire of Forego. As an interesting side note, we can observe that Grecian Banner's dam, Dorine, herself a brilliant racemare, was bred on the same Aristophanes/Advocate nick as Forli.

Neither Grecian Banner nor Luna de Miel, the products of the Ribot/Aristophanes cross, were runners of note, but in Personal Ensign and Lord At War, they produced two outstanding performers. Since Grecian Banner and Luna de Miel are similarly bred, (they have more in common than just Ribot and Aristophanes), it's no surprise that strains which produced good results with them, also have an affinity for each other.

Meadowlands To Host Four Turf Races Next Week:

The Meadowlands racetrack in Northern New Jersey is set to host four turf races next week, with a pair each scheduled for May 15 and 16. "It's an experiment and one that hopefully works," said Bob Kulina, vice president of racing for the New Jersey Sports and Exhibition Authority, which conducts racing at Monmouth and the Meadowlands. "With an agreement in place between the Thoroughbred and standardbred horsepeople, it's a sign that both groups are willing to cooperate and try new things." The two Thoroughbred races will kick off the action on both days with post time for the first race at 6:35 p.m. followed by the second at 7:20. A full program of harness races follows off at 8 p.m. All four of the turf races are scheduled to be drawn at Monmouth Park this Saturday morning.
