SUNDAY BREAK OUT OF PREAKNESS

Trainer Neil Drysdale announced late Sunday that **Sunday Break (Jpn)** (Forty Niner), third in the GI Wood Memorial S. Apr. 13, will not run in this Saturday's GI Preakness S. After conferring with the colt's owner, Koji Maeda, Drysdale confirmed that they are taking the three-year-old to Belmont for the GII Peter Pan S. May 25. Sunday Break, who failed to make it into the Kentucky Derby line-up earlier this month because of insufficient graded stakes earnings, may attempt to use the same route employed by another Drysdale pupil, A. P. Indy, who won the Peter Pan en route to a win the 1992 Belmont S. This year's Belmont is scheduled for June 8.

EASYFROMTHEGITGO LEADS TRIALS

Easyfromthegitgo (Dehere) breezed over the Churchill slop yesterday in his final major work heading into Saturday's Preakness. The colt covered five furlongs in 1:02 2/5. With assistant trainer Scott Blasi looking on, the colt galloped out six furlongs in 1:16 2/5. "He finished up well," said Blasi. "He went the last quarter in 24-and-change and we're pretty happy with the move." Also on yesterday's worktab, **Straight Gin** (Go For Gin) worked five-eighths of a mile in 1:00 3/5 at old Hill Top for trainer Nick Zito. Fourth in the GI Blue Grass S. at Keeneland Apr. 13, Straight Gin will join stablemate **Crimson Hero** (Capote) in Zito's quest for his second Preakness win, following Louis Quatorze in 1996. "Two is better than one," Zito told the *Blood-Horse*. "I'm happy to have two horses, and they belong here." Another fresh horse looking to steal the big prize, **Equality** (Mt. Livermore), winner of the GIII Tampa Bay Derby Mar. 17 and most recently second in the Aventura S. at Gulfstream Apr. 6, covered six furlongs in 1:13 4/5 at Pimlico Sunday.

Turtle Bow underlined her credentials for the G1 Prix de Diane Hermes (French Oaks) at Chantilly June 9 with a smooth success here. She had taken the step from the provinces--where she had finished second on her debut before winning in February--to the Paris tracks in stride, taking a conditions event at this track Mar. 5 in style. She then proved 3/4 of a length too strong for Bright Sky (Ire) in the Listed Prix Finlande at Longchamp Apr. 7. When that filly and the fourth place, Ana Marie (Fr), went on to finish first and second, respectively, in the G3 Prix Vanteaux at Longchamp Apr. 28, the form received a considerable boost. Looking for her first Group success, Turtle Bow raced in second early as Totally Cosmic went to the front. Switched to challenge at the top of the straight, she took command a quarter mile out before being pushed out to score comfortably. "At one time after she won the Prix Finlande, we toyed with the idea of running her in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches [French 1000 Guineas]," said trainer Francois Rohaut. "We ran her here to see if she stayed and she fulfilled her promise today. All being well, she'll probably run in the Prix de Diane."

PEDIGREE INSIGHTS

Picking a topic for today's column was something of a no-win situation. The fact that several stallions and female lines have enjoyed tremendous runs of success in recent days meant that, whatever subject I picked, some very deserving achievements would go unmentioned.

So which do I choose? Do I opt for the Florida-based Zamindar, whose first crop supplied Juddmonte with three good recent winners in France, including the French 1000 Guineas winner Zenda?

Or what about Derrinstown Stud's Alhaarth, whose trio of first-crop winners on May 13 included Bandari, who ran away with the G3 Derby Trial at Lingfield, and Birdie, winner of the Oaks Trial at the same meeting?

Or how about the full-sisters Wemyss Bight and Hope? Eight days after the GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic was won impressively by Wemyss Bight's son Beat Hollow, the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches went to Hope's daughter Zenda.

Grand Lodge and Sadler's Wells are other in-form stallions, with Grand Lodge's batch of recent winners being headed by Grandera, hero of the Singapore Airlines International Cup. But the vote has to go to Danehill, another member of the Coolmore line-up.

This unstoppable stallion completed a notable classic double when Landseer won the French 2000 Guineas just eight days after Rock of Gibraltar had taken the English version. What's more, Danehill's daughter Firth of Lorne was a creditable second to Zenda in the French 1000 Guineas. This highly versatile stallion also racked up two other promising winners from his three-year-old crop, in addition to winning the 2¼-mile Chester Cup with Fantasy Hill.

After years of having the depth of his talent questioned in the Northern Hemisphere, Danehill silenced all of his critics with a sensational 1998 crop. Thanks to the G1 winners Aquarelliste, Banks Hill, Mozart and Regal Rose, plus an excellent supporting cast comprising Royal Dragon, Danehurst, Hawkeye, Honours List, Prove, Quarter Note, Street Poker and the Japanese G2 winner Air Eminem, this crop contained the grand total of 12-Group winners. This equates to roughly 10 percent of the whole crop.

Even though his 1999 crop is some 40-percent larger and was sired at a higher fee (Ir35,000gns, compared to the previous year's Ir25,000gns), Danehill surely faces an enormous task in trying to match or better this figure of 12-Group winners in a single crop. So far, his total stands at three--Landseer, Rock of Gibraltar and Half Glance--but there are plenty of potential Group winners in this large crop, such as Dolores, a close fourth in the 1000 Guineas on only her second start, and Firth of Lorne.

Landseer has all the credentials--as does Rock of Gibraltar--to make him a popular replacement for Mozart, the very fast son of Danehill who died during his first season at Coolmore. Landseer possesses all the toughness we have come to associate with Danehill's progeny, and he matured quickly enough to win the G3 Coventry Stakes on his third start last June. He has trained on so well that he has never been beaten more than half a length in five subsequent appearances, three of them at Group 1 level.

Landseer was bred by Rockwell Bloodstock, belonging to former jockey Walter Swinburn. The Swinburn family's Genesis Green Stud has built up an impressive record over the last dozen years, numbering Possessive Dancer, winner of the Oaks in Italy and Ireland in 1991; Victory Note, winner of the French 2000 Guineas in 1998; and Desert Prince, winner of the 1998 Irish 2000 Guineas among its other graduates.

This collection acts as a useful reminder that pedigree can be far more important than performance in a broodmare. The dams of Landseer and Possessive Dancer never raced and the dams of Victory Note and Desert Prince failed to win. What these mares have in common is that they all come from top-class female lines.

Landseer's dam Sabria is by Miswaki, who has the remarkable record of also being the broodmare sire of the classic-winning colts Galileo, Daylami and Hernando. Miswaki is also the broodmare sire of Danehurst, a very fast daughter of Danehill.

You can get some idea of the calibre of Sabria's pedigree from the fact that her half brother by Caerleon was the third-highest-priced yearling in Europe in 1995. That colt, King Sound, developed into a Group performer at up to 1 1/2 miles, but he wasn't in the same league as another colt sired by Caerleon from this family. This was the champion three-year-old Generous, whose dam Doff The Derby is a half-sister to Landseer's third dam, Hail Maggie.

As a daughter of Hail To Reason and Margarethen, Hail Maggie was a sister to Trillion, the exceptional French racemare who numbered a second in the Arc among her many top-class efforts. Trillion, of course, went on to produce the brilliant Triptych to a mating with Riverman and Landseer's second dam, the Riverman mare Flood, is a sister-in-blood to Triptych.

This family also produced the Group 1-winning sprinter Tamarisk to Green Desert (who, like Danehill, a son of Danzig) and more recently, enjoyed further classic success when Imagine, a half sister to Generous, won the Irish 1000 Guineas and Epsom Oaks. With a background of this quality, the Coolmore team seem to have another ready-made stallion in Landseer.

She will be useful with regards to the Oaks form, as she was beaten 1 1/4 lengths when third to another contender **Esloob**, receiving seven pounds, in the Listed **Pretty Polly S.** at Newmarket nine days ago.

GUINEAS WINNERS FOR ZAMINDAR

When **Zenda (GB)** crossed the finish line first in Sunday's G1 French 1000 Guineas, the young sire **Zamindar** (Gone West--Zaizafon, by The Minstrel) had garnered a classic winner from just his first crop to race. Owned by Juddmonte Farms, Zamindar began his stud career in Newmarket, but is currently standing at Marablu Farm in Reddick, Florida. "He's had some very impressive winners in the last few weeks," admitted Juddmonte Farm Manager Garrett O'Rourke. "Obviously the owners had very high regard for him and sent him some very good mares. It's a tremendous tribute to him to have a classic winner in his first crop." Of the decision to repatriate the eight-year-old stallion, Juddmonte farm manager Garrett O'Rourke commented, "We just felt he would suit the Florida market very well. He's by Gone West, whose sons have done exceptionally well in the states, with Mr. Greeley being another example. And the Florida people love speed and he ran five furlongs in :55 as a two-year-old." Zamindar covered 80 mares in Florida this season.
