DICK HERN, TRAINER OF NASHWAN, DIES

Major William Richard Hern, CVO, who trained the winners of 17 European Classics, and the likes of Brigadier Gerard (GB), Nashwan, Dayjur and Troy (GB), died yesterday at the age of 81. Hern took out his first training licence in 1957 and soon entered the record books by becoming the youngest man to win the trainers' championship since the war in 1962, the year of his first Classic success with Hethersett (GB) in the G1 St Leger. He began his association with Her Majesty the Queen at West Ilsley in 1967 and provided her with Classic glory in 1974 with G1 1000 Guineas and G1

Prix de Diane winner Highclere (GB). He also trained Highclere's daughter Height of Fashion (Fr) for the Queen, and she achieved notoriety as the dam of Nashwan, Alwasmī, Unfuwain and Nayef. Honoured with a CVO in 1980, the year he completed the Epsom Derby and Oaks double with

Henbit and Bireme (GB), Hern handled the brilliant Brigadier Gerard (GB), who beat Mill Reef in the 1971 G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket and was eventually retired as the winner of 17 of his 18 races; and the brilliant Troy (GB), winner of the 1979 Epsom Derby and G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot. Hern broke his neck in December 1984 while hunting in Leicestershire and in October 1985 broke his leg at home. Following major heart surgery in early 1988, Hern was back in action later that year and just a few months later sent out Nashwan to win the G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket, G1 Epsom Derby and G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown, cementing his new relationship with Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum. He trained for that owner and others at Kingswood Stud near Lambourn from 1991 until he retired at the end of October 1997. His last notable success came with Sheikh Hamdan's Alhaarth (Ire) in the G2 Prix du Rond-Point at Longchamp. That colt, who was champion two-year-old in 1995, was by Unfuwain, whom Hern trained and who also died this year.

LOGIC SCRATCHED FROM IRISH GUINEAS

Queen's Logic (Ire) (Grand Lodge), who came up lame on the eve of the G1 English 1000 Guineas three weeks ago, was yesterday taken out of Sunday's G1 Entenmann's Irish 1000 Guineas at The Curragh by trainer Mick Channon after she scoped dirty. The unbeaten filly was found to have an unclean trachea wash and was coughing yesterday morning the day after she had worked impressively. "She worked great on Tuesday," Channon told *PA Sport*. "Her trachea wash came up bad and she's been coughing so we're not running." Queen's Logic was rated the champion two-year-old filly of 2001 off wins in the G3 Queen Mary S. at Royal Ascot in June, G2 Lowther S. at York in August and G1 Cheveley Park S. at Newmarket in October. She reappeared to take the G3 Fred Darling S. at Newbury Apr. 20 by 1 3/4 lengths from Roundtree (Ire) in workmanlike fashion, securing ante-post favouritism for both the English and Irish 1000 Guineas.

KEENELAND CATALOGS 200 FOR JULY SALE

A total of 200 horses have been cataloged for this year's Keeneland July Selected Yearling Sale. The number cataloged represents a 22-percent increase over last year, when just 164 yearlings were offered. Sires featured in the catalog include Storm Cat, Deputy Minister, A.P. Indy, Saint Ballado, Kingmambo, Seeking the Gold and Unbridled. Several young stallions whose first foals are yearlings of 2002 include Kentucky Derby winners Silver Charm and Charismatic, Exploit, Forestry and Artax. Progeny from a pair of top sires who recently died, Nureyev and Kris S., have also been cataloged. The sale takes place in a pair of 7:30 p.m. sessions set for Monday and Tuesday, July 15 and 16 in Lexington.

Request For Parole To Belmont?:

Sam and Jeri Knighton's **Request For Parole** (Judge T C), a solid fifth in the Kentucky Derby May 4, appears likely to take his place in the Belmont S., trainer Steve Margolis said yesterday. "Mr. Knighton and his wife decided that they wanted to take a shot," the conditioner said. "There's only one Belmont Stakes." The winner of the John Battaglia S. and third behind Perfect Drift in the GII Lane's End Spiral S. at Turfway Park Mar. 23, Request For Parole worked over the turf course at Churchill Downs last week, with an eye on the GIII Jefferson Cup on the grass June 8, but Margolis has had a change of heart. "The horse came out of [the Derby] better than the Spiral," the trainer continued. "He ran a mile and a quarter and it didn't seem to phase him. He's sharp." Should he start in the Belmont, Request For Parole will be ridden by his Derby pilot Robby Albarado.

REMEMBERING DICK HERN

Trainer John Dunlop:

"He was a wonderful, wonderful trainer and there's no trainer, and I'm not even sure any man, that I've admired more than Dick. He was a superb handler of horses and a wonderful horseman in every way until he had his terrible accident. He was a great enthusiast and a very, very brave man during all these long years he was in his wheelchair, with all those problems with his heart and chest and everything else. To survive all those and live to 81 was quite remarkable really. He was a great party man—a great raconteur and loved singing and reciting poetry—he loved a drink and he was a wonderful man and I will miss him tremendously. I think he was one of the greatest trainers of the 20th century, without any doubt. He was a great man."

Jockey Willie Carson, who rode for the Major throughout his career:

"He was two different people—he was an army man and was on parade when he went racing and had this aloofness on the racecourse, which was business. When he got home, he was a different man. He had a fantastic sense of humour, but not on the racecourse. We're going to miss him."

Saturday, Belmont Park

PETER PAN S.-GII, \$200,000, 3yo, 9f

Godolphin's **Ibn al Haitham (GB)** (Zafonic) breezed five-eighths of a mile in 1:00 2/5 at Belmont Park yesterday morning ahead of his expected start in Saturday's feature. Despite his maiden status, the bay has kept top company, finishing second to stablemate and Belmont S. probable **Essence of Dubai** in the GII Norfolk S. last October and third to that rival in the G2 UAE Derby in his most recent racetrack appearance Mar. 23. "It's a bit of a step up for him, but it looks like there could be a short field and it would be a good opportunity," said Tom Albertrani, assistant to trainer Saeed bin Suroor. Ibn al Haitham is slated to be ridden by jockey Jerry Bailey.

Monday, Belmont Park

METROPOLITAN MILE H.-GI, \$750,000, 3yo/up, 1m

A pair of top competitors tuned up for the weekend's marquee event with Tuesday morning works. **Left Bank** (French Deputy), winner of last year's GI Cigar Mile H. at the Met Mile distance Nov. 24, covered five furlongs in 1:00 2/5 with jockey John Velazquez in the irons. "He finished up very well," trainer Todd Pletcher said. "I clocked him the last quarter mile in :23 3/5." Owned by Michael Tabor, the chestnut made his first start since the Cigar Mile a winning one, taking the GIII Bold Ruler H. by one length May 11.

Affirmed Success (Affirmed) has shown no signs of letting up at age eight. Third in the GII General George H. in his second start of the season, the bay comes into the Met off back-to-back wins in the Mar. 16 Toboggan H. and the GI Carter H. Apr. 13. "I really wouldn't have considered this race if he hadn't run so well in the Carter," trainer Richie Schosberg admitted. "He certainly seems to back in peak form." The Albert Fried Jr. colorbearer signaled his readiness for Monday's race with a solid five-furlong breeze on Tuesday in :59 4/5.

Also prepping for the race, **Burning Roma** (Rubiano), third to Affirmed Success in the Carter, worked five furlongs in 1:01 1/5 at Belmont yesterday morning.

NYTHA Makes Grayson-Jockey Club Donation:

The New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association has donated \$37,000 to the Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation. A portion of the contribution was made in memory of Ogden Phipps. "We at the NYTHA appreciate that the Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation seeks out and funds the best research available on the most important problems facing the horse," said the group's executive director Robert Flynn. "When mares started losing foals in large numbers last year, the Foundation stepped up immediately to fund several projects seeking answers. At the same time, that did not diminish its commitment to seeking solutions to other problems all horses and horse owners face." The Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation currently funds 23 research projects, addressing issues like equine infectious diseases, laminitis, and an array of soundness issues.

SHEIKH HAMDAN BUYS BANDARI

Bandari (Ire) (Alhaarth {Ire}) has been purchased by Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum and will be supplemented for the G1 Epsom Derby June 8, it was announced yesterday. In a bid to follow up his successes with Nashwan (USA) in 1989 and Erhaab (USA) in 1994, Sheikh Hamdan has privately purchased the Mark Johnston-trained colt from Abdulla Al Rostamani. Impressive in winning the G3 Lingfield Derby Trial by 13 lengths May 11, Bandari currently holds no entry for the Classic, but is expected to be supplemented at a fee of £90,000 at the next stage. "The decision on supplementing him will be left until the last minute and will depend on the well-being of the horse, but I understand he is being aimed at Epsom," Johnston told *PA Sport* yesterday. "He looks the best chance I have had for the Derby. A few years ago we had Mister Baileys, but there were already question-marks about his staying the trip as he had finished third in the Dante S. There should be no doubt about Bandari staying the trip and he should handle the track." Sheikh Hamdan's Racing Manager Angus Gold said yesterday: "Sheikh Hamdan rang me yesterday to tell me he'd bought the horse, and said as long as Mark Johnston's happy with the horse by the end of next week, when it comes to the supplementary stage, we'll put him in the Derby. As far as I understand Richard Hills will ride."

GUINEAS CUTTING UP

Officials at The Curragh, who described the field for Saturday's G1 Irish 2000 Guineas as "disappointing," received a further blow yesterday as **Queen's Logic (Ire)** (Grand Lodge {USA}) and **Snowfire (GB)** (Machiavellian {USA}) were ruled out of the fillies' equivalent on Sunday. Reacting to the 11 five-day entries for Saturday's Classic, eight of which are trained by Aidan O'Brien, Curragh Manager Paul Hensey said: "It is very disappointing, but we can do no more. There is prizemoney all the down to €4,000 for 10. After the Newmarket Guineas turned into such a muddling race, with the stands side at such a disadvantage, you would have thought trainers would have given their horses the benefit of the doubt. I was looking at the entries for Newmarket on Saturday and there are a number of horses in a listed race there that could have come over here." **Rock Of Gibraltar (Ire)** (Danehill {USA}) is quoted at 1-4 by Cashmans to complete the English-Irish Guineas double. With yesterday evening's meeting at Leopardstown cancelled due to waterlogging, the ground at The Curragh, which is currently described as soft on the Guineas course, is of concern to O'Brien, who said yesterday: "[Rock Of Gibraltar] goes through it because he is such a versatile horse, but he is so good that he must be better on better ground." The easy conditions has led to the withdrawal of Snowfire. John Dunlop's filly, who was runner-up to Kazzia (Ger) in the Newmarket Classic, will avoid the Irish version and head to the G1 Epsom Oaks June 7. Dunlop's racing secretary Marcus Hosgood told *PA Sport* yesterday: "The owner and trainer have consulted and they have decided that she should go to Epsom." Also concerned about the likelihood of soft ground is trainer Marcus Tregoning, who withdrew **Misterah (GB)** (Alhaarth {Ire}) from the Irish 1000 Guineas on Tuesday and is keeping an eye on the weather for **Nayef (USA)** (Gulch {USA}) in the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup on the same card. "There is no decision about Nayef," said Tregoning. "There is every chance he will run, but we will leave it for a bit to see how much rain they have."

LEOPARDSTOWN OFF

Leopardstown's evening meeting was abandoned yesterday after the course was found to be waterlogged. Recent heavy rain in Ireland has led to the abandonment of several meetings over the past few days, and after an inspection of the course at 11 a.m. yesterday the decision was made to postpone until May 30. Among the lost races was the Listed Saval Beg S., set to feature the return of last year's G1 Irish St Leger winner **Vinnie Roe (Ire)** (Definite Article {GB}).

SECOND GUINEAS WIN FOR DUPONT

Dupont (GB) (Zafonic {USA}) was the star of the show last weekend, adding the G2 Mehl-Mülhens-Rennen-German 2000 Guineas to his Italian Guineas victory. Racing off a strong pace early, he had the call over the unbeaten favourite **Next Desert (Ire)** (Desert Style {Ire}) and the fast-finishing **Whisperer (Ger)** (Spectrum {Ire}). Dupont's sire Zafonic, a son of Gone West (USA)--one of Mr. Prospector's (USA) most prolific sons at stud--and the The Minstrel (USA) mare Zaizafon (USA), was most impressive himself when breaking the track record in the English 2000 Guineas in 1993. Dupont's dam, the Sadler's Wells (USA) mare June Moon (Ire), already produced a pair of notable full siblings to the Guineas winner; Japanese stakes winner Zachariah (GB) and German 2000 Guineas winner Pacino (GB). The colt's second dam is the smart G3 Cherry Hinton S. winner Kerrera (Ire), who ran second in the English G1 1000 Guineas. She is by Diesis (GB), a son of Sharpen Up (GB), also from the Native Dancer (USA) sire line. Dupont is inbred 4x3 to Northern Dancer (Can) as well as carrying further strains of Native Dancer. Kerrera is a half sister to the smart sprinter Rock City (Ire) from the family of Derby winners Dante (USA) and Sayajirao (GB), which should make Dupont an interesting sire prospect.

BANDARI LEADS MARKET MOVERS

With the news that **Bandari (Ire)** (Alhaarth {Ire}) will be aimed at the G1 Epsom Derby June 8 and the dramatic withdrawal of **Queen's Logic (Ire)** (Grand Lodge {USA}) from Sunday's G1 Irish 1000 Guineas at The Curragh, William Hill reported lively markets for both Classics yesterday. "After the confirmation that Bandari will be supplemented to the Vodafone Derby, William Hill have removed the 'with a run' clause and installed the colt at 7-1 all in for Epsom," said Spokesman David Hood. "Conversely, Queen's Logic is fast becoming the unlucky filly of her Classic year, after the news that she will now miss the Irish 1000 Guineas and Hills have revised their betting, making Gossamer the 11-4 favourite, but Kournakova is the steamer at 7-1 from 20-1."
