

BATTLESHIP POTEMKIN

With the scratches of two previous Group winners, the G3 Brigadier Gerard S. at Sandown yesterday afternoon was left with just four runners, but the race did not lack for excitement as with **Potemkin (Ire)** (Ashkalani {Ire}) had to survive a lengthy stewards' enquiry to earn his first Group victory. Shadowing **Tarfshi (GB)** (Mtoto {GB}) in second early, he had the narrow call over that filly approaching the quarter-mile marker, but jinked right at that point, taking her ground and also that of **Imperial Dancer (GB)** (Primo Dominie {GB}), who was being brought up the inner. Potemkin was judged to have caused accidental interference by the stewards as they concluded that the result was unaffected by the incident. "He drifted left the last two times he ran and we were expecting that today, so he just surprised us here," said winning jockey Dane O'Neill. "He's starting to hit winning form now, so let's hope it continues." Potemkin showed promise last year, winning the Listed Fairway S. in June before finishing third in the G2 Prix Eugene Adam at Deauville in July. Last time, he had showed a tendency to swerve under pressure when beaten 3/4-length by Asian Heights (GB) in the Listed Berkshire S. at Windsor May 26.

All Systems Go for War Emblem

The Thoroughbred Corp.'s War Emblem (Our Emblem) completed his major preparation for his Triple Crown bid with a five-eighths work at Churchill Downs yesterday morning. The nearly black colt covered the distance in 1:01, galloping out in 1:14. "It was nice," said trainer Bob Baffert. "I was a little bit worried about the heat, but it looked like he was still full of himself. We didn't let him gallop out too strong." Baffert will saddle

a Triple Crown hopeful for the third time in five years, following Silver Charm (1997) and Real Quiet (1998). "I think he's ready," he said. "If he were a big heavy horse, it [the Triple Crown campaign] would have zapped

him pretty good. But he's a very light horse; he's very tough. He's got a long, very fluid and efficient stride and he covers a lot of ground. He's got a lot of heart and a lot of stamina, so he's got all the ingredients." War Emblem is scheduled to fly to New York this morning, as are Belmont challengers **Perfect Drift** (Dynaformer) and **Wisemans' Ferry** (Hennessy).

Maryland's hero **Magic Weisner** (Ameri Valay) completed his preparations with a five-furlong work at Laurel Monday morning. The G1 Preakness runner-up stopped the clock in 1:01 and will be vanned to Belmont Friday.

Essence of Dubai (Pulpit) posted 1:03 4/5 for his five-furlong breeze yesterday at Belmont.

Also breezing at Belmont, **Sarava** (Wild Again) sailed through a half in :48 3/5. "Sarava is what I call a :12s horse," said trainer Ken McPeck. "He'll grind out each eighth in 12 seconds and he'll keep coming. He's got to run the race of his life in the Belmont and I think he's going to."

BIG CLASSIC WEEKEND

After War Emblem's Kentucky Derby win, Andrew Caulfield wrote about the power of Mr. Prospector, particularly in American racing. This coming Saturday, the line goes for a huge trans-Atlantic double: War Emblem goes into the Belmont with a big shot to be the first Triple Crown winner in 24 years, and Mick Kinane has selected unlucky English 2000 Guineas second Hawk Wing, over stablemate and second favorite High Chaparral, as his mount in the Epsom Derby.

War Emblem, as we all know by now, is by Our Emblem, a subject which has now been discussed sufficiently, including by me, that it won't be necessary to review those details this week; you should have it all memorized by now. Hawk Wing is by Woodman, and there has been a lot of entertaining debate--including, no doubt, in Mick Kinane's mind--about whether he will stay 12 furlongs. Several good Woodmans have, most notably 1991 Belmont (and Preakness) winner Hansel--who, incidentally, was not out of a mare with an obvious staying pedigree herself.

The way I read the form book, if Hawk Wing doesn't get the trip, it will not be because of his dam's side--he is a mortal lock to stay 12 furlongs on that side of the pedigree. The dam is La Lorgnette, winner of the 1985 Queen's Plate, beating the best colts in Canada over 10 furlongs. She is by Val de l'Orne out of a Nijinsky mare, out of an Argentinian-bred mare called *La Sevillana. That mare was champion two-year-old and three-year-old filly in Argentina in 1968-69, when she won both the Argentine 1000 Guineas and Oaks; she did win there at 12 furlongs, but whether that was in the Oaks or not, I'm not certain. In any case, she did win over that distance, and she was by Court Harwell, who was a son of Prince Chevalier, himself a son of Prince Rose, who also sired Princequillo. So, yes, that part stays.

But there's more. Hawk Wing is by Woodman, and La Lorgnette's only other SW was Alexandrina, a Conquistador Cielo mare who was a SW at two. Now, Conquistador Cielo is notorious (in certain circles) as a good damsire of two-year-olds, yet this two-year-old SW produced the 12-furlong Canadian International winner, Thornfield; OK, he was by Sky Classic, but even so. Hawk Wing's three-quarters sister who was a two-year-old SW produced a Group 1 winner at 12 furlongs. Case closed: on the dam's side, he gets the trip. But what really locks it up for Hawk Wing is that I have an ante-post voucher on High Chaparral at 20-1. That is the kiss of death.

GONE WEST - THE SPOILER?

If there is to be a spoiler to thwart Bob Baffert's third assault on the Triple Crown (Silver Charm 1997, Real Quiet 1998), it's most likely--in my book, at least--to be the Wayne Lukas-trained Proud Citizen, second in the Derby and third in the Preakness after what I thought was a troubled trip from an outside post. He was never closer than three off the rail, and I felt he would have given War Emblem a serious fright with a better trip.

Proud Citizen is maybe not even the best of a very good crop of three-year-old colts by Gone West--a much better-known son of Mr. Prospector than was Our Emblem--this year, though he's won the GII Lexington S. and placed in the Derby and Preakness. It's a tossup between him and Came Home, 6-for-8 lifetime and a GISW at two (Hopeful) and three (Santa Anita Derby). He's a devastating miler--unfortunately a category not as well served in American racing as it ought to be--and will be a hugely popular addition to the Lane's End stallion barn when his racing career is finished.

Besides these two, let me just mention a few other colts in this crop by Gone West. There is Castle Gandolfo, Group 3 winner and twice Group 1-placed at two, who has been 12th in the Kentucky Derby and sixth in the French Derby this year. Two other Aidan O'Brien trainees, G3 Tetrarch S. second Creekview and Nostradamus, contested (unsuccessfully) the G1 Prix Jean Prat at Chantilly on French Derby day last Sunday.

The Thoroughbred Corp.'s Johar (out of champion Windsharp) was second in the G3 Will Rogers at Hollywood Park last month; and two other two-year-old SW from this crop last year were Changeintheweather (Canada) and Saddad (G2 Flying Childers S. at Doncaster).

Considering Gone West now lays seventh on the 2002 General Sire List, and his best son to date in North America, Mr. Greeley, is 11th and having his best year yet, it may be that Gone West has more impact as a sire of sires than many others by Mr. Prospector. Zafonic has recovered well after a slow start, and his full brother Zamindar sired the French 1000 Guineas winner this year from his first crop. Even the previously unconsidered Pembroke, a fast dude who hadn't done much up till now, had a real speedball double on Kentucky Oaks day--the five-year-old Testify won the five-furlong GIII Aegon Turf Sprint, and the three-year-old filly Drippingindiamonds won an allowance race so impressively she got the call-up to join Bobby Frankel's barn. And this week Grand Slam, the second-best two-year-old (behind Favorite Trick) of 1997, had his first winner, by six lengths, at Churchill Downs.

ELSEWHERE ... I'm not the first person to say it, but what an impressive win that was by the Niarchos family's **Sulamani** over Act One in last Sunday's French Derby. The previously unbeaten Act One was five lengths clear of the third, and appeared to run his race, but Sulamani mowed him down impressively. It's a huge boost for Hernando--his second French Derby winner in three crops--and, yes, referring to my essay of a couple of weeks ago, there is a third cross of Northern Dancer; his second dam is by Northfields ... That 22-year-old overnight sensation, **Night Shift**, already has eight two-year-old winners this year, and is the damsire of Rag Tag (by Barathea, another sire having a much better season), who won a two-year-old stakes in Ireland this week. He's been siring some fast horses for a few years here recently, has Night Shift, but his two-year-olds are winning early and often this year ... none of them, however, looks as good as the filly **Presto Vento**, by a first-year sire called Air Express. Trained, like Rag Tag, by Richard Hannon (bet whatever he runs in the Queen Mary), Presto Vento won yesterday's National S.-Listed at Sandown impressively. Air Express, by Salse out of a Caucasus mare (inbred to Northern Dancer 'top and bottom'), won the 1997 Italian and German 2000 Guineas, ran second in the G1

St. James's Palace (to Starborough) at Royal Ascot, and surprised almost everyone by winning the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Royal Ascot at the end of his three-year-old campaign. I believe he only sired two crops, standing at England's National Stud for £5,000, and died. He wouldn't have had huge crops out of great mares, either.

KAZZIA COMPLETES HER PREPARATION

Kazzia (Ger) (Zinaad {GB}) took part in a five-furlong spin on the Newmarket gallops yesterday morning as she completed her preparation for Friday's G1 Vodafone Oaks at Epsom. Godolphin's unbeaten filly, who was purchased from Andreas Wohler's yard last season, is currently quoted at odds of 7-2 with Coral Eurobet to follow up her success in the G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket May 5. "Kazzia surprised me by winning the Guineas," jockey Frankie Dettori told *PA Sport* yesterday. "I thought that the Oaks would be more down her street, but by winning the Guineas she shows she has more ability than I thought. She's a strong, tough and game filly--typical of the German school where the ground gets very soft and they race on the extremes of conditions. Kazzia will not go down in a fight." Simon Crisford, racing manager, added: "Kazzia obviously benefited from a tactical ride on that day, but she may well have won the race anyhow because she's a very talented filly. She's done very well since the Guineas and a mile and a half will suit her down to the ground. She's a very tough type and if any filly eyeballs her they will know they have been in a battle. She can handle any sort of ground and she will be doing all her best work at the finish. She's the right type for the race and what we saw at the Guineas was a big, big bonus. She's in great heart."

O'BRIEN INSPECTS

Aidan O'Brien will walk the course at Epsom today and his verdict on the state of the going will determine which of his representatives--**Hawk Wing** (Woodman) or **High Chaparral (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells)--Michael Kinane will ride in Saturday's G1 Vodafone Derby. Kinane told *Racing Post*, "If the ground is fast I will ride Hawk Wing." Rain is expected today, prompting course officials to bring a halt to watering. Clerk of the course Andrew Cooper yesterday reported that due to the unsettled forecast there would be no extension of the watering of the last three furlongs of the round course carried out on Sunday.

It seems strange to be talking about a horse who was a champion juvenile the season before last as only beginning to fulfil his potential, but that might be true of Macho Uno, winner this weekend of the GII Massachusetts H.

In fact a review of Macho Uno's Beyer Speed Figures prior to the Mass Cap reveals a record of almost constant improvement, and despite some long gaps in his record, the colt has never run a bad race. In fact in 10 starts, his only finish outside the first three was in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Classic, where he came home in fourth, beaten 4 1/2 lengths by the winner Tiznow.

Although he has only faced the starter 10 times, Macho Uno was actually in action as early as the July of his two-year-old career, when he proved forward enough to win a 5 1/2-furlong maiden event at Saratoga. Next time out, he closed strongly to take third, a neck behind dead-headers City Zip and Yonaguska, in the GI Hopeful S. On his final two outings of the year, Macho Uno nailed down championship honors with a seven-length stroll in the GI Grey Breeders' Cup S. and then despite running very greenly in the stretch, holding off Point Given by a nose in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile.

At the time, Macho Uno seemed a prime candidate for the following season's classics, but a weakness behind--especially in his ankles--caused by immaturity, led trainer Joe Orseno and owner Frank Stronach to decide to give the colt time to develop. Returning in a seven-furlong allowance contest at Saratoga in July, Macho Uno lost by a nose, a repeat of his erratic stretch run in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile costing him victory.

Benefitting from the experience, a more professional Macho Uno defeated subsequent GI Breeders' Cup Distaff heroine Unbridled Elaine in the GIII Pennsylvania Derby. A close third to the formidable front-runner Western Pride in the GII Ohio Derby and the fourth in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic ended the season. This year, Macho Uno had started only once prior to the Mass Cap, defeating subsequent GIII National Jockey Club S. and GII Hawthorne Gold Cup winner Hail the Chief in an allowance race at Gulfstream Park, running a career best Beyer in the process.

Macho Uno is a member of the third crop sired by Holy Bull. A truly great racehorse, Holy Bull earned honors as champion and Horse of the Year at three. The powerful grey won 13 of the 15 races which he completed, including the GI Futurity S., GI Travers S., GI Metropolitan H., GI Haskell Invitational H., GI Woodward S. and GI Florida Derby. Like several other outstanding runners of recent years, among them Skip Away, Silver Charm and Tiznow, Holy Bull presented breeders with something a dilemma when he retired to stud, as his superlative talent was allied to a less than commercial pedigree.

Holy Bull's first crop contained only 42 foals, due to a late retirement following his career-ending injury suffered in the GI Donn H., but five of these became stakes winners, including the GI Frizette S. victress Confessional and other graded stakes winners Crash Course and Hollywood Picture. Five more stakes winners appeared from Holy Bull's second crop, headlined by graded stakes winner Turnofthecentury. Macho Uno and Thunder Blitz, winner of the GIII Flamingo S. and fourth in the GI Kentucky Derby, are from his third crop.

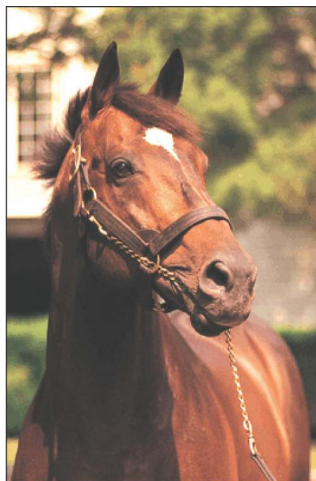

There are some surprises in Holy Bull's stud career. He is a son of the sprinter Great Above, a horse with a Tartan Farm pedigree which closely resembles that of the mighty Dr. Fager (he's by Minnesota Mac, a son of Dr. Fager's sire Rough 'n Tumble out of Dr. Fager's half-sister champion Ta Wee). Normally breeding back the Tartan strains respond well to reinforcement, but adding Dr. Fager, In Reality, Rough 'n Tumble and Aspidistra hasn't worked well here. In addition, Holy Bull has sired plenty of horses who stay quite well by American standards, and several who have a penchant for turf. Although we can note that he appears to have often been used to put speed into staying bred mares, it may also be that as a sire, Holy Bull has influenced by the pedigree of his dam Sharon Brown, whose grandsires are the staying turf horses The Axe II and Grey Dawn II.

If Holy Bull's origins were not from the cutting edge of fashion, the same can't be said of Macho Uno's dam, Broodmare of the Year Primal Force. Bred by Mr. and Mrs. Bertram R. Firestone, Primal Force demonstrated extreme speed winning four of her first six starts by a total margin of nearly 30 lengths. Injured after winning a seven-furlong Belmont Park allowance race in 1:22.0 on the last of those outings, Primal Force started only twice more, and never recaptured her previous form.

Purchased by Stronach for \$95,000 at the 1992 Keeneland January Sales, Primal Force began her stud career by producing the winning Alwuhush filly, All Primed. Primal Force's second foal is Deputy Minister's son, Awesome Again. Awesome Again showed good form at three, when he won the Gil Jim Dandy S. and Queen's Plate and finished third in the GI Travers S., but was much better at four. At that age he went undefeated through a six-race season which included victories in the GI Whitney H. and GI Breeders' Cup Classic. Primal Force's next two foals were an unraced colt by Holy Bull and Macho Uno, and she has since produced a three-year-old filly by Siphon, a two-year-old filly by Touch Gold and a yearling filly by El Prado.

Primal Force is by Blushing Groom out of the stakes-winning Mr. Prospector mare, Prime Prospect, also granddam of the GIII Bashford Manor S. winner Miss Ra He Ra (by Blushing Groom's son Rahy). Her granddam Square Generation, a stakes-winning daughter of Olden Times, is ancestress of numerous stakes winners, including the champion older mare North Sider and the promising young sire Storm Creek (out of a three-quarters sister to Primal Force's dam).

Macho Uno's six-cross pedigree is quite an outcross, but Primal Force does offer some reinforcement for prominent strains in Holy Bull's dam, Sharon Brown. Earlier we mentioned that Sharon Brown's grandsires are The Axe II and Grey Dawn II. The Axe II is by Mahmoud out of a daughter of a Blue Larkspur mare, and the same pattern is found in Grey Dawn II's dam. When we look at Primal Force we see that she is inbred 3x5 to Nasrullah (out of a three-quarters sister to Mahmoud) and has Blue Larkspur's relative, Relic. In addition, Sharon Brown's sire Al Hattab is out of a mare by the brilliant English sprinter Abernant, and through Blushing Groom, Primal Force has Abernant's close relative Tudor Minstrel.

What it means is missing Royal Ascot with a long term view in mind."

Dubai Destination (USA) (Kingmambo {USA}) will head the Godolphin team for Royal Ascot, Racing Manager Simon Crisford told *Sportinglife.com* yesterday. As expected, the colt, who was runner-up to Coshocton (USA) in the Listed Predominate S. at Goodwood May 21, will miss Saturday's G1 Vodafone Derby at Epsom. Godolphin's colt will be aimed at the G1 St James Palace S. at Royal Ascot June 18. "He's tightened up a lot since that race [Predominate S.] and done extremely well," said Crisford. "I think the idea about dropping back to a mile is the right one. He's a horse that we hope can be a top three-year-old in the second half of the season."
