STUDY LINKS FOAL LOSS AND CATERPILLARS

A recently concluded study found a link between eastern tent caterpillars and the Mare Reproductive Loss Syndrome which afflicted Kentucky farms last spring. The study, funded by Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation and Rood and Riddle Equine Hospital, was conducted by Bill Bernard DVM, Bruce Webb Ph.D. and Michelle LeBlanc DVM and involved three groups of five mares. One group of mares received starved caterpillars, one group received caterpillar frass (waste) and one group served as control. Four of the five mares administered caterpillars lost pregnancies within eight to 13 days after the first dose of ETC. None of the mares in the two other groups lost their foals. The mares that aborted were at 49, 64, 70 and 96 days of gestation. Alpha streptococcus was cultured from one aborted fetus while Serratia was cultured from the remaining three fetuses. Neither pericarditis nor ophthalmologic disease was observed. The investigators concluded from the study that ETC can cause early fetal loss in pregnant mares but did not define the toxic component of the caterpillar responsible for the early fetal losses. Support for the study also came from Taylor Made Farm, Ernie Paragallo, Fasig-Tipton Co. and the Kentucky Thoroughbred Farm Managers Club.

SLEEPYTIME'S SISTER AT TATTERSALLS

A half sister to 1000 Guineas winner **Sleepytime (Ire)** (Royal Academy--Alidiva {Ire}, by Chief Singer {Ire}), a yearling by Sadler's Wells, will be offered at this autumn's Tattersalls Houghton Yearling Sale at Newmarket Oct. 2nd and 3rd as part of a complete dispersal of Charles Wacker III's 2001 foal crop. The yearlings will be consigned by Mary Anne and Anthony Penfold's Bugley Stud in Dorset. Alidiva, the first mare in history to have three Group 1 winners in the same year, has also produced **Taipan (Ire)** (Last Tycoon {Ire}), twice highweight older horse in Germany and Italy at 9.5-11 furlongs and a multiple Group 1 winner in Germany and Italy, and the

late **Ali-Royal (Ire)** (Royal Academy), highweight older horse in England at 7-9.5 furlongs and a Group 1 winner in England. "Alidiva, and her dam Alligatrix (Alleged), have been the two most influential broodmares in Europe over the last decade," said Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony. "Mr. Wacker's yearlings are world class in every respect, and we are absolutely thrilled that he has chosen Tattersalls as the best arena in which to showcase this spectacular family." As part of the dispersal, Wacker will also be selling a Danehill colt out of Sleepytime herself, as well as an Alzao colt from her unraced full sister Sometime. Of the impeccably bred triumvirate, Wacker's racing manager Tote Cherry-Downes offered, "The three Houghton yearlings will be the first yearlings sold by Mr. Wacker in a number of years, and it is hard to imagine a more exciting trio."

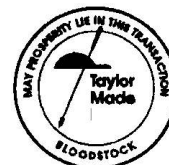

Veteran Wild Again has long been one of North America's most consistent sires of stakes winners, but for all his successes, the record of the 22-year-old stallion lacked a Classic winner. That omission was corrected this weekend when Wild Again's son Sarava battled his way past a stubborn Medaglia d'Oro to claim the GI Belmont S. Although Sarava created history by becoming the longest priced winner in the history of the longest classic, he did come into the race as an improving colt, who had never finished worse than second in five starts on dirt.

Sarava had looked a lot less promising at the beginning of his career. A \$190,000 purchase at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic yearling sale, he was resold at the Fasig-Tipton Two-Year-Olds In Training sale in Florida for \$250,000. Sent to England, Sarava ran disappointingly in three juvenile starts on turf, and was shipped back to the U.S., where he ended his two-year-old season with a maiden win at Churchill Downs, and a second in a Turfway Park allowance race. This year, he opened his season with seconds in allowance races run on sloppy tracks, and then raced his way into the Belmont S. field with a four-length victory in the Sir Barton S. at Pimlico, on the same day that War Emblem captured the GI Preakness S.

Sarava's sire Wild Again is no stranger to upset victories, since he was dismissed as a 30-1 shot when defeating Slew o' Gold and Gate Dancer to capture the inaugural GI Breeders' Cup Classic. Wild Again has gone on to forge an excellent record as a stallion, and when Sarava captured the Sir Barton S., he became the 73rd stakes winner to represent his sire, these coming from 13 crops of 769 foals (9.5 percent stakes winners to foals). Wild Again's other major stakes winners include Wilderness Song, champion older mare in Canada and heroine of the GI Spinster S. in the U.S.; the champion Canadian two-year-old Free At Last; the GI Metropolitan and GI Carter H. winner Wild Rush; the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint winner Elmhurst; Milwaukee Brew, successful this year in the GI Santa Anita H.; and Grade I winners Vicar, Wild Event, A Wild Ride, Shine Again and Wild Escapade.

There is one very strange aspect to Wild Again's stud career, and that is his propensity to work with an extraordinarily wide range of strains, in fact at one count he'd sired 61 stakes winners out of mares by 59 unique broodmare sires. This is probably accounted for by the fact that, even for a 22-year-old horse, Wild Again has a very "old" pedigree. He is by Icecapade, a foal of 1969, and his dam, Bushel-n-Peck, was born in 1958, and is by Khaled, a son of Hyperion and a foal of 1943.

This means that strains close up in the pedigree of Wild Again--for example he has Nearco 3 x 4 and Hyperion 4 x 3--have receded much further back in the pedigrees of the modern commercial population, and this likely explains his ability to successfully pick up on the background of a very wide variety of mares.

It probably didn't take much perusing of pedigrees for Sarava's breeders, Timber Bay Farm, to decide to send Sarava's dam, Rhythm of Life, to Wild Again. An unraced daughter of Deputy Minister out of the stakes winning Nalee's Rhythm, Rhythm of Life is half sister to the previously mentioned Wilderness Song, a filly who still reigns as Wild Again's highest earner.

Sarava is actually the second try at the mating, the first resulting in Rhythm of Life's first foal Wild Rocket, a \$250,000 Keeneland Yearling and \$265,000 Keeneland April Two-Year-Old who has won once in 10 starts.

Rhythm of Life is a great granddaughter of Northern Dancer, and this is extremely significant when considering Wild Again, as Wild Again's sire Icecapade and Northern Dancer are both by Nearctic out of Native Dancer mares, making them three-quarters genetic relatives--the pair appearing 2 x 4 in this pedigree. The combination of Wild Again with Northern Dancer line mares has proved to be an extremely fruitful one, as it's also responsible for Grade I winners Vicar and Wild Event, Canadian Grade I winner Wild Zone, and graded stakes winners Wild Emotions, Wild Syn and Wildly Joyous.

Foster Developments:

Congaree (Arazi), winner of the Gill Lone Star Park H. in his last start, has been confirmed a starter in Saturday's GI Stephen Foster H. at Churchill Downs, but **Hail the Chief (GB)** (Be My Chief) has been withdrawn from the race with an injury. Trainer Bob Baffert had been wavering between the Foster and Hollywood Park's GI Californian for Congaree. "He loves this racetrack [Churchill], he's training well and he's here," Baffert explained. "I was thinking about maybe going to California for the race there, but I've always thought that if you're here, why ship if it's right here in your back yard?" Trainer Niall O'Callaghan's bid for a second straight Foster win was derailed when GI Hawthorne Gold Cup winner Hail the Chief sprained his left front ankle during a work at Churchill Friday. "He came back a little off, we medicated him and he was sound the next day," O'Callaghan said. "We decided to give him 30 days. It's not a serious injury. You could give consideration to running him on Saturday, but I've decided not to because I feel that it's too much of a chance to take. I'm just going to drop back and punt."

Unshaded (Unbridled) worked five furlongs in :59.40 at Churchill yesterday in preparation for the Stephen Foster. In his first start since August, Unshaded ran second in a one-mile allowance contest at Churchill Downs May 18 last time out...**Parade Leader** (Kingmambo), third in the GI Hawthorne Gold Cup, worked four furlongs in :49.40 at Churchill yesterday. "He's a very nice horse," trainer Neil Howard said of the five-year-old. "He might lack a little bit of the consistency that you need to be a Grade I horse, but he's a beautifully bred horse and he always finishes in his races. I didn't think the Hawthorne Gold Cup was that bad a race, I mean he was third. The make-up of his last two races definitely didn't help him any and he still managed to run okay."

Nichols Nears City of Brotherly Love:

Les Nichols is scheduled to arrive at Philadelphia Park on Thursday morning as he continues his trek from San Antonio, Texas to Ground Zero in New York City. Nichols and his horse JJ's Cowboy, along with a group that has come to be known as the American Posse, have logged over 1,700 miles at a rate of about 20 miles a day. During the trip, the 41-year-old is hoping to raise \$2 million for the New York Firefighters 9-11 Disaster Relief Fund and the Patrolmen's Benevolent Association Widow's and Children Fund.

A Triple Crown hopeful earlier this season following a win in the GIII Tampa Derby over the Tampa main Mar. 17 and a second in the Aventura S. at Gulfstream Apr. 6, Equality had to settle for a 13th-place finish when thrown to the wolves last time in the GI Preakness S. at Pimlico May 18. Sent off the favorite in his turf debut, the roan settled off the pace in fifth early, challenged for the lead after five furlongs and appeared ready to draw off to an easy win, but found Coco's Madness still had something to say about the matter. Undeterred, the sole graded-stakes winner in the field showed grit in the stretch and edged clear late for the victory. "He ran a great race," said winning trainer Graham Motion. "He really relaxed, we took the blinkers off today, and Ramon [Dominguez] said he could put him anywhere he wanted. He handled it beautifully." According to Motion, the colt's first turf win gives the conditioner numerous options, "You have the [GIII] Kent [Breeders' Cup, July 21] here, so that would certainly be an option if we want to keep him on the grass."

BETFAIR RESPONDS TO DAMNING TV PROGRAMME

Betfair.com, the world's leading betting exchange, has responded publicly to claims made in the BBC Television programme, Kenyon Confronts--which was screened on BBC TV last night--that a trainer laid his horse to win £1,600 at a race at Fakenham in March this year. It can confirm without question that the bet never took place, and has made that fact known to the producers of the programme prior to its being screened. Betfair is in a position to be able to state exactly what bets have taken place in every race and on every outcome of every sporting event since its launch. The total amount laid on the horse in question, Christiansted, was £419, with the largest bet placed being £52. As the horse was an 8-1 shot, the amount a layer would have had to have in account to place the bet alleged would have been £12,800. The total volume for the race was unusually small--£26,000. Betfair had passed on this--and other more detailed--information to the Jockey Club prior to the publication of the content of Kenyon Confronts, continuing the constructive working relationship which Betfair enjoys with it, as it does with other administrative bodies. As such, for the second time in as many months (following the Ashgar enquiry at Plumpton), Betfair has been able, within hours, to provide information on an unprecedented scale of bets placed, matched, or cancelled. Previously, unscrupulous individuals may have sought to collaborate with unscrupulous bookmakers, but because Betfair recognises that those same individuals may now seek to use the exchange model for questionable betting, it is actively working with government to ensure the strict regulation of betting exchanges, and to impose as a legal requirement the adherence to the rigorous audit standards which it has set as the norm. The level of information which Betfair can access immediately ensures that for the first time ever in bookmaking, any forensic examination which might need to be undertaken by any official body can be speedily backed up by hard evidence.

The call centre is serviced by Teletech, one of the World's leading customer service providers. attheraces telebet will accept bets on all UK races. This service will expand later in the year in tandem with attheraces's plan to broadcast regular overseas race meetings on its idTV channel. "This telebet facility, our third service, will allow our customers to access attheraces anywhere and at anytime," Chris Stoddart, CEO of attheraces, said. "We want to provide customers with a complete racing information service, live pictures, live audio and access to betting through as many platforms as possible using just one account number."
