

### A NEW PRINCE

**Grandera (Ire)** (Grand Lodge), the 4-1 joint second favourite, travelled on the bridle throughout before unleashing a dramatic turn of foot in the closing stages to pull five lengths clear of his nearest rival **Indian Creek (GB)** (Indian Ridge {Ire}) in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot yesterday afternoon. In doing so, he provided Godolphin with their fourth victory in the race and their third consecutive renewal. "It was unbelievable--I have to say we were pretty scared when we saw [jockey] Frankie [Dettori] taking a pull two out because to win here and win that impressively you have got to be some type of machine," commented Godolphin Racing Manager Simon Crisford. "It's very hard coming back from Singapore and expecting him to put up that type of performance against these horses--it's more impressive than what people imagine."

### Sophomore Success Leads to Private Purchase

Trained by James Fanshawe at three, the chestnut was a 1/2-length third to Anabaa Blue (GB) in the G1 Prix du Jockey Club at Chantilly in June before finishing second by a similar margin to Medicean (GB) in the G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown in July. No match for subsequent Arc winner Sakhee when seven-lengths second in the G1 International S. at York the following month, the four-year-old came back to win the Listed Dubai Arc Trial at Newbury in September and was subsequently purchased by Godolphin with an overseas campaign in mind. Second by 3 1/4 lengths in the G3 Dubai City of Gold in his seasonal debut at Nad al Sheba Feb. 24, he disappointed when fifth in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II Cup at Sha Tin Apr. 21, but bounced back to win the G1 Singapore Airlines International Cup at Kranji May 11 in impressive fashion. Grandera did not enter this contest with the same reputation as Dubai Millennium and Fantastic Light, the two most recent winners of this, but was certainly equally as impressive as the latter here.

### Easy Win Could Touch Off Clash of the Titans

Held up in eighth as stable rabbit **Sydenham** (A.P. Indy) cut out the running, he travelled with ease to the quarter-mile marker, where **Nayef** (Gulch) and favored **Banks Hill (GB)** (Danehill) were committed. Pulled to the outer of that pair, he quickened to pass them at the furlong pole before stretching clear from the fast-finishing runner-up. "This horse has got great ability and we've found the key to him now--he needs fast ground and a strong pace and he had everybody beaten," Dettori enthused. "I just bided my time as I know he's got a good turn of foot and he just idled a bit in front, but the race was over by then." Crisford added that Grandera may take on High Chaparral (Ire) and Sulamani (Ire) in the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot July 27. "He is in just about every race he can be in all over the world, including the King George here next month, so he could be back for that."

Best of luck to the connections of **SHAWS CREEK** and **ANGLIAN PRINCE** in their Classic quest in the \$1 million Queen's Plate. The two likely favorites are from the first crop of millionaire

**JUST HAVIN' FUN Just James (GB)** (Spectrum {Ire}) provided an upset in yesterday's opening event, coming with a daring late dash under Olivier Peslier to deny fellow outsider **Steenberg (Ire)** (Flying Spur {Aus}) in the G3 Jersey S. Having captured a highly competitive Newmarket handicap over six furlongs May 25 contested by Tuesday's Balmoral H. winner Zargus (GB), he raced just four days ago when fourth in Saturday's William Hill Trophy at York. In the former he had shown electric acceleration to arrive from the rear and land the spoils on the line and that is a character trait according to trainer Jeremy Nosedá. "He is a talented horse--we saw that at Newmarket when he decided to run two furlongs from home and he's done it again today. It's all about his mind and I knew he had the talent if he decided to have a going day. I said to Olivier, 2½ [furlongs] out you ask him to run and he'll either decide to go or he won't go, and it's only then that we'll realise if we're in business. He's shown a lot of class at home in the morning, but a little bit in the same way--he does it when he feels like doing it." Here his jockey executed the waiting tactics in rear as **Redback (GB)** (Mark of Esteem {Ire}) seized the rail advantage and the early lead. Just James responded to Peslier's urgings to challenge Frankie Dettori on Meshaher, who had committed inside the final furlong alongside Ted Durcan on Steenberg. As the latter gained the upper hand, it was the fast-finishing Just James who proved too strong under hands and heels to assert in the final 25 yards. Peslier explained: "Just James was just about confidence. He wanted to go, but I didn't want to too soon as I wanted to go outside. He needs a little bit of time to get going, but in the last half a furlong he just kept going." (Chart p3)

**ELSWORTH FULL OF PRAISE FOR CREEK**

"He's run the race of his life," said David Elsworth, trainer of G1 Prince of Wales's S. runner-up **Indian Creek (GB)** (Indian Ridge {Ire}). "He's an improved horse and there is more to come. I'm disappointed with the result, but not the way he has run. He was short of a gallop and while on the day he was beaten by a better horse, we'll look forward to taking him on again."

**A ROMANTIC QUEEN MARY** It was a case of history repeating here as **Romantic Liaison (GB)** (Primo Dominie {GB}) burst clear to provide the broodmare My First Romance (GB) with her second Queen Mary winner after the similarly impressive Romantic Myth (GB) in 2000. She had a slightly unorthodox preparation in winning a Lingfield maiden on the polytrack May 28, but trainer Brian Meehan explained that decision. "She's very good and has always shown plenty of ability," said Meehan. "We had the coughing problem and she had it

and we couldn't get her out on the grass in time, but you've got to try and give two-year-olds a start before Royal Ascot. Lingfield's track is superb and she won it nicely--it was the ideal preparation." Held up towards the rear early as **Floppie Disk (GB)** (Magic Ring {Ire}) blazed the trail, she was keen off the strong fractions and pulled her way into contention by half-way. Eddery chose not to contain her any longer and let her

stride past the leaders with 250 yards remaining. From there she turned the contest into a procession, pulling further clear with distance for a highly impressive score. "We've always thought she was really good and Brian always said she was the Queen Mary filly so we ran her on the all-weather and she struggled to win that day--I don't know why, but she did a great bit of work three days ago," Eddery said. "She'll go on from that--that was impressive." With the victory, Eddery equalled Lester Piggott's record of 4,493 domestic winners. Having pulled 3½ lengths clear for his 73rd Royal Ascot success, the 11-time champion jockey now sits second in the all-time list behind Sir Gordon Richards on 4,870. "It's been a long time doing it and it's been great fun," said the 50-year-old Eddery. "I've got a long way to go for that [Richards' record], but we'll see how we go. I'm still getting plenty of rides with plenty of trainers putting me up which is great news." Meehan paid tribute afterwards. "Pat's been so good to me over the years and it's great to be involved with him--he's the greatest." Added Willie Carson: "Everybody in the weighing room will tell you that he is the true professional--he's always early for the race meetings, always ready to ride anything and always in the right place in the right time. He's one of the hardest jockeys even at his age in the weighing room." (Chart p3)

**CAN VINNIE GO THE DISTANCE?** He has to go further than he has ever done here, but **Vinnie Roe (Ire)** (Definite Article {GB}) is the logical choice to show the old-timers a clean pair of heels. He is unbeaten over staying trips, showing improvement from his early summer clashes with Galileo (Ire) last year to take the Listed Challenge S. at Leopardstown in July and Listed Ballycullen S. at The Curragh in August. From there he completed the unique double of the G1 Irish and French (Prix Royal-Oak) St. Legers in the fall, beating seasoned elders in Millenary (GB) at The Curragh and Generic (Fr) at Longchamp. He defied a nine-pound penalty when successful on his return in the Listed Saval Beg S. at Leopardstown June 3 and he has all the right credentials to follow in the steps of Enzeli (Ire), the last Irish-trained winner of this marathon event in 1999. Godolphin are represented by **Wareed (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) and **Hatha Anna (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells). Wareed is the pick on the form of his impressive display when winning the G2 Prix Vicomtesse Vigier at Longchamp May 19 on fast ground. He beat the track record there and showed that he is no longer just the soft ground performer that ground out victory in last year's G2 Prix Hubert de Chaudenay in the mud at that track. Mark Johnston is a specialist in the stayer's division and has won two Gold Cups with Double Trigger (GB) and last year's winner **Royal Rebel (GB)** (Robellino). (Odds p5)

Miletrian (Ire) in 2000, Bahr (GB) in 1998 and Yashmak in 1997 all proceeded to bounce back here after defeat in the Oaks. **Shadow Dancing** holds **Bright and Clear** and **Sunray Superstar** on the form of her Listed Cheshire Oaks success at Chester May 8 and may possess more scope than the two fillies she edged out of third place at Epsom last time. **Fraulein** rates a danger on the basis of her luckless third behind Bustan (Ire) in the Listed Fairway S. at Newmarket June 1 last time. **TAKE CHARGE LADY GETS VACATION** Select Stables' **Take Charge Lady** (Dehere), winner earlier this year of the GI Ashland S. and runner-up in the GI Kentucky Oaks, is headed to Longfield Farm for a "three- or four-week rest," according to trainer Ken McPeck. She will miss a planned engagement in the GI Mother Goose S. at Belmont June 29. The bay filly was found to be suffering from a lung infection in the days following the Oaks, prompting McPeck to cancel a trip to Maryland for the GII Black-Eyed Susan S. May 18. She recovered from that quickly enough to return a week later with a convincing victory in the GIII Dogwood S., but the trainer became increasingly concerned about her training and ordered blood work. No serious problems were discovered, but McPeck made the decision to rest her. "Her blood is showing that she's a bit dehydrated," he commented. Formerly a national hunt jockey and now a bloodstock agent, Bradley will be asked to explain his part in the providing of sensitive information to Brian Brendan Wright, alleged head of a worldwide drug operation. Bradley admitted having passed on information in court during the 'Operation Extend' trials, whose reports had restrictions lifted last week. Bradley is one of three men to have been contacted by the Jockey Club of their intentions to hold disciplinary hearings, alongside former licensed individual Barrie Wright and the unlicensed Christopher Coleman. The Jockey Club yesterday confirmed that it will hold disciplinary hearings to consider whether or not to impose exclusion orders on Wright, his son Brian Anthony Wright, Ian Kiernan and Paul Shannon. Dates of the hearings have yet to be announced. Ex-jockey Dermot Browne, who admitted to having doped horses during the 1990 season, is currently the subject to a 10-year period of disqualification imposed by the Jockey Club in October 1992.
