CURTAINS FOR ACT ONE

Act One (GB) (In the Wings {GB}--Summer Sonnet {GB}, by Baillamont) has been retired to stud having suffered a career-ending injury while being prepared for this Sunday's G1 Budweiser Irish Derby at The Curragh. According to *Sportinglife.com*, trainer Jonathan Pease said: "Act One suffered a hairline fracture

of his hind cannon bone while doing a routine exercise on Sunday. Although the horse is expected to make a complete recovery, it will not be possible to prepare him for an autumn campaign. It was the owner Gerald Leigh's [who passed away at the weekend] wish

that Act One be syndicated to stand at stud in England after his three-year-old season. These plans will be brought forward and Act One will be retired to stud in England. Act One was the best horse I have trained and it is a great disappointment that, unlike my Breeders' Cup winners he has not had the chance to show his brilliance outside France. He has great physical presence and is a correct horse with a lovely temperament. He is a Group 1 winner at both two- and three-years-old and I am confident that, at stud, he will prove a lasting legacy to Gerald Leigh and Eydon Hall." Act One captured his first five career starts before losing his unbeaten record when second to Sulamani (Ire) in the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club. Among his victories were the G1 Prix Lupin, G1 Criterium International, G2 Prix Greffulhe and the G3 Prix Thomas Bryon. Out of the stakes-placed Summer Sonnet, he is a half brother to stakes-winner Summer Solstice (Ire) (Caerleon) and to the Group 1-placed Summer Symphony (Ire) (Caerleon).

SUNDAY SILENCE RECOVERING

Sunday Silence (Halo--Wishing Well, by Understanding) is recovering from surgery after suffering a bacterial infection in his right front leg, according to *The Blood-Horse*. The 16-year-old stallion underwent surgery June 23 at Katsumi Yoshida's Northern Farm in Japan. He will not resume breeding this season. Before the infection developed, Sunday Silence, Japan's leading sire since 1995, had covered 130 mares at Shadai Stallion Station.

DERBY HIGH ON CHAPARRAL'S AGENDA

Aidan O'Brien's Ballydoyle stable looks likely to be represented by four runners in this Sunday's G1 Budweiser Irish Derby at The Curragh. The quartet will be headed by current odds-on favourite **High Chaparral (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells), winner of the G1 Vodafone Derby at Epsom June 8, seeking to emulate former stable companion Galileo (Ire) who won both races last year. Irish bookmaking firm Cashmans currently quote High Chaparral at a very short 1-4 to complete the Derby double. The Epsom hero is set to be joined by **Ballingarry (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells), **Della Francesca** (Danzig) and either **Roar of the Tiger** (Storm Cat) or **Sholokov (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells), but the G1 Vodafone Derby second **Hawk Wing** (Woodman) won't take his chance despite being left in at yesterday's declaration stage. "We always do this," O'Brien told *Sportinglife.com*. "We leave the main horses in until the final declaration day. Hawk Wing is being trained for the Eclipse at Sandown the following weekend. Hawk Wing and High Chaparral are both well; they are working nicely and seem fine." Jockey plans for the Ballydoyle camp will not be announced until later in the week. The remaining entries include the Dermot Weld-trained pair **In Time's Eye (GB)** (Singspiel {Ire}) and **Jazz Beat (Ire)** (Darshaan {GB}) as well as three British-trained challengers. Sir Michael Stoute, successful three times in the race, is also doubly represented with **Balakeri (Ire)** (Theatrical {Ire}) and **Princely Venture (Ire)** (Entrepreneur {GB}). The Richard Hannon-trained **Nysaeen (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) completes the 11-strong entry.

Storm Cat seems to have been a little out of the limelight this season, perhaps because of not having a three-year-old classic contender. However, while most eyes have been on the Triple Crown scene, Storm Cat has quietly gone about becoming the season's leading sire by both stakes winners and stakes wins, and is fast closing on the 100-stakes winners mark. The most recent week was a particularly good one for Storm Cat as he was represented by two winners at England's Royal Ascot meet: Sophisticat, who defeated the winners of the Irish and French 1,000 Guineas in the G1 Coronation S.; and the two-year-old Statue of Liberty, who maintained his unbeaten record in the G3 Coventry S.; and by the GI Ogden Phipps (formerly Hempstead) H. heroine, Raging Fever.

Four-year-old Raging Fever has been a model of consistency, 15 starts bringing her 10 wins, three seconds and one third, and a bankroll of \$1,176,365. Her only unplaced effort has been a sixth in the 2000 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. Oddly, prior to the Ogden Phipps, that was Raging Fever's last try in a Grade I event and her last at a distance beyond a mile. She had, however, proved that she could handle both that class and the 1 1/16-miles distance with a juvenile win in the GI Frizette S.

The fourth foal and second winner for her dam, the Seattle Slew mare Pennant Fever, Raging Fever is a sister to the colt Stormin Fever. Although a little slower maturing than Raging Fever, the elder brother set the trend for being both speedy and versatile. A winner over six furlongs, Stormin Fever gained his sole stakes victory in the seven-furlong GIII Sport Page H. and was twice second in the GI Vosburgh S. at the same distance, but he stayed 1 1/8 miles well enough to come within inches of defeating Skip Away in the GII Philip H. Iselin H. Now standing at Airdrie Stud in Midway, Kentucky, Stormin Fever is represented by first-crop yearlings in 2002.

Pennant Fever, who earned black type when third in the GIII Golden Rod S., was the only stakes performer for her dam Letty's Pennant, a daughter of Bold Forbes. However, Letty's Pennant, who gained some minor black type with a second in the Peach Blossom S., is a half sister to champion two-year-old filly Sacahuista and to the good stakes winner Far Flying, who is also dam of GIII Rebel S. and GIII Nashua S. winner Dalhart, and granddam of Geri, a Grade I winner of over \$1,700,000.

Raging Fever's third dam Nalees Flying Flag never ran, but was extremely well-bred, as she was by Hoist the Flag out of Nalee, winner of the Black-Eyed Susan S. and Santa Ynez S. and herself a sister to the great mare Shuvee, twice conqueror of colts in the Jockey Club Gold Cup.

The cross of Storm Cat with mares by Seattle Slew is one which has worked rather well, as, in addition to Stormin Fever and Raging Fever, it has also produced group/graded stakes winners Statue of Liberty and China Storm and stakes winner Stormy Atlantic. A more distant version of the cross is found in the pedigree of Night Patrol, a recent graded-stakes winner who is by Storm Cat's son Storm Boot out of a mare by Seattle Song.

EVERYDAY A GROUP ONE

The world's best week of racing stretched to five days this year, instead of the usual four, in honor of the Queen's 50th year on the throne, but there was no letup in the march of class horses across our radar screens.

They ran a Group 1 a day, and every one of those was a great race. As detailed after opening day in my column last week, Rock of Gibraltar and stablemate Landseer engineered an Aidan O'Brien and Danehill 1-2 in the three-year-old colt milers' championship, the St. James's Palace S., kicking off an Aidan double completed by Statue of Liberty, a \$1.3-million Storm Cat colt from last September, in the meet's most important two-year-old race, the six-furlong G3 Coventry.

Things quieted down for Aidan's team after that, their only subsequent score coming when Sophisticat, the \$3.4-million Storm Cat filly out of Serena's Song, won Friday's Coronation S., the three-year-old fillies' mile championship. So Coolmore bagged both Group 1 three-year-old mile races. The connections of Queen's Logic--who beat Sophisticat three times in three meetings last year, but has been on the shelf since pricking her foot the day before the English 1000 Guineas--must have watched Sophisticat's win with mixed emotions, and it would be great if they could meet up again somewhere down the line this season.

The Maktoum family is proving a far greater force with their older runners now than with their younger stock, and they scored in two of the three Ascot Group 1s open to olders. Grandera ran probably the race of the meet when burying his rivals in the 10-furlong Prince of Wales's S., Wednesday's feature. Coolmore got to count that as a win, too, though, as they stand the winner's sire Grand Lodge, who has now had Sinnidar, Queen's Logic, and Grandera show championship form in the last three seasons.

But Godolphin's older horses now look overwhelming: they have Street Cry for the dirt (obvious target: Breeders' Cup Classic), Grandera for fast turf (King George VI next), and Sakhee for soft turf (Arc). They maybe didn't plan it this way, but they're in it to win races, and that's giving them a big edge among older runners. Coolmore is in the business of making stallions, so their horses have to be the best at two and three. The popularity of two of their 2003 first-year sires, Johannesburg and Rock of Gibraltar, will illustrate that point once again.

Sheikh Hamdan's third-string, the four-year-old Kingmambo colt Malhub, just wouldn't stop, and scored his biggest career win in Saturday's six-furlong Golden Jubilee S. (formerly the G2 Cork and Orrery); and the stayers produced one of the week's best finishes, three horses slugging it out at the end of 2 1/2 miles. BHB chairman Peter Savill's Royal Rebel (g, 6, Robellino) won the race for the second straight year, fighting off challenges from dual 2001 St. Leger (Irish and French) winner Vinnie Roe (c, 4, from the first crop of Definite Article) and Godolphin's Wareed (c, 4 Sadler's Wells). Riders of the first and third--Murtagh and Dettori--were each given four-day whip bans, which would be a joke if it weren't so serious. That's one set of rules in desperate need of review.

Sire of the week, hands down, was Danehill. He had Group 1 winner Rock of Gibraltar, of course, and the Group 2 winning three-year-old filly Irresistible Jewel in the 12-furlong Ribblesdale. But, besides those two, Danehill had no fewer than four Group 1 placings: Landseer (1m), Danehurst (6f), Banks Hill (10f), and Dolores (1m). I call that a sensational week, and if anybody had any doubt that he is the new King of Europe, those doubts are blown away now. Significantly, too, four of the six are Northern Dancer 'top and bottom,' including Irresistible Jewel (out of a Sadler's Wells mare), and Dolores (out of a mare by In the Wings). Trendsetting. Interestingly, the two not out of Northern Dancer-line mares, Landseer and Danehurst, are both out of Miswaki mares. Guess those will be selling well later this year... *Cont. p. 4*

The mighty Storm Cat was the only other sire to have two group winners during the week--both Coolmore-connected--Sophisticat and the two-year-old, Statue of Liberty. Four other sires had two winners each: Machiavellian (the first and last races of the meeting, interestingly, both trained by Sir Michael Stoute); Rainbow Quest--those two are among Europe's top five proven sires anyway--but also the resurgent Barathea and that 22-year-old overnight sensation I mentioned a few weeks ago, Night Shift. The latter two were among four sires who each doubled up with two-year-old placegetters at the meet; the other two were Primo Dominie, a useful speed sire who stands at Cheveley Park; and Royal Applause, one of Europe's top freshman sires last year. Each of those four had two-year-olds show abundant speed and precocity last week.

Quite a number of third-year (first four-year-olds 2002) and second-year (first three-year-olds 2002) sires had runners in the first three at Ascot. Among those with first three-year-olds, Zamindar had a Handicap winner and Zenda, the French 1000 victress who looked the winner of the Coronation until Sophisticat got clear. Royal Applause, as already mentioned, enhanced his reputation as a sire of precocity; and Alhaarth had that huge win on Tuesday, when the three-year-old filly Dominica outran her elders in the five-furlong G2 King's Stand. Spinning World, Desert King, and the American sire Langfuhr all scored placings.

Among sires with first four-year-olds, group leader Spectrum had the winner of the G3 Jersey S., and Tagula had the winner of the Britannia H. Pivotal had two placegetters, including the arguably unlucky King's Stand third Kyllachy and Definite Article, at the other end of the spectrum, had Gold Cup second Vinnie Roe. King's Theatre, Celtic Swing, Flying Spur, and Shaamit also had top-three finishers. Other sires who merit a mention include: Polish Precedent (three placegetters, all at 10f-plus); In the Wings (2m Queen's Vase winner Mamool and 1m Queen Anne second Tillerman); and the unheralded Muhtarram (three placegetters), and

former top sprinter Lake Coniston, who had the Wokingham winner, Capricho, and King's Stand second, Continent, both five-year-olds, from his first crop.

A tip of the top hat to the trainers, too. That hard-working Scotsman, Mark Johnston, had four winners, including Royal Rebel and the G2 Hardwicke winner Zindabad to lead the trainers' list, followed by Aidan O'Brien and Sir Michael Stoute, with three each. Godolphin's Saeed bin Suroor had two, along with John Gosden, who didn't even get on the score sheet until the last race on Friday. Sixteen others bagged a winner each during the world's very best festival of horse racing.

Finally, congratulations to jockeys Pat Eddery, who during the week passed Lester Piggott as Britain's second leading all-time rider in number of wins, and now has 360 to go to catch Sir Gordon Richards; and American jock Chris McCarron, who retired on Sunday after notching up win number seven thousand and something on Came Home. And condolences to the family and friends of Gerald Leigh, who died, aged 71. Gerald proved there is still a place for small breeders even in the midst of the game's Titans; he was much liked and respected, and his legacy of thoughtfulness, and class will live on.

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a ▲ will denote a first-time Grade/Group 1 winner.

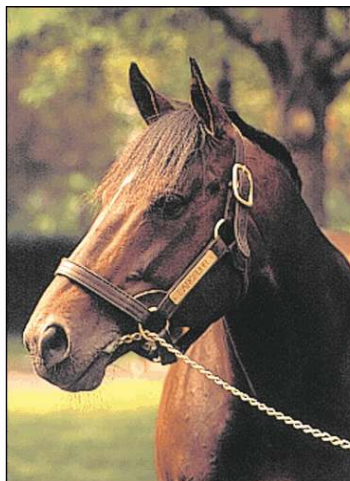

The success of the Storm Cat/Seattle Slew cross is not surprising when one considers that Storm Cat's broodmare sire Secretariat is also broodmare sire of Seattle Slew's most important son A.P. Indy. Secretariat was the greatest product of the direct Bold Ruler/Princequillo cross, and Seattle Slew is bred on an extended version of the same cross. In addition, Seattle Slew's broodmare sire Poker is by a son of Princequillo out of a mare by Bold Ruler's sire Nasrullah. The Storm Cat/Seattle Slew cross therefore gives a double of Bold Ruler, and Raging Fever actually has a third cross of Bold Ruler. This passes without comment these days, but at one time the wisdom of inbreeding to Bold Ruler was as hotly debated, much as more recent times have seen much discussion regarding duplicating Northern Dancer.

We can't leave Raging Fever without mentioning that she traces to the renowned tap-root mare, Bourtai (granddam of Nalee). Bourtai was three-parts sister to Sun Again, who is in the male line of Damascus, and either Bourtai or Sun Again (usually through Damascus) appear in at least 20 of Storm Cat's stakes winners.

CORRECTION: Last week when listing stakes winners bred on the Pleasant Colony/Northfields cross, I cited I'm Very Irish as a Grade I winner. I'm Very Irish is a stakes winner and graded-stakes placed performer, but the Grade I credit belongs to Forbidden Apple, a multiple graded stakes winner of over \$1,000,000 who captured last year's GI Manhattan H., and also took second in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile. -Alan Porter

IMADEED EUTHANIZED Imadeed (Alydeed), injured in a spill at Belmont Park on Belmont S. day, was euthanized June 20, according to *The Blood-Horse*. The five-year-old mare, second in the 2001 WNBC S., fell in the stretch of this year's renewal of the same race. She suffered torn suspensory ligaments in her right foreleg and was transferred to the Rood and Riddle Equine Clinic in Lexington for treatment. Her condition never improved enough for surgery to be performed and the decision was made to euthanize the mare Thursday. A winner of six of 17 starts, Imadeed earned \$213,380.

INDIAN CREEK AIMING FOR ECLIPSE Indian Creek (GB) (Indian Ridge {Ire}), who posted a career-best effort when second to Grandera in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot last week, is being readied for an attempt at the £325,000 G1 Coral Eurobet Eclipse S. at Sandown July 6. "At this moment in time you can consider Indian Creek a probable runner, although my other entry Premier Prize won't be participating as she suffered a little setback before Royal Ascot," trainer David Elsworth said. "I thought there was a little bit left to work on the other day because of the small setback we had in Ireland in the Tattersalls Gold Cup [when sixth to Rebelline on unsuitable soft ground in May] when he came back with a pulled muscle. He wasn't quite right and it delayed us returning him to full work. It wasn't decided until a few days before Royal Ascot whether or not he would participate in the Prince of Wales's S., but we did and I'm glad we did because he ran very well. However, I would have liked to have had another week with him. We wonder who the danger to him [in the Eclipse] will be at the moment and I don't see why the course should present a problem. I don't know if he'll win the Eclipse, but he's a very high-class horse and he's been placed in two Group 1s. What is there around--from the three-year-olds, everybody will be excited about Hawk Wing, but don't you worry, we're looking forward to the encounter. I'm sure Richard [Quinn] will ride him depending upon availability--you never have a problem in my experience finding good jockeys when you've got a good horse!" Indian Creek is set to face some stiff competition from the two major powerhouses of European racing. Champion trainer Aidan O'Brien still has 16 entered including **Hawk Wing (USA)** (Woodman {USA}), **High Chaparral (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}), **Rock of Gibraltar (Ire)** (Danehill {USA}), **Landseer (Ire)** (Danehill {USA}) and **Castle Gandolfo (USA)** (Gone West {USA}). Godolphin also has a wealth of talent to choose from, with nine representatives including **Grandera (Ire)** (Grand Lodge {USA}), **Moon Ballad (Ire)** (Singspiel {Ire}), **Noverre (USA)** (Rahy {USA}) and **Sakhee (USA)** (Bahri {USA}).

SULAMANI A KING GEORGE MAYBE G1 Prix du Jockey-Club hero **Sulamani (Ire)** (Hernando {Fr}) remains a possible for next month's King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot, but could take the alternative route of having a summer break before being prepared for the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. "If Mr. Bary [the colt's trainer] thinks the horse needs a race before the autumn he could run in the King George," Alan Cooper, the Niarchos Family's representative, told *Sportinglife.com*. "If not, it would probably be the G2 Prix Niel in preparation for the Arc, so we are just taking it as it comes. It will be the King George if we think he needs a race in the summer, but we might put him by until September. We will be guided by Mr. Bary. The horse is absolutely fine. He has come out of his race in the Prix du Jockey-Club well, but having had four races in seven weeks, he needs a break. That was a big effort at Chantilly."
