SPAIN RETIRED

Racing's all-time leading female money winner, **Spain** (Thunder Gulch--Drina, by Regal and Royal) has been retired from racing. The five-year-old mare was bred to leading sire Storm Cat in mid-May and has already been pronounced in foal. She returned to the races after being bred to capture the GII Fleur de Lis H. June 15.

Her final career start came over the weekend when she finished third in the GII Molly Pitcher H. at Monmouth Saturday afternoon. "I think they [owner The Thoroughbred Corp.] took the position that adding on to the [earnings] record is nice, but it really has no significance [on her breeding career]

and, God forbid, something would happen to her," said trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "There were no more worlds to conquer, it looked like. So they were just comfortable with sending her to the farm." Spain started her career under the guidance of Jeff Bonde, for whom she ran second in the GI Vinery Del Mar Debutante S. and third in the GI Oak Leaf S. Transferred to Lukas in the spring of her three-year-old season, Spain won the GII Monmouth Breeders' Cup Oaks in July and later shocked a stellar field at 50-1 in the \$2-million GI Breeders' Cup Distaff. "When they dropped her off here, I never thought she'd ever earn \$3 million," Lukas added. "She stepped up to another level." She won just one of nine starts in 2001, but missed by only a head in her title defence at last year's Breeders' Cup. Spain got off to a slow start this year, getting her first win in her fifth start in taking the GII Louisville Breeders' Cup H., a victory which took her past Serena's Song's earnings mark. The consistent homebred retires with a record of 35-9-9-7 and a bankroll of \$3,540,542. "She had a great career," said Lukas. "We'll always think we should have won both Breeders' Cup races. It was probably one of the best races of her life and she was second."

CASHIER'S DREAM DIES

Cashier's Dream (Service Stripe--Jerry's Sister, by Monetary Gift) died Monday night at Hagyard, Davidson, McGee Equine Clinic in Lexington, Kentucky after suffering complications from intestinal surgery, according to *The Blood-Horse*. The three-year-old Team Valor filly was preparing for the GI Prioress S. when she was stricken with what was believed to be colic. She underwent surgery last Tuesday and never recovered. "Dr. [Robert] Hunt was pessimistic," Team Valor president Barry Irwin told *Blood-Horse*. "Because there's always the fear that whatever initiated this could still be at work and no one really knows enough about horses to know for sure what's going to happen. A blockage formed, which became toxic, and gangrene set in." Cashier's Dream set a track record for 5 1/2 furlongs at Churchill Downs while winning last year's GIII Debutante and went on to win the GI Spinaway S. at Saratoga. She ended her juvenile campaign with a runner-up finish behind You in the GI Frizette. In her only start this year, the filly won the GIII La Troienne. She was first or second in all seven of her career starts, winning five races and earning \$423,042.

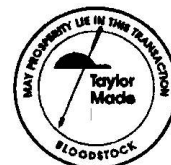

CLEARANCE RATE AND GROSS KEY JULY FACTORS

Only 12 days until announcer John Henderson reminds us of the conditions of sale and head auctioneer Ryan Mahan opens proceedings at the world's most prestigious--and expensive--yearling sale: Keeneland July, Monday night, July 15. Against the backdrop of world instability in politics and economics, and the internal market factor of a smaller overall 2001 foal crop due to MRLS, what can we expect?

Hopefully, good news, which I reckon will be gauged by the number of horses actually selling and the gross, both at Keeneland and the resurgent Fasig-Tipton July sale following on July 17 and 18. Judging from the number catalogued, MRLS will be a factor more in September than in July; Keeneland will suffer the loss of Mr. Prospector this year, but benefit from the return to July of major consignors (and Keeneland directors) Lane's End (13) and Mill Ridge (3).

Let's begin with the tale of the tape. In 1999, Keeneland catalogued 216 July yearlings and sold 132, grossing \$76.8 million and averaging \$581,932. In 2000, there were 208 catalogued, of which 130 sold, grossing \$80.7 million and averaging \$621,015. Last year marked the sale's nadir in terms of number catalogued, just 164, of which only 89 sold, grossing \$63.2 million, a mere \$800,000 more than Saratoga, but the average jumped to \$710,247.

An even 200 are catalogued for this year's edition, bringing it back at least to within five to 10 percent of the number catalogued in 1999-2000. In those two years, over 60 percent of the number catalogued finished up as listed sales; last year it was down to 54 percent. If the percentage of listed sales from number catalogued goes back up just to 60 percent (this is counting withdrawals as well as not-solds), that would mean 120 listed sales. Considering the loss of Mr.

Prospector, I think if the sale averages \$600,000 and grosses \$72 million, it will be back on track. That would represent a 15-percent drop in average, I concede, but it would also mean a 15-percent rise in gross, to within 10 percent of the 2000 figure, and the average would be back in the 1999-2000 range. That would be fine.

Fasig July experienced a similar phenomenon last year, though not as extreme: the average shot up 26 percent, from \$77,817 to \$97,671, but the number sold fell 30 percent (336 to 237), and the gross dropped by \$3 million (\$26.1 million to \$23.1 million). In fact, 1999 was their strongest year: a whopping 75 percent of those catalogued sold, which was 295 sales, grossing \$22.1 million and averaging \$75,037. The number catalogued jumped from 395 in 1999 to 550 in 2000, and, though the number sold rose to 336, that in fact represented just 61 percent of those catalogued. The gross rose by \$4 million (to \$26.1 million), and the average rose marginally, from \$75,037 to \$77,817. Last year the number catalogued dropped down again, to 422, but only 56 percent of those catalogued sold.

This year, Fasig has catalogued 604 yearlings for their two-day sale, and if just over 60 percent of those sell and even if the average drops back to \$80,000, they should have a \$30-million sale.

In 1999, there were 427 sold in the two sales combined, grossing \$98.9 million. In 2000, 466 sold, grossing \$106.8 million. But last year only 326 sold, grossing just \$86.3 million, though the average for the two sales combined looked good, at \$264,908. If Keeneland sells 120 for \$72 million, and Fasig follows up with 375 (62 percent of those catalogued), averaging \$80,000, the combined week's business should see around 495 yearlings grossing \$102 million and averaging \$206,000. That would be a 22-percent drop in average from last year (and would still be 10 percent below 1999-2000 averages), but a 50-percent improvement in the number sold from last year's shocking low of 326, and an 18-percent rise in the two-sale gross. In my view, those would all qualify as good results.

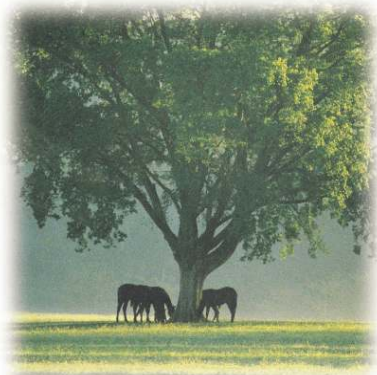

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

Mackie has been an expensive individual as both a racing prospect and a broodmare. Happily, we can report that she is also one of those rare horses who has proved well worth the money in both roles.

Mackie made her first trip to the sales ring as a weanling, appearing at the 1993 Keeneland November Sales as part of the John R. Gaines consignment. A half sister to the GI Kentucky Derby winner Sea Hero, and what at the time were three other graded-stakes winners, she was purchased for \$550,000 by a partnership of Tom Van Meter and Ben P. Walden Jr. Mackie didn't earn back her purchase price on the track, but she did significantly increase her value by winning the GIII Busher S. and taking third in the GI Ashland S.

Mackie began her stud career by producing Alligator Allie, a Gone West filly who was retained and who has started just twice. The next year, however, she foaled a Red Ransom colt, who realized \$950,000 when he appeared in the ring for the 2000 Keeneland September Yearling Sales. Earlier that year, Mackie made another trip to the sales: consigned by Eaton Sales, and carrying a foal by Mr. Prospector, she was purchased for \$5,000,000 by the Britton House Stud of Englishman Roger Baines at the Keeneland January Sale. Subsequent to this transaction, which made her the second most expensive mare sold in North America since the

1980s, Mackie produced a colt by Mr. Prospector, which is now in training in England and she has a yearling colt by Seeking the Gold.

Having achieved graded-stakes winning status as a runner, Mackie has now matched that effort as a producer. At the weekend, her Red Ransom colt, now named Mr. Mellon, produced a strong finishing effort to claim the GII Arlington Classic, and although he's initially going to be pointed for the GII Jim Dandy S. on the main track, Mr. Mellon eventually looks set for a major career on the grass.

Mr. Mellon's appellation is a tribute to Paul Mellon, who bred Mackie's dam, Glowing Tribute, as well as Mackie's numerous stakes winning siblings. A daughter of Graustark, Glowing Tribute came from one of the strongest families in the stud book. Her third dam, the Selima S. winner, Big Hurry, was a daughter of La Troienne, and a sister to champions Black Helen and Bimelech. Mackie's granddam Searching was bred on the hugely successful formula of breeding a daughter of La Troienne to War Admiral, which also produced, among others, the great mare Busher, her sister Striking, and Busanda (also dam of Buckpasser). Searching herself was a tremendously durable and talented performer, making 89 starts for 25 wins, 12 of which came in stakes company. As a tap-root mare, Searching has done even better. Her very first foal was two-year-old filly champion Affectionately, herself dam of 1970 Preakness S. winner, champion three-year-old colt and Horse of the Year Personality.

Another daughter, Priceless Gem, earned championship honors at two, after a season in which she defeated her "cousin" Buckpasser in the Futurity S., and she subsequently produced the great mare Allez France. The strongest branch of Searching's family, however, is that of Glowing Tribute, who is out of Priceless Gem's sister Admiring, herself winner of the Arlington-Washington Lassie S. (incidentally, we can note that Priceless Gem and Admiring were by Hail to Reason, as were their three-parts brother Personality and other La Troienne filly champions Regal Gleam and Straight Deal). *Cont. p. 5*

Twice a winner of the GII Sheepshead Bay H., and a Broodmare of the Year, Glowing Tribute produced no fewer than seven stakes winners. The most celebrated of these is Sea Hero, who gave Paul Mellon a long awaited victory in the 1993 GI Kentucky Derby, but the others include, in addition to Mackie, multiple Grade 1 winner Hero's Honor, and graded-stakes winners Wild Applause, Glowing Honor and Coronation Cup. The family is breeding on too, as Wild Applause herself has thrown three more graded-stakes winners, including the sires Eastern Echo (responsible for the current leading freshman sire Swiss Yodeler) and Roar, while Glowing Tribute's unraced daughter, Victoria Cross, is dam of last year's ill-fated European sprint champion, Mozart.

The mating between Summer Squall and Glowing Tribute which produced Mackie, gave reinforcement to the La Troienne family, as Summer Squall's second dam Lassie Dear is by Buckpasser, giving Mackie the three-parts sisters Busanda and Searching 5 x 3. Red Ransom, the sire of Mr. Mellon, doesn't add any more La Troienne, but he is a grandson of Hail to Reason, a horse who we have noted has done extremely well with this family, and who appears here 3 x 4 at the top and bottom of the pedigree.

Mr. Mellon's pedigree is also an example of a cross which is itself a promising one, but which didn't work well in reverse. The cross of Storm Bird and Storm Bird line stallions over mares descended from Hail to Reason has generally been a disappointing one. This is especially so when one considers the channels involved in the pedigree of Mackie. Summer Squall has never sired an unrestricted stakes winner out of a Hail to Reason line mare, and while there are five unrestricted stakes winners bred on a Storm Bird/Roberto cross, none of them are graded. Although in its early days, the reverse, Roberto over Storm Bird, seems to have more potential. The first stakes winner out of a mare by Storm Cat (bred on

the same Storm Bird/Secretariat cross as Summer Squall) was Japanese classic winner Phalaenopsis, a daughter of Brian's Time. Dynaformer, a three-parts brother to Brian's Time, has sired a graded-stakes winner out of a Storm Cat mare. As far as Red Ransom is concerned, he has sired Mackie out of a Summer Squall mare, and stakes winner Lulu's Ransom, out of a Storm Bird mare. His son Sri Pekan has also sired graded-stakes winner Buffalo Berry out of a Storm Bird mare.

Besides the absence of Mr. Prospector, only eight of Storm Cat's 2001 crop of 94 yearlings are catalogued at Keeneland (another three at Saratoga). No doubt there will be plenty more in September, which, in spite of MRLS, is not about to relinquish its position as the world's most important yearling sale now. But, considering he was the only American sire to have two group winners at Royal Ascot, and considering the two best Aidan O'Brien two-year-olds seen out so far are both Storm Cat colts (Statue of Liberty, the G3 Coventry Royal Ascot winner, and Hold That Tiger, winner of last weekend's G3 Railway S. at The Curragh)--well, you'd have to think the more there were at Keeneland, the higher the sale's gross would be.

In fact, Storm Cat is one of 11 sires with seven or more catalogued at Keeneland, which among them account for just over half the catalogue--103 of 200. Perennial September kingpin and 1997-1998 leading North American sire Deputy Minister has the most catalogued with 16. These were breedings of 2000, after his two sire championships, so it's no wonder his 2001 foal crop reads so well. But in the last four years Deputy Minister inexplicably hasn't figured among the

top 50 on the General Sire List. He's got some big-time pedigrees at Keeneland, though, and deserves to have a big sale.

Kingmambo, who just had his seventh Grade I winner in his first five crops, has 13 catalogued, while A.P. Indy and Gone West have 10 each. Four Taylor Made stallions: Unbridled's Song (9), Saint Ballado (8), and first-crop Storm Cat sons Forestry (8) and Exploit (7) are well represented, while Unbridled (7), and Seeking the Gold (7) round out the 11 sires with seven or more catalogued each.

Nine first-crop sires are represented at Keeneland, though the Taylor Made duo of Forestry and Exploit account for 15 of the 29 yearlings catalogued by first-year stallions. Old Trieste has five, while Classic winners Charismatic, Victory Gallop, and Silver Charm have three, two and one, respectively. Stravinsky, Artax, and Horse Chestnut have one each. The Airdrie pair of Mazel Trick (16) and Stormin Fever (12) will be very prominent at Fasig-Tipton, along with Overbrook's Tactical Cat (16).

Ten stallions with their first two-year-olds have yearlings at Keeneland, but only Coronado's Quest (5) has more than two. Six second-crop sires have double-figure representation at Fasig, though, including: Adena Springs' Wild Rush (20); Gainsborough's Elusive Quality (14); Airdrie's Deputy Commander (13); Ashford's Grand Slam (12) and Tale of the Cat (10); and Overbrook's Cape Town (10). Elusive Quality, who leapt to second on the Freshman Sire List with Canadian SW Frankiefourfingers last weekend, continues the good run Gone West is having. Latest figures show him 10th on the North American General Sire list--his best this year is McCarron's last ride, Came Home--with his son Mr. Greeley one notch ahead of him in ninth, including two Grade I winners this year. Zamindar had a Classic winner in his first crop; the latter's full brother, Zafonic, has recovered well from a slow start; and the other major freshman sire by Gone West, namely Grand Slam, is emitting positive signals as well.

From the Not Very Surprising But Still Noteworthy Dep't...Aidan O'Brien saddled the first three in Sundays Irish Derby, and Sadler's Wells was the sire of the first four, from four runners... what would that superfecta have paid? Probably not that much, on home ground, and with it raining...big accomplishments, even so.

No Dwyer for Buddha:

Off since his victory in the GI Wood Memorial Apr. 13, **Buddha** (Unbridled's Song) will miss Sunday's GI Dwyer S. with a cough. The grey colt missed a scheduled workout Monday morning and a subsequent endoscopic exam revealed mucus in his lungs. "It's not that big a deal to me," trainer H. James Bond told *Daily Racing Form*. "The Travers [GI, Aug. 24] is the ultimate goal. I do need to run in a prep before then and the Jim Dandy [GII, Aug. 4] will be the spot I most likely will pick out." Buddha was forced to scratch on the eve of the GI Kentucky Derby with a bruised foot and hasn't raced since.

Proud Citizen Surgery Postponed:

Kentucky Derby runner-up **Proud Citizen** (Gone West), who sustained a shin fracture when fifth in the GI Belmont S. June 9, will have to wait before undergoing surgery, *Daily Racing Form* reported. The three-inch long fracture is located two inches below the knee and a number of tiny fractures are in close proximity to the main fracture, which increases the risk of the surgery, according to Dr. Stephen Selway. "I'm not convinced it would be safe to go in and fix the major fracture at this time," Selway told *DRF*. "It's a difficult fracture to deal with because it's right underneath the knee. He's doing fine; he's back in his stall. I'd rather play it safe than sorry. When it tells us it's safe to put screws in, we'll do it. Until then, it's better to keep the knife in the pocket." Selway added that he may wait another two or three weeks to perform the surgery.

Jockey Club Clarifies Registration Eligibility:

The Jockey Club stewards have approved changes in the American Stud Book to clarify the eligibility for the registration of foals resulting from certain breeding practices. The rule had previously stated that registered foals must have been bred by natural means, but now it has been re-worded in order to "make clear that natural breeding practices do not include cloning," said Edward Bishop, Jockey Club registrar. Section 1, Rule 1D now reads: "To be eligible for registration, a foal must be the result of a stallion's natural service with a broodmare (which is the physical mounting of a broodmare by a stallion), and a natural gestation must take place in, and delivery must be from, the body of the same broodmare in which the foal was conceived. For example, and without limiting the above, any foal resulting from or produced by the processes of Artificial Insemination, Embryo Transfer, Cloning (as defined in the Glossary of Terms) or any other form of genetic manipulation not herein specified, shall not be eligible for registration. As an aid to the natural service, a portion of the ejaculate produced by the stallion during such cover may immediately be placed in the uterus of the broodmare bred." The American Stud Book defines cloning as: "Any method by which the genetic material of an unfertilized egg or an embryo is (i) removed, (ii) replaced by genetic material taken from another organism, (iii) added to with genetic material from another organism, or (iv) otherwise modified by any means in order to produce a live foal." SHEIKH MOHAMMED STRENGTHENS JUVENILE HAND

Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid al Maktoum has purchased the impressive G3 Queen Mary S. winner **Romantic Liason (GB)** (Primo Dominie {GB}). Unbeaten so far, the Brian Meehan-trained filly followed up a maiden win over the Lingfield polytrack May 28 with a 3½-length score in the Royal Ascot contest June 19. She will remain in training with Meehan for the rest of her juvenile campaign and will be aimed at the six-furlong G2 Lowther S. at York Aug. 22. Godolphin's supremo has also purchased the Mark Tompkins-trained **Winisk River (Ire)** (Barathea {Ire}), winner of a York maiden June 15. While no definite plans have been made for the colt, he is likely to be transferred to the operations' base in Dubai.

JOCKEYS ESCAPE INJURY AT HAMILTON

Three jockeys, including former champion Kevin Darley, were lucky to escape serious injury after being involved in a spill at Hamilton yesterday, *PA Sport* reports. The incident occurred when **Trudie (GB)** (Komaite {USA}), ridden by Tony Hamilton, swerved to the right, causing **Touch Of Fairy (Ire)** (Fairy King {USA}) and jockey Tyrone Williams and Darley and his mount, **Distinctive Dream (Ire)** (Distinctly North {USA}) to fall. Distinctive Dream went through the plastic running rail, but all three horses survived, and their jockeys were treated for minor scrapes and bruises.

ASCOT TO STAGE CHARITY RACE

Ascot will stage a race to benefit its charity of the year, the British Red Cross, on Aug. 10, according to *Sporting Life* on-line. The race, to be called the Red Cross S., will feature jockeys Frankie Dettori and George Duffield and two international riders against an additional eight riders, who have yet to sign up. TURIN BIDS GOODBYE

ARREST WARRANT FOR EGAN

Irish-born jockey John Egan was yesterday urged by the Hong Kong Jockey Club to make himself available to answer accusations of alleged corruption. Egan, who was expected to return to the territory Sunday, remained in Britain despite an arrest warrant against him. An official statement from the Hong Kong Jockey Club issued yesterday read, "With a court case pending on jockey John Egan, the Hong Kong Jockey Club is not in a position to comment on today's statement issued by the Independent Commission Against Corruption [ICAC] relating to charges alleging that [Egan]...accepted an advantage from a horse owner in return for his providing racing tips. However, the Jockey Club strongly urges jockey Egan to respond to the arrest warrant and return to Hong Kong in accordance with the conditions originally set by the court. The court has directed Egan to return to Hong Kong by the 30th of June. We believe that jockey Egan should have complied with the court directive and failing this must now respond to this arrest warrant."
