MORE SILENCE, S'IL VOUS PLAIT

Preeminent Japanese stallion Sunday Silence accounted for most of the fireworks during yesterday's second and final day of the 2002 JRHA Select Sale, as hip number 179, a colt out of Dancing Key (Nijinsky II), passed through the ring for a sales record

¥335,000,000 (\$2.79 million). Consigned by Teruya Yoshida's Shadai Farm, the full brother to two Japanese Classic winners, champion three-year-old Dance In the Dark and multiple champion Dance Partner, was widely regarded as the star of sale. Auctioneer Shigehisa Tanabe called for an opening bid of ¥100,000,000 and it rocketed up to ¥200,000,000 within a minute. From that point, it became a battle between two very enthusiastic parties, Futoshi Kojima on behalf of Kiyoshi Nishikawa, the owner of a chain of parking lots, and Takaya Shimakawa, who bid via telephone through his racing manager Kazuhisa Okasa. It looked as if neither would ever give in, as bidding passed the previous sales record ¥320,000,000, but when Okawa made the eventual winning bid, Kojima shook his head and the long battle for the colt with an obvious stallion's pedigree ended. Shimakawa, who runs a fish canning company and natural medicine company at Sendai, did not disclose who is going to train the record colt. Nishikawa more than made up for his disappointment when he went to ¥135,000,000 (\$1.125 million) for hip number 196, yet another colt by Sunday Silence. Out of 1994 G1 English 1000 Guineas winner Las Meninas (Ire) (Glenstal), the bay was consigned to the sale by Shadai Farm and will be trained by Futoshi Kojima, who currently trains Nishikawa's MG1SW Manhattan Café. *JRHA results cont. p. 2*

JRHA Finale Heats Up...

The first heated battle of yesterday's Select Sale finale surrounded hip number 164, a colt by Sunday Silence out of GI Ramona H. winner See You Soon (Fr) (Kaldoun {Fr}). Consigned by Katsumi Yoshida's Northern Farm, he was also purchased on behalf of Nishikawa by Ko Saito of Ever Union Shokai for ¥150,000,000 (\$1.25 million). Yasuhisa Matsuyama, a top trainer at Miho Training Center near Tokyo who was sitting beside Saito at the sale, is going to train the colt. The underbidder was Makoto Kaneko, who just missed taking home some of the top lots, before finally taking home hip number 246, a colt by Sunday Silence out of Aubergade (Fr) (Kaldoun {Fr}) for ¥120,000,000 (\$1 million). Consigned by Northern Farm, the colt is the first foal out of Aubergade, a Listed winner in France and sister to Abbatiale (Fr), who was second in the G1 Prix de Diane. It is not decided who is going to train the colt.

Sale Figures Up...

Total sales for the two-day auction reached ¥5,439,600,000--up 5.3 percent from last year, and the average price of ¥29,250,000 is up 4.8 percent from last year. "Look at my smile," said Teruya Yoshida, acting chairman of Japan Racing Horse Association, the organizer of the Select Sale. "Honestly speaking, this result is better than we expected. None of us could be optimistic considering the country's current economy. But there is a new record price, and both total sales and average price went up. We are very happy, and I believe consignors should be happy."

SAKHEE IMPRESSES IN GALLOP Sakhee (Bahri) delighted connections yesterday when pulling clear of his stable companions in a racecourse gallop at Sandown. Working over 10 furlongs under Frankie Dettori at the Surrey track, he established a 10-length advantage over Jamie Spencer on **Atlantis Prince (GB)** (Tagula {Ire}), having tracked his lead horse **Sydenham** (A.P. Indy) until two furlongs out. Ground conditions appear crucial to whether the five-year-old will take his place in the line-up for the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot July 27, for which G1 Prince of Wales' S. winner **Grandera (Ire)** (Grand Lodge) is another possible. Yesterday's gallop took place on very soft ground, similar to that on which he was so impressive in winning the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp in October. "Sakhee went well and the whole team is very pleased," Godolphin's racing manager Simon Crisford said yesterday. "He finished 10 lengths clear following some excellent work up the hill and will improve for that. He liked the ground and the gallop was perfect for him. This will have put him right for the King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S."

HAP RETIRED MGSW Hap (Theatrical {Ire}--Committed, by Hagley) has been retired from racing after suffering an ankle injury, according to *Daily Racing Form*. The six-year-old stallion captured the 2001 GII Shadwell Keeneland Turf Mile S., GII Dixie S. and GIII New Hampshire Sweepstakes H. and the 2000 GII Fourstardave H. He won the 2000 and 2001 renewals of the GII Bernard Baruch H. and was second in last year's GI Arlington Million S. Hap won 10 of 20 starts and earned \$1,329,210. Stud plans have not been finalized.

Any more rain would compromise the chances of **Dolores** and **Misterah**, third and fourth respectively behind **Sophisticat** and **Zenda** (GB) in the G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot. **Misterah** was scratched from the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas at The Curragh May 26 due to rain-softened conditions and, like **Dolores**, has shown her best form on a fast surface. **Dolores** also holds sway over that rival on the form of her third behind **Kazzia** (Ger) in the G1 1000 Guineas on the Rowley Mile here May 5, where **Misterah** was sixth, and should confirm that superiority. **Richard Hills**, who tasted success in this with **Alshakr** (GB) two years ago, has chosen **Tashawak**, who beat **Misterah** in a conditions event at Salisbury in September before returning to take the Listed Fern Hill S. at Royal Ascot June 22 in impressive fashion. She leads a two-pronged attack by **John Dunlop**, who also saddles **Kootenay**. She loves cut in the ground, as evidenced by her smooth success in the Listed Princess Elizabeth S. at Epsom June 7, having failed to stay the near 10 furlongs of the Listed Lupe S. at Goodwood May 22. Last year she was only beaten 2 1/4 lengths by **Kazzia** (Ger) in the G3 Premio Dormello at Milan in October and that form has taken on a different dimension thanks to the winner's Classic exploits. **Carlos Laffon-Parias** pulled off a cross-channel raid when **Ronda** (GB) took this in 1999 and he relies on **Spring Star** today. She won a below-par G2 Prix de Sandringham at Chantilly June 2.

David Loder bids to extend his impressive record of three consecutive renewals here with **Harb**. Unlike his trio of **City on a Hill**, **Noverre** and **Meshaheer**, **Harb** has not been tested at stakes level and bids to build on a fluent Nottingham maiden success June 24. With the ground easing and likely to race no faster than good to soft here, he may be vulnerable to more experienced rivals such as **Membership**, **Tizzy May** and **Tacitus**. That trio were sixth, seventh and 10th in the G3 Coventry S. at Royal Ascot June 18 and, with altered ground conditions here it may be **Tacitus** who comes out on top. He was impressive in beating a subsequent winner in a Goodwood maiden June 7 on a similar surface and is worth another chance. The unbeaten **Mister Links** is **Richard Hughes'** pick of **Richard Hannon's** three representatives and his form stands up to the closest inspection.

Like Mozart, Landseer has been drawn widest of all the 14 remaining declarations in his bid to successfully step back to six furlongs. Heavy rain at the track yesterday morning caused **Danehurst (GB)**, runner-up in the G1 Golden Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot June 22, to be cut to 11-4 as clear favourite by Coral Eurobet. Her Royal Ascot conqueror **Malhub**, who was supplemented on Friday, may miss the contest if the ground softens further. Frankie Dettori has chosen Golden Jubilee S. third **Three Points (GB)** over **Meshaheer**.

Millenary arrived with a late surge to outstay Mubtaker and return to winning ways here, booking his place in the line-up for the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot July 27. Hero of the 2000 G1 St Leger at Doncaster, he has only won once subsequently, in the G2 Jockey Club S. last May, but had produced some fine efforts in the interim, including a second in the G1 Irish St Leger in September. Second in his bid for a follow-up success in the Jockey Club S. here May 3, he finished third in the G2 Hardwicke S. at Royal Ascot last time June 22. Settled in fifth off the respectable early pace carved out by Yavana's Pace, Millenary was asked to quicken as Mubtaker overhauled the game front-runner at the quarter-mile marker. Switched off the rail, Millenary delivered a strong challenge to head that rival in the final 25 yards en route to a narrow win. "He is a grand horse and just does need a bit of give in the ground," winning trainer John Dunlop explained. "He came unstuck at Ascot when the ground was too fast for him and he just got nabbed up here when the ground was okay for him."

Peter Harris saddled his second winner in three years here as Spinola held off the late challenge of Cassis and Pearl Dance in a thrilling finish. Having finished third in a Ripon maiden June 9, she quickly made amends by taking a similar event at Goodwood June 28. Here she was held up in third on the rail early by Richard Quinn off the fast pace set by Wimple (Kingmambo) before making stealthy progress after halfway. Taking command from the faltering leader with 250 yards remaining, she stayed on well before tiring in the final strides as Cassis and Pearl Dance cut into her advantage up the rising ground. Harris said, "If she continues to progress, then the G1 Cheveley Park S. here [Oct. 4] is an obvious objective. We've always thought a lot of her and she has shown us plenty at every stage."

It's been clear for some time now that Carson City has few superiors when it comes to getting speedy and precocious stock. That was underlined again this weekend when he was represented by a Grade I winner over six furlongs, and a two-year-old who captured a \$100,000 stakes event.

Carson Hollow, who led almost every step of the way to win the Prioress S. is certainly speedy, but she wasn't actually as precocious as some of Carson City's offspring. She didn't make her debut until she was three, opening her career with an 18 3/4-length victory over fellow New York-breds maidens Mar. 22. Following an allowance win in open company, Carson Hollow took the state-bred Bouwerie S. by five lengths, and Saturday's Prioress S. victory took her record to four wins in four starts.

Carson City himself was very effective at both two and three years of age. As a juvenile he captured the GII Sapling Stakes by 7 1/4 lengths, and the following season he added the GIII Boojum H. and GII Fall Highweight H. Although the distaff side of his pedigree reflects something of a middle-distance background--his dam is by Blushing Groom out of the GIII Gallorette H. winner, Summertime Promise (by Nijinsky II)--Carson City's influence as a stallion has been far more of a reflection of his racing career. To date, he has sired 56 stakes winners from his first nine crops, and in addition to Carson Hollow, his other Grade I winners include GI Hopeful S. victor City Zip; GI Oak Leaf S. heroine City Band; Flying Chevron, winner of the GI NYRA Mile; and Pearl City, who captured the GI Ballerina H. Additional graded scorers include Good and Tough, Lord Carson, Ormsby, Five Star Day, Daiwa Carson, Boone's Mill, Imperfect World, Paved in Gold, Don't Tell the Kids, Leelanau and Wrangler.

Carson Hollow is the first graded stakes winner to appear under her first three dams, but she does eventually go back to a classic producing family. Her third dam is stakes winner Mousam River, who is by Cohoes and who had as her third dam a half sister to Cohoes' son, Quadrangle, conqueror of Northern Dancer in the 1964 Belmont S. Bred to In Reality, Mousam River produced stakes winners Shananie (who died young after showing considerable initial promise at stud) and Really Smiling, as well as Carson Hollow's granddam, Lilya's For Real. Only a minor winner on the track, Lilya's For Real, has done very well at stud, producing multiple stakes winning and graded stakes placed Penn Fifty Three; stakes winner Duck Trap; and the GII Ladies H. third Dancer's Gate, who is dam of the 2002 stakes winner Portcullis (by Mr. Prospector's son Smart Strike, so bred along similar lines to Carson Hollow). Carson Hollow's dam Lizeality, a daughter of Hold Your Peace, didn't earn black type, but was a more than useful performer, acquiring a bankroll of \$133,434, over four seasons. Carson Hollow is her fourth foal and third winner.

Carson Hollow represents the cross of Mr. Prospector-line sires over mares descending in male line from Prince John. This has not been a particularly successful cross, although we can note that Carson City's graded stakes winning two-year-old Leelanau has a second dam by Hold Your Peace. On the other hand, In Reality, the sire of Carson Hollow's granddam, is in the male line of the dams of City Zip and City Band, so he appears in three of Carson City's five Grade I winners.

One of the keys to Carson City's success has been an ability to work with a very wide range of strains, but as far as his pedigree combining with Hold Your Peace, the key might be that the distaff sides of the pedigrees of both his sire Mr. Prospector and the sire of his second dam Nijinsky II have a Blue Larkspur/Teddy combination. The same pairing is found in the granddam of Hold Your Peace, and Carson Hollow as an extra combination through the dam of Cohoes.

'EIGHTH POLE' FOUNDERS WIN DOMINION

AWARD Jim Greene and Shirley Edwards, founders of the New England-based Eighth Pole, have been named winners of the 2002 Dogwood Dominion Award. The Eighth Pole is a non-profit organization that serves the health and substance abuse needs of the backstretch workers of Suffolk Downs and Rockingham Park. Greene, a Thoroughbred owner, and Edwards, a trainer, founded the organization 13 years ago and induced the Boston Medical Center to set up a clinic on the backstretch of both tracks to provide medical care to those without insurance. The couple transport workers to appointments in Boston and stock supplies in their offices to take care of the needy. "The Eighth Pole, founded and administered by Shirley and Jim in 1989, has upgraded the lives of so many backstretch workers," said Dogwood Stable President Cot Campbell. "Through the Boston Medical Center's outreach facility, the organization has managed to bring quality medical treatment to the backstretch on a regular basis, and numerous lives literally have been saved." The Dogwood Dominion award, inspired by Dogwood's multiple-stakes winner, was created in 1993 to recognize the unsung heroes in the racing industry. Greene and Edwards were selected from 30 nominations by judges Anne Campbell, Penny Chenery and Jerry Bailey. They will receive a cash award of \$5,000 and a bronze statue of Dominion at a luncheon at the Saratoga Reading Room on July 31.

FOREVERNESS TOPS MIDLANTIC AUCTION

Foreverness (Island Whirl), a three-year-old colt consigned by Harbor View Farm, brought a final bid of \$102,000 to top yesterday's Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Two-Year-Olds in Training and Horses of Racing Age sale in Timonium, Maryland. Purchased by John Brunetti, the New York-bred chestnut was a maiden winner over the Belmont turf June 30. The top-priced juvenile at the auction was hip number 45, a bay colt by freshman sire Arch named **Golden Arch**. The juvenile was consigned by North Country Thoroughbreds LLC and was purchased for \$70,000 by Anthony Dutrow.

FIRST BREEDERS' CUP FUTURE BET CLOSES A

total of \$173,844 was wagered on Pool One of the inaugural Breeders' Cup Future Bet, which ran from July 4-7. Wagering was available on the Breeders' Cup Classic, Distaff and Sprint. When the pool closed at 7 p.m. ET Sunday, Street Cry (Ire) was the Classic favorite at odds of 4-1. The mutuel field was second choice at 6-1, followed by Macho Uno at 8-1. Azeri was the 5-2 favorite for the Distaff, with the mutuel field (6-1) and Bella Bellucci (9-1) rounding out the top three. In the Sprint, the mutuel field closed as the 9-2 favorite, with Swept Overboard and Crafty CT both closing at 9-1. "We are very pleased with the final handle figures, which comfortably exceeded our expectations," said Ken Kirchner, senior vice president of product development for the National Thoroughbred Racing Association. "Fans took advantage of some very attractive prices in all three races. We are hopeful that we will expand the number of outlets for the next three pools and also increase our marketing efforts." The next pool runs from Aug. 9 through 11, with wagering on the Breeders' Cup Turf, Mile and Filly and Mare Turf.

Quarter Moon (Ire) (Sadler's Wells {USA}) was yesterday backed into 4-5 from 5-4 by Cashmans Bookmakers for Sunday's G1 Darley Irish Oaks at The Curragh. The Aidan O'Brien filly, who was runner-up to Kazzia (Ger) in the G1 Epsom Oaks June 7 after finishing second in the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas at The Curragh May 26, was one of 13 fillies left in the Classic at yesterday's stage. She may be joined in Sunday's contest by stable companions **Starbourne (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}), fourth in the Epsom Classic, and **Kournakova (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}), who was further back in 11th there. Dermot Weld's G2 Ribblesdale S. winner **Irresistible Jewel (Ire)** (Danehill {USA}) is currently quoted as the 4-1 second favourite ahead of Saturday's G3 Lancashire Oaks winner **Mellow Park (Ire)** (In The Wings {GB}). Mick Channon has left in last year's champion juvenile filly **Queen's Logic (Ire)** (Grand Lodge {USA}), while Sir Michael Stoute has left in Chepstow maiden winner **L'Affaire Monique (GB)** (Machiavellian {USA}).

CULHANE CAUSES PUNTER OUTRAGE

Jockey Tony Culhane was at the centre of controversy yesterday after being beaten on the 8-13 favourite **True Courage (GB)** (Machiavellian {USA}) in the Tanshelf Maiden S. at Pontefract. Culhane eased the Barry Hills-trained colt when clear inside the final furlong as Ted Durcan pushed out the eventual winner **Kahaláh (Ire)** (Darshaan {GB}) to take the contest in the final strides. Culhane was handed the maximum suspension of 21 days by the Pontefract stewards after an angry crowd jeered him upon his return to the winners' enclosure, following which he needed a police escort. His ban, which follows on from two separate two-day suspensions picked up at Beverley on Saturday, will mean he will be out of action from July 15 to Aug. 9, inclusive. Culhane commented, "The horse was a bit difficult going to the start, he is a bit nervous and what I was trying to do was to give him confidence by winning as easy as I could on him so he would progress from this. I have seen other jockeys do it and I always said to myself that it would never happen to me, but I have gone and done it and I have let the owner, the trainer and punters down, I can only apologise to them."
