CALLER ONE INJURED; RETIREMENT LIKELY

Top sprinter **Caller One** (Phone Trick) fractured his right front sesamoid while breezing at Belmont Park yesterday morning and will likely be retired. "The only good thing was that it was better to have happened there than in a race when he could have hurt himself worse," James Chapman, Sr., whose son James trains the five-year-old, told *The Blood-Horse*. "If he could

Chapman added that Caller One would be flown to the family farm in Ocala, Florida, where a determination will be made as to whether surgery would be necessary. Caller One had been forced to withdraw from the G1 Golden Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot June 22 due to a throat infection and had been pointing towards the \$400,000 Smile Sprint H. at Calder's Summit of Speed Saturday. The front-running bay had been one of the nation's leading sprinters since his three-year-old campaign, when he won the GIII Kentucky Cup Sprint S. and the GIII Lafayette S. and was a close fourth in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint. At four, Caller One captured the \$2-million G3 Dubai Golden Shaheen and the GIII Los Angeles H., then notched a third in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint. He successfully defended his Dubai title this year, leading home a 1-2-3 for the U.S., but couldn't carry that form to Singapore, finishing 12th in the G3 Singapore Airlines KrisFlyer Sprint on the turf at Kranji May 11. Caller One's record stands at 20-10-3-3, with earnings of \$3,184,500.

SUMMER RAIN FOR JULY CUP

With the rain lashing down on the already damp July course yesterday afternoon, only proven soft ground performers need apply for the honours in today's G1 Darley July Cup. Stepping forward is **Danehurst (GB)** (Danehill), who reserves her best for these conditions. As a juvenile, she dominated her rivals over similar ground in the G3 Cornwallis S. at Newbury and in the Listed Bentinck S. on the Rowley Mile. Her performance when second to **Malhub** (Kingmambo) in the G1 Golden Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot June 22 appears all the more meritorious as she was making her seasonal return on good to firm ground. Significant rainfall was not on the wishlist of trainer John Gosden for Malhub, who rattled over the fast surface at the Royal meeting. However, he has a history of breathing problems and may struggle to confirm his superiority on this ground, especially as he has a notable incline to contend with in the closing stages. Those conditions may provide the best chance of **Landseer (GB)** (Danehill) clawing back the hardened sprinters this time. Winner last year of the six-furlong G3 Coventry S. at Royal Ascot, the sophomore has been campaigned at a mile this season, winning the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains at Longchamp May 12, and was subsequently runner-up to Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) in the G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot June 18.

Tashawak produced a brilliant turn of acceleration between the three and two-furlong poles before staying on well up the rising ground to take this competitive event in style. Unbeaten since her debut third in a Kempton maiden last July, she counts a neck beating of Misterah (GB) (Alhaarth {Ire}) in a conditions event at Salisbury in September and a win in the Listed Fern Hill S. at Royal Ascot June 22. This time, she settled in sixth early as the free-running Misterah shared pace setting duties with Kootenay, who was taken over from her middle draw to race upsides. Travelling easily until asked to quicken inside the final three furlongs, she responded instantly with a change of gear that took her to the front with 300 yards remaining. Despite veering left towards the rail from there, she always had a comfortable advantage over the fast-finishing Golden Silca, who relished the uphill climb to the line. Jockey Richard Hills explained, "She has had a lot of problems, but today she quickened up really well and I could have sat even longer, but coming from handicaps to Group company it wasn't worth taking the chance. She ran to the rail and I was clear, so I let her do it as on the July course its quite a stiff uphill finish--she did it nicely. I should think we'll take the colts and the older horses on now. She's won a Group race, so it's the right way to go."

Mister Links maintained his unbeaten record here from stablemate Tacitus to provide trainer Richard Hannon a one-two finish. Having taken a Kempton maiden June 5 from the subsequent Listed Dragon S. winner Bella Tusa (Ire), he beat the promising Hilbre Island (GB), who has taken a competitive maiden since, in a Newbury conditions event June 13. Although the favorite was keen in second early off the steady pace set by The Bonus King (GB), he enjoyed the invaluable rail position as Membership (Belong To Me) was sent ahead. Switched off the rail at the quarter-mile marker, he took a while to reach top gear, but eventually lengthened to catch the long-time leader with 125 yards remaining. Staying on from there, he always had enough to hold off Tacitus, who made steady inroads into his lead without looking a serious threat. Assistant trainer Richard Hannon Jr. said, "Two furlongs out I thought he was going to get well stuffed, but that's him--he's very lazy. I really didn't see much of an early stage two-year-old in him, but one day they worked him and the head lad said 'this is the best we've got' and he gives me the same feel as Bold Edge used to do. He's a big horse with a massive stride and a very good future. We'll probably go for the G1 Prix Morny [at Deauville Aug. 25] or G2 Gimcrack S. [at York Aug. 21] and it will take a good one to beat him."

NO AUSTRALIAN SEASON FOR END SWEEP

Arrowfield Stud has announced that **End Sweep** (Forty Niner) will be forced to miss the Southern Hemisphere breeding season due to a serious injury to his withers sustained recently in Japan. The 11-year-old stallion has not responded quickly enough to treatment and will be unable to cover mares during the 2002/03. "We are obviously very disappointed," said John Messara, Arrowfield chairman. "The horse had been so warmly received by the marketplace here and to have this happen just before his first two-year-olds hit the track here is really unfortunate. At this stage we are working on a replacement stallion for this season. If we are able to secure this horse, it will be announced in the next few days." End Sweep started his career at Mockingbird Farm in Florida, where he was the leading freshman sire of 1998. Among his leading runners are Grade I winners Swept Overboard, Trippi, Nany's Sweep and Dark Ending. Arrowfield purchased the bay stallion in 1999.

CENTURY CITY TO AMERICA Three-year-old **Century City (Ire)** (Danzig--Alywow, by Alysheba) has been purchased by Tom Nichols and John J. Greely IV's Kitchwa Stables and will continue his career for trainer C. Beau Greely. The third highest-priced yearling in Europe in 2000, when he sold for Ir£2,000,000 at Goffs Orby, Century City will make one more start in Ireland for Aidan O'Brien in Saturday's G2 Goffs International S. at The Curragh. The bay colt captured the G3 Tetrarch S. before running second to superstar stablemate Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) in the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas, and finished fifth last out in the G2 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot. "We will make plans for his next start following Saturday's race," said Beau Greely. Upon the conclusion of his racing career, Century City will stand at the Greelys' Wintergreen Stallion Station in Midway, Kentucky.

TURTLE ISLAND GELDING TOPS DAY TWO AT TATTERSALLS

Jumping prospects led the way on day two of the Tattersalls July Sales yesterday when the Aga Khan's home-bred **Mirpour (Ire)** (Turtle Island {Ire}), winner of a 10-furlong handicap at Leopardstown in May, was sold to Irish agent Sean Tiernan for 115,000gns. Former Irish trainer Mick O'Toole was underbidder on the gelding, who will race for an undisclosed owner with young Co. Kilkenny handler Eoin Griffin. "He will come back to my place in Wexford for a six-week break before joining Eoin," said Tiernan, who previously trained for six years in the U.S. "He is an exceptionally well-bred horse. He will be aimed at three-year-old hurdles initially, but could run on the Flat again." A 22-strong draft from the Zabeel Racing Office in Dubai included several well-bred performers, including **Aleron (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}), an own brother to Darley sire In The Wings (GB), who is now set to embark on a dual-purpose career. Yorkshire trainer John Quinn bought the four-year-old for 52,000gns and said: "He's not been over-raced and has a smashing pedigree. He'll probably race on both the Flat and over hurdles. I am not sure who will own him at present." The best-known member of the draft, 1999 G1 Derby Italiano winner **Mukhalif (Ire)** (Caerleon {USA}), is also going hurdling after selling for 32,000gns to jumps trainer Mark Pitman. The sale concludes today, with a session beginning at 9:30 a.m.

QUARTER MOON HEADS KING GEORGE ENTRIES

Trainer Aidan O'Brien left in five at yesterday's forfeit stage for the £750,000 G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot July 27 with Sunday's G1 Irish Oaks contender **Quarter Moon (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}) heading the group. Godolphin, who are responsible for seven of the 25 remaining entries, plan to run **Sakhee (USA)** (Bahri {USA}) and **Grandera (Ire)** (Grand Lodge {USA}), currently quoted at head of the market by Coral Eurobet at odds of 13-8 and 7-4, respectively. Meanwhile, **Golan (Ire)** (Spectrum {Ire}) will gallop at Newmarket after racing today as he continues his preparation for Ascot's midsummer showpiece. Last year's G1 2000 Guineas winner will work over a mile of the July course. The work will be the first time the colt has been seen on a racetrack since his sixth placing in the G1 Japan Cup last November. Lisa Hancock, Newmarket's managing director, said yesterday: "I am delighted that Golan will be working tomorrow. It will add considerable interest to the end of the afternoon." Golan is currently quoted at odds of 8-1 by Coral Eurobet as third favourite behind Godolphin's duo.

JOCKEY CLUB RESPOND TO CULHANE FIASCO

Following jockey Tony Culhane's error on True Courage (GB) in Tuesday's Tanshelf Maiden S. at Pontefract, in which he dropped his hands and lost the race aboard the 8-13 favourite, the Jockey Club have no plans to change policy. Director of regulation Malcolm Wallace yesterday responded to calls to increase penalties for such offences, suggesting that rules for jockeys to ride out all the way to the line are on their way. He told *PA Sport*: "We reviewed the penalty last year and put the maximum up from 14 days to 21--it was only five in 1997. It is a huge penalty and at the moment there are no plans to increase it. We think the punishment fits the crime. We need to talk to the trainers, but if we bring in riding out to the line it would reduce this problem virtually to zero so it must be an option."
