A DANDY ONE-TWO IN THE JULY CUP

He went to war with two former handicappers, but trainer "Dandy" Nicholls came away with a first and second in yesterday's G1 Darley July Cup at Newmarket as 12-1 shot **Continent (GB)** (Lake Coniston {GB}) bested 16-1 chance **Bahamian Pirate** (Housebuster) by a half-length. Receiving what jockey Darryll Holland described as a "dream run" up the rail in the final quarter of a mile, the striking chestnut made no mistake as he quickened to emulate his sire's success in this contest in 1995. While both the first and second are past winners of the prestigious six-furlong Ayr Gold Cup H., they have progressed markedly at a higher level, with Continent tackling six stakes events in little more than two months from mid-April. Twice beaten by **Reel Buddy** (Mr. Greeley), including in the Listed Abernant S. on the Rowley Mile here Apr. 16, he produced a career-best when finishing fast--but too late--to catch **Dominica (GB)** in the G2 King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot June 18. Returning to that meeting just four days later, he ran a respectable fifth behind **Malhub** (Kingmambo) in the G1 Golden Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot and built off that effort here under a cool ride from Holland. *July Cup wrap-up cont. p. 2*

QUEEN'S LOGIC RETIRED

Queen's Logic (Ire) (Grand Lodge--Lagrion, by Diesis {GB}), Mick Channon's champion two-year-old filly of 2001, was yesterday retired by connections after a

recurrence of the virus that ruled her out of her early season targets. Mucus was found on the lungs of the filly after routine exercise at Channon's West Ilsley base, ruling her out of the G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood July 31. Soon after, the decision was made by owner Jaber Abdullah to retire her to stud with her unbeaten record intact. Queen's Logic, who

achieved a rating of 122 pounds in the 2001 International Classifications, the highest allotted to a filly since Ravinella in 1987, was the impressive winner of the G3 Queen Mary S. at Royal Ascot in June and G2 Lowther S. at York in August, before powering away with the G1 Cheveley Park S. at Newmarket in October. She returned to take the G3 Fred Darling S. at Newbury Apr. 20 before a minor foot problem caused connections to bypass the G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket May 5 and a dirty trachea wash ruled her out of the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas at The Curragh May 26. "She just gave a cough after a routine canter. We have scoped her and she has still got a lot of mucus on her lungs," Channon told *The Mirror* yesterday. "We had just started to do a little bit more with her, but it obviously hadn't cleared up and it wouldn't have been fair to train her with it. It is just a question of time--if she had two to three months off it is September by the time you get back, and the season is over. There was the option to keep her in training at four, but they have decided not to do that," Channon added. Jockey Steve Drowne paid tribute to the filly when he told *PA Sport* yesterday, "It's very sad. She is the best I've ridden by far--a champion. All over the winter she was what everyone was looking forward to. I was so relieved when she won the Fred Darling so well. Since then nothing has gone her way. She has retired unbeaten, but it's a shame she couldn't have proved it again as a three-year-old as I'm sure she would have."

FRANKEL FEARS SKY JACKING IN GOLD CUP

Trainer Bobby Frankel will saddle likely favorite **Milwaukee Brew** (Wild Again) in Sunday's GI Hollywood Gold Cup, but the New York native was keeping a wary eye on the speedy **Sky Jack** (Jaklin Klugman) as entries were drawn for the 1 1/4-mile race yesterday. "Milwaukee Brew has been training great, but how can that other horse lose," Frankel asked yesterday. "Sky Jack is unbeaten here [at Hollywood]. Nobody else in the field has the speed to put any pressure on him early. How can he lose? He's the best bet of the year." Frankel's opinion likely reflects the second-place finish of his Lido Palace (Chi) behind front-running E Dubai in last week's GII Suburban H. at Belmont. Sky Jack, a perfect four-for-four at Hollywood Park, is coming off a win in the GII Mervyn LeRoy H., while Milwaukee Brew has moved to the head of the handicap division with wins in the GI Santa Anita H. and GII Californian. He could become the first horse since Affirmed in 1979 to win the Big 'Cap and the Gold Cup in the same year. **Dig For It** (Digamist) was a last-minute supplement to the seven-horse field. The Gold Cup will be televised live on ESPN2 and is scheduled to go off at 3:31 p.m. PT.

Breaking well, Continent established a prominent position just two lengths off the trail-blazing **Three Points (GB)** (Bering {GB}) in the early stages, on the inner with a wall of horses in front. "He wasn't as slowly away as he usually is," explained Holland afterwards, "which always helps in these races over short distances, but he needs everything to go his way." That was what the gelding got as Three Points faltered in front inside the final quarter of a mile, with **Danehurst (GB)** (Danehill), Malhub and **Landseer (GB)** (Danehill) failing to land a blow in the centre of the track. Diving through the gap approaching the furlong marker, he hit the front with 200 yards remaining and, despite veering right, had enough to hold his spirited stable companion, who had the worst of the draw. "It opened up like the Red Sea and he duly went through it--he was just in front a little too long, but he's very gutsy and very tough. We've tried to ride him handy, but he doesn't finish off so we've found the key to him," Holland said. Nicholls added, "They're two really nice horses to train and they've got a load of ability--it's come right on the big day." Both Continent and Bahamian Pirate will head to the G1 Nunthorpe S. at York Aug. 22.

Tattersalls' Mixed July Sale finished yesterday afternoon with new records for gross sales, 3,635,100gns, average, 10,916gns, and an equal best-ever median of 6,000gns. "The July Sale continues to go from strength to strength, both in terms of quality and numbers, and our largest ever July catalogue has attracted a truly global cast of buyers who have pushed the Sale turnover past the 3,000,000 guineas mark for the first time," reflected Edmond Mahony, Tattersalls' chairman. "Demand for well-bred mares and fillies has mirrored the trade we saw at last year's extraordinary December Sales, and high profile successes of recent July Sale purchases like Ulundi have also ensured solid demand for the horses in training. It is always encouraging to see our regular overseas buyers returning to the sale year after year, and they have made a huge contribution to the record average and turnover, but even better has been the number of new faces we have seen. There is no doubt that the profile of the July Sale is in the ascendancy, and the major consignments from so many of the top owner/breeders have been crucial to the steady development of the sale in recent years, and in particular to the success of the sale this week." Trainer Venetia Williams, who signed the buyer's ticket, said, "I think he will be gelded sooner rather than later. He is going jumping, and he has some very good three-year-old form, so given the prices maiden winners and handicappers have made, he may not have been too dear."

GOLAN SET FOR ASCOT SPECTACULAR

Golan (Ire) (Spectrum {Ire}) put in a satisfactory gallop after the day's races were completed on the rain-softened grounds at Newmarket yesterday and was reported on course for the G1 King George VI And Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot July 27. Last year's G1 2000 Guineas winner worked over a mile of the July course under Sally Eddery, tracking lead horse Cover Up (Ire) before lengthening past that stable companion on the far rail to end comfortably on top. "That ground is pretty soft out there and they went a sensible pace, but I love the way he traveled," said Golan's trainer, Sir Michael Stoute. "I'm happy with him."

BUNBURY CONTROVERSY HITS HQ

After **Capricho (Ire)** (Lake Coniston {Ire}) dead-heated with **Mine (Ire)** (Primo Dominie {GB}) in yesterday's feature handicap, the Ladbrokes Bunbury Cup at Newmarket, the former was disqualified after his jockey weighed in nine pounds light. A remiss John Akehurst, trainer of Capricho, accepted responsibility for having left the weight cloth out of the gelding's saddle and was fined £1,500 by the stewards. Stipendiary steward Patrick Hibbert-Foy explained, "The weight cloth had been found in the unsaddling enclosure, and Mr. Akehurst then came to the clerk of the scales and alerted him to the fact that he had, as the result of a very fractious horse, unwittingly, left it off. Capricho's weight was wrong by nine pounds and, under Rule 161 (iii), it is mandatory disqualification and the minimum fine is £300, and the stewards fined Mr. Akehurst £1,500. He was absolutely honest in his evidence, and he admitted that it was entirely his fault and an oversight on his part."
