

LANE'S END LANDS KEENELAND TOPPERS

The overall market dropped sharply, but Lane's End had to be pleased with their results at last night's opening session of the 2002 Keeneland July Sale in

Lexington. Lane's End sold the two top fillies and the top colt, in the process accounting for the only two yearlings to reach seven figures. Honors as the opening-night sales topper went to Hip 94, a filly by Belong to Me out of MGISW Tomisue's Delight (A.P. Indy). Born on St. Patrick's Day, the chestnut brought a final bid of \$2 million from John Ferguson

Bloodstock. "We thought she was an exceptional filly," Ferguson said. "I've liked her ever since I saw her on the farm as a foal. She is the daughter of a Grade I winner from an outstanding family. She is one of the very best fillies that I have seen this year. She's athletic, she's got everything." As for the sales-topping price tag, he said, "We've all been here before. We know what it's going to take to buy the best." Lane's End's Bill Farish added, "We had really high hopes for her right from the start. She's always been a lovely filly. John really liked her when he saw her on the farm this winter. This is especially gratifying since she is from one of our foundation families. When it comes down to it, that's what made this. When you have a multiple Grade I winner [Tomisue's Delight] out of a multiple Grade I winner [Prospectors Delite], that what it takes for people to go to the next level." This is the first foal by the eight-year-old Tomisue's Delight, who won the GI Personal Ensign S. and GI Ruffian H. and was second in the GI Kentucky Oaks and GI Coaching Club American Oaks. As for why they chose to breed her to Belong to Me, Farish said, "My dad [Will Farish], myself and Stephen and Tomisue Hilbert decided collectively to send her to Belong to Me. The Hilberts own part of the stallion and they purchased and raced Tomisue's Delight, so it was kind of a no-brainer."

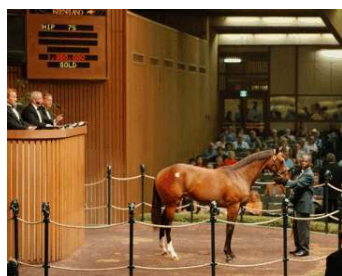

Going, Going, Gone

Lane's End's other seven-figure yearling was Hip 75, a daughter of Gone West out of Primedex (Deputy Minister). The dark bay filly, a half-sister to Prime Direc-

tive (Tactical Advantage), a stakes winner at two and three; and Japanese stakes winner Maltese Superb (With Approval), was purchased for \$1,350,000 by Wayne Lukas as agent for Bob and Beverly Lewis and Overbrook Farm.

"She is simply a lovely filly, very well put together," Bob Lewis said. "Her pedigree is

just outstanding--just have a look at her page. We are delighted to have purchased her and look forward to our partnership with Mr. Young. Not to sound presumptuous at all, but I think the price was a little bit low. We were prepared to go considerably higher than that." (The Lewises and Overbrook raced Timber Country in partnership following the Preakness; he was injured prior to the Belmont S. and eventually sold to Japan). Bill Farish of Lane's End, happy to sell the first lot to push past the \$1 million mark, said, "The market has been very tough tonight. It's been very scary, so we didn't know exactly where she would land, but she ended up selling very well. Whenever you have a yearling that sells for that kind of money, you have to be pleased."

Another Anees?

Hip 50, a full sister to champion juvenile Anees, brought a final bid of \$850,000. The daughter of Unbridled was consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, Agent XCIV, and purchased by JMJ Stables Corp. Mark Taylor of Taylor Made said, "She is a carbon copy of her brother. He was a little immature when he was young and she is a little bit that way as well, but she looks like a filly that is just going to get better with time. I'd say that she is going to be a runner." He added, "I thought that there was a chance that she'd bring seven figures...I thought the price would fall somewhere in the \$600,000 to \$1 million range." John Manganaro, who owns JMJ with his father, Paul, said, "We thought she was an outstanding prospect, being a full sister to a champion, and we have high hopes for her, first as a racehorse and later as a broodmare. I thought that the price was very fair. Not too high and not too low. I'm tickled to have gotten her."

A Disappointing Opener

Last night's first session of the two-day auction saw a 39.1 percent drop in the average and a 34.6 percent decrease in the median from last year. There were 37 yearlings that did not reach their reserves, as opposed to 25 bought back in 2001, and only two seven-figure purchases, as compared to five a year ago. "I am very disappointed and surprised in the results," Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell said. "It was significantly worse than I thought it would be. I won't say that we expected to improve on the average, but we didn't expect that big of a hit." But, he added, "In walking around the barn area this morning, consignors prepared us for a down night. They said it would be a little light and that horses were not being vetted. Also, a few horses that we had high expectations for were withdrawn prior to the sale. This is a very boutique sale. We have a limited number of buyers every year. We think that we have a good number of buyers here, but maybe the first session was a little light in terms of sires. It seems that tomorrow should be a little stronger. There are some lots catalogued that we really like."

Strength Not Necessarily in Numbers

As far as David and Ginger Mullins are concerned, it's definitely quality versus quantity where it comes to selling horses. Whereas some of the household consignors are here with imposing double-digit drafts, the Mullinses, who operate under the banner of Doninga from a 110-acre farm in Northern Fayette county, bring their first-ever yearling to a sale. The couple's one-orse consignment is hip number 105, a chestnut filly by Storm Cat out of Amelia Bearhart (Bold Hour).

"We've concentrated primarily on nice young mares, elling them at breeding stock sales," David Mullins explained. "But we like to stay small and do our best to achieve the best possible price on each individual horse. This allows us to develop a solid one-on-one relationship with our clients, both buyers and sellers. We've been approached to come to this sale before, but hesitated to do so. When we got this filly, we decided to change our minds."

The filly's pedigree rivals any in the catalog. A half sister to 1997 champion turf horse Chief Bearhart, GI Hollywood Derby winner Explosive Red and to the dam of MGSW Strut the Stage, the April foal was bred by Richard Maynard, who acquired the mare from Spendthrift Farm in the late 1980s. Mullins explained that the mare appealed to Maynard in large part based on her female family. By the Bold Ruler stallion Bold Hour, Amelia Bearhart is out of Myrtlewood Lass (*Ribot), herself a half sister to the late Mr. Prospector.

The Mullinses are no strangers to success at Keeneland. After purchasing Saoirse (Cure the Blues) from Knob Hill Stable following her championship Canadian campaign in 2000, the couple decided to retire her to stud after a pair of disappointing starts last season. Bred to Seeking the Gold, the six-year-old mare was entered in the 2001 November Breeding Stock Sale, where she sold for \$2.2 million to Charlotte Weber's Live Oak Stud. Doninga hopes that their July debut will end up equally, if not more, successful.

"She has a beautiful temperament and is a no-fuss filly," David Mullins said. "She showed 36 times on Friday, but she still found time during all that to sleep. That's the kind of filly she is. She does have a bit of an attitude though. If another horse is on the same ring as her, she's going to let you know that she is there."


Mullins adds that she has been viewed in excess of 100 times and that there is "interest from all over the place, from all the right people."

Gaillardia Not So New on the Scene

A glance at the list of consignors for this year's sale sees several well-known entities, and others which are not so familiar. Ed Gaylord is the owner of the newly named Gaillardia, but he is certainly no stranger to Keeneland. "We've been here before as Lazy E Farm," said Gaylord, who, with his wife, owns a 200-acre farm just down the road from Lane's End Farm, between Midway and Versailles. The couple also owns a farm in Oklahoma, but Gaylord has been coming to Keeneland with July consignments for about six years and says this is the place to be. "Keeneland July has been very good to us," Gaylord explained. "This is horse country and you just have to be here if you are in the business of breeding or selling horses. We always like to have a presence here." The outfit has two horses in this year's sale, a colt by Danzig--Sunlit Silence (Tremolino), bred by Gaylord and Everett Dobson, which was RNA'ed at \$240,000, and a colt by Gone West--Red Cat (Storm Cat), which sells tonight as lot number 178. Gaylord hopes to duplicate the success of last year's September Sale, when Lazy E sold a colt by Mr. Prospector--Destination Mir for \$3.8 million.

Eaton Hoping for Stormy Weather

Perennially a leading consignor at this event, Tom Van Meter and Reiley McDonald's Eaton Sales consigns a total of 22 horses to the sale, headlined by hip number 123. By Seeking the Gold out of 1995 Breeders' Cup Sprint winner Desert Stormer (Storm Cat), the full sister to GII Stonerside Beaumont S. winner Sahara Gold is a top prospect, according to Van Meter. "This is a very very nice filly," he enthused. "She is one of the top physicals of all the fillies in the sale and one of the best in the sale overall. It seems that all of the right people are looking at her and we hope that she sells well." Van Meter and McDonald own the February foal in conjunction with Joanne Nor. Van Meter is also high on hip number 166, a filly by Storm Cat--Nannerl (Valid Appeal), a full sister to Magicalmysterycat, who won Saratoga's GII Schuylerville S. in 1999.

"This was a major transition for us and the technology and capital investment for this change have required the full-time focus of our board of directors and our staff," the Prince said from Riyadh. "I missed the Belmont and I'm sorry not to be in Kentucky for the sales. I had hoped to visit

Three Chimneys to see Spain and Point Given. I hope Spain will forgive me not coming--I did send her carrots and flowers." The Prince hopes his schedule will allow him to see War Emblem in the GI Haskell Invitational H. at Monmouth Park Aug. 4, and to spend some time at Del Mar. "And watch out for The Thoroughbred Corporation at later sales. I don't intend for my friends Sheikh Mohammed, Mr. Magnier and Mr. Tabor to have all their own way in the marketplace," he added.

SAY IT IN FRENCH

A hundred horses catalogued for the Keeneland July opener. After 22 outs, including several after 6 p.m. last night, 78 horses went through the ring last night. If you got that far, you had a 50-50 chance of selling: 41 sold (53 percent), 37 didn't (47 percent). In a session which needed to have 60 percent of the catalogue sell, a gross of \$30 million and an average of \$500,000, it instead saw 41 percent of the catalogue sold, grossing \$15.7 million (down 39 percent from \$25.8 million in 2001), and averaging \$383,902, down 34.6 percent from last year's corresponding session figure of \$587,432. The French might say, bain de sang--a bath of blood.

But, a few observations. First: today's second and final session will average at least \$100,000 higher, probably even more. Second: compare last night's 41 horses, which averaged \$383,902, with last year's Keeneland September Book 1...353 horses sold, averaging \$386,170. Pretty similar. Maybe July is just now September Book 1, six weeks early, at least to some extent.

And there were some big sales, high hundreds of thousands, two seven-figure fillies from Lane's End. Just not very many; not nearly enough. But there will be some better numbers today--like maybe more than 41 percent of the catalogue will actually get sold.

Imperial Dancer provided the first boost to the form of the G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown July 6 with his first Group success. Fourth behind Hawk Wing when pitched in at the deep end there, he was not disgraced finishing 8 1/2 lengths adrift of the convincing winner. Previously he had taken the Listed Festival S. at Goodwood May 23, where Border Arrow was just over three lengths back in third. Either side of that success, he failed to best that old rival as the pair trailed Chancellor (Ire) in the G3 Gordon Richards S. at Sandown Apr. 27 and Island House (Ire) in the Listed Leicester Mercury S. at Leicester June 16. Renewing rivalry here, the duo had the smart front-running Sohaib to contend with and Chris Catlin decided to play a waiting game on Imperial Dancer biding his time in last place as Sohaib dominated the early stages. Always traveling smoothly, the winner was moved closer as the pacesetter kicked off the final turn and was asked to quicken inside the final quarter-mile as Border Arrow threatened the long-time leader under Kieren Fallon's drive. But that horse failed to make a serious impact, and it was left to Imperial Dancer, who responded to Catlin's urgings to quicken past the game Sohaib with 100 yards remaining before asserting for a comfortable score.

The 12-year-old stallion completed the 2002 Northern Hemisphere season with a full book of mares at £20,000 and will serve his debut at Arrowfield at A\$38,500 (GST included). "He is at a value fee this year when you consider his race record, the fact that he is a proven stallion, and when compared to other stallions standing here. This [reduced fee] is due to the lateness of this announcement, with the start of our breeding season being only six weeks away," Messara added. A European champion at two and three, the homebred retired to his owner's stud in 1994 following an undefeated juvenile season that included victories in the G1 Prix Salamandre, the G1 Prix Morny and the G1 Dewhurst S. He became a Classic winner the following year, capturing the G1 2000 Guineas. The winner of five of his seven starts for earnings of \$332,520, the dark bay also has proved valuable at stud, having sired dual European champion Xaar (GB). A full brother to the promising young sire Zamindar, Zafonic's yearling crops averaged 45,299gns in 1999, 105,873gns in 2000 and 86,004gns last year.

According to a *Thoroughbred Times* report last December, the Turkish Jockey Club had received--and rejected--two offers to sell Doyoun, the 1988 2000 Guineas winner who has had a remarkably successful time since he stood his last season in Ireland in 1998.

Since his sale in the fall of that year, the son of the great Mill Reef has reeled off plenty of important victories, thanks to Daylami (whose four Group 1 wins in 1999 included the King George and the Breeders' Cup Turf), Kalanisi (G1 Dubai Champion S. and GI Breeders' Cup Turf in 2000), Manndar (a dual Grade I winner on turf in 2000), Takarian (twice winner of the GI American H.) and Akbar (this year's G2 Henry II S.).

A list of this length might suggest that the people who sold Doyoun have been left with egg on their faces. Not in this case, though. As I wrote after Daylami's victory in the 1998 Eclipse S., Doyoun's "record as a stallion would look disappointing but for Daylami's efforts. Although Doyoun has a perfectly respectable proportion of black-type performers to his credit--around 12 percent to the end of 1997--only four of them--Daylami, Manntari, Dalara and Adaiyka--have managed to win a Group race. This has to be considered a disappointing record for a stallion who has enjoyed the support of the Aga Khan's outstanding team of broodmares."

The Aga Khan was also safe in the knowledge that Daylami was destined to return to his stud, even though the colt was by then campaigning in the Godolphin colours. And His Highness also knew that Doyoun had attracted only around 40 mares, including quite a few of his own, during the 1998 season, when Doyoun's fee was a comparatively modest 7,000 Irish guineas.

However, Doyoun has continued to turn around his fortunes. Two of those 40 mares were represented by their Doyoun fillies in Sunday's G1 Darley Irish Oaks and they supplied the first and fourth. It was Airlie Stud's Mild Intrigue who came up with the very unexpected winner, Margarula. Although this tough filly had gained all three of her previous wins in handicaps, she proved very well suited by a return to 1 1/2 miles in the Oaks, staying on to become the third filly to beat the luckless Quarter Moon into second place in a Classic.

Margarula's win is likely to have the bloodstock agents trying to secure the return of Doyoun from the Izmit Pension Stud, approximately 60 miles southeast of Istanbul. However, agent Jean Pierre Deroubaix, who has pulled off some notable coups for the Turkish Jockey Club, thinks the 17-year-old is destined to remain in Turkey.

"The Turkish Jockey Club will never sell him," Deroubaix claimed last year. "The purpose of purchasing stallions was to offer local breeders good quality horses at very reasonable fees. Doyoun is a good one."

Another good one is Distant Relative, the Habitat horse who has had several Group and Graded winners in recent years. Coincidentally, Distant Relative descends from Natasha, a daughter of Nasrullah and the champion American racemare Vagrancy, and so does Margarula.

Margarula, who cost Jim Bolger only IR£33,000 as a yearling, must now be a very valuable proposition as a broodmare. Not only does she come from a terrific female line, but she also has a pedigree free from Northern Dancer blood.

She is closely related to Wild Heaven, a two-year-old Listed winner over 1 1/8 miles who resulted from Mild Intrigue's mating with Mill Reef's grandson Darshaan. Now owned by the top Irish jockey Michael J. Kinane, Wild Heaven started her broodmare career with visits to Sadler's Wells and Giant's Causeway.

Margarula possibly owes her toughness to her broodmare sire, Sir Ivor, who had the type of record to which all top-class horses should aspire. Constantly travelling from his base in Ireland as a three-year-old, Sir Ivor won the 2000 Guineas, the Derby and the Champion S. in England and the Washington D.C. International in the U.S., as well as finishing second in the Irish Derby and the Arc.

Margarula's dam, Mild Intrigue, was an above average winner over 1 1/4 miles and she had a couple of talented half brothers in Grimesgill and Determined Bidder. Apart from Distant Relative and his top-class half brother Ezzoud, the Natasha family owes its fame largely from the descendants of Natasha's top-class daughter Natashka.

This daughter of Dedicate became a broodmare in a million, producing five individual Group or Graded winners. She did especially well with Ribot and his son Graustark, producing Classic-placed Arkadina, unbeaten Blood Royal and Group 1 winner Gregorian. Arkadina visited Mill Reef to produce the Group 2 winner South Atlantic, possibly planting the seed for the idea of sending Mild Intrigue to several Mill Reef-line stallions.

However, the most interesting of Natashka's winners where Margarula is concerned is her Test S. winner Ivory Wand. With Sir Ivor as her sire and Natashka as her dam, Ivory Wand was closely related to Margarula's dam, who was sired by Sir Ivor from Natashka's Buckpasser filly Mild Deception.

Ivory Wand produced Gold And Ivory, a top-class middle-distance colt in Europe, but is perhaps better known nowadays as the second dam of Anees (Breeders' Cup Juvenile) and of Gone West's record-setting son Elusive Quality, who is making an eye-catching start with his first runners.

Correction: Monday's *TDN* listed incorrectly listed the breeder of G3 Emirates Airline Minstrel S. winner Gate-man (GB). The correct breeder is Kirsten Rausing. Additionally, the editorial of the race indicates Gateman was sold after making his debut in England. This was not the case, as the owners who purchased him as a yearling are still the current owners.

"We are pleased that the emergency relief for horse breeders in the central Kentucky region and other areas is now available," National Thoroughbred Racing Association Deputy Commissioner Greg Avioli said. "This would not have been possible without the quick action of David Switzer of the KTA/KTOB and members of the Kentucky Congressional delegation, led by Congressman Ernie Fletcher, who recognized the impact of MRLS and enlisted NTRA's support to obtain government assistance for this very important sector of the Thoroughbred industry." The Kentucky Thoroughbred Association/Kentucky Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders will hold a seminar on filling out loan applications at 5 p.m. July 25 at the KTA office, located in the Kentucky Horse Park next to the Saddlebred Museum. To qualify for a loan, applicants must be horse breeders who had 30 percent or more of the mares they own fail to conceive, miscarry, abort or otherwise fail to produce a live healthy foal from Jan. 1 through Oct. 31 of 2000, 2001 or 2002; or who had 30 percent or more of the mares boarded on their farms fail to produce a live foal during those time periods. MAGNA AND MJC FORM ALLIANCE The Maryland Jockey Club and Magna Entertainment Corp. have entered into an alliance to jointly own and operate Pimlico Race Course and Laurel Park. The transaction, subject to regulatory approvals and legislative review, is expected to close in the fall. The day-to-day management of the Maryland Jockey Club will remain in the hands of current MJC President and Chief Executive Officer Joe DeFrancis. DeFrancis will also be proposed for election to the Magna Entertainment Board of Directors. Under the agreement, Magna will purchase a 51-percent equity and voting interest in The Maryland Jockey Club of Baltimore City, Ltd., owner of Pimlico; and a 51-percent voting interest and a 58-percent equity interest in Laurel Racing Association, Inc., for approximately \$50.6 million in cash. After closing, the DeFrancis family will retain a 49-percent equity and voting interest in the MJC. and a 49-percent voting interest and a 42-percent equity interest on a fully diluted basis in LRA with an option to acquire an additional seven-percent equity interest. Frank Stronach, chairman of Magna Entertainment, said, "The acquisition of a majority interest in Pimlico Race Course and Laurel Park will mark an important milestone in our strategic program of growing Magna Entertainment's racing operations throughout North America. We are excited about the future prospects of Maryland racing and look forward to working closely with the DeFrancis family. I also look forward to welcoming Joe to the Magna Entertainment Board of Directors." Magna Entertainment currently operates 10 racetracks around the country, including Santa Anita, Gulfstream Park, Golden Gate Fields and Bay Meadows. Magna has also contracted to purchase Lone Star Park. According to Joe DeFrancis, "The combination of Magna Entertainment together with our family's strong local ties will create a dynamic alliance that gives Maryland racing an unparalleled chance to succeed in these intensely competitive times. We are honored to have the opportunity to work with Magna Entertainment and their outstanding leadership team."


HOWARD BATTLE DIES Longtime Keeneland racing secretary Howard Battle died Sunday night at his home in Lexington, Kentucky. He was 71 and had been fighting stomach cancer. Battle served as a racing official at Latonia, Toledo and Hialeah before being named assistant racing secretary at Arlington Park in 1963. He graduated to racing secretary at Detroit in 1967, then Liberty Bell in Pennsylvania, before being named to succeed Allan Lavin as Keeneland's racing secretary in 1973. Battle held that title until January, 2002, when he became stakes director for the Lexington track. "Howard Battle was one of the most respected and revered racing executives in the world," said James Bassett III, Keeneland trustee and retired chairman of the board. "He was primarily responsible for restructuring and building the Keeneland racing program into one of the most competitive in the nation. He will be fondly remembered by all who had the privilege and pleasure of knowing him." Battle served on the International Classifications Committee, Experimental Free Handicap and Daily Racing Form Handicap. Geoffrey Gibbs, chairman of the International Classifications Committee, said, "A wonderful man whose loyal friendship I enjoyed for nearly 20 years, he was a racing secretary who epitomized all that is great in Thoroughbred racing and who was a tower of strength in helping, through the North American Rating Committee, the integration of North American horses into the International Classifications. We shall miss him greatly." Battle is survived by his wife, three children and eight grandchildren. Visitation will be July 17 from 5:30 p.m. until 8 p.m. at Kerr Brothers Funeral Home with a funeral mass following on July 18 at 10 a.m. at the Newman Center.
