**STORM RAGES AT KEENELAND**

Monday's opening session might have started off sluggishly, but the second and final session of the Keeneland July Selected Yearling Sale seemed to rebound in Lexington, Kentucky last night, when three of the first seven horses to sell attracted seven-figure price tags. At the end of bidding, leading sire Storm Cat was the night's star with two of his yearlings surpassing the \$2-million mark. Hip number 186, a son of the supersire out of the Mr. Prospector mare Tacha, brought a sales-topping \$3.1 million. The handsome bay was consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency and was purchased by Irish bloodstock agent Demi O'Byrne on behalf of the Michael Tabor/John Magnier partnership. "I suppose he was the biggest horse in the sale, right?" O'Byrne asked. "He's a very nice colt. I think it showed tonight that the few nice horses sold very well. It's just a pity that the vendors don't support the sale. I thought the price was just about right, but I don't know how much higher I would have been willing to go." The sale topper will be trained in Ireland by Aidan O'Brien. Godolphin was the underbidder on the colt.

**On the Storm Cat Undercard...**

Storm Cat got off to a quick start at Keeneland last night when the third horse through the sale's ring attracted a final bid of \$2.8 million. A daughter of the leading sire, the filly is out of Amelia Bearhart (Bold Hour) and is a half sister to Breeders' Cup Turf champion Chief Bearhart (Chief's Crown) and Grade I winner Explosive Red (Explodent). The yearling was consigned by David and Ginger Mullins and was purchased by Eugene Melnyk. Melnyk's longtime advisor Dr. Robert McMartin signed the ticket for the filly. "She is a very nice individual, well conformed and well balanced," McMartin said. "She is by the preeminent stallion from an especially outstanding family. The price was just about what we thought it would be. It was a very fair price." David Mullins said, "We are absolutely thrilled with this. She has excellent conformation, she's got the looks, she is by one of, if not the, best stallions in the world, is a half to two Grade I winners and you get Mr. Prospector under the third dam [Gold Digger]." Of the seven-price tag in light of the sale's slow start on Monday, Mullins added, "The price was great. We brought her here to sell her. She is a very good buy from our standpoint and I think from the buyer's standpoint as well. We sold her with essentially no reserve. Head auctioneer Ryan Mahan begged me to put a small reserve on her, so that's what I did. It really didn't concern us how the market performed last night. We came here to sell a yearling. I think what it shows is that if you come here with the right horse, it is a great place to sell."

Of the overall strength of the market, Chace added, "I think that the market has been there for the good horses. The nice horses brought the good money last night and I think you are seeing more of the same tonight. I thought last night there were some very nice fillies and tonight the colts are nicer. It all evens out." Of the Gone West colt, Frank Taylor, of Taylor Made, said, "This is a very athletic, racy, good-looking colt. He showed very well and did very well at the vet. We're very pleased with the price."

The bay yearling, consigned by Taylor Made Sales, brought a final price of \$2.1 million from bloodstock agent Buzz Chace. "He is a Gone West, so it looks like he's bred for speed on the top and stamina on the bottom, being out of a mare by Pleasant Colony," Chace said. "He's a very nice individual. I bought him for a new man in the game who wishes to remain anonymous for the time being."

**Seeking a Desert Stormer Filly...**

Also bringing seven figures at last night final session of the Keeneland July sale, hip number 123 sold for \$1.8 million. The dark bay filly by Seeking the Gold is out of Breeders' Cup Sprint winner Desert Stormer (Storm Cat). From the Eaton Sales consignment, the yearling was purchased by bloodstock agent Reynolds Bell, Jr. on behalf off Rich Santulli. "We obviously liked her pedigree," Bell said of the yearling. "She looks like an athlete. She's a filly with a lot of potential. She fits the mold of what Mr. Santulli is looking for--a filly with a strong pedigree who can be a good racehorse and go on to a career as a broodmare. Seeking the Gold looks like he is going to be a good broodmare sire." Reiley McDonald of Eaton Sales agreed. "She has great conformation, wonderful balance," McDonald said of the yearling. "She has even grown up a bit over the last few months. She's got more leg and a lot more scope. She looks like a Seeking the Gold and she looks just like her mother. Put them tail to tail and you wouldn't be able to tell them apart." Desert Stormer's Mr. Prospector filly failed to sell at the Keeneland July sale last year when she RNA'd for \$1.95 million.

**Lane's End Withdraws Tuesday Consignment...**

William S. Farish's Lane's End Farm, which consigned the two highest-priced lots in Monday's opening session, informed Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell yesterday afternoon that they would be pulling the remainder of the horses cataloged for the sale. Three of the farm's remaining six lots had already been listed as outs prior to yesterday, leaving three which were withdrawn yesterday. "Lane's End sent a hand-delivered message," Russell said. "Consignors have the right to withdraw their consignments at any time. We are simply a marketing agency. We are happy to help if called upon, but this is their prerogative."

**The Final Word...**

Despite a busy second session, the Keeneland July sales' average fell 31.4 percent from last year's figure. The median declined 30 percent. There were a total of 58 RNAs. Nine yearlings brought seven-figure price tags, compared to 16 a year ago. "Overall I would have to say that we still characterize the sale as disappointing and surprising," Russell said after the close of business yesterday. "This session was much more in line with what our expectations were. The sales-topping price of \$3.1 million was a little bit less than last year, but then again, it seems that everything is down by about one-third." Russell explained the large number of outs at the sale by saying, "Simply because the consignors decided that there was not enough vet work to warrant putting the horses through the ring. I wish that there were some way that we could control the withdrawals, but we cannot make the consignors and buyers sell their horses. We are an agency." Asked if the buyers had gotten what they were looking for from the sale, he added, "We had all but one of the major buying groups on the grounds, but while we received positive reports conformationally, it seems that many of the horses that were available just didn't fit their needs. Those horses that did sold very well."

**FASIG-TIPTON YEARLINGS ON SALE TODAY**

Fasig-Tipton's Kentucky Selected Yearlings Sale gets underway today at 10 a.m. A record 604 yearlings have been catalogued for the two-day sale, including youngsters by such sires as Announce, Arch, Atticus, Awesome Again, Cape Town, Dixieland Band, Editor's Note, Elusive Quality, French Deputy, Gold Fever, Grand Slam, Gulch, Louis Quatorze, Maria's Mon, Our Emblem, Saint Ballado, Silver Deputy, Siphon (Brz), Stormy Atlantic, Tale of the Cat, Unbridled's Song and Woodman. "We've increased the size of our catalog by 50 percent versus last year, due in large part to the success of the 2001 sale," said Terence Collier, director of marketing for Fasig-Tipton. "The increase is also due to the fact that this year we were offered many more yearlings that fit this sale very well. We had the opportunity to look at a lot more yearlings this year. In other words, we had a bigger pond from which to fish." The first 260 lots through the ring make up Fasig-Tipton's New Sire Showcase. Sires represented by their first crop at the sale include, Accelerator, Artax, Bianconi, Charismatic, Comic Strip, Crafty Friend, Doneraile Court, Expelled, Exploit, Family Calling, Forestry, General Royal, Good and Tough, Horse Chestnut (SAf), Lil's Lad, Mazel Trick, Menifee, Old Trieste, Parade Ground, Real Quiet, Scatmandu, Sea of Secrets, Silver Charm, Stormin Fever, Stravinsky, Tactical Cat, Victory Gallop and Wagon Limit. "We have restored the reputation of this sale based on conformation," Collier added. "The buyers are here because they know that we are putting a strong product in front of them. We are very confident that we are going to have a strong sale." At last year's Fasig-Tipton July sale, 237 yearlings sold for \$23,148,000. The sale average of \$97,671 marked a 25.5-percent increase from 2000. According to Collier, "We would be disappointed if the average did not at least remain steady since we feel that the quality of the catalog has increased. We are also hopeful for a good clearance rate. If all that happens, we should be able to continue our growth." Thursday's final session gets underway at 10 a.m.

**EL CONDOR PASA DIES** Japanese champion El Condor Pasa (Kingmambo--Saddlers Gal {Ire}, by Sadler's Wells) died last night after suffering a bout of colic. The seven-year-old stallion first showed signs of colic Saturday and underwent surgery Sunday. The surgery seemed to be a success, but the stallion's condition continued to deteriorate and he died shortly after 9 p.m. on Tuesday. El Condor Pasa won the 1998 G1 Japan Cup and 1999 G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud, before finishing a narrowly beaten second in the 1999 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. He won eight of 11 starts and earned ¥453,000,800. His 134 rating on the 1999 International Classification is the best ever for a Japanese-raced horse. He was named champion three-year-old in Japan in 1998 and the country's Horse of the Year in 1999. The dark bay was France's highweighted older horse at 11-14 furlongs in 1999. El Condor Pasa retired to Shadai Stallion Station in Hokkaido, Japan after the 1999 racing season. His first crop of foals is now yearlings.

**INJURED SARAVA SHELVED FOR 2002**

**Sarava** (Wild Again), winner of the GI Belmont S. June 8, sustained a fracture to his hind cannon bone during a workout at Churchill Downs yesterday morning which will force him to miss the remainder of the season. The bay showed discomfort soon after his five-furlong work, which he covered in 1:01 over a fast track. "We had Dr. [Foster] Northrup take x-rays, and it's actually kind of a complicated break," trainer Ken McPeck told the *Daily Racing Form*. "But he's of the belief that, with time, the colt will come back 100 percent." The New Phoenix Stables and Mrs. Susan Roy-owned sophomore was being pointed toward Monmouth's GI Haskell Invitational H. or the GII Jim Dandy S. at Saratoga. Both major preps for the GI Travers S. at Saratoga are scheduled for Aug. 4. Sarava, a winner of three of nine starts and earner of \$696,845, is expected to return to training for a four-year-old campaign.

**Player A Player...**

With the British Open scheduled to start tomorrow morning, it would come as no surprise to see Hall of Fame golfer Gary Player holding court. But in Lexington? At the July Sale? That's exactly where the South African native was last night, as he watched hip 133, a Hennessy filly consigned on his behalf by Stonereath Farms Inc., owned by his good friend Darrell Brown, the one-time private pilot to fellow golfer Arnold Palmer. Player, who owns the aptly named Gary Player Stud between Johannesburg and Cape Town, basked in the afterglow after the chestnut was purchased for \$325,000 by North Hills Management of Japan. "It is so exciting to be here," he said after the sale. "I would absolutely put this on par with winning the Masters or the U.S. Open." The popular golfer, who won the Masters a record-equaling four times in his illustrious career, is deep into the Thoroughbred game, particularly in his native South Africa. Player owns about 110 broodmares and partners with Bob Lewis in the nine-year-old stallion Aristis (Storm Cat--Freesia, by Cox's Ridge), who, says Player, has sired six winners from 11 to race from his first crop. He credits many prominent horsepeople with supporting him in his equine ventures, including Overbrook Farm's Bill Young and Ric Waldman, trainer D. Wayne Lukas and Brookdale Farm's Fred Seitz.

**WHAT YEAR WAS THAT OTHER SALE?**

Really, it was like some higher power had just re-wound the tape and said, no, that wasn't the real sale. That was just a bad dream you had. The real sale is tonight. Well, that's what it felt like last night at Keeneland. It was like that other sale had taken place last year, and now it was this year.

Second horse in the ring: \$2.8 million. Third horse: a million two-fifty. Seven-figure prices every time you turned around--well, for a few minutes, anyway; seven in all last night, just two Monday night. Another Black Monday. Last night, bids zinging back and forth. Atmosphere. Buzz. Magnier. Ferguson. At least five different Americans who will bid seven figures. The real thing. The Keeneland July sale.

It needs more work. They are trying. But Keeneland can only sell what they're sent. For a lot of years now this sale has been half July, half September, but it's questionable whether it was even half July this year. There's going to be a lot of wringing of hands and the usual strong opinions about who should have done what and how it should be changed--chop it down to one session of 100 horses, expand it to be effectively a pre-September sale, drop it entirely (hard to see Keeneland ever letting Saratoga go first). You name it, someone will think of it. But here's the truth. The best sales are the ones that have the best sires in it. Five Storm Cat colts isn't enough. There should be 15. Kentucky's top sires of the last 20 years are mostly dead, and even Storm Cat himself will be 20 next year. If I were writing the script, my next move would be to concentrate on the top sires, and the two or three top new prospects from each crop of sires, for this sale. Don't fill out the sale, just get at least 100 likeable individuals by the top sires, and they will have a rip-roaring sale, start to finish. Oh, and one other thing. Let's go straight alphabetical by dam, no dividing half one session, half another, no assigning into one session or the other. Rotate five letters each year, tell everybody a year in advance what the beginning letter will be the next year, and then just go alphabetical by dam.

Now on to Fasig. After just 43 percent of the Keeneland catalogue sold, the clearance rate will be the most important statistic of all at Fasig.

**What They're Saying  
At The Sales**

**James Delahooke, Bloodstock agent**

"We all knew what the situation was when we came in here. Anyone who thought that the current economic situation would have no effect on goings-on was way off base. It was clear to see over the weekend that it could be a down market. There was nobody looking at horses. On the whole, the horses are not the problem; the horses are fine. What you have to realize is that there is no divine right that says that people have to buy the horses. July is a wonderful sale. It always has been and always will be, but there just aren't that many people out there with clients who can compete in the July market."

**PROUD CITIZEN WELL AFTER SURGERY**

**Proud Citizen** (Gone West), winner of the GII Coolmore Lexington S., is reportedly doing well following surgery yesterday morning to repair a series of fractures sustained during an unplaced effort in the GI Belmont S. June 8. Dr. Stephen Selway, who performed the operation at his Belmont Park clinic, inserted seven screws to repair the colt's fractured left front cannon bone. Selway estimates that the screws will be removed in approximately 60 days, but the colt will have to sit out at least six months before he is returned to training. The sophomore, who ran second in the GI Kentucky Derby and third in the GI Preakness S. before his Belmont injury, was scheduled for surgery July 1, but plans were changed after he came up lame a day before the procedure.

**BUDDHA TO BYPASS SARATOGA**

**Buddha** (Unbridled's Song) will not start in Saratoga's GII Jim Dandy S. Aug. 4 or the GI Travers S. Aug. 24 as was previously announced, reports *The Blood-Horse*. According to Ben Glass, racing manager for owners Gary and Mary West, there is nothing physically wrong with the roan, but the colt's connections do not want to push the colt who is being pointed toward the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Arlington Park Oct. 26. The GIII Pennsylvania Derby Sept. 2 is an option as the sophomore's next start. The James Bond-trained colt, who won the GI Wood Memorial S. Apr. 13 before he was scratched from the GI Kentucky Derby with a bruised foot, has won four of five lifetime starts with earnings of \$489,600.

After a prominent freshman campaign that included a victory in the GIII Nashua S. at Aqueduct in November of 2000 and a second in the GII Remsen S. a few weeks later, Ommadon made only one start as a three-year-old--an allowance victory at the Big A in March. Sidelined off that one, the bay returned 14 months later and was clearly a different horse, finishing a distant fifth against a tough allowance group at Belmont May 8, then wilting back to sixth in a grass effort June 29. **FALLON ON BOREAL IN KING GEORGE** Reigning champion jockey Kieren Fallon has been booked to ride German raider **Boreal (Ger)** (Java Gold {USA}) in the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot July 27. Fallon was in the saddle when Boreal won the G1 Vodafone Coronation Cup at Epsom June 7 and became the first German-trained winner of a British Group 1 race since Star Appeal's 1975 Eclipse S. win. "As far as I know Kieren Fallon has been booked to ride the horse," Boreal's trainer Peter Schiergen told the *Racing Post*. "He rode an excellent race on him at Epsom and also won the G1 Oaks d'Italia for me this season with **Guadalupe (Ger)** (Monsun {Ger}), whose next run will be the G1 Yorkshire Oaks [York, Aug. 21]. I think Boreal has improved from last year and he is at the top of his form now. The top German horses have shown in recent seasons that they can hold their own in the best company. The one I'm afraid of is obviously **Sakhee (USA)** (Bahri {USA}), if he runs to his Arc form. He is clearly going to be very difficult to beat but, that said, I don't know too much about the others. Boreal acts on any ground; it was on the fast side when he ran well in Dubai when not fully wound up and he won the G1 Deutsches Derby last year on heavy ground, so the going is likely to be no problem, although we would not want it too firm." Aidan O'Brien has yet to finalize plans for Europe's midsummer showpiece. "We certainly haven't ruled out the possibility of having a runner in the King George," O'Brien told *Racing Post*. "Nothing has been decided, but we have the likes of **Della Francesca (USA)** (Danzig {USA}) and **Bach (Ire)** (Caerleon {USA}) in the race. **Hawk Wing (USA)** (Woodman {USA}) and **High Chaparral (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}) won't be running and **Quarter Moon (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}), who is entered, will wait for possibly the G1 Yorkshire Oaks, although it will depend on how she is nearer the time."

**MILAN OUT FOR SEASON** Aidan O'Brien's **Milan (GB)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}), winner of last year's G1 St Leger at Doncaster and second to Fantastic Light (USA) in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf, will not run again this season. The Classic-winning four-year-old has not been out since sustaining a spiral fracture of a cannon bone in the Listed Mooresbridge S. at the Curragh May 6. "Milan has made a good recovery from his cannon bone injury, but we have decided against trying to bring him back this year," O'Brien told *Racing Post*. "Hopefully he will be okay to run next season."

**JESSICA'S ABBAYE DREAM** James Given's **Jessica's Dream (Ire)** (Desert Style {Ire}), third in last Saturday's Listed City Wall S. at Chester, is to have the rest of her season planned around a tilt at the five-furlong G1 Prix de l'Abbaye de Longchamp Oct. 6. "She was very unlucky on Saturday, but she's entered in the G1 Nunthorpe S. at York 22, the G3 Taby Open Sprint Championship in Sweden Sept. 8 and she's going to be entered in the G2 Flying Five at the Curragh Sept. 1," Given told the *Racing Post*. "We'll just take a look and see which one seem to be the most suitable for her. They are all within about three weeks of each other. She'll then go for the Abbaye as she's a proven soft and heavy ground horse, and it is often quite testing ground at that time of year."

**JUST GRAND** Godolphin's G1 Prince of Wales's S. hero **Grandera (Ire)** (Grand Lodge {USA}) pleased his connections with his latest workout at Newmarket in preparation for the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot July 27. The son of Grand Lodge worked seven furlongs of Headquarters' Round Gallop in the company of stable companions **Marienbard (Ire)** (Caerleon {USA}) and **Hatha Anna (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}). "Grandera worked brilliantly and we're delighted with his progress," said jockey Frankie Dettori, who was aboard for the exercise. "We just need lots of sunshine for Grandera, whereas Sakhee wants plenty of rain." Grandera is currently second favourite in ante-post lists behind stablemate **Sakhee (USA)** (Bahri {USA}), who is scheduled to undergo a Newmarket gallop test today.
