MAZEL TRICK A TREAT


Fasig Tipton's Kentucky Selected Yearling Sale got off to a fast start yesterday at the auction house's Newton Paddocks in Lexington, Kentucky. Leading the way, Hip 144, a chestnut colt by Mazel Trick (Phone Trick) out of the unraced mare Private Dish (Private Account) secured a \$535,000 final bid from agent Ben Glass, who was acting on behalf of Gary and Mary West. Consigned by former Kentucky governor Brereton Jones' Airdrie Stud, the three-quarter brother to stakes-winning Lolabell (Phone Trick), will be trained by Kentucky-based Dallas Stewart. According to Airdrie Manager Tim Thorton, Mazel Trick's offspring look like winners, "He stamps his offspring--they are all racy looking, correct and muscular." Six-year-old stallion Exploit (Storm Cat) also made an impressive first crop debut when Hip 26, a colt out of multiple-stakes placed Eastside Westside (Eastern Echo), was sold for \$500,000, the second highest price of the session. Purchased by agent Jerry Bailey, who was acting on behalf of an undisclosed party, the dark bay was consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency and is earmarked as a possible pinhook prospect for next year's juvenile sales. Today's final session begins at 10:00 a.m.

Buyers Find Strong Market at Fasig-Tipton

"I think it is extremely solid," bloodstock agent Pete Bradley commented as bidding reached the midway point of yesterday's opening session of the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Selected Yearlings Sale. "There are a lot of good individuals. They increased the size of the catalogue, but that doesn't seem to matter. It is a extremely strong sale for good individuals. As a pinhooker, I haven't been able to buy a single one. The sale is stronger than I expected." As at the Keeneland July Yearling Sale, which concluded Tuesday night, the lower end of the market is weak at Fasig-Tipton, according to Bradley. "The bottom 30 percent at any sale is tough in this market. I would guess right now there is a 30-percent buyback, but that should be expected." Asked to compare the Fasig-Tipton auction to the Keeneland sale, Bradley said, "It's hard to compare the two sales. It's more a boutique market over there [at Keeneland]. People are looking for pedigree and conformation. Here they are looking for racehorses--it's more like a September Sale. People are looking in the range of \$150,000 to \$300,000 and the sale is very strong in that area."

Young Stallions Making a Splash...

Taylor Made stallions **Forestry** (Storm Cat) and **Exploit** (Storm Cat), the top two freshman sires at Keeneland July, continued to sell well yesterday at Fasig-Tipton. Forestry averaged \$443,333 at Keeneland. His lone representative at Fasig-Tipton, a colt consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency as agent for Brylynn Farm Inc., brought \$170,000 from Dogwood Stable Inc. Exploit, who averaged \$366,350 at Keeneland, had nine catalogued at Fasig-Tipton, including a colt from the Taylor Made consignment that was purchased for \$500,000 by Jerry Bailey, agent. "Forestry stands for \$50,000 and Exploit stands for \$30,000, so breeders are getting a pretty good return on their investments," said Ben Taylor of Taylor Made. "We expected both stallions to have really good sales--they are producing nice horses that look like they are going to be runners." He added, "The Exploits are well-balanced, racy horses that look like they will improve with age. When his first crop were weanlings, it seemed like he might be breeding stockier individuals. They were nice enough as weanlings, but they have gotten some scope to them now. The Forestrys are really nice horses as well. The way they are selling pretty much tells you what kind of horses they are."

Lane's End Still High on July

Lane's End sold the top two lots at Monday's opening session of the Keeneland July Yearlings Sale, but the consignor was not represented by any yearlings Tuesday when three horses were scratched prior to the start of bidding. But the late scratches should not be taken as a lack of support for the auction, which got off to a slow start on Monday, according to Lane's End's Bill Farish. "The three horses that we withdrew at the 11th hour were horses with no vetting, who had very few people looking at them and, for whatever reason, were not very popular," Farish said yesterday. "We were not in any way abandoning the sale." Lane's End originally had six horses entered in the sale's second session. "We had three horses who were taken out well in advance," Farish explained. "They were three horses in the upper echelon that were taken out for different reasons. If we could have sold them, it would have balanced the whole thing out, but in no way were we deserting the sale." Farish added that it was just a coincidence that Lane's End's \$2-million *Belong to Me* filly and \$1.35-million *Gone West* filly both sold on the auction's first day, leaving the consignor with no stellar yearlings on day two.

Airdrie's Young Guns...

Up and coming Airdrie stallions, who are represented by their first crop of yearlings in 2002, accounted well for themselves in the New Sire Showcase portion of this year's Fasig Tipton Sale. **Mazel Trick** (Phone Trick) wowed the crowd with a quartet of yearlings who brought over \$200,000, including hip 144, a colt out of Private Dish who sold for \$535,000. The seven-year chestnut proved that his \$15,000 stud fee was a bargain when no less than eight of his offspring sold for more than \$100,000. **Stormin Fever** (Storm Cat) also enjoyed a banner day with a pair of yearlings surpassing the \$300,000 mark. Hip 95 and 33 brought \$325,000 and \$335,000, respectively, for their eight-year-old sire, who also stood for \$15,000 in 2002. "We are very excited about both young stallions," said Airdrie Manager Tim Thorton. "All the yearlings have a very uniform look to them and I think that is something buyers look for. It was a very good sale for us." Reflecting on the days events, Thorton indicated that he expected both stallion's offspring to sell well, but was pleasantly surprised when many of the yearlings, "exceeded expectations." He added, "It is a whole different world from Keeneland. In this price range, the market is strong which is healthy for business."

WAR EMBLEM SHARP AT SANTA ANITA Kentucky Derby and Preakness winner **War Emblem** (Our Emblem), prepping for the Aug. 4 GI Haskell Invitational H. at Monmouth Park, breezed at Santa Anita yesterday morning, going seven furlongs in 1:23.40 and galloping out the mile in 1:36.40. He is scheduled to have two more workouts before heading to Monmouth July 31.



What They're Saying At The Sales

Brereton Jones of Airdrie Stud:

"When you bring the right horse up to the sale, they do well. Buyers respond well to the New Sire Showcase. There are many buyers that will support a young stallion with the right pedigree, race record and precocity. Those types of horses fit the bill in this market."

Duncan Taylor of Taylor Made Sales Agency:
(Keeneland vs. Fasig Tipton)

"This year's Keeneland sale had many good horses, but they were not great. Last year's high sale average discouraged new buyers from coming over, and the existing buyers [this year] were shopping in the \$100-400,000 range. The product did not match the market. Fasig Tipton had less pedigree, but more buyers shopping at that level, so it appeared stronger although Keeneland wasn't a big disaster like every was saying."

NORMAL BUSINESS RESUMES AT FASIG

Even though they increased the number catalogued by more than 40 percent, with 604 this year versus 422 in 2001, early returns at Fasig suggested the average might not be far off last year's figure of \$97,671. Through the first 112 horses yesterday, there were only seven withdrawals (6 percent), vs. Keeneland's 27 percent (consignors reportedly had a 'trap door' to the September sales for July withdrawals).

Of the first 105 through the ring at Fasig, my count was 65 sold (62 percent, the same as last year's entire sale) and 40 not sold (38 percent), with the average running just over \$98,000. If those trends continue today, Fasig should crack the \$30 million mark in gross.

After the debacle across town, Fasig directors and shareholders will be both relieved and thrilled. Not to mention Brere Jones, who continued an Airdrie tradition as his young guns Mazel Trick and Stormin Fever racked up impressive afternoon results.

No doubt, as one leading owner said to me at Fasig yesterday, the general economic picture and recent steep declines in the stock market are playing their part. The economic tenor isn't exactly such that people are filled with confidence, and they tend not to splash out on luxury goods such as big boats and racehorses. But the Keeneland July sale is now clearly a victim of its sister September sale's success, complicated--in my view--by the deaths of a number of Kentucky's top-class older stallions.

This has been coming for a long time, and I think one of the big things that happened to this year's July sale is that it pretty much arrived. Mr. Prospector had his last yearlings last year. Still represented is deceased Nureyev (small crops the last few years), Seattle Slew (last yearlings next year) and Unbridled. Danzig is 25 and has almost no colts sell in the sales now. The titans of the last two decades are gone.

As I said in my notes yesterday, even Storm Cat is 20 next year; and Deputy Minister, not that he had much of a sale in the end, will be 24.

This makes assembling a strong group of sires for the July sale a difficult task. In fact, for some years now, the July sale has effectively been half-July, half-September.

Sure, there is A.P. Indy--for Americans. Sure, there is Kingmambo and Thunder Gulch--when he eventually has a decent-sized crop of yearlings here.

My new tip for the top is Unbridled's Song and, next year, Fusaichi Pegasus. But this year, with only five Storm Cat colts even catalogued, it rather all went awry, and there were just not enough big-time colts by big-time sires to paper over the cracks: the vulnerabilities of the July sale were ruthlessly exposed.

Given the decline and demise of the last generation of great sires and the transitional nature of this time, before the next wave of greats is identified, the North American yearling market is now effectively one big September sale. Keeneland July should be an exception, and Saratoga has certainly re-emerged as a strong boutique market, but, effectively, everything else is the September sale. Maybe that's what's really happening--with the dilution of American pedigrees by Arab and Japanese interests and the demise of the top stallions, maybe American breeding is becoming just one huge September sale market.

That's not a bad thing, nor is it depressing, nor anybody's fault. There were a billion dollars' worth of horses sold at the major Northern Hemisphere auctions in 2000, and \$850 million last year, when Mare Reproductive Loss Syndrome was the major reason for the decline. These are just historical facts. But Geoff Russell and the Keeneland team are going to have to put their thinking caps on and come up with a way to reconfigure the storied July sale so that it can resume its rightful place at the beginning of the sales season as the barometer of the Thoroughbred auction market.

Thankfully, this week's sale is likely an aberration, not a barometer of this year's market. As one player said to me Monday night, whatever they come up with, "this ain't workin'."

Whittled down to four horses after three scratches, this contest was Shine Again's race to lose as she went off the heavy favorite. The dark bay, who won the GI Ballerina H. at Saratoga last August, was second to the brilliant Xtra Heat in the GII Genuine Risk H. at Belmont May 12, then finished third behind that one and Gold Mover--who won the GII Princess Rooney S. this past weekend--in the GII Vagrancy H. in early June. Clearly thrilled to be rid of those imposing rivals, she cruised home a 6 1/2-length winner against allowance company in her latest June 27. Kept just off the pacesetting Home on the Hill by jockey Jean-Luc Samyn, Shine Again took the lead on the far turn, quickly opened up on the field and never looked back, winning easily under a hand ride.

Rhythm Band settled just off the early leaders, rallied three wide down the stretch and won going away.

ESPERENCE (h, 5, Wild Again--Lotka {GISW, \$721,804}, by Danzig) had not raced since finishing a well-beaten 12th in the GIII Gallant Fox H. last December at Aqueduct. Dismissed at 17-1, the bay pressed the pace from the start and outbattled Dicken's Storm (Future Storm) in a long stretch drive to win by a head. RTCA Launches White Horse Fellowship & Award:

The Race Track Chaplaincy of America has formed the White Horse Fellowship and the annual White Horse Award to recognize the contribution and professionalism of racing's unheralded backstretch workforce. "A true hero is as rare as a white Thoroughbred, yet every day racing workers risk their safety for others," said RTCA President Don Dean. The first annual White Horse Award Banquet is being planned for Breeders' Cup week 2003. Voting members already include the Thoroughbred Charities of America, the American Quarter Horse Association and former NTRA executive and Lexington Thoroughbred owner Reed Farley. Kenny and Lisa Troutt, co-owners of WinStar Farm, have donated \$100,000 to the effort.

INQUIRY SCHEDULED INTO SECOND CASE OF JOCKEY ERROR

Jockey Club officials will hold an inquiry next Thursday into the riding of Lakatoi (GB) at Beverley last week. Just a day after Tony Culhane was handed the maximum 21 days' penalty for his riding of True Courage (GB) in a Pontefract maiden, trainer Barry Hills witnessed another of his stable runners suffer defeat as a result of jockey error when J D Smith dropped his hands in the closing stages of a similar event. Beaten a short-head in the process, Hills alerted the Jockey Club of the incident, which escaped the scrutiny of the local stewards. Jockey Club public relations director John Maxse told *PA Sport*, "The reason is to inquire into the incident as to whether or not any breach of the rules took place from the riding of Lakatoi by J D Smith."

KAZZIA HEADS LEGER LIST

Godolphin's **Kazzia (Ger)** (Zinaad {GB}) headed the 46 entries remaining in the £400,000 G1 Rothmans Royals St Leger at Doncaster Sept. 14 at yesterday's forfeit stage. Having won the G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket May 5 and G1 Epsom Oaks June 7, she is bidding to become the first to complete the fillies' Triple Crown winner since Oh So Sharp (GB) in 1985. Kazzia, who sidestepped Sunday's G1 Irish Oaks at The Curragh, goes next in the G1 Yorkshire Oaks at York Aug. 21. "Kazzia is doing well," reported Godolphin's racing manager Simon Crisford. "She missed the Irish Oaks on purpose and heads for the Yorkshire Oaks next month with the view of then running in the St Leger." She is joined in her bid to provide Godolphin with their fourth St Leger success by four stable companions in the list, headed by G3 Queen's Vase S. winner **Mamool (Ire)** (In the Wings {GB}). Aidan O'Brien yesterday pulled dual Derby winner **High Chaparral (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}) out of the extended 14-furlong contest which he took for the first time last year with Milan (GB). Nevertheless, he left in eight entries, headed by G1 Irish Derby second and third **Sholokhov (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}) and **Ballingarry (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}). Other notables include the Mark Johnston-trained **Bandari (Ire)** (Alhaarth {Ire}), disappointing when eighth in the G1 Epsom Derby June 8; and **Balakheri (Ire)** (Theatrical {Ire}). The latter, who took the G2 King Edward VII S. at Royal Ascot June 21 before finishing fifth behind High Chaparral in the Irish Derby, is one of six entries representing Sir Michael Stoute, who has yet to win the oldest Classic.

HUGHES WARNS OF SHORTFALL IN LEVY

Racing is set to lose as well as gain from the new commercial agreement on data rights, according to Robert Hughes CBE, chairman of the Levy Board. In the organisation's annual report issued yesterday, Hughes warned that the industry will lose out as the data rights agreement stops mirroring the Levy from April 2003. Although the next submission from the agreement "should add about £10 million to the Levy next year," Hughes warned that "the downside is that the commercial deal makes no allowance for payments by British bookmakers on bets taken on overseas horseracing." Estimating this loss at about £5 million a year, Hughes talks of the loss of "a source of alternative income during periods of lengthy abandonments." Hughes also explained the significance of the replacement of the racing surface at Lingfield Park with Polytrack: "So-called 'all-weather' racing has become increasingly important to the Levy in recent years, so the Board was very pleased to be able to make a substantial contribution, in the form of an interest free loan, in order to ensure that the replacement surface was 'state of the art.' I believe that Polytrack has transformed all-weather racing. I would like to see a similar surface at one or two other racecourses."



SAKHEE AND NAYEF PLEASE IN WORK

Sakhee (USA) (Bahri {USA}) and **Nayef (USA)** (Gulch {USA}) pleased connections in separate gallops yesterday as the pair continued their preparation for the £750,000 G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot next Saturday. Although no firm decision has been made as to whether one or both will run in the mile-and-a-half showpiece, the state of the ground will determine which of the Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum-owned duo takes part. Godolphin's racing manager Simon Crisford has warned that Sakhee, who took in an easy seven furlongs on Newmarket's Round Gallop yesterday with two stable companions, may miss the contest if the ground is fast, conditions which will suit his stable companion **Grandera (Ire)** (Grand Lodge {USA}). After the work, a "delighted" Frankie Dettori revealed to *PA Sport*: "If it is good to soft I will ride Sakhee; if it is fast I will ride Grandera. As long as both horses are ready to win, I will be ready and they are right now. Now it's down to the weather. It's nice to have that sort of choice." Fast conditions may mean that the Marcus Tregoning-trained Nayef will deputise for Sakhee, and his preparation was stepped up a gear in a racecourse gallop on Lingfield's polytrack surface yesterday. Although the four-year-old also has the G1 Juddmonte International S. at York Aug. 20 as a target, Tregoning is keen to get him ready for Ascot. "We worked him over the pretty stiff mile here," he said. "It was a proper bit of work and, most importantly, Richard [Hills] rode him and was very, very pleased with him. I couldn't be more happier with his condition muscle-wise and he looks in great form and is working like it, so that's the main thing. If the ground stays on the fast side we're thinking we are going to go for the King George with him. He's also got the Juddmonte International at York as a possibility and then probably at the end of the year we're looking towards Chicago."
