FILLIES STAR IN SPA OPENER

A field of nine juvenile fillies has been entered for today's opening day feature at Saratoga, the GII Schuylerville S. The 5-2 morning-line favorite off an eight-length romp in the June 30 Astoria S. at Belmont is **Mike's Wildcat** (Forest Wildcat). The filly began her career with trainer Jeff Bonde, but was recently purchased by John Oxley and transferred to the barn of

trainer John Ward. "Mr. Oxley saw the Astoria and thought it was quite a special effort," Ward said. "She looks good and fit. She's run three times, so she's pretty seasoned." **Freedom's Daughter** (Saint Ballado) will be making just the second start of her career in the Schuylerville. The bay filly, trained by Todd Pletcher, stormed home to a 7 3/4-

length victory in her five-furlong debut at Monmouth Park June 22. "She trained very well up to that race," Pletcher said of his filly's maiden win. "She broke running and responded very well in the stretch. We thought that effort merited a shot in the Schuylerville." Edward Evans and Michael Tabor's **Stellar** (Grand Slam), a \$700,000 purchase a few months ago at the Keeneland April sale, will be making her career debut in today's Grade II event. Of the unusual spot for a debut, trainer Patrick Biancone said, "She's fast and she's going to be ready. Most of the others have only run a few times, so they're only a start or two in front of us."

WAR EMBLEM OUT OF HASKELL

Kentucky Derby and Preakness winner **War Emblem** (Our Emblem) will not compete in the Aug. 4 GI Haskell Invitational at Monmouth Park. The colt was assigned highweight of 124 pounds for the race, prompting concerns from his connections. "That's a lot of weight for a small horse to carry," trainer Bob Baffert told *The Blood-Horse*. "The heat back east can sap him, too," he added. Before his death on Sunday night, Prince Ahmed Salman told Baffert to, "do what we thought was best for the horse," with an eye towards the Breeders' Cup Classic at Arlington in October and next year's G1 Dubai World Cup. War Emblem may start next in the GI Pacific Classic at Del Mar Aug. 24.

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

One of the oldest adages in breeding is "breed the best to the best and hope for the best." Veteran horsewoman Nancy Alberts has turned that into something like "breed the cheapest to the nearest" and still come up with a colt who is one of the best of his generation.

Alberts, who has credits as owner, breeder, trainer, and at one time work rider, for Magic Weisner, purchased his dam Jazema for \$1 from Ahmad Foustock, who thought that Jazema would not make it to the races after being slow to recover from surgery to correct a conformation problem. Remarkably, Jazema actually recovered in time to win twice as a two-year-old. After several other wins for Alberts, Jazema was claimed by King Leatherbury. Alberts claimed her right back, only to lose her to Penn National-based conditioner William Ecker. Alberts traveled to Penn National to claim Jazema back, only for her to be scratched. However, she left a note with Ecker, and a year later after a call from Ecker, bought Jazema back for \$1,500.

When the time came to retire Jazema, who ended her career with a record of 14 wins in 68 starts, Alberts selected local sire Ameri Valay, after recalling how Jazema interacted with Ameri Valay when the pair were in the barn of King Leatherbury. Magic Weisner is one of two stakes performers bred from two matings based on this unorthodox selection process.

Magic Weisner first came to national prominence in the GI Preakness S., where a storming late run carried him to second, just 3/4 lengths behind War Emblem. It was tempting to dismiss this effort as merely the result of being ridden from way off the pace in a race where the tempo up front had been extremely hot, but Magic Weisner came right back to finish a solid fourth in the GI Belmont S. At the weekend he again underlined his class, running down a stubborn Wiseman's Ferry to

take the GII Ohio Derby. The race was Magic Weisner's first graded stakes win, but from December 31st to March 30th, he put together four consecutive victories in Maryland-bred stakes. The string was snapped with a second in the Fedrico Tesio S., then came the Preakness, Belmont and Ohio Derby. Overall, Magic Weisner now has a record of 13 starts, for seven wins, three seconds, and earnings of \$688,110.

Oddly enough, although she changed hands for \$1, one can argue that Jazema has something of a classic pedigree, at least in terms of the sires in her female line. She is by the "Puerto Rican Rolls-Royce" Bold Forbes, winner of the GI Kentucky Derby and Belmont S., out of a mare by Julio Mariner, winner of the English classic G1 St. Leger. Jazema's granddam, a sister to the English group winning miler Saher, is by Great Nephew, sire of two English G1 Epsom Derby winners. Jazema's fifth dam is the Mahmoud mare Moonstone, ancestress of English G1 1,000 Guineas heroine Nocturnal Spree, and Moonax, winner of the French St. Leger equivalent, the G1 Prix Royal Oak, as well as such well-known North American performers as Quack, To the Quick, Exuberant, It's Freezing and Wild Rush.

Magic Weisner's sire Ameri Valay was a tough and very accomplished performer, winning 16 races, including back-to-back editions of the GIII John B. Campbell H. and earning \$742,779. Magic Weisner and his stakes placed year older brother Deliver Hope are the only stakes horses from Ameri Valay's first three crops. Ameri Valay is by Maryland stalwart Carnivalay, a Northern Dancer horse who is a half brother to champion Go For Wand, and a full brother to GII Jerome H. winner Dance Spell, a promising sire who died very young, and GII Gazelle H. victress Discorama.

Magic Weisner's pedigree is an outcross at five generations. He does have linebreeding to the noted English foundation mare Fair Freedom, which comes via the similarly bred Ameri Lib and Emancipation, who are 4 x 5 here. We can also note the relationship between Nearctic, who is in the fourth generation of Magic Weisner's male line, and Great Nephew, sire of Magic Weisner's third dam. Nearctic is a three-parts brother to Great Nephew's dam Sybil's Niece and is by a son of Pharos, where Great Nephew is by a son of Pharos's brother, Fairway. The combination of Nearctic and Great Nephew is found within four generations in the pedigrees of more than 60 unrestricted stakes winners, eight of them Group or Grade I winners, so it's probable that it should receive a significant measure of the credit for Magic Weisner's ability.

RAISING THE BAR

Though I stand by my declaration last week that Fasig-Tipton was the market and Keeneland an aberration, that might be, as they used to say, cold comfort. I had said before the sale if Fasig grossed \$30 million, the market would be holding. In fact, Fasig grossed \$31,975,000--a 38-percent increase from last year, while the average held steady, gaining a .10 percent, to \$97,815. I had expected the average to fall. It's kind of bad news that the gross arrived at \$30 million the way it did.

In a good sale, there will be only around 10 percent withdrawals from the catalogue. It isn't rocket science to work out that Keeneland's 27-percent withdrawals signaled trouble all by itself. Fasig catalogued 604 yearlings--43 percent more than last year's 422. Last year at Fasig, 10 percent were withdrawn. That figure climbed a sliver, to 11 percent this year. I had also suggested a standard of 60 percent of those catalogued selling. If 10 percent are outs, that 60 percent selling of those catalogued simply means two-thirds of those who go through the ring have to sell. The actual percentage this year was 61 percent (down a point from 62 percent last year), which is six percentage points below the optimum. That means nine percent fewer horses, of those through the ring, were listed as sold, than the figure would have been had my 60 percent of those catalogued been achieved. The actual figure at Fasig was 54 percent. At Keeneland, it was a desultory 43 percent.

What This Means...

Fasig demonstrated there is plenty of money around for a good horse, but it also meant the standard required to qualify as 'a good horse' is tightening. Often a fall in the overall market doesn't mean that every single horse falls by about that percent: what's happened this

year--and not for the first time--is that good horses cost about the same, but there is a stricter definition of what is a good yearling. Especially with the repositories and advances in vet work, it gets tougher and tougher to produce a respectable yearling. The prices on those deemed acceptable appear to be holding up fine, but what we call a market 'downturn' may simply be that fewer--too few, I'd say--are being deemed acceptable.

It's the percentage that are coming home, not the prices of those that are selling, which makes me think there is trouble ahead. For the last two years, 70 percent of those catalogued at Saratoga have sold, and in fact the percentage sold of those who went through the ring were as high as 79 percent and 81 percent in 2000 and 2001, respectively. Saratoga 2001 grossed \$62.4 million, up 49 percent from 2000, and averaged \$385,259, a 26-percent gain in average from the previous year. There are 229 catalogued this year, virtually the same as last year's 233. Even if the average remains the same, which I think will be difficult, I believe the gross will drop somewhere between \$5-\$10 million, just because the percentage selling has been so low elsewhere already this year. Look for a Saratoga gross between \$52-\$57 million.

In each of the last two years, the three major North American summer sales have grossed \$148.7 million. In 2000, the overall major Northern Hemisphere Thoroughbred auction market totaled around \$1 billion by the end of the December sales. In 2001, when the summer sales were virtually the same, the overall market dropped to \$850 million, because of the effect of MRLS on the November sale. At this stage of the summer sales last year, there was \$86 million in the books. This year, that total is down to \$75 million. Saratoga is up against a \$62-million gross; if they gross \$55 million, that would make the three-sale total \$130 million, a drop of 12 percent from 2001. With the Dow-Jones below 8,000 and the 'Footsie' (FTSE) below 4,000 as I write this, a 12-percent decline in the yearling market might look quite acceptable by the end of the year.

GODOLPHIN PACEMAKERS SET FOR KING

GEORGE The field for this Saturday's G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot is beginning to take shape after Godolphin announced they intend to run two pacemakers, Group 1 placed **Narrative (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}) and **Sir Effendi (Ire)** (Nashwan {USA}), to ensure a truly run race for the Maktoum brothers' **Sakhee (USA)** (Bahri {USA}), **Grandera (Ire)** (Grand Lodge {USA}) and **Nayef (USA)** (Gulch {USA}). Godolphin Racing Manager Simon Crisford told *Racing Post*: "[Narrative]'s in there as a potential pacemaker if we want him, and we'll decide if we do nearer the day. In fact, it looks as if the race will be set up for the likes of Sakhee or Grandera anyway, but you always have to cover yourself in these situations just in case." Sheikh Hamdan's racing manager Angus Gold added: "Marcus [Tregoning] just wanted to leave [Sir Effendi] in in case we need to make sure that there's a decent pace for Nayef. We don't want a situation where they jump out and then slow things up, and Sir Effendi is there if we need him. I don't think anyone truly knows Nayef's optimum distance. I did think it was a mile and a quarter, but after his win on bad ground at Ascot last back end and then in Dubai, I'm not so sure. His best trip is open to conjecture, but Marcus is keen to run and tells me the horse is in great form."

WHAM BAM, NO THANKS ARAMRAM

Sheikh Ahmed bin Rashid Al Maktoum's **Aramram (USA)** (Danzig {USA}) has been banned from racing in France after the Mick Channon-trained colt unseated his rider on the two occasions he raced in France this season. The first incident occurred in the G1 Prix Jean Prat at Chantilly June 2 and the dose was repeated by the son of Danzig in the G2 Prix Eugene Adam at Maisons-Laffitte July 14. Stewards of France-Galop (French Jockey Club) informed Channon earlier this week that Aramram was not allowed to participate in future French races. In between his two French appearances, Aramram was third to Rock Of Gibraltar (Ire) in the G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot June 18, and most recently finished fourth in the Listed Steventon S. at Newbury July 20.

GRANDERA HARDENS AS KING GEORGE CHOICE

British bookmaking firm William Hill have reported that further money continues to come in for Godolphin's **Grandera (Ire)** (Grand Lodge {USA}) in advance of this Saturday's King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. and have cut his price accordingly. The ante-post favourite has been trimmed to 11-8 (from 6-4) and as a consequence **Sakhee (USA)** (Bahri {USA}) has been lengthened to 2-1 (from 13-8). Hills also saw money for **Golan (Ire)** (Spectrum {Ire}) and **Zindabad (Fr)** (Shirley Heights {GB}), who were both shortened to 7-1 (from 8-1) and 8-1 (from 12-1), respectively.

★ GERMANY ★

BOLTE BAN REDUCED

German trainer Dr. Andreas Bolte, the first trainer to be suspended by the Direktorium fur Vollblutzucht und Rennen (German Jockey Club), has had his 18-month "non-trier" ban reduced to six months on appeal. The trainer, who intends to fully clear his tarnished reputation, told *Racing Post*: "I am convinced that the decision is wrong. The first decision was outrageous and this one is equally wrong. Since it is impossible for me to take the matter further within racing, I will probably now resort to the civil courts." The case arose when Bolte's Sir Ivanhoe (Ger) (A Very Good Time {Ire}), ridden by apprentice Katherina Niederbacker, was adjudged to have not obtained the best possible placing in a race at Neuss in January. In the post-race enquiry, Niederbacker was alleged to have told local stewards that her instructions were to race in last position and stay there so that Sir Ivanhoe would receive a favourable handicap rating. Bolte tried to submit new evidence suggesting that Niebecker suffered psychological pressure on the day of the race, but the Direktorium panel refused to allow that evidence. The Direktorium did recognise, as Sir Ivanhoe was the outsider in the race, punters hadn't suffered and the original sentence was too harsh, so reduced the ban to six months starting Sept. 1 this year.

MURPHY JAILED

National Hunt jockey Timmy Murphy was jailed for six months by Judge John Crocker at Isleworth Crown Court, West London yesterday. The Irish jockey pleaded guilty to indecently assaulting a flight attendant and being drunk on board a flight from Tokyo to Heathrow in April this year. He was given a six-month sentence for the former offence and a three-month penalty for the latter with both sentences to run concurrently. Judge Crocker also ordered that the Irishman should remain on the sex offenders' register for the next five years. Jockeys' Association chief executive Michael Caulfield told *PA Sport*: "He requested help and embraced the help that has been given to him by the experts with regard to his problems. That impressed the judge and the court this morning. He has been helped by other jockeys who have been through similar difficulties and he has responded positively. I believe and hope that owners and trainers, when he emerges from prison, will want to help him get back on track because he wants to remain a jockey. He's got to be positive and strong, but he must take responsibility and that is what he is doing at the moment." The Jockey Club's John Maxse added, "The offence, though very serious, is not in connection with racing, and at this stage, we have no comment to make on the matter."
