**BARUCH ATTRACTS COMPETITIVE FIELD**

A competitive field of seven turf performers will line up for today's GII Bernard Baruch H. at Saratoga. A graded stakes winner on dirt and turf, **Volponi** (Cryptoclearance) will attempt to win his second straight in today's 1 1/8-mile turf event. The bay colt, winner of last year's GII Pegasus H. over the Meadowlands main track, pressed the pace before drawing clear to take the July 5 GIII Poker H. over the Belmont turf course last time out. **Del Mar Show** (Theatrical {Ire}) began his 2002 campaign with a win in the GIII Fort Lauderdale H. in January, but was well beaten in the G1 Dubai Duty Free at Nad Al Sheba in March. The five-year-old returned to run second in the GII Dixie and he was back in the winner's circle with a 1 3/4-length score in the June 22 GIII New Hampshire Sweepstakes H., but he'll be forced to break from the outside post today. "He's coming up to it in good shape," trainer Bill Mott said of Del Mar Show. "This will be a good test for him. He's really come around this year." **Forbidden Apple** (Pleasant Colony) ran second in last year's Breeders' Cup Mile and ended 2001 with a fourth-place effort in the G1 Hong Kong Mile. He opened his seven-year-old campaign with a runner-up finish in the June 8 GI Manhattan H. The dark bay, always tough at Belmont, has not raced at Saratoga since 2000. "We know he loves Belmont Park," trainer Christophe Clement said. "He hasn't raced at Saratoga in a long time. That concerns me. I don't know how he's going to handle it. He looks good and has been training good."

**Whywhywhy** (Mr. Greeley) rallied from last to first and was drawing away to win yesterday's GII Sanford S. at Saratoga by 2 3/4 lengths. The colt attended the pace and avoided a spill to score a 5 1/2-length maiden win in the GIII Flash S. last time out. Yesterday, he was pinched back at the start and trailed the field through zippy fractions of :21.74 and :44.99. Four wide on the turn,

Whywhywhy took the lead with authority at midstretch and drew clear to the wire. "When the gates opened, I thought we were done," winning trainer Patrick Biancone said of his charge's slow start. "But when I saw :21 and change, now we have a good chance. The first time he was beaten [May 16 at Belmont] when we rushed him a little at the start and he forgot to breathe. He was just a baby. Now he's starting to be more mature." Favored **Wildcat Heir** (Forest Wildcat) was bumped at the start and was hustled up early. He briefly took the lead in the stretch and just held on for second.

Cheshire and jockey Yutaka Take took advantage of an untimely stumble by the long-time leader King of Tara to take this competitive event. Although he had raced only once this term, when sixth behind Polish Summer (GB) in a Chantilly allowance contest June 1, he showed the benefit of that softly-softly approach for his most important success to date. Held up in third early off the moderate pace set by Christophe-Patrice Lemaire and King of Tara, he was asked to quicken as that rival stole a healthy advantage inside the final quarter mile. He looked held until that colt lost his action momentarily and ducked into the rail with 175 yards remaining, after which he rallied to pass him with 75 yards to race. Cheshire was adding to his two career stakes successes in the Listed Prix Ridgway at Deauville in August 2000 and Listed Grand Prix de la Region Alsace at Strasbourg last September. Last year's EP Taylor S. heroine Choc Ice, having her first run of the season, was an eye-catching late closer off a pace that would have compromised her chances.

Frankie Dettori was yesterday in limbo regarding his ride in tomorrow's G1 King George VI And Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot as the forecasted dry spell proved correct. Godolphin appear increasingly likely to withdraw **Sakhee** (Bahri), leaving Dettori free to partner G1 Prince of Wales' S. winner **Grandera (Ire)** (Grand Lodge) in the 1 1/2-mile contest. "Basically until we arrive there on Friday and have a look at the ground then, no decision will be made," Dettori said yesterday. "I'm in the dark as much as the punters and everybody else." Trainer Saeed bin Suroor told *Gulf News* yesterday, "The ground is good-to-firm in most places, and I think it will suit Grandera more than Sakhee." While the final decision will be made by Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum and Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid al Maktoum, bin Suroor is hoping that both are given the green light. "I'm really very pleased with both horse's preparations," bin Suroor said. "Personally, I would really like to see Sakhee run, but it's also very important to ensure he has the right ground as he has a history of knee problems, and we really don't want to aggravate anything." The ground may also result in the withdrawal of the Henry Cecil-trained **High Pitched (GB)** (Indian Ridge {Ire}) and John Dunlop-trained **Millenary (GB)** (Rainbow Quest). "He never runs a bad race--he is a very consistent horse," Millenary's jockey Pat Eddery said yesterday, "but, I would prefer if we got some rain." Aidan O'Brien yesterday withdrew his remaining entries **Bach (Ire)** (Caerleon) and **Della Francesca** (Danzig), who head to tomorrow's G3 Meld S. at The Curragh.

**HALLOWED DREAMS RETIRED** **Hallowed Dreams** (Malagra--Pacific's Dream, by Brother Machree), who tied the modern mark for 16 consecutive wins held by Cigar, Citation and Mister Frisky, has been retired to her owner's Erath, Louisiana farm following an apparent injury to her right front ankle, according to co-owner and trainer Lloyd Romero. The five-year-old mare, who was preparing for a shot at consecutive wins in Lone Star's Miller Lite S. June 22, came out of a routine work last month favoring her right fore leg. "There are no fractures, but we don't know what the problem is," Romero told the *Daily Racing Form*. "We can't find any problem. She stands on the leg perfect, but when she walks, she favors it." Romero, who owns the two-time record-holder jointly with Johnny Gaspard, added that there is an outside chance that the mare could return to the races, but admitted, "I don't think that is going to happen." The Louisiana-bred, who ran third in her most recent start in the Valid Expectations S. at Lone Star May 27, won 25 of 30 lifetime starts, with 17 of those in stakes company, and has earned \$740,143.

**SNOW RIDGE TO PADUA** Recently retired **Snow Ridge** (Tabasco Cat--Snow Forest, by Woodman) will stand the 2003 breeding season at Padua Stables in Ocala, Florida, as the property of Padua and Overbrook Farm, which raced the colt. The chestnut, winner at three of the GII Kentucky Cup Sprint, rounded into one of the top sprinters in the country this season, capping a three-race winning streak with a 1 1/2-length score in the GI San Carlos H. at Santa Anita in March. Disqualified from a victory in the GII Churchill Downs H. May 4, Snow Ridge was an impressive 7 3/4-length winner of the GIII Maryland Breeders' Cup H. at Pimlico in what would be his final start May 18. He retired with 10 wins from 21 starts and earnings of \$711,989. His stud fee has been set at \$5,000 live foal.

### Medaglia d'Oro Works:

Belmont S. runner-up **Medaglia d'Oro** (El Prado {Ire}) breezed six furlongs over a fast Saratoga main track in 1:13 4/5 as he prepares for his upcoming start in the GII Jim Dandy S. at the Spa Aug. 4. "Today was a serious work," trainer Bobby Frankel said afterward. "I was pleased with the way he handled the track. I'll probably give him another work before the Jim Dandy. Right now he's on target for the race." A troubled fourth in the Kentucky Derby, the Edmund Gann colorbearer was a disappointing eighth in the Preakness prior to his improved run in the Belmont.

### A Trainer's Instincts:

Following the sixth-place performance of favored **Mike's Wildcat** (Forest Wildcat) in Wednesday's GII Schuylerville S. at Saratoga, trainer John Ward Jr. thought something was amiss. His instincts proved right yesterday morning. "She got something between the time she ran last and [Wednesday]," the conditioner said. "I didn't have time to work her with the race coming up so quick. If I had time to work her, we probably would have detected that." Ward indicated that the filly is likely to pass the Aug. 12 GII Adirondack S. in favor of the GI Spinaway S. Aug. 30.

### Puzzlement To Travers:

Joseph A. Shields' **Puzzlement** (Pine Bluff), an off-the-pace allowance winner on the opening day card at Saratoga Wednesday, will make his next start in the GI Travers S. Aug. 24, trainer Allen Jerkens said yesterday. "He was walking around this morning and looked great," the Hall of Fame trainer commented. "We are probably not going to run him in the Jim Dandy. We've always wanted to run him in the Travers. We're just going to work him up to that race, if everything goes well between now and that race."

### JOCKEY CLUB CRACKS DOWN

Jockeys Darryll Holland and J D Smith were handed lengthy suspensions yesterday after Jockey Club disciplinary committee hearings. J D Smith, who mistook the winning post and eased down the eventual runner-up Lakatoi (GB) in a Beverley maiden two weeks ago, was banned for nine days from next Friday. Judged guilty of not taking "all reasonable and permissible" measures to ensure his mount was given the best chance to win (rule 158), he escaped the maximum three weeks' suspension handed to Tony Culhane in a similar incident just days beforehand. "It was a different case, as Tony Culhane dropped his hands on a horse who would otherwise certainly have been first," Jockey Club public relations officer John Maxse told *PA Sport* yesterday. "This is a slightly different part of the rule, as the committee were not satisfied that what J D Smith definitely made a difference to the result. So he was found guilty of not taking all reasonable and permissible measures to obtain the best possible placing." Meanwhile, Darryll Holland will miss the last two days of 'Glorious' Goodwood and the Shergar Cup at Ascot after being handed a 15-day ban under the 'totting-up' procedure. Eleven days of the ban, brought about by careless riding in a Lingfield maiden last Saturday, will stretch from next Friday, with a further four days deferred until Oct. 25.

### RICHMOND ATTRACTS 16

'Glorious' Goodwood's feature juvenile contest, Tuesday's G2 Gerrard Investment Management Richmond S., attracted an entry of 16 at yesterday's five-day stage. Heading the list for the six-furlong contest are G3 Norfolk S. winner **Baron's Pit (GB)** (Night Shift {USA}), one of four Richard Hannon-trained entries, and Windsor Castle S. scorer **Revenue (Ire)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}), who will bid to follow up their achievements at Royal Ascot. Revenue's owners, Highclere Thoroughbred Racing Ltd., are keen to point the colt at the contest, although Thursday's G3 Molecomb S. is also an option. "Revenue is a very likely runner," Highclere spokesman Harry Herbert told *PA Sport* yesterday. "We will look at the Molecomb as well, but the Richmond is the race for him provided the ground is good or faster."
