LOOKING FOR SOMETHING SPECIAL

A field of five two-year-olds will line up for today's 100th renewal of the GII Saratoga Special at Saratoga and trainer Patrick Biancone will attempt to continue his dominance in New York racing's juvenile ranks when he saddles the race's 3-5 morning-line favorite **Zavata** (Phone Trick). Zavata debuted with a runner-up finish behind the filly Holiday Runner in the May 4 Three Chimneys Juvenile S. After graduating with a 5 1/2-length victory in a

May 27 Belmont maiden event, the bay colt stormed to a 6 1/4-length win in the June 29 GIII Tremont. Off since then, Zavata has turned in a pair of bullet works over the Saratoga track. "We gave him a little break after he won the Tremont at Belmont," Biancone explained. "He's really been doing well up here. He's basically doing everything we've asked of him. He's trying a new distance on Wednesday, but I think he'll be up to it." Biancone also trains star juvenile Whywhywhy, who captured Saratoga's GII Sanford S. and is expected to start next in the Aug. 21 GI Hopeful S. The undefeated **Lone Star Sky** (Conquistador Cielo) is the 4-1 second choice in the Special. Trained by Tom Amoss, the bay colt broke his maiden with a come-from-behind win at Arlington in June and returned to take the GIII Bashford Manor S. at Churchill in stakes record time in his last outing July 7. "We ran him back in the Bashford Manor and we expected a good effort," Amoss commented. "But we didn't expect to see that kind of performance. He stepped it up and he will have to step it up again in the Saratoga Special. But we are coming to Saratoga because this race is a nice progression for him. And he looks like he might be wanting more distance." Also in the Special field, **Spite the Devil** (Devil His Due), a maiden winner against state-bred company in June, closed well to finish third behind Whywhywhy in the Sanford. The dark bay gelding is 6-1 on the morning line.

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

Sunday, Saratoga

It has taken some time to establish Orientate's metier. Now it is not only clear that he is a sprinter, but also that he is one of the best in the business. Orientate's victory in the GII A. G. Vanderbilt H. on Sunday gave him three straight wins at around six furlongs, and in light of that fact, it's remarkable to reflect that he didn't capture his first sprint stakes until the 12th start of his career.

It's obvious from his early career that Orientate must have impressed his connections as a miler or middle-distance type. His only juvenile outings came over seven furlongs and 8 1/2 furlongs, and it wasn't until he was dropped back to six panels for his fourth outing that he broke his maiden. That success came last July at Saratoga, and after taking an allowance event over the same track and distance, Orientate took on the fastest of his generation in the GI King's Bishop S. Conclusively outpaced there, Orientate finished 19 lengths behind the winner, Squirtle Squirt. Stretched out again for the 8 1/2-furlong Indiana Derby, Orientate parlayed a near unchallenged lead into a 3 1/4-length triumph. Not surprisingly, the same style of running proved much harder to employ in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, and after a brief foray at the front of the field, Orientate dropped back to finish a distant 12th. The experience clearly did him no harm, as he ended the campaign by taking the Sir Beaufort H. over a mile on turf at Santa Anita.

This year, before starting his dominating tear in sprint stakes, Orientate tried everything from nine furlongs on dirt to five furlongs on turf. While generally running

creditably, he recorded only one win, taking the seven-furlong GII Commonwealth Breeders' Cup H. in a swift 1:21.2. Returning to dirt sprints two starts after that score, Orientate presaged Sunday's victory with wins in the GIII Aristides H. and Smile Sprint H.

Orientate is a D. Wayne Lukas trainee, as was his sire Mt. Livermore and his dam Dream Team. Mt. Livermore was one of the best of Blushing Groom's North American-raced sons, and, along with Rahy, has been one of the principal representatives of Blushing Groom's influence on this side of the Atlantic. Taking after the influence of his maternal grandsire Crimson Satan, Mt. Livermore was a sprint specialist, and as a four-year-old he captured four stakes events, including the GII Carter H., GII Fall Highweight H. and GIII Boojum H., and also took third in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint. A consistently successful sire, Mt. Livermore has been represented by 56 stakes winners in his first 14 crops, six of them in 2002. His best, in addition to Orientate, include two-time champion sprinter Housebuster; champion two-year-old filly Eliza; Peaks and Valleys and Mt. Sassafras, who both were named Horse of the Year in Canada; Mountain Angel, the champion older mare of 2001 in Canada; as well as millionaires Subordination and Luthier Fever. Although he's done extremely well as a sire of sprinters, Mt. Livermore has sired plenty of runners who are effective at middle distances, and Peaks and Valleys, Mt. Sassafras and Subordination are all Grade I winners at nine furlongs.

Orientate's dam Dream Team was one of a slew of top-class fillies trained by D. Wayne Lukas and owned either in whole or part by Eugene Klein. Among others are Lady's Secret, Winning Colors, Open Mind, Family Style, Life's Magic and Twilight Bridge. The latter pair, Life's Magic and Twilight Bridge, were daughters of Cox's Ridge, and that must have played a part in the purchase of Dream Team, who was four years younger than Life's Magic, and two years junior to Twilight Bridge. Dream Team wasn't able to duplicate Life's Magic's award as champion three-year-old filly, or Twilight Bridge's victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, but she proved well worth her \$500,000 purchase price. Dream Team made only six starts, but she won six of them, including the GI Oak Leaf S. and GIII Anoakia S., and also finished third in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. Dream Team was sold for \$750,000, carrying her first foal, a filly by Saratoga Six, at the dispersal of the Klein bloodstock in the 1989 Keeneland November Sales.

THE NEW WORLD ORDER

Last year, 16 yearlings from Mr. Prospector's final crop brought in \$21.2 million in revenue at the yearling sales, and averaged over \$1.3 million. The fact that his absence alone may account for more than 20 percent of a projected \$90-million fall in revenues at this year's four major North American sales (we've already seen a \$39-million drop at the summer sales; if September drops \$54-million, from \$254-million to \$200-million, that would add up to \$93-million, or a 23-percent, decline) is emblematic of a dramatic 'changing of the guard' taking place at the top of the world's stallion rankings.

If you still include Mr. Prospector among the world's top 10 sires, for the moment, since he still has two-year-olds racing, five of the current World Top 10 have either died, or are not going to be around much longer. Besides Mr. Prospector, Nureyev and Seattle Slew have only six yearlings between them in the September Sale. Danzig (10 in September) will be 26 next year, and, great sire that he is, his influence as a sire of racehorses is already beginning to wane. That's four of the top 10. I include Sunday Silence among the world's top 10, and he is fighting for his life, so that's five by my count. You may argue that he shouldn't be in the world top 10 anyway because he has limited impact outside Japan; fine, that would let Unbridled into the world top 10, and he's dead, too. So, whichever way you look at it, half of the world top 10 is receding in influence so swiftly that this factor alone could have a significant negative effect on the world's auction markets, even aside from outside economic and political factors, and the impending effect of MRLS.

But it also creates a vacuum at the top, and over the next little while some new names are going to feature in the world top 10. There is a line of thinking that the next wave will possibly not be so dominant as the last

wave has been, that the immense gulf (of value) separating the top 10 from everything else will narrow, and that--for the first time in at least 30 years--the world's top 10 sires won't be worth three times as much as everything else. But more likely some new horses will fill the vacuum. Even if they aren't quite as far ahead of their contemporaries as has been the case in the recent past, the shrewd investor will surely achieve immense economic benefit from correctly identifying and/or predicting the composition of this emerging New World Order. In other words, who will be the new World Top 10?

Of course, we must begin with the five holdovers from last year's list, which included seven from Kentucky, two from Europe, and Sunday Silence from Japan. Right now there could be no debate that Storm Cat (20 next year) is the World Number One, and that Sadler's Wells (22 next year) is the World Number Two. Then we have Danehill (17 next year), and the two youngest Top 10 sires, A.P. Indy (14 next year) and Kingmambo (13). So you can already imagine that, in five years' time (I know, who can think that far ahead?), only two of the current top 10--so far all-American A.P. Indy and predominantly European Kingmambo--will figure among the 2007 Top 10.

Open to debate, as always, but here's my version of the current World Top 10. Feel free to revise and otherwise disagree.

From the Home Office in Scotland ... The Top 10...

1. **Storm Cat**, 1983 (Overbrook) -- Everybody's World Number One.
2. **Sadler's Wells**, 1981 (Coolmore) -- Undisputed Europe No. 1, legendary sire. But will he really make a sire of sires?
3. **Danehill**, 1986 (Coolmore) -- Leading Sire of two-year-olds in Europe last two years after five Australian sire championships. Could be a sire of sires, too.
4. **A.P. Indy**, 1989 (Lane's End) -- Blockbuster figures for America (6.84 North American APEX 'A Runner' Index), but so far 0-for-Europe. Can he be the World No. 1 without Europe? I doubt it, myself. *Cont. p. 4*

5. **Kingmambo**, 1990 (Lane's End) -- Seven Group 1 winners in first four crops including at least one serious sire prospect in each. Effective everywhere. Has to be for real, though I think is still a little bit underrated by the marketplace.

6. **Gone West**, 1983 (Mill Ridge) -- A rare case of a horse actually graduating from the Second 10. He's always been borderline Top 10, and the success this year of sons Mr. Greeley and Elusive Quality, plus a very good three-year-old crop headed by Came Home finally carries him to the top level.

7. **Grand Lodge**, 1991 (Coolmore) -- When you look at his averages, you say 'how can a 2.00 sire be seriously talked about as a Top 10 sire?' This is how: 2000-Sinndar; 2001-Queen's Logic; 2002-Grandera (in the Prince of Wales). Sinndar won what may have been an outstanding Derby, with last year's Arc winner Sakhee second, and this weekend's Arlington Million favorite Beat Hollow third; and Queen's Logic might have been the best two-year-old in Europe last year, including Johannesburg. One superstar a year, that's enough.

8. **Thunder Gulch**, 1992 (Ashford) -- With 11 'A Runners' in his first two crops (oldest now five-year-olds), including new all-time record money-winning female Spain and last year's champion three-year-old Point Given, he is poised to achieve major recognition. Mind you, his two-year-old crop being in Japan doesn't help, and he is so far 0-for-Europe, too. But he's for real.

9. **Unbridled's Song**, 1993 (Taylor Made) -- Three Grade 1 winners in his first two crops (Songandaprayer and Breeders' Cup winner Unbridled Elaine in his first, now four-year-olds, and Buddha in his second) demonstrate his ability to play in the majors. Now he's had saletoppers, or near-saletoppers, in the last three sales of note: Fasig July, Saratoga, and, this week, the opening session at Del Mar. He also marks the arrival of Taylor Made -- which nearly got there with Saint Ballado -- as a place where a top-class sire can stand. In a strong sire group which also includes Maria's Mon and Hennessy, Unbridled's Song is emerging as the best of a good group. I'd even go so far as to say he is The Next Big Thing in the stallion business.

10. This spot is open right now. Europe No. 3 Rainbow Quest is a contender, but he's 22 next year, coming out of that same great 1984 French Derby with Sadler's Wells and Darshaan. Claiborne's Pulpit could still be in the running -- he's clearly got some horses with class, and I wouldn't discount his chances of achieving stardom just yet. Coolmore's Spinning World is the other horse with first three-year-olds that has shown Top 10 potential; he's got plenty with group-caliber form or potential in both crops. But there are three horses whose first foals are on the ground this year who should step straight into top 10 company -- at least commercially -- when their first yearlings hit the market next year. Two of them stand for six-figure stud fees: 2000 Kentucky Derby winner Fusaichi Pegasus (Ashford), and Storm Cat's best son yet, Giant's Causeway (Ashford). Finally, the aforementioned Sinndar (Gilltown) -- because, yes, the 2000 Epsom Derby might really have been that good.

Oriente is Dream Team's fifth foal, and she produced an earlier stakes horse in the shape of Olympic Cat, who earned black-type with a second in the GII Sport Page H. Almost an "every other year" breeder, Dream Team was barren in 1999, but in 2000 she produce a Mr. Greeley colt who realized \$1,400,000 at the 2001 Keeneland September Yearling Sales. Named Johnny Red Kerr, and now in training with Bob Baffert, he has yet to start.

Dream Team and Oriente represent something of a progression in class for this family. Dream Team's dam Likely Double (by Nodouble) did win the GIII Little Silver H., and her granddam Likely Lark was a minor West Coast stakes winner, but both were the only black-type winners produced by their respective dams. In tail female line the family does eventually go back to Ortegal, a sister-in-blood to the undefeated English Triple Crown winner Ormonde, and ancestress of Kentucky Derby winner Shut Out, and more recently of Leallah, Lea Lane, Rose Bower, Sea Saga, Sea Sister, Targowice, Miswaki, High Brite, Southern Halo, Lacovia, Jump Start, General Challenge and Snow Dance.

Oriente's ability seems to be more a function of being produced by two extremely able parents, rather than a profound pedigree pattern. He's the only unrestricted stakes winner to date by a Blushing Groom line stallion out of a mare descending from Cox's Ridge or his sire Best Turn. In fact, he appears to be the only unrestricted stakes winner with Blushing Groom or Best Turn combined in his pedigree. This would incline one to downplay the significance of the close relationship between Aimee, the granddam of Blushing Groom, and Khaled, who appears as the sire of Best Turn's own broodmare sire Swaps. Both Mt. Livermore and Storm Cat, the sire of the graded stakes placed half brother to Oriente, are out of mares by Crimson Satan, but he appears in combination with Cox's Ridge/Best Turn in only one other unrestricted stakes winner. The combination of Blushing Groom with mares carrying Nodouble, the sire of Oriente's second dam, has been slightly more profitable. The G1 Irish 1,000 Guineas heroine Al Bahathri is by Blushing Groom out of a Nodouble mare; group winner Good Example is by a son of Blushing Groom out of a Nodouble mare; and Love the Groom, an English Group 2 winner by Blushing Groom, has a second dam by Nodouble out of a mare by Ballydonnell, the broodmare sire of Cox's Ridge.

ASHFORD STUD

BUSINESS BRISK AT FASIG A filly by 2002 freshman sire Tale of the Cat sold for \$300,000 to top Monday's second and final session of the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Preferred Sale in upstate New York, which enjoyed upticks in a pair of critical statistics versus a year ago. The average of \$49,495 for the two-day sale marked a 14.1-percent jump from the corresponding figure from 2001, while the median of \$35,000 represented an increase of just over 11 percent. Buybacks were down from nearly 36 percent last year to 33 percent this year. Monday's session and overall sale topper, out of Unbridled Bird (Unbridled), was consigned by Eaton & Thorne, Inc., agent, and was purchased by bloodstock agent Buzz Chace, acting as agent for Ernie Paragallo's Paraneck Stable. The filly is the second-highest priced yearling in the history of the New York-bred sale and was one of 11 horses to sell for better than \$100,000 during the sale, which was expanded to two sessions this year.

DEL MAR SALE SETS NEW RECORDS The annual Del Mar Yearling Sale sponsored by the California Thoroughbred Breeders Association set new records for average and median during its two-day sale which wrapped up Monday evening. The cumulative average of \$43,770 just eclipsed the previous record of \$43,663 while the overall median of \$32,000 was just ahead of last year's record \$31,500. "Overall, we're very pleased with the results of the sale," said Doug Burge, general manager of the CTBA. "In light of industry trends, it was very encouraging to match and slightly top last year's record results," he added. Monday's closing session was headlined by three six-figure purchases, including hip 102, a colt by Bertrando. Mary Knight consigned the son of Desert Violet (Desert Wine), who was purchased by California trainer Mel Stute on behalf of Bob and Beverly Lewis for \$150,000.

TATTERSALLS CHANGES DATES FOR 2003

Tattersalls is to make major changes to its sales dates in 2003, with the flagship Tattersalls Houghton Yearling Sale set to take place one week earlier than at present, and the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale moving to the week currently occupied by the Houghton. In addition, the Tattersalls Autumn Yearling Sale will move to the week vacated by the October Yearling Sale, and be renamed the 'Tattersalls October Yearling Sale Part 2', while the Tattersalls Autumn Horses in Training Sale will remain as it stands in the last week of October. The Tattersalls (Ireland) September Yearling Sale will also be held a week earlier beginning September 16th.

Houghton sandwiched between top class racing.....

The 2003 Houghton Yearling Sale will therefore take place Sept. 24-25, with racing at Newmarket Sept. 23 and the three-day Ascot Festival of Racing, which features five Group races including two Group 1 contests, beginning the day after the Houghton ends. The October Yearling Sale will begin five days after the conclusion of the Houghton from Sept. 30 through Oct. 4.

A cause for change.....

The change has been facilitated by the decision of Newmarket Racecourse to reduce the Cambridgeshire Meeting from four days to three days, beginning Oct. 2 after the first two days of the October Yearling Sale. According to Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony: "We have felt for a long time that we have been squeezing too many major sales into too few days....Both the Houghton and October Yearling Sales have traditionally taken place either wholly or partly clashing with racing at Newmarket, and as a result we have always had to juggle numbers and timings around factors outside our control. We have always enjoyed fantastic cooperation from Newmarket Racecourse, but with foal crops at record levels this task has become increasingly difficult in recent years." The revised schedule will mean that next year the new Tattersalls October Yearling Sale Part 2 will begin Oct. 15, while the Tattersalls Autumn Horses in Training Sale will take place from Oct. 27-30.

FRANKIE GOES TO SALISBURY

Godolphin's retained jockey Frankie Dettori will return to racecourse action at Salisbury today after an enforced 10-day absence due to chicken pox, which he caught from his children. The popular Italian has two rides at the picturesque Wiltshire track including Fraulein (GB) (Acatenango {Ger}) for trainer Ed Dunlop in the Listed EBF Upavon Fillies' S. Dettori's comeback will be shortlived, however, as he is required at the Jockey Club's London HQ Thursday to explain his riding of the Ed Dunlop-trained Lobos (Swi) (Rainbow Quest {USA}) at Newmarket June 21. Dettori's agent Ray Cochrane told *PA Sport*: "He is bright as a button now and is a little bit heavy, but he is in good form. Both his rides today look like they would have every chance, but it looks like he will have to have day off on Thursday for this inquiry, so he will have to go to Portman Square. Then it is Newmarket on Friday, Newbury on Saturday and France on Sunday for the G1 Prix Jacques Le Marois."
