YOU DRAWS OUTSIDE IN ALABAMA

You (You and I), who captured the seven-furlong GI Test S. at Saratoga Race Course July 27, wheels right back in the 10-furlong GI Alabama S. Saturday. The three-year-old drew the far outside in the seven-horse field as she tries to become the 12th filly to complete the Test-Alabama double. The list of distaffers to earn that achievement includes Vagrancy ('42), Gamely ('67), Desert Vixen ('73), Love Sign ('80), Go for Wand ('90), Versailles Treaty ('91) and, the most recent, November Snow ('92). You, untested at the mile-and-a-quarter distance of the Alabama, faded to finish fourth behind fellow Alabama candidate **Farda Amiga** (Broad Brush) in her longest race to date, the nine-furlong GI Kentucky Oaks May 3. But, said trainer Bobby Frankel, "She only got beat three lengths in the Kentucky Oaks and I think she's much better right now. She's won twice over this track and she's got a lot of class. She's not going to quit on you." Edgar Prado, who rode the filly to victory in the GI Adirondack S. at Saratoga and the GI Frizette S. at Belmont Park last season, will take over the reins from Jerry Bailey, who will be at Arlington Park Saturday.

ANOTHER AUSSIE TITLE FOR DANEHILL

The 2001-2002 Australian racing season ended July 31 and, for the sixth consecutive year, **Danehill** (Danzig--Razyana, by His Majesty) led the general sire standings. The 16-year-old stallion sired 109 winners of 187 races; his 202 runners accounted for seasonal progeny earnings of A\$7,805,297. His 26 stakes winners won 32 stakes races. Second on the list was **Zabeel (NZ)** (*Sir Tristram), who sired 69 winners of 113 races for earnings of A\$5,673,163; he had six stakes winners last season. Danehill has shuttled between Coolmore Australia and Coolmore Ireland, but will skip the Southern Hemisphere season this year.

A competitive field lined up for this contest despite the withdrawal of the soft-ground performers, but it was Highdown who came out on top after a thrilling drive to the line. Highdown showed a fair level of form during a heavy campaign as a juvenile under the care of Mick Channon, finishing eighth behind Johannesburg in the G1 Phoenix S. at Leopardstown in August and fifth in the G2 Criterium de Maisons-Laffitte in October. Transferred to Marcus Tregoning, he returned to beat subsequent G2 Dante S. winner Moon Ballad (Ire) by a short head in the Listed Newmarket S. May 3. After three moderate efforts, the colt was impressive in his latest, beating Foreign Affairs (GB) by four lengths in the Listed Steventon S. at Newbury July 20 on his preferred faster ground, and the drying days earlier in the week at Deauville helped him gain his most significant success here. Held up under cover in last place by Martin Dwyer, he traveled well off the moderate pace set by Burning Sun. Kept to the inner as Burning Sun started the sprint at the top of the straight while leading the field off the rail, the winner quickened to gain the advantage with 100 yards remaining and had enough to hold that late thrust of Olivier Peslier and Shaanmer, who drove past Burning Sun in the final strides. Dear Mr. Oppenheim,

Firstly I would like to commend you for your recent article in *TDN* titled "The New World Order" (Wednesday, Aug. 14). Certainly we are coming to an end of an era with the likes of Mr. Prospector, Danzig, Sadler's Wells, et al, all reaching the end of their influence. While it is hard to look into the future as far as five years, it does seem as though there will be a leveling of the playing field. Might we see another Mr. Prospector arrive from a regional program? Who knows?

Any article like yours is sure to raise questions, especially as this is a topic that should be at the forefront of all the major players in North America, Europe, Japan and Australasia.

As far as the emerging sires, you have put in Grand Lodge, Thunder Gulch and Unbridled's Song in the top 10 and have Spinning World and, on potential, Pulpit just outside. This is all a matter of opinion and maybe it is seeing things from a distance being based in the Southern Hemisphere, but wouldn't Anabaa, Monsun and Linamix out-rate Grand Lodge in Europe, given relative book size and performance? Grand Lodge is a good sire, capable of getting a very good horse, but his first four Northern Hemisphere crops has elicited just 4 percent stakes winners to foals while Anabaa (two crops at 6 percent), Monsun (three crops at 14 percent) and Linamix (eight crops at 9 percent) clearly out-rate on this basis.

Thunder Gulch and Unbridled's Song are both nice stallions also and certainly the latter is selling outstandingly well and is clearly seen by many good American judges as the heir apparent. However, while their American stud record stands up to scrutiny, their names seem incongruous when compared with Danzig, Kingmambo, Gone West and Storm Cat. The latter four all have strong European results making them Northern Hemisphere sires or "world sires," not just sires successful in one continent.

Of course, the same in reverse applies to Grand Lodge and indeed the stallions I mentioned as alternatives. Their success rests almost solely in Europe.

Maybe this is symptomatic of the recent power shift in stallion acquisitions on a world scale. In the last 50 years of the last century, American stallion masters had outstanding results importing the best European racehorses--Blushing Groom, Caro, Lyphard, Mahmoud, Nasrullah, Nijinsky II, Nureyev, Ribot, Riverman, Roberto and Storm Bird, et al, have been imported to America after success in Europe and become "world sires." In more recent times, America seems to have taken its eye off the ball, whether it meant to or has been forced to (oil and tax refuges are hard to beat), and Europe has managed to regain its seat in the international Thoroughbred industry.

With the rise of Coolmore and Darley in the last 15 to 20 years, American stallion masters have begun to play reserve quarterback (or not at all) in this lucrative marketplace. We are almost in a position where Coolmore and Darley are sourcing and standing just about all the top-class stallion prospects available in Europe. Both now having American and European bases--will it be down to these two conglomerates to decide who is the next "world sire," effective on both continents? Could Kingmambo be the last of the top-class European horses to be imported to America by a third party?

American stallion masters, once famed for their ability to think outside the square and bring in stallions that were successful on two surfaces, thus appealing to a wider market, seem to be becoming rare. (John Gaines, where are you?) Combine this with what seems to be a concerted effort by American breeders/trainers/vets to produce horses specifically suited to their racing environment (hence the rise of the Fappiano sire line) and we could be looking at the end of two eras at once.

It is possible within five years that as the influence wielded by the likes of Mr. Prospector, Danzig and Sadler's Wells on the international sphere begins to wane, it will end the era of not only a phase of outstanding stallions all born in a 10 year period, but also the end of the era of the "world sire," as America and Europe tread different paths in developing the Thoroughbred and begin to divide pedigrees and sire lines to suit their own needs.

It is possible, but on reflection not probable. The Thoroughbred is now a truly international creation, not a localized market product. While Coolmore and Darley have a strong hand in Europe and will play their part in creating and maintaining a "world sire," the fact is breed-shaping stallions can come from anywhere. Everyone had a chance at standing Sunday Silence and hands up the European geniuses who said Danehill was just a Southern Hemisphere creation when the wild colonial boys were saying (shouting!) he was one of the best stallions in the world (you know who you are!).

We operate in an industry where the amazing and unexpected is possible and indeed happens on a regular basis. Horses by Zinaad can win the English 1000 Guineas and Oaks, Godolphin can be beaten in a Melbourne Cup by a horse owned by a school teacher and the next Mr. Prospector or Danzig has probably just started at stud in Texas.

Andrew Reichard of the Australian Bloodhorse Review recently made the comment about the changing of the guard in Thoroughbred breeding, he said, "Whatever happens, the vacuum will be filled by default, the question of whether it is filled by an aviator or a pedestrian remains to be seen."

We live in interesting times.

LEFT BANK PROGRESSING Left Bank (French Deputy) is making good progress from emergency colic surgery Aug. 10 and could be released from a Boston clinic as early as next week, trainer Todd Pletcher told *The Blood-Horse*. "We're pretty optimistic that things are going in the right direction," he said. "It's obviously day-to-day, but the way things sound right now it's kind of on schedule for him to maybe go home to Kentucky on Monday or Tuesday if everything continues to go well." The winner of the GI Whitney H. in his most recent start Aug. 3, Left Bank has won 14 of 24 career starts and has earnings in excess of \$1.4 million.

SELLERS HANGS UP TACK FOR GOOD Jockey Shane Sellers has decided to call it a career. Sidelined with a knee injury for most of the last two seasons, the 35-year-old has ended another comeback bid and officially announced his retirement from racing. Sellers, who suffered an injured knee in a post parade mishap at the Fair Grounds in December 2000, prepared for a return to the saddle earlier this spring by working as an exercise rider at Saratoga. But after an application to regain insurance coverage as a jockey was denied this past June, the Louisiana native indicated that his desire to return had waned and he instead opted for retirement. A staunch advocate for a five-pound increase on the scale of weights for jockeys, he pointed to this issue as the chief reason for retiring. "I realized that racing is never going to change the weight limits," Sellers told *The Blood-Horse*. "I'm a person who fights for what he believes in, but this is a fight I know I am not going to win." Sellers has also been closely involved with fundraising efforts for former jockey Randy Romero, who needs kidney and liver transplants, conditions that he feels were brought on by the constant struggle to make weight. During his 19-year career, Sellers rode a total of 3,720 winners, including Breeders' Cup victories aboard Countess Diana in the 1997 Juvenile Fillies and Buck's Boy in the 1998 Turf.

NYRA Requests Day Off on Sept. 11:

The New York Racing Association has submitted a request to the New York State Racing and Wagering Board to have Belmont Park closed on Sept. 11. The track would instead run Monday, Sept. 9. "With the first anniversary of the terrorist attacks on the World Trade Center, we can best pay our respects to those who lost their lives in that tragic event by not racing on that day," NYRA Chairman and CEO Barry K. Schwartz said. "A deep sadness and loss was felt by all New Yorkers that day and we think this is the appropriate measure to take." If the request is approved, there will be free general parking and free grandstand admission to Belmont Sept. 9.

Lawsuits Dropped:

Trainers Mark Hennig, Todd Pletcher, David Donk and Mike LaRocca have agreed to drop lawsuits they started in 1999 against the Florida Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering. In return, the state agreed to dismiss charges against the four resulting from trace levels of cocaine found in horses they ran at Florida tracks. The then-director of the DPW, Debbie Miller, summarily suspended LaRocca's license and tried to suspend those of the other three without due process. Hennig, Pletcher and Donk hired the New York law firm of Gibson, Dunn & Crutcher to get them a stay on the suspensions. Once federal judge Kimba Wood granted the trio a stay, they continued to train while the lawyers hammered out the terms of the agreement. The levels of cocaine in all the horses involved were believed to be less than 60 nanograms and their lawyer John Behrendt argued that there "were just too many ways that trace levels of cocaine can get into a horse's system in our society, and none of these trainers deserves to have their records tainted with something like this."

A four-length winner of the Gill Cinema H. in June of his three-year-old season, David Copperfield fetched \$2.6 million one month later at the 505 Farms dispersal, but had managed just one subsequent victory for his new connections, a Keeneland allowance score last April for Bill Mott. The dark bay was sidelined after a fifth in an allowance test over a sloppy track at Churchill June 15, 2001 and was sent off at 6-1 in his return to action under the guidance of John Shirreffs. Breaking from the outside, David Copperfield quickly went up to set the pace, shook free heading for home and clung on stubbornly in the final strides.

"We'll just monitor them and see if any of them are healthy and well. One of the trio could run and probably may have to be leased for the race by the owners of Golan."
