SUNDAY SILENCE DEAD

After undergoing three surgeries and battling laminitis for nearly two weeks, **Sunday Silence** (Halo--Wishing Well, by Understanding) died of heart failure yesterday at Shadai Stallion Station in Japan. The 1989 Horse of the Year, who won two-thirds of the American Triple Crown and dominated the Japanese stallion ranks for nearly a decade, was 16. "He has been getting very much worse the last few days," Shadai spokesman Eisuke Tokutake said yesterday. "Today he got down and was unable to get back up. He was in a lot of pain despite the strong medicines we gave him. He died earlier today of heart failure and we are very up-

set about the loss of such a great horse." In an official statement, Japan Racing Association President Masayushi Takahashi said, "It is with deep regret that we witness the passing of Sunday Silence, who has given us so many outstanding racehorses, and whose name is known not only in our country, but throughout the world." Sunday Silence, who stood his entire career at Shadai Stallion Station, was taken out of stud duty in May after showing inflammation in his right foreleg. He underwent three operations in an attempt to alleviate the condition; the most recent surgery was performed July 18 after he showed signs of bacterial peritendinitis, an inflammation of the tendon sheath, and he seemed to be recovering. He began to show signs of laminitis in his left foreleg at the end of the first week of August, but, showing the courage he displayed as a racehorse, he battled the disease before finally succumbing yesterday.

A Champion on the Track...

Sunday Silence was bred in Kentucky by Oak Cliff Thoroughbreds and owned by Ernest Galliard and Arthur B. Hancock. "My first memory was of him as a foal in the field," Hancock said. "When he was little, he was silver-gray, and he just kept running and running and running, in and out of the mares and the other foals. He must have kept running for five minutes." Nearly black by the time he reached the track, he caught the eye of his trainer, Charlie Whittingham, early. "I knew he was really going to be something when Charlie called me one day and said, 'this big black son of a bitch can run a little.' Those were his exact words--he was a master of understatement," Hancock recalled. The talented Thoroughbred won just one of three starts at two, breaking his maiden by 10 lengths in his second appearance at Hollywood Park, but he became a force to be reckoned with at three. Sunday Silence reeled off consecutive wins in a March allowance at Santa Anita, the GII San Felipe S. and the GI Santa Anita Derby. Still, he was sent off the 3-1 second favorite in the Kentucky Derby to Easy Goer, who had sailed through his East Coast preps in similar style. He got the better of his New York nemesis in the Derby, winning by 2 1/2 lengths, yet was the crowd's 2-1 second choice once again at Pimlico. But it was in the Preakness that, according to Hancock, the colt ran the race of his life. Headed by Easy Goer as they raced into the far turn, he battled back to win by a nose. "Easy Goer swept past him and I was 100 percent sure the race was over," Stone Farm's owner admitted. "In fact, I put my binoculars down and didn't look up for four or five seconds. But my wife, Traci, kept saying, 'he's coming back,' and I'll be damned if he wasn't. I'd never seen a horse do that before--he just wouldn't quit."

“The Gift of a Lifetime”...

His jockey, Patrick Valenzuela, was equally amazed by the willingness his colt displayed. “He was very rambunctious on the track, but he was talented and quick as a cat,” he commented. “He’d do anything for you and race any way you asked him to. He gave me the gift of a lifetime in the Kentucky Derby and the Preakness.” The tough competitor was denied a Triple Crown sweep, finishing eight lengths behind Easy Goer in the Belmont, but he got his revenge in a dramatic showdown with his arch rival in the final race of his 1989 campaign, the Breeders’ Cup Classic, outfinishing Easy Goer by a neck and, in so doing, earning honors as the Horse of the Year and champion three-year-old. Sunday Silence opened 1990 with a win in the GI Californian, but was retired with an injury after finishing second in the GI Hollywood Gold Cup. He ended his racing career with nine wins and five seconds from 14 starts for earnings of \$4,968,554, but the best was yet to come.

A Champion in the Breeding Shed...

Sunday Silence was sent to Japan to stand at stud because there was little enthusiasm for the horse among Kentucky breeders. “I think Easy Goer already had 40 contracts, and we had two,” Hancock said. “I called everybody in the world and only three people wanted shares in him. People weren’t interested in breeding to him, it was as simple as that.” But he quickly established himself as that country’s leading stallion, smashing Japanese sire records from the time his first crop hit the racetrack in 1994. He was the champion sire in Japan every year from 1995 through 2001, and maintains a sizeable lead in 2002. Through Aug. 13, Sunday Silence had sired 75 stakes winners, 10 champions, four Japanese Derby winners and the earners of \$322,194,260 from nine crops to race. Special Week (Jpn), winner of the 1999 G1 Japan Cup, is his leading money winner to date with earnings of \$9,346,435. He also sired champion older mare To The Victory (Jpn), who was second in the 2001 G1 Dubai World Cup; and Stay Gold (Jpn), hero of the 2001 G2 Dubai Sheema Classic and the 2001 G1 Hong Kong Vase. The average price of Sunday Silence’s foals at the Select Sale in July was ¥92.48 million; Green Desert, second on the list, averaged ¥35.33 million and El Condor Pasa, third, averaged ¥24.91 million. “I think he would have been a great stallion here,” Hancock said. “He would have passed on that spirit of his wherever he stood.”

All carry 131 pounds except Starbourne, 120 pounds. Following their epic struggle in the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot, **Golan (Ire)** and **Nayef** are back in the ring for this afternoon’s feature. Golan’s, winner of last year’s G1 2000 Guineas, was a runner-up in the G1 Epsom Derby last June and third in the Irish version at The Curragh in July. Despite his recent King George effort and his wins in the G3 Select S. at Goodwood and G3 Cumberland Lodge S. at Ascot last year, the left-handed courses suit him best. Impressive in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic at Nad al Sheba Mar. 23, he later won the G1 Champion S. at Newmarket in October and was fourth in the G1 Prince of Wales’s S. at Royal Ascot June 19. Interestingly, his owner was only keen to run him at Ascot after race-course officials had turned on the taps. **Noverre**, last year’s G1 Sussex S. winner, was a closing second in the G1 Dubai Duty Free at Nad al Sheba Mar. 23 before another second in the Sussex S. at Goodwood last time July 31.

Bandari steps back into the breach after his impressive score in the G3 Gordon S. at Goodwood July 30. Winners of that contest have a fair follow-up record here in recent years, with Stowaway (GB) in 1997 and Bonny Scot (Ire) in 1992 having completed the double, and Air Marshall (Ire), who was narrowly beaten at Goodwood, making amends in this. Bandari was bouncing back from a disappointing eighth placing in the G1 Epsom Derby June 8, having taken the G3 Lingfield Derby Trial May 11 by 13 lengths. He faces **Bollin Eric**, runner-up in both the G2 Dante S. May 15 and G2 King Edward VII S. at Royal Ascot June 21, where **Bustan** was fifth. He bids to emulate Dushyantor, the last runner-up in the Dante to win here. **Systematic** holds **Highest** on the form of the King George V H. at Royal Ascot June 20, where a neck separated the pair. While both possess considerable scope for improvement, Systematic is a strong-galloping type who will be in his element on this track.

TRAVERS CONTENDERS' OUT FOR FINAL WORK

The Nick Zito-trained pair of **Quest** (Seeking the Gold) and **Nothing Flat** (Peaks and Valleys), second and seventh, respectively, in the GII Jim Dandy S. Aug. 4, led the charge of final workouts at Saratoga in advance of Saturday's feature, the Travers S. Both colts breezed five furlongs over the Spa's training track in 1:03 2/5 in separate workouts. "They don't need much," said Zito. "Obviously, the training track here is very deep. I guess on any other track they would have worked in 1:01." Trainer D. Wayne Lukas also worked one of his Travers starters, **Shah Jehan** (Mr. Prospector), Monday morning. The regally-bred sophomore breezed five panels in 1:03 1/5 over the Oklahoma track. "I didn't time him," Likas said. "He's tight. If he runs the way I'm expecting him to, he'll be a factor." Also out for his final Travers work, **Like A Hero** (Pleasant Colony) eased through five furlongs in 1:01 3/5 over the main track. "He didn't need to go fast," said trainer Beau Greely. "He has been doing well since the Haskell [third to War Emblem]."

"This has been the best 24 hours since I have owned horses," was the understandable reaction of Khalid Abdullah after his magnificent filly Banks Hill had completed a GI treble initiated by Beat Hollow and Chiselling. The Prince's delight must have been even greater in view of the fact that all three of these Grade I winners are homebred and are out of mares which themselves carried the Prince's colors to victory at stakes level. Impressive victories from the promising juveniles Rainwashed Gold and Intercontinental also contributed to the feel-good factor at the Juddmonte operation. Intercontinental, a sister to Banks Hill and the top miler Dansili, won so well on her debut at Deauville that she seems sure to add to the magnificent record of her dam Hasili, who is also responsible for Heat Haze, a good fifth in this year's French 1000 Guineas. Juddmonte can also take pleasure from the achievements of Ulundi, a 5,500-guineas reject who was beaten less than half a length into fourth place behind Beat Hollow at Arlington. Jockey Jerry Bailey's comment after the Million that Beat Hollow will be, "a better horse going a mile than he is at a mile and a quarter," resulted in some raised eyebrows in Britain, where mature horses tend to be kept to a narrow range of distances.

International Appeal.....

I always envy other countries where trainers tend to take a more adventurous approach, such as Australia and the U.S. A good example of what can be achieved was provided by an English colt called Jeune. There was no turning back once this son of Kalaglow had been stepped up to 1 1/4 miles, and the last 11 races of Jeune's admirable European career were all at distances from 1 1/4 miles to 1 1/2 miles. Then he was sent to Australia, where he became a Group 1 winner over such varied distances as 7 furlongs, 1 1/8 miles, 1 1/4 miles and 2 miles! The history of the Breeders' Cup Sprint also illustrates that American trainers tend to be less hidebound in their attitude to distance. Precisionist, the 1985 winner, was a dual Grade I winner over 1 1/4 miles; Smile (1986) had earlier won a Grade I over 1 1/8 miles; Gulch (1988) had been campaigned at up to 1 1/2 miles; Dancing Spree (1989) was a Grade I winner over 1 1/4 miles; Cherokee Run (1994) had finished second in the Preakness; and Artax (1999) had run third in the Santa Anita Derby. Every now and then the connections of an outstanding European performer, such as Dubai Millennium, Galileo and Rock of Gibraltar, tantalise us by saying that their star performer has so much speed that he could easily win a major prize over shorter distances, but so far this type of speculation has proved to be nothing more than talk. Perhaps one day their claims will be put to the test and will encourage others to adopt a more adventurous approach. Had Beat Hollow remained in Europe, it is likely that he would have been kept to either 1 1/4 miles (the distance of his victory in the G1 Grand Prix de Paris) or 1 1/2 miles (the distance of his creditable third behind Sinndar and Sakhee in the Derby). However, Bobby Frankel, from a fresh viewpoint--recognised that his charge also possesses plenty of speed. This speed has allowed Beat Hollow to finish first or second in his four appearances over 1 1/8 miles, which included an impressive Grade I win in the Turf Classic, and both trainer and jockey are convinced that he is fast enough to shine in the BC Mile. Only time will tell if they are right, but there are aspects of Beat Hollow's pedigree which lend credence to their belief. *(cont. p6)*

What They're Saying At The Sales...

DEAUVILLE DAY THREE

The third day of the Deauville August Yearling Sale confirmed the trend registered the first two days, with another drop in both gross and average. On the day, the aggregate was off 15.48 percent and the average was down 28.48 percent. Over the first three days, the gross is down by 26.18 percent and the average by 29.06 percent. The encouraging sign yesterday was that, in a very selective market, 71 percent of the horses were sold. That figure matched last year's results, but 202 horses went through the ring yesterday, compared to 146 in 2001. Although the French activity was much stronger than over the first two days, there was also international business, with buyers from the United States, England, Ireland, Italy, Spain, Germany, Japan and Australia. Top price on the day was Hip 251, a chestnut colt by Machiavellian out of stakes winner Vitaba (Northern Baby) that was knocked down to English bloodstock agent John Warren for €220,000. The colt was from the Haras d'Etreham consignment; his dam is a half-sister to Adalgisa (Spinning World), who broke her maiden by three easy lengths in a maiden race at Del Mar on her American debut. The sale continues this Tuesday after racing at approximately 5:30 p.m.

Eric Puerari of Haras des Capucines:

"As everyone can see, it is a difficult sale. We've lost a few clients from last year and, of course, the economy is not booming. So what can you say? When you make your matings, you don't know what the market will be in two years. You just have to carry on. I hope the stud masters will take into consideration the facts of the market and lower stud fees. For years we had a boom, but what we need now is a readjustment to find a steady base and attract a wide spectrum of buyers."

Peter Doyle, bloodstock agent:

"The market is down 20 percent, isn't it? But that's the world economy. It's been the same at the American sales. You have to keep looking until you find the right horse."

Haras du Mezeray's Charles Henri de Moussac, president of French Breeders Syndicate:

"I think it is a very selective sale. There is a lot of money for a few good horses, but they have to be well received. They have to have the pedigree and conformation and the vet work." About the high rate of buy-backs, he said, "I'm not surprised. Before the sale, I had the feeling it would be up 10 to 15 percent. I thought it would increase just like in the United States. There is an overproduction. The number of horses is up, but the number of buyers is the same or down and they have less money. It is quite tough for us. If you have the right horse it sells OK, but if not you have nothing."

Beat Hollow's half brother Yaralino was fast enough to lead throughout in last year's GIII Tanforan H. over 8 1/2 furlongs, even though he was by Caerleon, a reasonably strong influence for stamina. Although the name of Beat Hollow's sire, Sadler's Wells, is nowadays largely associated with stamina, it must be remembered that this very tough performer never quite managed to win over 1 1/2 miles, scoring his main successes over a mile (Irish 2000 Guineas) and 1 1/4 miles (Eclipse S. and Irish Champion S.). He occasionally sires top-class milers, such as Baratheia, Entrepreneur, King of Kings and Gossamer, and his brother Fairy King was a very good sire of milers. Beat Hollow's broodmare sire Dancing Brave was an impressive winner of the 2000 Guineas. When his trainer, Guy Harwood, was asked after the race about the Derby, he commented that, "He's got such speed that we've always thought of today as his race." Subsequent events showed that Dancing Brave was just as brilliant over 1 1/4 and 1 1/2 miles, and versatility was also the hallmark of Mill Reef and Sorbus, the two horses who combined to produce Beat Hollow's second dam, Bahamian. Mill Reef's exceptional achievements over middle distances were prefaced by a string of breathtaking displays over six and seven furlongs as a juvenile, while Sorbus was second in Irish 1000 Guineas prior to being demoted to second in the Irish Oaks. Although Wemyss Bight, the classic-winning dam of Beat Hollow, never tackled a distance shorter than 1 1/8 miles, she was blessed with excellent acceleration and her unraced sister, Hope, is the dam of Zenda, one of this year's best three-year-old fillies over a mile. While I would probably side with Bobby Frankel's assessment that a 1 1/8 miles is Beat Hollow's best distance, I hope the five-year-old will be given his chance to show how much speed he has.

MEDICATION TOPS ISSUES AT ROUND TABLE

Scot Waterman, the executive director of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association's Racing and Integrity and Drug Testing Task Force, was among the speakers featured in The Jockey Club's 50th Annual Round Table Conference at the Sheraton in Saratoga Springs Sunday. Issuing a report on the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium's progress concerning issues related to the development of a uniform medication policy, Dr. Waterman outlined the work of the three sub-Task Forces--Business and Organizational, Research Priority and Model Medication Policy. Strong support for reciprocity concerning medication policies was reiterated by horse owner Gary Bizantz, who commented, "Times have changed and owners are paying a huge price for many medications, some of which are given for the wrong purposes, some which are given to get an edge. I'm hopeful we can go back to thinking that the horse, safety and fairness is more important." According to Bizantz, the advantages of a uniform medication policy include the improved health and welfare of the horse, sports integrity, fuller fields and reduced costs for national drug testing. Another topic featured at the annual affair was globalization of the sport of racing. National Thoroughbred Racing Association Vice Chairman and Breeders' Cup President D. G. Van Clief Jr., who examined the organization's earlier efforts to establish the Breeders' Cup on an international level, outlined new strategies to be implemented in an effort to boost the global racing economy by increasing international sponsorship and visibility. Also on tap for the upcoming season is an agreement with the British network and wagering service *attheraces*, which is slated to provide coverage as well as commingled pari-mutual wagering on the Breeders' Cup World Thoroughbred Championships via *Sky Digital Television*.

LISTEN HERE INJURED Three-year-old **Listen Here** (Gulch), winner of the GII Amsterdam S. at Saratoga Race Course Aug. 3, fractured the sesamoids in his left front leg during a morning workout at Saratoga yesterday morning. "He is in his stall and stabilized with a Robert Jones bandage and brace, temporarily," trainer Bill Mott said, but added, "I think the humane thing to do would be to euthanize the horse." Mott said a decision on the colt's fate would be made by the end of the day. Listen Here has won four of his 10 career starts, including the GIII Nashua S. at two.

POMPEII RETIRED Trainer Elliot Walden announced yesterday that Grade I winner **Pompeii** (Broad Brush--Flying Heat, by Private Account) has been retired from racing after injuring an ankle while preparing for Saratoga's GI Personal Ensign H. Sept. 2. "She wrenched an ankle," Walden told the *Daily Racing Form*. "We're not going to make this race, and we felt like she's done enough to make a broodmare out of her." Fourth in her most recent appearance in the GIII Delaware H. July 21, the dark bay has one win from four starts this term, an allowance score at Churchill Downs May 26. Owned by WinStar Farm, the winner of nine races from 22 starts has earned \$717,288 during three seasons, taking both the GI Personal Ensign H. and the GIII Rare Treat H. last year.

Two-year-old action continues on Wednesday with the Listed Costcutter Roses S. over the minimum trip. Thursday's action centers around distaffers in the Listed European Breeders Fund Galtres S. over a mile and a half and G2 Peugeot Lowther S. for juvenile fillies over six furlongs, where G3 Queen Mary S. winner **Romantic Liason (GB)** (Primo Dominie {GB}) meets **Russian Rhythm (USA)** (Kingmambo {USA}), who impressed in winning the G3 Princess Margaret S. at Ascot July 27. The headline event Thursday's is the five-furlong G1 Victor Chandler Nunthorpe S., won last year by Mozart (Ire). **Dominica (GB)** (Alhaarth {Ire}) will be favoured to follow up her success in the G2 King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot.

BANKS HILL CAPS FINE WEEKEND FOR JUDDMONTE After the double success of **Beat Hol-low (GB)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}) and **Chiselling (USA)** (Woodman {USA}) in Saturday's GI Arlington Million and GI Secretariat S., respectively, in Chicago, **Banks Hill (GB)** (Danehill {USA}) added to the weekend success story of the Juddmonte Farms operation by taking Sunday's G1 Prix Jacques le Marois at Deauville. Prince Khaled Abdullah said Sunday, "Winning three Group and Grade I races in 24 hours with homebreds has to stand as one of the best moments as an owner and breeder."
