NAYEF BACK ON TOP

Nayef (Gulch), sent off the 6-4 favourite, avenged the head defeat by **Golan** (Ire) (Spectrum {Ire}) in the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot July 27 with a battling half-length defeat of that rival in yesterday's G1 Juddmonte International S. at York.

Overcoming a steady early gallop to sweep to the front with three furlongs remaining, he was not to be denied as Golan attacked time and again. "He's been working so well, and al-

CAN KAZZIA KEEP IT UP?

Dual Classic heroine **Kazzia** (Ger) (Zinaad {GB}) will attempt to maintain her unbeaten record when she goes postward this afternoon in the G1 Aston Upton Yorkshire Oaks. **Islington** (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) has emerged as a chief threat and bids to dethrone the G1 1000 Guineas and G1 Oaks winner. **Kazzia** is equal to the challenge, displaying the same street-fighting qualities that helped the tough **Ramruma** follow up her Epsom success here in 1999. She possesses inherent stamina, which she brought into play in the grueling battle with **Quarter Moon** (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) in rain-softened ground at Epsom. Connections will have been pleasantly surprised, then, that she had sufficient speed to deny her peers in the mile Classic at Newmarket. The uniting factor in both performances was her will to win and, more importantly, her desire not to be passed. **Islington** displayed her potent turn of acceleration, dulled by the testing conditions at Epsom, over the 10 furlongs **Goodwood** in the G1 **Nassau** S. She appears to possess the natural speed of her brother **Greek Dance** (Ire), who despite being a Group 1 performer over this mile and a half, was at his best over shorter. Her performance here when winning the G3 **Musidora** S. May 14 was all the more meritorious as she was keen in the early stages, had to quicken early in the straight and face a strong headwind when making the best of her way home up this wide starry space.

NAYEF EVENS THE SCORE Jockey Richard Hills was confident throughout the race as he pulled Nayef upsides the rabbit **Starbourne (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) early in the straight. While he asked the smooth-travelling colt to take command, Kieren Fallon was looking for a gap on the inner to challenge on Golan. Denied that opportunity, he was forced to arrive wide as Nayef increased the pressure from the front. For a brief period it looked as if Golan would go past as he had at Ascot, but Nayef gave more against the rail, asserting in the final furlong for a hard-fought success. The regally bred four-year-old was scoring for the third time at the highest level, having taken the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic at Nad al Sheba Mar. 23 and G1 Champion S. at Newmarket in October. "Willie Carson used to say that Nashwan was at his best over a mile and a quarter and it was only his class that got him further, and I think that is the same with Nayef," Tregoning said. "He could go for either the G1 Champion S. [at Newmarket Oct. 19] or to Chicago, but the options are wide open." Owner Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum was delighted with the achievement. "He will go for either Champion S. [at Newmarket or the G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown Sept. 7].," he said. "If he goes to Chicago he might go on the dirt, but it's a long way to travel and he has been on the go since March. He is a better horse now on the dirt than on grass."

Bandari had to battle to follow up his success in the G3 Gordon S. at Goodwood July 30, but he responded to every call to take this trial for the G1 St Leger at Doncaster Sept. 14. Trainer Mark Johnston, recording his 100th winner of the 2002 season, suggested that is where he will head, "That's his toughest race and not how we want to see him run as he's still immature," he said. "Still, it will do him good and all indications are that he would have won easier had he gone further." Taken to the front early, he set a moderate pace there which allowed Johnny Murtagh the chance to challenge early in the straight on Highest, who had tracked him throughout. Passed momentarily by that rival inside the final quarter-mile, he rallied gamely against the rail to get back in front at the furlong marker. Asserting from there, he had enough to hold Highest and the fast-finishing Bollin Eric. Bandari will be enjoying a second crack at a British Classic at Doncaster, having disappointed when eighth in the G1 Epsom Derby June 8. : "At Epsom it was a rough race and he had to battle to get into the race and then run another race again when he had got there," Johnston explained. "[Jockey] Richard [Hills] said in hindsight he went too slow, but that is because we told him to relax him, so he was loathe to get after him. It is up to Sheikh Hamdan, but he will clearly get the trip and we would have to think about the St Leger."

Boreas swooped from rear and held off all challenges to record his first Group success. Settled in last place early as Movie King (Ire) (Catrail) set a generous tempo for stablemate Jardines Lookout (Ire) (Fourstars Allstar), he always travelled easily and as the latter faded tamely in the straight, it was left to jockey Jamie Spencer to commit passing the three-furlong marker. Boreas responded to his rider's urgings from there, showing tenacity to ward off the attentions of Cover Up in the closing stages. Boreas was scoring for the first time this year, having showed improved form when beaten 1 1/2 lengths by Zindabad (Fr) when second in the G2 Yorkshire Cup over this course May 16 and finishing runner-up to Daliapour (Ire) in the G3 Curragh Cup June 29. "He deserved that as he is very very consistent and has been knocking at the door at Group level," said trainer Luca Cumani. "He is pretty versatile in terms of distance, which is not important, but he likes a good galloping straight. He may head to Doncaster now [for the G3 Doncaster Cup Sept. 12]."

Mister Links, winner of the G3 July S. at Newmarket July 10, sets the standard in this competitive contest. He had to work to defend his unbeaten record that day, but was firmly on top of stable companion Tacitus (Ire) at the end. He holds strong claims here of providing trainer Richard Hannon with his fifth success since 1988, after that of Sharp n'Early (GB), Rock City (Ire), River Falls (GB) and Bannister (GB). However, he has to emulate last year's winner Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) in defying a three-pound penalty and that may anchor him against some unexposed types in **Country Reel** and **Masterpoint**. Country Reel, successful on his debut in a Newmarket maiden Aug. 1, bids to provide David Loder with his second winner after Abou Zouz in 1996, while Masterpoint, who beat the smart Winisk River (Ire) in a Newmarket maiden May 25, is aiming to provide a belated first Gimcrack winner for Mark Johnston. **Revenue**, who stepped up to this trip when second to Elusive City in the G2 Richmond S. at Goodwood July 30, has the speed to expose any weaknesses in his rivals based on his performance when winning the Windsor Castle S. at Royal Ascot June 21. He also hails from the Richard Hannon stable and it will be interesting to see how he fares with his stable companion on three pounds better terms this time.

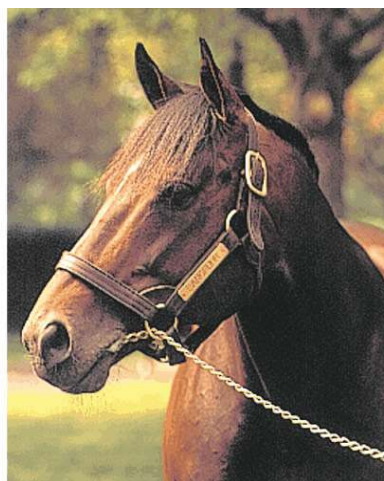

Saturday, Saratoga

TRAVERS S.-GI, \$1,000,000, 3yo, 1 1/4m

Trainers Bobby Frankel and Ken McPeek are equally confident and are looking forward to this Saturday's "Mid-Summer Derby" at Saratoga with **Medaglia d'Oro** (El Prado {Ire}) and **Repent** (Louis Quatorze), respectively. The blowout winner in his most recent effort of the GII Jim Dandy S. Aug. 4, the former can cement his position near or at the top of the division with another strong performance on the weekend, something his trainer fully expects. "I think he has made the step to the next level," Frankel told media yesterday assembled on a conference call. "The Jim Dandy was really the first time that I've had a chance to train him instead of just run, run, run. I'm not really worried about anyone in the race. If he runs his race, he'll win." Should War Emblem turn in a sub-par performance when he takes on the older set in this weekend's GI Pacific Classic, would a win from Medaglia d'Oro put him into Eclipse consideration?

"I'm really not that interested in the championship," Frankel explained. "I am interested in winning as much money with him as we can and to increase his stud value." Repent is unraced since his runner-up finish to War Emblem in the GII Illinois Derby in early April, but McPeek relishes the opportunity to return to action on a grand stage. "We're in the ballgame," he said. "He's been doing extremely well. I have no concerns about his fitness level. Medaglia d'Oro is going to be tough to beat if he runs back to that last race, but if they set a fast pace, I think Repent will be very tough on the wire. This horse is as good as any three-year-old in the nation. His owners think so and I think so, but he has to prove it." Edgar Prado, who guided Sarava to a win in the Belmont S. for McPeek, has the call for the first time aboard Repent on Saturday.

Sunday, Del Mar

PACIFIC CLASSIC-GI, \$1,000,000, 3yo/up, 1 1/4m

War Emblem (Our Emblem) caused his connections some concern when he blitzed through a five-furlong breeze in :57 3/5, much faster than trainer Bob Baffert was looking for. "When we went to break him off, it seemed clear, but he hooked another horse on the rail and rambled through the first quarter in :22. [Exercise rider] Dana [Barnes] got him under control after a half mile and it looks like he came out of it OK." The dark bay was caught galloping out six furlongs in 1:11, seven-eighths in 1:23 and change and the mile in 1:37 and change. Baffert said that the decision to run the Derby and Preakness winner at Del Mar instead of the Travers was made on Sunday. "He likes it here at Del Mar and we weren't excited about the double ship," the conditioner explained, citing the cross-country trip two weeks ago for the Haskell. "If I could beam him out there, then I'd run in the Travers, but Point Given and Congaree both ran there and were both injured, so that's in the back of my mind, too." War Emblem figures a slight favorite over GII Swaps S. victor **Came Home** (Gone West), Santa Anita H. winner **Milwaukee Brew** (Wild Again), Hollywood Gold Cup hero **Sky Jack** (Jaklin Klugman). **Bosque Redondo** (Mane Minister) is also a confirmed starter and could ensure a sharp pace for his stablemate Came Home.

DEAUVILLE RESULTS REPLICATE U.S.

When a sale drops 26 percent in gross and 29 percent in average, with 11 percent fewer sold than last year, it would be understandable if that was not regarded as good news. But in the context of the 2002 yearling market thus far, it's not particularly bad news, either.

With nine more sold than last year (but 60 more offered), Deauville's first three days were off 8¼-million Euros, and the average dropped from €142,000 to €100,736. The first three days' clearance rate dropped from 80 percent to 69 percent. The three North American summer sales also dropped 26 percent in gross, but 35 percent in average, and the clearance rate was only 63 percent. So, in that sense, Deauville's first three days actually slightly outperformed the market. And, after 10 straight years of virtually unbroken gains--including the gross and average both doubling between 1997-2001, like everywhere else it wasn't a question of whether there would be a contraction, but when, and how much. In 2002 terms, Deauville's results so far are palatable--and they did set a new sales record, the €2-million Indian Ridge filly bought by Sheikh Maktoum.

All Roads Lead to Keeneland September

It's the time of year when a winner or two--especially a good winner--can make a big difference to a sire whose first two-year-olds are racing, because there are now only 19 days left for a sire to make an impression before the September Sale gets underway. If you just take the top 20 on the current North American freshman sire list (see p7, Table 1), 12 of the 20 stand in Kentucky. Those 12 alone have 407 yearlings catalogued in September--almost 10 percent of the sale. Especially in a market going down, freshman sires whose names haven't popped up on the radar screens are likely to suffer severely--so a placing at least in the top 20 has got to be a big help.

The freshman sire who is absolutely guaranteed to have a big sale is leading North American freshman sire Elusive Quality, who has 37 yearlings catalogued. Sheikh Mohammed's been pretty quiet at the yearling sales so far this year, but he campaigned this son of Gone West who has made a mighty impressive start at stud, and it will be a surprise if his team isn't scouting for some top yearlings by him. That will just be an added boost, because, from what I've seen, this fellow could be a top sire. You've also got to be impressed with third-placed Distorted Humor (20 catalogued), a son of Forty Niner who stands at WinStar Farm. True, he does only have four winners, compared to Elusive Quality's 13, but two of the four are SWs, including the impressive undefeated Saratoga GSW Awesome Humor.

Ashford rolled out three prolific possibles at last year's yearling sales, and--though it's a bit early to be dogmatic since none of the three has sired a SW yet--all three might work. That will be a relief to the sellers of the 143 September yearlings by the trio: Grand Slam (61) and Tale of the Cat (43) rank 4-5 in the current freshman sire table, with nine winners each; and King of Kings (39) has seven winners, another nine placed, and has jumped from 20th place to 12th this month. Others who have made good moves forward in the last three weeks include: Awesome Again (29), 15th to 8th; Favorite Trick (33), 24th to 16th--though he has just one winner to go with his multiple California stakes-placed filly; and Coronado's Quest (32), up to 18th, with three winners in the past week. Swain (26) hasn't hit the top 40 yet, but had the impressive winner of the Washington Singer S.-Listed last week at Newbury; they may not be precocious, but they might be pretty good, too.

As far as September overall is concerned, we can take a wild stab and predict it will suffer a 26 percent drop in gross--the same as the U.S. summer sales and Deauville's first three days. In the unlikely event that the results are that predictable, we'll know where it stands after the first Tuesday. The last two years Book One has accounted for 56 percent and 54 percent of the sale's total gross, respectively. If Book One drops 26 percent, it will gross just over \$100-million; if the whole sale drops 26 percent, the gross will be \$188-million. So the most important measurement we'll have to look at will be to see where the Book One gross ends up, over or under \$100-million.


Among European freshman sires (see p7, Table 2), the unheralded Averti has now claimed top spot, courtesy of his daughter Wunder's Dream's impressive win in the G3 Molecomb S. at Goodwood; she clashes tomorrow with Queen Mary S. winner Romantic Liaison and Princess Margaret S. winner Russian Rhythm is a very hot edition of the G2 Lowther at York. Averti, Danetime, and Air Express each have over £150,000 in progeny earnings now. Four others are now above £100,000 in progeny earnings, including Desert Prince--by far the top commercial prospect in this group; he now has 10 winners and ranks fifth, but they look as if they could figure pretty strongly when the good seven-furlong races come up.

Big Guns, Big Wins

Two long-established and well-respected Arab operations have had huge weeks. As Andrew Caulfield detailed Tuesday, Prince Khalid Abdullah's Juddmonte had three G1 winners in 24 hours and Sheikh Hamdan had a big double at York yesterday, with Nayef winning the G1 Juddmonte International and Bandari (from his sire Alhaarth's first crop) scoring in the G2 Great Voltigeur. The Juddmonte looked a race with three serious future stallions in it: Nayef will surely succeed his half-brothers Nashwan and Unfuwain at Nunnery; Golan is already ticketed for Coolmore; and don't forget yesterday's third, Rahy's son Noverre. He has the right profile to make a sire, too.

DEAUVILLE DECLINES The market continued to slow down on the fourth day of the Deauville August Yearling Sale. With 66.67 percent of horses sold (81percent last year), the gross stood at €1,693,000, a drop of 45 percent with the same number of horses going through the ring, 78 this year, compared to 79 in 2001. The average was also down at €32,558, 28 percent less than a year ago. Over the first four days of the sale the aggregate is now down by 30 percent and the average is down by 29 percent. Top price on the day was €80,000 for Hip 368, a grey filly by Highest Honor (Fr) out of the winning Lyphard mare Lyphard's Dream. Her second dam Dial Dream is a half sister to MGISW Al Nasr (Fr). From the consignment of Haras de Fresnay Le Buffard, she was bought by Jacques Rossi, the leading trainer in Marseilles. Carlos Lerner bid €77,000 for an Anabaa colt out of Star Aline (GB) (Shardari {GB}) offered by Haras de la Reboursiere et de Montaigu. Most of the activity was generated by French trainers and bloodstock agents as only eight of the 52 horses were sold to foreign interests. The sale's final session gets underway this morning at 11am.

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

There is no doubt that El Gran Senor was a great racehorse. The son of Northern Dancer won seven of eight starts, including a vintage renewal of the G1 2000 Guineas (in which he defeated Chief Singer, Lear Fan and Rainbow Quest); the G1 Irish Derby, at the chief expense of Rainbow Quest; and the G1 Dewhurst Stakes. In fact, El Gran Senor may well have retired undefeated had he not gone down by inches to Secreto in the G1 Epsom Derby after being given what was generally regarded as an over-confident ride.

El Gran Senor might have also passed into history as a great sire had it not been for fertility problems which saw him sire only 392 foals from 14 years at stud. Of those 392 foals, no less than 52 won black-type events, giving a world-class 13 percent stakes winners from foals. These included champion sprinter Lit de Justice; Rodrigo de Triano, a champion and classic winner in England; Helmsman, a champion at two in Ireland, and a GISW in North America; as well as other Group/Grade I winners Kundalini, Senor Tomas, Spanish Fern, Belmez, Corrazona, Saratoga Springs, Le Triton, Al Hareb and Toussaud, a remarkable haul when one considers that his fertility problems discouraged breeders from sending him their best mares.

It appears that El Gran Senor might also be every bit as good a broodmare sire. His daughters have produced 98 starters to date, and no less than 18 of

them have won graded stakes, including the Group/Grade I winners Grand Slam, Poplar Bluff, Vicar, Honest Lady, Chester House and this weekend's GI Secretariat S. winner, Chiselling. Honest Lady, Chester House and Chiselling are all out of Toussaud, who now owns the remarkable record of producing four graded-stakes winners--including three Grade I winners--from her first five foals.

Toussaud was also one of El Gran Senor's best on the racetrack. Winner over colts of the G3 Van Gheest Criterion Stakes in England, Toussaud won four of nine starts in North America, including the GI Gamely H., GII American H. and GII Wilshire H. El Gran Senor actually managed to get Toussaud's dam, Image of Reality, in foal two years running, the first mating resulting in Toussaud's sister, the GIII Vineland H. victress Navarra.

As Image of Reality's name suggests, she was a daughter of In Reality. A graded stakes winner herself in the GII Milady H., Image of Reality traced to the noted Aga Khan tap-root mare Teresina via her granddam Ortalan, a half-sister to the Matron and Spinaway S. winner Candalita, and the GI Gulfstream Park H. winner, Hail the Pirates.

There is some very intelligent inbreeding and linebreeding in the pedigrees of Chiselling himself, his dam and granddam. Image of Reality's sire, In Reality, was inbred 3x3 to War Relic, who in turn was inbred 3x3 to Rock Sand and Fairy Gold, two of the grandparents of Man o' War. Image of Reality's dam was by Cornish Prince, and his grandsire, Eight Thirty, is also inbred to Rock Sand and Fairy Gold. In tail-female line, Cornish Prince goes back to Adargatis, a dual classic winner who was also three-parts sister to the great matron La Troienne.

El Gran Senor was a shrewd choice to reinforce the Cornish Prince segment of the pedigree. Whereas the dam of Cornish Prince was by Eight Thirty (inbred to two grandparents of Man o' War, and having a three-parts sister to War Admiral as his granddam) and tracing to a three-parts-sister to La Troienne, El Gran Senor was out of a mare inbred to La Troienne through her granddaughter and grandson, Busanda and Mr. Busher, both by War Admiral. In addition, El Gran Senor also brought in Alibhai, a son of Teresina and a three-parts brother to Image of Reality's fourth dam Teretania.

Chiselling's sire, Woodman, has drifted in and out of commercial favor, and his record is almost the opposite of El Gran Senor's in that the tremendous number of mares he has covered has hurt his statistics and rather obscured just how good a stallion he is (larger books to increase opportunity, but because only a limited number of mares will have pedigrees and/or physiques which suit the stallion, opportunity doesn't increase in direct proportion to the number of mares covered). Although Woodman's tally of stakes winners stands at only seven percent, he comes up with a top horse virtually every year, and they include North American champions and classic winners Hansel and Timber Country; Hector Protector and Bosra Sham, both classic winners and champions in Europe; Canadian champion and classic winner Woodcarver; champion Japanese sprinter and miler Hishi Akebono; champion French two-year-old colt Way of Light, and other Group/Grade I winners Hula Angel, Ciro and Mahogany Hall. This year, in addition to Chiselling, he is also represented by one of Europe's best three-year-olds, the GI Eclipse Stakes winner Hawk Wing, and South African Group 1 scorer Timber Trader.

Breeding Toussaud to Woodman was a very logical move as it not only resulted in a three-parts brother to her first foal, the GI Arlington Million winner Chester House (by Woodman's sire, Mr. Prospector), but also strengthened the La Troienne background of El Gran Senor's pedigree. Like El Gran Senor, Woodman is out of a Buckpasser mare and like El Gran Senor, his dam is also inbred to three-parts sisters from the La Troienne family, in his case, Busanda and Striking, who are 2x3 in the pedigree of Woodman's dam, Playmate. So in all, Chiselling has Buckpasser 3x4, and the sister/brother Striking and Mr. Busher 5x6, with their three-parts sister Busanda 4x5. And behind all this La Troienne is a strain of her three-parts sister, Adargatis.

Accumulating the La Troienne strain also worked when Toussaud was bred to Seattle Slew, who is out of a mare inbred to the War Admiral/La Troienne cross, to get the excellent filly Honest Lady. A very similar mating produced graded-stakes winner Indygo Shiner who is by A.P. Indy (a Seattle Slew son with Buckpasser in his dam) out of Toussaud's sister, Navarra. Two other stakes winners out of El Gran Senor mares have inbreeding to Buckpasser, and there is also a stakes winner by Woodman's son, Mujtahid, out of a mare El Gran Senor's son, Al Hareb, and so bred on very similar lines to Chiselling.

ALBERT CLAY DIES Breeder and industry figure-head Albert G. Clay passed away at his home Tuesday morning. He was 85 years old. The native Kentuckian helped found the American Horse Council, Inc., in 1969 and served as the association's secretary for many years. Clay was also a founding member of the University of Kentucky Equine Research Foundation and served as chair from 1988 to 1998. As a breeder, Clay bred 20 stakes winners, including Grade I winners Albert the Great, George Navonod, Gorgeous, Pompeii and Seaside Attraction. He is survived by his wife, Lorraine Newlin Clay; two sons, Robert N. Clay and John W. Clay; a daughter, Charlotte Clay; and seven grandchildren. SKIMMING TO STUD IN CALIFORNIA

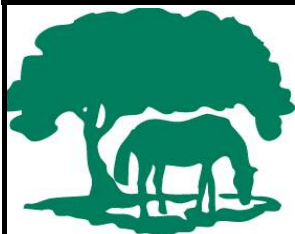
Juddmonte's homebred winner of back-to-back GI Pacific Classics, **Skimming** (Nureyev--Skimble, by Lyphard) has been retired and will enter stud in 2003 at Cardiff Stud Farm near Atascadero, California. The six-year-old will stand as the property of a syndicate for \$7,500. "We are thrilled to secure a stallion of this stature for California breeders," said Robert Harmon, co-manager of the syndicate. "We were looking for a horse that would keep the best California mares at home and we believe Skimming will do that. His sizzling internal fractions indicate the brilliant speed and class Skimming possessed while defeating Grade I competition at classic distances." Out of the multiple graded-stakes winner Skimble, who earned most of her \$777,680 on the turf, Skimming broke his maiden on the all-weather at Wolverhampton before transferring to Bobby Frankel's shedrow. The compact bay was brilliant at Del Mar, completing the GI Pacific Classic-GII San Diego H. double in both 2000 and 2001, defeating subsequent Horse of the Year Tiznow in 2000. He has not started since running second in the GII Goodwood H. at Santa Anita Oct. 7. Skimming's career record stands at 20-8-5-1 with earnings of \$2,286,598.
