'MID-SUMMER DERBY' ATTRACTS NINE

GII Jim Dandy S. winner **Medaglia d'Oro** (El Prado {Ire}) has been installed the overwhelming 2-5 favorite to have owner Edmund Gann's blue and white colors painted on the infield canoe following the running of Saturday's GI Travers S. at Saratoga. "Nobody is 2-5," trainer Bobby Frankel said following yesterday's post position draw. "They still need to run around the track." Still, those odds could prove generous, given the current form of the handsome dark bay colt. An excellent second to Sarava in the GI Belmont S. June 8, he was freshened a bit off that effort with an eye on the rest of the year. His second season commenced with an eye-popping, 13 3/4-length victory in the Jim Dandy, earning him a divisional-best Beyer Speed Figure of 120. Frankel is not concerned about Saratoga's reputation as a graveyard of favorites. "I expect him to win this race," the conditioner said. "If he doesn't, I'll be disappointed. The Travers will tell how good he is." Adding a good deal of intrigue to the race is the return of GII Louisiana Derby winner **Repent** (Louis Quatorze). Unraced since suffering an injury in the GII Illinois Derby Apr. 13, the Ken McPeck trainee has trained well for his comeback, but McPeck is a bit concerned about the shape of the race. "If Medaglia d'Oro cruises up front, he's going to be very tough to beat," he said. "I'd like to see someone keep him honest." Another entrant who could benefit from a hot pace is **Like A Hero** (Pleasant Colony). A confirmed closer, the bay finished a respectable third to War Emblem in the GI Haskell H. at Monmouth Park last time out Aug. 4.

Islington reigns at York.....

Islington was keen on the way down to the start and in the early stages as she raced in third under Kieren Fallon off the generous pace set by **Starbourne (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells). As that filly carved out furious fractions, she settled in Fallon's hands and travelled with ease while tracking Kazzia and Frankie Dettori, who chose to ignore the rabbit in front. The winner moved alongside Kazzia at the top of the straight and that pair made their challenge in tandem to pass Starbourne with three furlongs remaining. Islington took command as the favourite faltered, and within a few strides, was clear. Kept up to her work inside the final furlong, she was never in danger from there, striding clear as **Guadalupe (Ger)** (Monsun {Ger}) stayed on well to grab second late. "I took a chance when I went on three furlongs out, which was probably too soon," explained Fallon. "She travelled well and stayed very well as they went a good gallop. We always thought she was a very good filly and she has the speed for a mile." Having taken a Newbury maiden Apr. 19, Islington booked her place in the Epsom Oaks line-up when taking the G3 Musidora S. over this course May 14. She bounced back from her unplaced effort in that Classic to win the G1 Nassau S. at Goodwood Aug. 3 in impressive fashion. Arlington or Longchamp could be on the agenda now, according to Stoute. "The GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf [Oct. 26] is definitely a possibility, as is the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe [Oct. 6]," he said. Islington emulated her dam Hellenic (GB), who in 1990 followed the success seven years earlier of Sun Princess (GB) for her late owner Lord Weinstock. "He loved this filly", said trainer Sir Michael Stoute. "It is the electrifying acceleration she has got that makes her special. The ground was against her in the Oaks and she came back very sore. I knew she would stay as her dam was second in the St Leger and this race." Simon Crisford, racing manager to Godolphin, commented on Kazzia's fourth-place finish: "We have given her an easy time since Epsom and I think she got found out a little. Frankie [Dettori] said that she wasn't enjoying the firm ground." Kazzia was subsequently lengthened to 5-1 from 9-4 by Coral Eurobet for the G1 St Leger at Doncaster Sept. 14, while Islington was made the 5-1 favourite by that firm for the Breeders' Cup and 8-1 for the Arc. **Mellow Park (Ire)** (In the Wings {GB}), winner of the G3 Lancashire Oaks, is set to be retired after finishing eighth, according to trainer Jeremy Noseda.

DOMINICA LEADS KNAVESMIRE DASH

Britain's sharpest sprinters head back into battle on the five furlongs of the Knavesmire this afternoon to contest the G1 Victor Chandler Nunthorpe S. **Dominica (GB)** (Alhaarth {Ire}) bids to uphold the form of the G2 King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot June 18, having made all there to beat the fast-finishing **Continent (GB)** (Lake Coniston {Ire}) and **Kyllachy (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}) by a head and a half-length. But she prefers slower ground, on which she won the G3 Cornwallis S. at Ascot in October, to the sort she will encounter today. More in her favour is the record of King's Stand winners here, with Dayjur, Pivotal (GB) and Nuclear Debate all having completed the double since 1990. Continent subsequently beat **Bahamian Pirate** (Housebuster) by a half-length in the G1 July Cup at Newmarket over a furlong further July 11, where the hold-up specialist got the openings he needed. He may find coming from behind more of a problem over this course on a track that favours front-runners. Kyllachy deserves another chance on the basis of his run in the King's Stand, when he was forced wide for his challenge in the closing stages. He was impressive when winning the G2 Temple S. at Sandown June 3, having taken the G3 Palace House S. at Newmarket May 4.

Russian Rhythm and **Romantic Liason** go head-to-head here in a fascinating six-furlong dash which should go a long way towards deciding the title of champion two-year-old filly of 2002. Both unbeaten, they represent the different schools of the two-year-old division, with Romantic Liason the sharp and early type as opposed to the slower-developing, progressive Russian Rhythm. Having impressed when winning the G3 Princess Margaret S. at Ascot July 27, that filly bids to emulate her trainer's 2000 winner Enthused, the only filly to win both races since 1985. Romantic Liason, who was imperious in winning the G3 Queen Mary S. at Royal Ascot June 19, will have to fare better than her half-sister Romantic Myth (GB), who was equally impressive in winning the Queen Mary, but found Enthused too strong here. Romantic Liason stepped up from winning a Lingfield maiden on the polytrack May 28 to turn the Ascot contest into a procession, beating subsequent G2 Prix Robert Papin winner Never a Doubt (GB) by 3 1/2 lengths. She bids to emulate the 1998 heroine Bint Allayl (GB) and last year's winner Queen's Logic (Ire), who followed up here after success in the Royal meeting's dash. **Wunders Dream (Ire)**, who showed natural speed in winning the G3 Molecomb S. at Goodwood Aug. 1, will bid to upset the favoured duo, but has a sixth furlong to contend with for the first time and that may be beyond her capabilities.

Country Reel held off the challenge of the penalised Mister Links late to maintain his unbeaten record. Despite the fact that the majority of the Loder stable's runners have needed their first run this year, he was sharp enough to score on his debut in a Newmarket maiden Aug. 1. Held up in fourth on the rail early this time as Revenue (Ire) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) blazed the trail in front, he was maneuvered wide by jockey Frankie Dettori for his challenge inside the final quarter-mile. Passing the long-time leader at the furlong marker, he had to battle to deny Membership, who stayed on well up the rail, before asserting over Mister Links, who attacked too late. "He's done it very well," said David Loder, collecting his second renewal of this contest after Abou Zouz in 1996. "He's very lazy and I don't think he'll ever win by five or six lengths--he only ever just does enough. I thought it was a bit bold going for the G1 Prix Morny [at Deauville Sunday] and thought the Gimcrack more appropriate. In my mind he would probably get further, but Frankie says we should keep him at this trip, so the G1 Middle Park S. [at Newmarket Oct. 3] would be an obvious target. I think he wouldn't mind a bit of cut in the ground."

Kafwain showed gameness and heart second time out with a 1 1/4-length score in a five-furlong maiden at Hollywood June 22, but was unable to duplicate that performance in his graded stakes debut last time in the GIII Hollywood Juvenile Championship July 20. Sent off the second-choice to finally get the job done this time, the dark bay broke alertly, settled in fourth behind early leader and stablemate Icecoldbeeratreds, passed that foe entering the stretch, drew off quickly and maintained his focus late for the game victory. "He was very good today," said winning jockey Victor Espinoza. "He broke good and I put him right in behind the speed. He's still a little green, but he's getting better." According to trainer Bob Baffert, "He was exhausted. I think he went after Icecoldbeeratreds a little too early. He should have sat a little longer. This track is pretty demanding right now."

DEAUVILLE FINALE The Agence Francaise Deauville August Yearling Sale concluded on a brighter note, compared to earlier sessions. With an equivalent number of horses in the session (141 compared to 138 in 2001) and a similar percentage of animals sold (61.7 percent to 61.59 percent in 2001), the gross on the day was down by "only" 10 percent at €1,998,000 and the average went down by 11 percent at €22,966. Top price on the day went to Broadhurst Agency of young bloodstock agent Laurent Benoit who paid €78,000 for Hip 554, a bay filly by Vettori (Ire) out of the Group-placed mare Dame d'Harvard (Quest for Fame {GB}), consigned by the Haras de Bernesq. Second-highest price on the day was the €77,000 paid by French-based, Belgian-born trainer Jean Marc Capitte for Hip 521, a bay filly by Orpen (Ire) out of Wenge (Housebuster) from the family of Group 1 stakes winners Rainbow Quest, Warning (GB), Commander in Chief (GB) and Yashmak. For the five days, 555 horses went through the ring, of which 66.31 percent were sold, compared to 75.25 percent in 2001. The total aggregate stands at €26,701,000, down 27.5 percent from last year, and the average at €72,557, down by 26 percent.

SAKHEE MAY HEAD TO LEOPARDSTOWN

Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum revealed on Tuesday that **Sakhee** (Bahri) may yet run in the G1 Ireland the Food Island Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown Sept. 7. Having suffered a shock defeat by Wellbeing (GB) in the G3 Prix Gontaut-Biron at Deauville Aug. 10, it was feared that the five-year-old would be retired. However, Sheikh Hamdan revealed Tuesday at York that the International Classifications highweight may race on after treatment to the knee that has proved problematic throughout Sakhee's career. "He is having treatment after Deauville, where he was carrying his head up in the air and was sweating before the race," he said. "He is not the Sakhee of last year, but I believe the Irish Champion S. was what they were aiming him at. The trainer is much happier now and after they work Sakhee we will see in a week."

GOSSAMER READY FOR AUTUMN CAMPAIGN

Gossamer (GB) (Sadler's Wells), winner of the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas at The Curragh May 26, is set to re-appear in either the G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp Sept. 8 or the G3 Matron S. at Leopardstown Sept. 7, according to trainer Luca Cumani. Despite Cumani's belief that the filly was equally effective on fast ground, Gossamer was disappointing when 11th behind Sophisticat in the G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot June 21, having powered away with the Curragh Classic in testing conditions. "She is really well and has been working really well," said Cumani. "It would be foolish to keep going against the tide and running her on fast ground, but I have seen her work just as well on good and faster ground at home. She will run in the Matron or the Moulin, whichever has the softest ground."

THIS DATE IN HISTORY...

August 23, 1974...Frank Whiteley-trained **Ruffian** won the Spinaway S. by 13 lengths at Saratoga Racecourse, ending her two-year-old season with a five-for-five record. Ruffian was subsequently voted Champion Juvenile Filly of 1974.

August 24, 1968...Carrying 134 pounds, **Dr. Fager** set the world record for a mile in the Washington Park H. at Arlington Park. The time for his 10-length victory was 1:32 1/5. The previous record was 1:32 3/5, set by 3-year-old Buckpasser on June 25, 1966 at Arlington Park.

August 24, 1989...Jockey **Larry Snyder** won his 6,000th career race, aboard a filly named Speedski, in the first race at Louisiana Downs. Snyder was the sixth rider in history to accomplish that feat.

August 25, 1987...**Julie Krone** won her 1,000th career race aboard Tiger Higgins in the second race at Monmouth Park.

August 26, 1972...**Secretariat** won the Hopeful S. by five lengths at Saratoga Racecourse for his second stakes win in as many tries.
