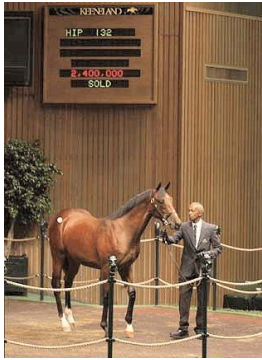

**DANZIG COLT TOPS KEENELAND DAY 1**

**Hip #132** *Horsephotos*

\$2.4 million to get Hip #132, the top seller at the opening session of the Keeneland September Yearling Sale in Lexington yesterday. The bay, a May 12 foal from the consignment of Helen Alexander's Middlebrook Farm, agent, is by Danzig out of MGSW Aquilegia (Alydar), making him a full-brother to European Group winner and multiple Group 1-placed Bertolini and a half-brother to SW Amelia (Dixieland Band). His second dam is the blue hen mare Courtly Dee, who produced eight stakes winners, including champion Althea and Grade I winners Ali Oop and Ketoh. "The pedigree was exceptional and he truly is an outstanding individual," Lukas said. "We'll have to see where we're going with him. I'm going to have to get together with some of my people on this one." Alexander, who is selling 20 lots at Keeneland September, was more than pleased with the sale. "We were thrilled," she said. "I would hesitate to say we ever expect to have one sell like that--you can only hope. But he's a very nice horse with a good pedigree and people liked him. If we'd gotten a million, I wouldn't have been over the moon, but I would have been satisfied." Alexander, who races in partnership with her mother, Helen Groves, and her sister, Dorothy Alexander Matz, campaigned Aquilegia. "We pretty much sell all the colts and keep the fillies out of that family," she explained. "If we keep a colt, it's because he had a bad X-ray or was an RNA. The only time we would sell a filly from that family would be in a year when we didn't have any colts to sell." Middlebrook, the leading consignor by average yesterday, sold all four lots they sent through the ring for a total of \$4,825,000 and an average of \$1,206,250, although Hip #165, a filly by Unbridled's Song, was purchased for \$200,000 by Helen Groves. They also accounted for the third-highest priced colt, a son of Deputy Minister who brought \$1,650,000 from leading buyer John Ferguson Bloodstock.

**Getting More Reserved...**

Becky Thomas, who buys yearlings to pinhook, was also on the other end of the market yesterday, selling horses with Lakland LLC as consignor. She said the key to getting her horses sold was setting realistic reserves. "The horses that we are selling from our breeding entity aren't making a whole lot, but they are certainly selling," Thomas said. "We kept pretty conservative reserves on them because we thought the market was going to be down. I was very realistic--we placed them at half what we thought they should be at. It is becoming a thinner market, as our two-year-old market already has." Still, Thomas was having a tough time buying during yesterday's opener. "We've been unsuccessful with the horses we're trying to buy," Thomas said. "We bought two horses that were buybacks...it is very difficult for us to buy these kind of horses."

**Taylor Made Happy With Day 1 Results...**

While they didn't have a seven-figure yearling, Taylor Made Sales Agency were satisfied with their opening-day results. The leading consignor by gross on the day, they sold 31 hips for a total of \$6,470,000 and an average of \$208,709. "People have readjusted their mindset and we're getting our horses sold," Duncan Taylor said. "I don't know how many buybacks there are, but for us, they are down. We have less than the year before. The sale is going better than I anticipated." Taylor Made was the second-leading consignor by gross at last year's September Sale, selling 239 yearlings for \$23,699,800, an average of \$95,179.

**Dance Stable Rebuilding...**

Laddie Dance had a tough meet at Saratoga. He lost one of his string to a bowed tendon while another, the \$650,000 Keeneland September yearling **Peppermint Kid** (Kingmambo), who won an allowance race on the turf at Belmont Park in July, had to be euthanized. But, undaunted, he was a major force at yesterday's session. With Mrs. M.J. Dance Jr. signing the tickets, he was the fourth-leading buyer by gross, purchasing four yearlings for a total of \$2,950,000, an average of \$737,500. "Saratoga was not too kind," Dance said, adding, "We're quite happy with what we got [yesterday] and we're happy with the prices we paid. We're restocking." Dance's biggest buy was Hip #108, a colt by Storm Cat out of SW Unbridled Wind (Unbridled), who is herself a full sister to champion Banshee Breeze. The dark bay, from the Mill Ridge Sales consignment, brought \$1 million.

**First Session Wrap-Up...**

As expected, the figures for the opening session were down, with the gross off 16.4 percent, the average down 33.1 percent and the median dropping 32 percent. Last year, there were nine seven-figure yearlings on opening day, but only six this year. But there were fewer buybacks, with 77 failing to reach their reserves this year compared to 88 last year. "The market has shown an adjustment of about a third all year," Geoffrey Russell, Keeneland's director of sales, said. "The consignors have done a good job in adjusting their expectations. The major players were buying...they just seemed to have less money to spend." He added, "When the breeders planned these matings three years ago, the world was a much different place. But the market, overall, has been consistent."

While the talented filly set quick fractions, the rest of the field sat back and waited for her to tire, but she never did. As anyone who clicks onto the Progeny PPs button on the TDN website will see, Danehill is enjoying another extraordinary season. His very extensive list of Northern Hemisphere stakes winners features the Group 1 winners Aquarelliste, Banks Hill, Landseer, Rock of Gibraltar and Spartacus, and the frequency with which he has hit the Group 1 target over the last two years has made it difficult for this columnist.

Last year, when writing about Danehill's son Mozart, I commented that there was a distinct danger that this column would have to be temporarily renamed "The Danehill Diaries," since when I have studiously tried to avoid returning to the well too often for fear of draining the Danehill topic dry. In doing so, I have done a disservice to one of the most amazing horses of the modern era Rock of Gibraltar.

The way Sir Alex Ferguson's colt quickened past an in-form Banks Hill in the Prix du Moulin to record his seventh consecutive Group 1 victory was deeply impressive. Although the colt's campaign has concentrated on a mile, Rock of Gibraltar is so tractable and has so much speed that it is hard to dispute the claims of his trainer Aidan O'Brien that he could win Group 1 events from five furlongs to 1 1/4 miles.

Unfortunately, these claims are unlikely to be put to the test unless this wonderful colt is kept in training next year, which would be a tremendous gift to the sport of horse-racing. How about it Sir Alex?

Mr. and Mrs. Walter Haefner of Moyglare Stud Farm have every reason to be grateful to Danehill, as he is the sire of their very good three-year-old fillies Dress To Thrill, who is developing into a formidable miler, and Irresistible Jewel, winner of the G2 Ribblesdale S. But the Haefners surely cannot watch Rock of Gibraltar without wondering "What if?"

The "if" concerns Rock of Gibraltar's dam Offshore Boom, who initially proved so disappointing as a broodmare, mated to a wide variety of stallions, that she was sold by Moyglare for only IR11,000 guineas as a 12-year-old in 1997.

The mare was bought by Joe Crowley for a partnership comprising himself, his daughter Anne-Marie and her husband Aidan O'Brien. The partnership's first move early the next year was to send Offshore Boom to Danehill, the stallion who had provided O'Brien with some of his best winners in his role as trainer in 1997. One of those winners, the Irish 2000 Guineas and Irish Derby winner Desert King, was out of a mare by Nureyev, so why not try Danehill with a mare by Be My Guest, another top miler by Northern Dancer?

Mating granddaughters of Northern Dancer with Danehill results in foals with no fewer than three lines to Natalma in the fourth generation of their pedigree. Concentrating so strongly on this celebrated mare has its obvious attractions, but also carried some risks. Windfields' Classic Sirelines booklet once carried the comment: "Natalma had a lot of ability, but she possessed a very sour disposition."

Her ability helped her cross the line in first place in the Spinaway S. at two, but Natalma was demoted to third in favour of Irish Jay. Unfortunately, her career came to an end after seven starts when she chipped a bone in her knee while being prepared for the Kentucky Oaks.

Of course, that injury proved to be most fortuitous, because there was just enough time to send Natalma to Nearctic at the end of the 1960 covering season, with the mating producing Northern Dancer.

Theoretically, the legacy of three lines to Natalma could be a difficult temperament and soundness problems, but nothing could be further from the truth where Rock of Gibraltar and Desert King are concerned. Rock of Gibraltar, like his very successful predecessor, has an ideal temperament and thrives on racing. Indeed, he has such a sturdy constitution that he even resisted the coughing epidemic that affected so many of O'Brien's other horses.

Perhaps we should remember that two of the three lines to Natalma come through Northern Dancer, another admirably tough individual. Despite being born as late as May 27, Northern Dancer raced nine times between the August and the November of his juvenile season in 1963. He packed another nine starts into the first six months of 1964, so he raced a total of 18 times in the space of 11 months.

Inbreeding to Northern Dancer through Be My Guest seems to pay dividends. Be My Guest is also the broodmare sire of Bachir, the French and Irish 2000 Guineas winner who is by a grandson of Danzig, and of Holding Court, the French Derby winner who is inbred 4x5x3 to Northern Dancer. Other Be My Guest mares have produced multiple Group winner Burden of Proof to Northern Dancer's son Fairy King, the juvenile G3 winner Ziria to Danehill's son Danehill Dancer, and Rainbows For All, a Group 3 winner in Ireland in August to Rainbows For Life.

Burden of Proof is inbred 2x3, while Rainbows For All is inbred 3x3.

Inbreeding to Natalma certainly seems to have worked very well for Offshore Boom. None of the eight stallions to which she was mated during her time at Moyglare was a member of the Northern Dancer male line (although Brief Truce, who sired a winner in Macau from her, created 3x3 to Northern Dancer). Offshore Boom has become a regular visitor to Danehill and her second foal by him, Great Pyramid, has already started to repay the IR£550,000 he cost as a yearling.

Offshore Boom won over six furlongs on her juvenile debut prior to finishing a good second in a Listed race over an extra furlong to earn an Irish Classification of 98.

The next dam, Push A Button, produced two other talented performers in Outside Pressure (a Listed winner over 1 1/4 miles) and the miler Winning Venture, but her main distinction is that she is a half-sister (by another Nasrullah line stallion) to Nasrullah's excellent grandson Riverman.

This son of Never Bend followed up his first-rate career on the racecourse, which featured a win in the French 2000 Guineas, with a stallion career that yielded nearly 130 stakes winners and many successful broodmare daughters. This link will surely be useful to Rock of Gibraltar--who numbers the English and Irish 2000 Guineas among his seven Group 1 wins--when he eventually retires. No doubt that retirement will come at the end of the year, but wouldn't it be fascinating to see what he is capable of over a wider range of distances?

Breaktime hadn't visited the winner's circle in 26 months, but got the job done with this stretch-running effort. He was the runner-up in the G1 Yasuda Kinen last year and, most recently, was second in the G3 Ivy S. in August. The five-year-old will now point for the Nov. 17 G1 Mile Championship.

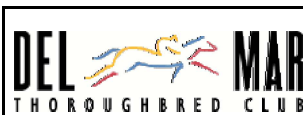

**RACING TO PAY RESPECT TO VICTIMS OF 9-11**

Racegoers attending Britain's three race meetings at Doncaster, Epsom and Hereford tomorrow will pay their respects to victims of last year's September 11 terrorist attacks. All jockeys riding at Hereford will wear black armbands and racegoers will observe a three-minute silence at 1.46 pm, the exact time of the first plane to impact the World Trade Center. Hereford's Simon Kershaw told *PA Sport*: "The racecourse is particularly honoured to be holding such a significant event as this and is confident the people of Herefordshire will support this unique occasion and, by doing so, make the day a suitably fitting tribute to last year's tragedy." Doncaster's manager Malcolm Taylor added: "We will certainly be holding a minute's silence at 1.46 pm. We've moved the first race forward to 1.35 so it should be completed by 1.46." A similar tribute is also planned for Epsom, as clerk of the course Andrew Cooper explained to *PA Sport*: "At 1.46, the jockeys should be coming into the ring and a minute's silence certainly looks the plan."

**BATH WASHED OUT**

Monday's meeting at Bath was abandoned after only two races due to poor visibility. Persistent rain and low cloud cover at Britain's highest course resulted in the track judge being unable to view the furlong pole from his box, a requisite under Britain's rules of racing. The third race on the card was delayed for approximately 30 minutes to allow time for conditions to improve but, with little prospect of improvement, course officials had no alternative to cancel the remainder of the card. Stipendiary Steward Paul Barton said: "We don't abandon unless we absolutely have to, but we have the horses for the third race saddled up and waiting in the saddling boxes and we can't keep them there forever. The judge cannot see anywhere near the furlong marker and if he can't see the furlong marker we cannot race."

**RAKTI MAY POINT TO CHAMPION**

Bruno Grizzetti, trainer of Sunday's Listed Premio Villa Borghese winner **Rakti (GB)** (Polish Precedent {USA}), expressed satisfaction with his colt's performance at Rome's Capanelle track. The G1 Derby Italiano winner put in a workmanlike performance, but the Milan-based trainer's horses are yet to hit 100 percent fitness. Rakti's original agenda was to target the G1 Gran Premio del Jockey Club at Milan Oct. 20 followed by the G1 Premio Roma at Rome Nov. 20, but he may now be rerouted to the G1 Dubai Champion S. at Newmarket Oct. 19 as his first main autumn target.

**NAPLES PROVIDES BOOST**

The advent of September has again signalled increased activity in Italy, especially at the racetracks of Rome, Milan and Florence. However, it was the summer staple at Naples which provided welcome good news for Italian racing. The Agnano track has always been a popular venue for both trotters and thoroughbreds alike, but this year saw an increase in popularity in terms of attendance and betting turnover. The new management, guided by Dr Gaetano Papalia, saw an increase of 40 percent in attendances and 35 percent in betting turnover. The average attendance for the summer evening meetings was 2,000 customers and the meeting highlight, FIA (equivalent of the EBF) day, saw an attendance in excess of 8,000. Despite the lack of a graded-stakes race, the meeting has proved a popular venue with Rome-based trainers to run their juveniles. Napoli is to stage one further special raceday this Sunday Sept. 15, which is dedicated to peace among all countries of the Mediterranean area and will see invited jockeys from many of these countries in action.
